BC CLASSIC WINNER BAYERN RETIRED

Bayern, winner of the 2014 Breeders' Cup Classic (gr. I), has been retired from racing, Hill 'n' Dale Farms announced Sept. 28.

The deal for Kaleem Shah's 4-year-old Offlee Wild colt to stand at Hill 'n' Dale in 2016 had been announced earlier this year. After his third-place finish in the Sept. 26 Awesome Again Stakes (gr. I), there were indications he wouldn't defend his Breeders' Cup Classic title Oct. 31 at Keeneland.

Bred by Helen Alexander, Bayern earned more than \$4.4 million with a 6-1-3 record in 15 starts. While fans will most likely remember the controversial start of last year's Classic, breeders will recall Bayern's ability to carry his speed over 1 1/4 miles.

Bayern's other stakes wins were the William Hill Haskell Invitational (gr. I), Pennsylvania Derby (gr. II), and Woody Stephens (gr. II).

"On his day he was a super brilliant horse," trainer Bob Baffert said. "Something was bugging him this year that we could never figure out even though he trained great. It's time to retire the horse and be thankful of all he has accomplished." **BH**

BIG STAKES WEEKEND FOR MEDAGLIA D'ORO

It's too early for Darley America to announce 2016 stud fees, but it's a good bet Medaglia d'Oro will be priced above his 2015 fee of \$125,000.

The 16-year-old son of El Prado is on a roll, with four stakes winners, headed by Chandelier (gr. I) winner Songbird, over the Sept. 26-27 weekend. Tied with leading sire Tapit by number of black-type stakes winners this year (21), he was third-leading sire at the Keeneland September yearling sale (34 sold; average \$341,324), behind only Tapit and War Front, who stood last year for \$300,000 and \$150,000, respectively.

"What's really appealing is you can't pigeonhole him as a sire of a certain type of horse," Darley America COO Dan Pride said. "It really has been exciting to see how diverse his runners are; not one style or surface."

Medaglia d'Oro, most famously the sire of Horse of the Year Rachel Alexandra, joined the Darley roster in 2010 and shuttles each year to Australia. **BH**

SIRE POWER BOOSTS LOUISIANA SALE

The Breeders Sales Co. of Louisiana's yearling sale falls just three days after Keeneland's September yearling sale. While BSC sales director Tim Boyce said some people might be a little tired, there's some traffic on the West Monroe sale grounds.

With outs, 192 yearlings remain in the Sept. 29 sale and offer buyers a range of sire power.

"There are a couple of Into Mischiefs in here and yearlings by Majesticperfection and Tale of the Cat," Boyce said. "And Star Guitar has several in here from his first crop."

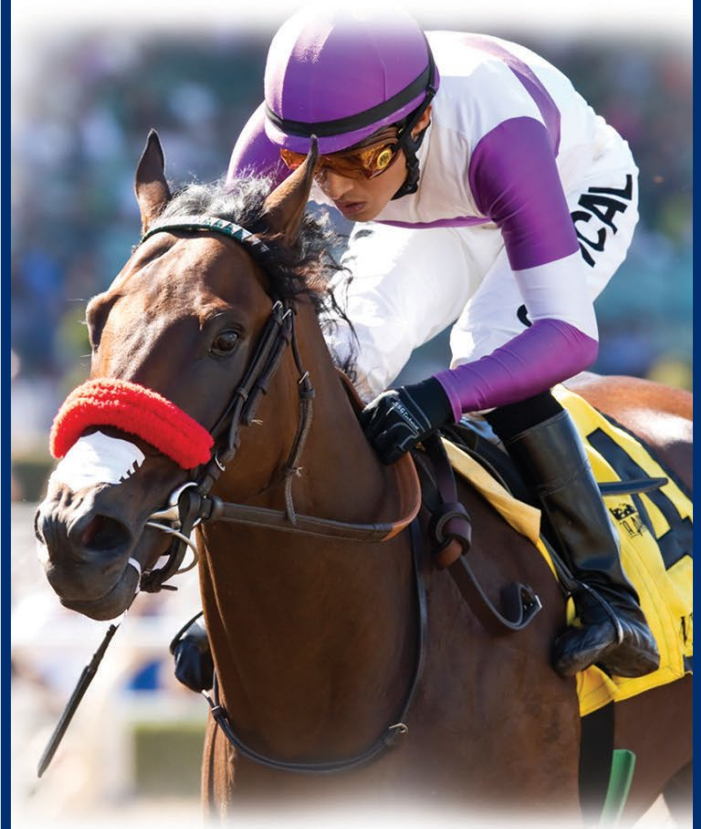
Last year 116 yearlings averaged \$13,318 with a Yankee Gentleman colt selling for \$100,000.

"The racing here is lucrative, based on what you pay," Boyce said of the local economic environment. "The pots may be bigger in New York, but your costs are at least twice as much. The premier meets here at Fair Grounds and Delta are strong."

