

War Front's stud fee will increase by 33% in 2016

WAR FRONT'S FEE UPPED TO \$200,000

ar Front will stand for a \$200,000 stud fee in **V** 2016, Claiborne Farm announced Oct. 12. The fee is a 33% increase over the \$150,000 he stood for in 2014-15 and solidifies the 13-year-old son of Danzig's rank as North America's second-most expensive stallion, behind only Gainesway's Tapit, who stood for \$300,000 this year.

Claiborne also increased the fee for Flatter, who moves up 50% to \$30,000 after standing the past three seasons for \$20,000. Flatter—an A.P. Indy full brother to Congrats—has gradually worked his way up the stallion ranks since entering stud for \$5,000 in 2004. He is the sire of 2015 graded winners Classic Point, Kobe's Back, Taris, and Upstart.

Claiborne's 2016 roster will also include versatile grade I winner Lea, who the farm bred and races with partner Adele Dilschneider. His fee will be announced after the Breeders' Cup, where Lea (by First Samurai) will make his final start in either the Oct. 30 Dirt Mile (gr. I) or Oct. 31 Mile (gr. IT). BH

PREFERRED SESSION BEGINS OBS FALL

The Ocala Breeders' Sales Co.'s two-day fall mixed sale begins Oct. 13, with 562 horses cataloged over three sessions. Hips 1-204 kick off the preferred session, down from 238 horses in 2014. Last year the session's average fell to \$16,569 (-26%), median declined to \$9,000 (-50%), and gross dropped to \$2,269,900 (-17%) compared with 2013.

Alexandra's Grace, in foal to Bodemeister, topped 2014's preferred session at \$120,000. This year's sale includes another mare covered by Bodemeister, as well as mares in foal to first-season sires Alpha, Itsmyluckyday, Real Solution, and Strong Mandate.

One of the year's first sales to offer weanlings, the auction gives buyers their initial chance to see offspring from the first crops of Kentucky and Florida-based sires. Weanlings by Kentucky's Graydar, Overanalyze, Oxbow, Take Charge Indy, and Violence as well as by Florida's Fort Larned, Poseidon's Warrior, Rattlesnake Bridge, Soldat, and Treasure Beach are cataloged in the preferred session. House bills address racehorse depreciation and capital gains definitions

TAX BILLS REINTRODUCED IN CONGRESS

It has been a rollercoaster ride for racehorse owners in terms of depreciation and capital gains in Washington, D.C., over the years. The industry has had to rely on temporary legislative adjustments designed to keep more money in the business through tax breaks.

That could be the case again this year for expiring tax provisions, but U.S. Rep. Andy Barr of Kentucky is among the lawmakers attempting to make the changes permanent. On Oct. 12 he said he has reintroduced the Race Horse Cost Recovery Act, which would make three-year depreciation of racehorses the norm rather than seven years; and the Equine Tax Parity Act, which would permanently reduce the capital gains treatment of racehorses to 12 months rather than 24.

The bills would amend the Internal Revenue Code of 1986.

Fiscal impact projections aren't attached to the bills, and the National Thoroughbred Racing Association doesn't have the estimates yet, but industry officials have said tax breaks are critical to keeping money in the racing and breeding businesses. BH

Dr. Mick Peterson reviewed track testing and measuring procedures at Keeneland Oct. 10-11

DIRT SURFACE REVIEWED AT KEENELAND

In the wake of several catastrophic breakdowns on its dirt surface since the fall meet began Oct. 2, Keeneland had Dr. Mick Peterson, executive director of the Racing Surfaces Testing Laboratory, on site Oct. 10-11 to review testing and measuring procedures. The daily protocol is standard at Keeneland, which first used the dirt surface during the 2014 fall meet after replacing its synthetic Polytrack surface. Keeneland officials Oct. 11 said Peterson's review found the dirt surface "met all of the pre-meet test criteria, and all maintenance had been performed in accordance with protocols developed for the track."

Three horses suffered catastrophic breakdowns on the

dirt: multiple stakes winners Rock Fall and Tacticus, during training, and Shore Runner. Skyring, another multiple stakes winner, broke down on the turf during the Shadwell Turf Mile (gr. IT).

Dr. Mary Scollay, equine medical director for the Kentucky Horse Racing Commission, said all the cases are being reviewed as part of a necropsy program conducted for all racehorse fatalities. BH

HANDLE GROWTH: IS IT NEARLY ENOUGH?

s the glass half full or half empty? In terms of commingled pari-mutuel handle on United States races, that's the question, with three months remaining in 2015.

