RED GIANT FILLY TOPS OBS AT \$120,000


he Ocala Breeders' Sales Co.'s two-day fall mixed sale is unique in that it offers one of the first opportunities for buyers to see weanlings from firstcrop sires.

Emerging on top during the Oct. 13 consignor preferred session was Florida-based stallion Treasure Beach, an Irish classic-winning son of Galileo. Treasure Beach—who stood for a \$10,000 fee this year at Pleasant Acres Stallions near Ocala—was represented by two that sold for a total \$100,000, including a filly that was the session's second-highest price at \$75,000. First-year stallion Violence had one sell for \$50,000, co-third-highest price on the day.

Topping the session at \$120,000 was Puddifoot, a stakes-winning daughter of Red Giant bought by Joy Ventures from the Kaizen Sales consignment.

The key economic figures fell for the second year in a row, with the gross down 31% to \$1,582,200 for 106 sold, for an average \$14,926 (-10%) and an RNA rate of 37%. The lone bright spot was the \$9,000 median, up from \$8,750 a year ago. BH

FEES SET FOR SPENDTHRIFT'S 25 STALLIONS

or the third year in a row Malibu Moon will stand for \$95,000, and he leads Spendthrift Farm's 25-stallion roster for 2016. The farm has increased fees for only two stallions: Into Mischief was increased 29% to \$45,000, and the fee for Temple City is up 20% from \$12,500 in 2015 to \$15,000. Into Mischief's fee was announced earlier this fall, and his 2016 book is already full.

Temple City's first 3-year-olds made an impression in 2015, highlighted by stakes winner Miss Temple City who most recently finished second in the Oct. 10 Queen Elizabeth II Challenge Cup Stakes (gr. IT) at Keeneland.

Along with the relocation of Court Vision (\$6,500) and Victor's Cry (\$3,500) from Spendthrift's Canadian base, the Kentucky farm will add four new stallions for the coming breeding season. Grade I winners Danza(\$4,000) and Palace (\$6,000), grade II winner Race Day (\$7,000), and grade III winner Medal Count (\$5,000) are all part of Spendthrift's Share the Upside program for their first year at stud. **BH**

KHRC officials will propose regulations on historical racing concerning purse money and licensing

HISTORICAL RACING **RULES UPGRADE SOUGHT**

he Kentucky Horse Racing Commission has told state lawmakers it will propose additional regulations for historical race wagering, including more flexibility in allocation of its revenue.

KHRC officials appeared before the Interim Joint Committee on Licensing and Occupations Oct. 9. Historical race wagering is governed under rules promulgated by the KHRC, and though the General Assembly did pass a bill that set the pari-mutuel tax rate for historical racing machines, there was never legislation authorizing the form of gambling because the state Attorney General's office issued an opinion that it qualifies under existing pari-mutuel law.

One proposal would offer more clarity on how purse money can be divvied up. Another would allow the KHRC to license all parties associated with historical race wagering, including companies that manufacture the video lottery terminal-like machines.

KHRC general counsel Susan Speckert told lawmakers the proposed changes wouldn't impact ongoing litigation. The Family Foundation has challenged the machines' legality, and a trial has been set for September 2016. BH

HORSE COUNTRY TOURS BEGIN BC WEEK

Preeders' Cup week in Lexington will provide a showcase for Kentucky's Thoroughbred industry, and various farms have stepped up as part of Horse County Inc., an organization launched in January to

promote fan involvement through farm tours.

Visits will be unique to each location, with farm personnel leading tours that include photo opportunities with Breeders' Cup-affiliated horses.

At an Oct. 12 pilot tour of Mill Ridge, Price Bell Jr. of Nicoma Bloodstock led a group exploring the history of his family's farm and its Breeders' Cup connections.

"Horse Country allows a conduit for people to come and see the stories," said Headley Bell, managing partner of Mill Ridge Farm. "The platform exists to provide an experience, which is what people want. The farm is where you fall in love with the horse, the driver for everything we do."

Regular tours will be offered Oct. 25-28 as a lead up to the Oct. 30-31 World Championships. There are 23 farms participating in the endeavor. **BH**

JOHANNESBURG 'READY TO RUN' SALE NEARS

ape Thoroughbred Sales (CTS) will hold its Johannesburg Ready To Run Sale at Inanda Club Oct.

18. The one-day sale, which starts at 1:00 pm, has 199
2-year-olds cataloged. Horses sold at this sale qualify for the 2016 Emperors Palace Ready To Run Cup, a race worth R2.5 million (\$185,993) in 2015.

Summerhill Stud provides the majority of the catalog, consigning more than 100 lots by such top class international stallions as Exceed And Excel, High Chaparral, Lonhro, and More Than Ready.

Other top international sires represented include Al Maher and Hard Spun. Last season's champion sire Captain Al, the very promising Elusive Fort and his own champion sire Fort Wood, Kahal, Trippi, Var, and Western Winter are among the leading South African sires. Visionaire, last season's leading first-crop sire in South Africa, has no less than 22 juveniles, including

a full sister to Strelitzia Stakes (SAf-III) winner Royal Pleasure and a half brother to 34-time winner Hear The Drums. BH

THE LESSONS OF KEENELAND SEPTEMBER

he last three Keeneland September sales have been stable. Each year the median was \$50,000, the gross between \$280 million and \$281 million, and the \$102,000-plus average for both 2013 and 2015 bracketed 2014's \$99,312.

The stability begets seller confidence and helps explain the higher percentage of 2015 RNAs. Smaller race fields/higher earnings per start also have encouraged some sellers to increase reserves. Those considerations affect my own decisions when I set reserves, but I've learned the hard way the wisdom of John Talbott, my first partner in the breeding business, who advised: "It's better to sell and be sorry than to keep them and be sorry."

Comparisons of the last three Keeneland September sales to pre-recession sales are instructive. The grand averages for the combined 2013-15 and 2006-08 sales were almost dead even at just over \$101,000. The story lies in the significant differences in other statistics.

The top price for 2013-15 was \$2.5 million (in 2013). Each of the 2006-08 sales saw higher top prices, and every top price from 1999 to 2008

was either equal to (once) or higher than (nine times) the \$2.5 million in 2013. They averaged \$5.96 million.

Statistics from the last sessions of those sales further enlighten us. The average prices for last sessions 2006-08 ranged from \$7,621 to \$9,020. Last-session averages in 2013-15 were \$8,934 to \$14,939. Last-session median prices also reflect the strength of the 2013-15 sales; 2006-08 last-session medians ranged from \$4,600 to \$5,750, while 2013-15 last-session medians ranged from \$7,000 to \$11,000.

The top-end and bottom-end statistics seem to tell different stories, but

they are both part of the same theme. The number of yearlings sold at Keeneland has dropped by approximately 24% from 2006-08 to 2013-15. The annual foal crop has dropped much more, falling approximately 40%.

Average prices at Keeneland have nearly recovered to the record pre-recession levels. Median prices are at record levels. High average and median prices are explained by the decisions of breeders to breed only about 60% as many mares as they did eight to 10 years ago. Mares with weak pedigrees and/or so-so conformation have exited broodmare bands. Better pedigrees and better physicals now populate the tail-end of the sale.

Demand for yearlings is down dramatically from pre-recession levels. To a similar degree, supply has adjusted downward, thus increasing average yearling quality and median prices, as well as average prices similar to pre-recession levels but lower top prices and gross sales.

Stallion season prices going forward will remain under pressure. Innovative "deals" will continue to be the order of the day for typical stallions. BH