Following a breakfast sponsored by Spendthrift Farm, the sale gets underway at 11 a.m. CDT. **BH**

MONMOUTH MEET HOLDS ITS OWN

Competition for the gambling dollar and for horses to fill races is intense in the Mid-Atlantic and Northeast regions. So it's no small feat that at Monmouth Park, the New Jersey track that ended its 58-day race meet Sept. 27, average field size was up from 2014.

Monmouth averaged 8.11 horses per race, up from 7.99. That's not a major increase, but, given statistics at other tracks in the region, it's solid. For instance, through Sept. 27 Monmouth's two closest competitors—Delaware Park and Parx Racing—had average field sizes of 7.07 and 7.78, respectively.

The three tracks' meets overlapped from June through September, with the exception of three weeks in August when Parx was closed.

Monmouth also reported a 1.9% increase in total pari-mutuel handle to \$266.1 million and a slight rise in average daily purses to \$392,745 per day. The Monmouth meet and a short all-turf meet at Meadowlands are remnants of a once year-round racing circuit with four major tracks. **BH**

SINGAPORE SCRAPS INTERNATIONAL RACES

The Singapore Turf Club has unexpectedly scrapped its two lucrative international group I races, the Singapore Airlines International Cup and KrisFlyer International Sprint, citing the races had achieved their original objectives.

"These objectives include branding Singapore races internationally and uplifting the quality of Singapore horses and Singapore racing," the club said in a release. "Both international races together with Singapore racing have grown in stature and prestige over the years."

Run at Kranji Racecourse, the races were introduced in 2000 and 2001, respectively.

A local horse won the inaugural SIA Cup, but 14 subsequent runnings went to horses from England, the United Arab Emirates, Germany, Australia, Japan, South Africa, Brazil, France, and Hong Kong.

The most recent editions of the races went to Hong Kong standouts Dan Excel, who repeated in the SIA Cup—a 1 1/4-mile race with a US\$2.37 million purse—and Aerovelocity, who captured the six-furlong Sprint, which offered a US\$790,000 purse. **BH**

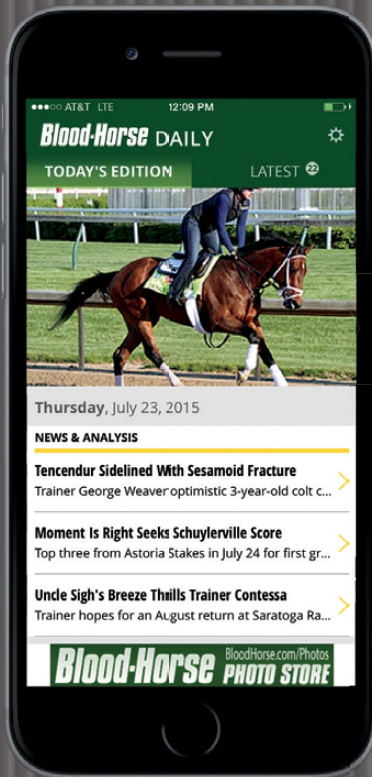

A NEW YORK DAY AT THE RACES

A few levels of urban purgatory below Madison Square Garden, about 16 hours after Pope Francis played there before a capacity crowd, I ambled onto the last remaining direct Belmont-bound train leaving Manhattan.

Boarding the "Belmont Special" requires navigating the tourist's nightmare known as Pennsylvania Station. But the tourists have it easy. For them, New York's "other" train station (no one goes to "Penn" to gawk at its ceiling) is just a bewildering, yet temporary way station. It provides inconvenience, and maybe a good horror story to tell the folks back home. For New Yorkers it is the monstrosity we inherited after the original beaux arts masterpiece that was "old Penn Station" was demolished in 1963.

Nowadays, the Belmont Special offers the modern-day Gotham-based race-goer a rare affordable luxury: a quiet and contemplative ride to a heavenly racetrack. Yes, it's only another string of Long Island Railroad cars. But it's also something like a dreamy visit to a vanished world, to step aboard a train where the only passengers are race-goers.

Arriving 40 minutes later, you are transported back in time, similar to the way Saratoga once managed but can't quite pull off any more.

It's been several decades since Red Smith's directions to Saratoga still held ("... turn left on Union Avenue and go back 100 years"). Now you are lucky if this year's Spa still looks like last year's. But if Belmont Park can't take you back a century, it still transports you to a time when it was not considered pure folly to build remarkable palaces for the comfort and enjoy-

ment of everyday people.

I have no idea how many people joined me Saturday. (The New York Racing Association no longer volunteers paid attendance figures.) But the thousands there who barely dented the park's capacity all seemed to have a great time.

There was plenty of room on the scalloped viewing stand half-circling the ancient white pine inside the beautiful paddock. Thousands of free seats with great racetrack views were there for the taking. Some complain Belmont is "too big" and the expanse of empty seats, depressing. But that's like saying Jones Beach is too wide and too sandy in the autumn.

Belmont is New York's last great everyman's palace. Getting there on the Belmont Special provides some wistful irony. Just like old Penn Station, the old Belmont grandstand also bit the dust in 1963. But while America's grandest train station was replaced with a buried, airless maze more suitable for lab mice than men and women, the old New York Racing Association, to its everlasting credit, elected to build a better Longchamp. **BH**