Through the first nine months, wagering on U.S. races has totaled \$8,303,928,513, up 0.9% compared with the same period in 2014. And part of that slight increase can be attributed to September, during which total handle increased 12% to \$776,270,810 from September of last year.

Any increase is a positive, given that through September there were 1,633 fewer races and 7,930 fewer starts compared with last year. Another good sign is that the average wagered per race this year is up 6.2% to \$270,399, but it doesn't hide the fact overall handle

is rather stagnant.

In 2003, total wagering on U.S. racing peaked at \$15.1 billion. Last year it totaled \$10.5 billion. The latter figure is within reach for this year, but it won't come close to turning around the 30% drop over a 12-year period. **BH**

DUBAWI, GALILEO DOMINANT AS EXPECTED

ast week's Tattersalls Book 1 sale again reached new heights, grossing 82,744,500 guineas (\$132,929,039), a 4.3% rise from the previous year's record. With 36 more lots sold this year, there was a slight dip in the average price, which fell 5.7%. The median, however, equaled 2014's high of 150,000 guineas (\$240,975).


As expected, Dubawi and Galileo dominated the leading sires. Dubawi's 11 sold averaged 662,273 guineas (\$1,056,921), which included the most expensive 2015 yearling sold at auction worldwide, a daughter of Dubawi that realized 2.1 million guineas (\$3,357,774). Galileo had 17 sell over the three days for an average of 545,882 guineas (\$871,235). His daughter out of Frizette Stakes (gr. I) winner A Z Warrior was the second-highest price of the sale at 1.3 million guineas (\$2,067,429).

Street Cry's penultimate crop had three sell for an

average of 536,667 guineas (\$862,156), while Frankel's nine lots averaged 445,000 guineas (\$711,649). Shamardal also posted high returns with 11 averaging 375,000 guineas (\$598,942); from his first of two European crops, Australian-based Redoute's Choice had five lots sell for an average of 321,000 guineas (\$515,687). BH

RANKING RACING'S ISSUES

he American Thoroughbred industry is like the weather. People like to complain a lot, but no one ever seems to do anything to improve things.

A recent exception is the Barr-Tonko bill and the Clean Horse Racing Initiative team striving to shepherd this legislation through the halls of our dysfunctional Congress. (So much for those who complain that true handicaps are dead!)

Just last week I came upon a reader survey at DRF.com. In one section, respondents were asked to review 10 "issues" (from Barr-Tonko to wagering takeout) and rank them in order of importance. And because this space is reserved for the airing of one horseplayer's opinions, it made sense to share my rankings (from "least" to "most" important) and brief comments.

- #10 Racetrack Infrastructure: I'm a New Yorker. I get to attend big race days at Saratoga, Aqueduct, and Belmont Park. For me to complain about infrastructure would be quibbling.
- #9 Cost of Buying and Racing Horses: As recent events indicate, there is no shortage of wealthy people looking to buy Thoroughbreds. New York's claiming races result in more "shakes" than a convention of belly dancers. Next.
- #8 Marketing: The only question here: Why didn't I make this topic number 10?
- #7 Eliminating Race-Day Lasix: This horseplayer could take race-day Lasix or leave it. It's counterproductive to make its elimination a stumbling block to real progress.
- #6 Catching the Cheaters: I'm with Bob Dylan and Satchel Paige: Don't look back. Go forward with strong testing and enforcement to change existing behaviors. Start freezing samples to show the cheaters you mean business.
- #5 IRS Withholding: The existing framework is an outdated system wasting taxpayer money

while harming business. This pointless sucking of money from the betting pools—most of which is later returned in tax refunds—needs to stop.

- #4 Customer Service: There are too many important details here to enumerate, so I will capsulize. Your customer is the bettor, not the kid getting the pony ride.
- #3 Takeout: This is a huge issue, but unless you can convince the states to help save racing by foregoing their cut of the rake, real progress is unlikely. Ideally, takeout should be much lower. Also, I should drink less and exercise more frequently.
- #2 Passing the Barr-Tonko bill: Creating national standards and an effective authority will not guarantee improvements in racing and horse welfare, but it's a great place to start.
- #1 Horse Welfare: The public's belief that Thoroughbreds are too often exploited and endangered is, alas, accurate. Racing can continue down the path to further marginalization, or it can accept today's reality that Thoroughbreds are more than mere "property," and must be protected accordingly. BH
