## YES IT'S TRUE, 19, EUTHANIZED

Three Chimneys Farm stallion Yes It's True, a 19-year-old son of Is It True, was euthanized Nov. 23 after emergency surgery to repair a perforated intestine was unsuccessful.

Yes It's True, a grade I-winning sprinter, entered stud in Florida and got off to a fast start in 2004 with grade I winner Proud Accolade and three other stakes winners in his first crop. By September 2004, he had been relocated to Three Chimneys.

Yes It's True has 51 black-type stakes winners and total progeny earnings exceeding \$58.8 million. His top runner this year is graded stakes winner La Verdad.

"It is always sad to lose a stallion but more so to lose one you enjoyed being around," said Sandy Hatfield, stallion manager at Three Chimneys. "He was true to himself in what he produced and consistent. The mares bred to him this year are owned by a lot of the same people who have been breeding to him for years."

Yes It's True bred 117 mares in 2015. **BH**

## CLARK HANDICAP APPEARS WIDE OPEN

Even with the absence of Dortmund due to a quarter crack, the \$500,000 Clark Handicap (gr. I) Nov. 27 drew another intriguing field.

Three sophomores—Keen Ice, Mr. Z, and Shotgun Kowboy—bring interesting storylines: the Travers Stakes (gr. I) upsetter who handed American Pharoah his only 2015 defeat, the Ohio Derby winner still gunning for that top-level win, and the Oklahoma-bred runner making his first start outside his native state.

Of the older horses, defending Clark winner Hoppertunity must rebound from a runner-up finish to rival Race Day in the Fayette Stakes (gr. II), while Race Day shares co-highweight assignment of 122 pounds with Effinex, the surprise Breeders' Cup Classic (gr. I) second-place finisher.

Grade II winner Protonico, second in last year's Clark, needs to improve over his recent Fayette fifth. West Virginia Governor's Stakes winner Looks to Spare is a longshot while the mare Frivolous could make her final career start here or could defend her title in the Nov. 26 Falls City Handicap (gr. II). **BH**

## COMMISSIONER TO WINSTAR FOR 2016

Commissioner, a classic-placed, multiple graded stakes-winning son of A.P. Indy, will be retired to stud at WinStar Farm near Versailles, Ky., at the end of 2015.

Winner of the Skip Away Stakes and Pimlico Special (both gr. III) in back-to-back starts this spring, the colt is being pointed to the \$250,000 Hawthorne Gold Cup (gr. II) Nov. 28 prior to his retirement.

Commissioner's stud fee is set at \$7,500 stands and nurses, and he will participate in WinStar's "Dream Big" program, which offers breeders the opportunity to earn a lifetime breeding right to the stallion after producing just two live foals from his first books. Commissioner's dam is multiple stakes winner Flaming Heart, a Touch Gold mare who also produced 2013 Breeders' Cup Sprint (gr. I) runner-up Laugh Track.

Commissioner set the pace and led until the final yards of the 2014 Belmont Stakes (gr. I) before he was headed by Tonalist, but the WinStar Farm

homebred outfinished Kentucky Derby and Preakness Stakes (both gr. I) winner California Chrome and Wicked Strong. **BH**

## NEW SHOOTERS FOR LA STALLION RANKS

Comprehensive and lucrative breeding and stallion awards are major incentives to attracting new stallions to Louisiana, which will see several new additions for 2016, including three launching their stud careers: Call Me George, Speighter Man, and Koh I Noor. Each brings an attractive pedigree.

Point Given's New Orleans Handicap (gr. II) winner Call Me George is out of multiple stakes winner Sassy Chimes from the family of Kentucky Oaks winner Silent Beauty. His initial fee is \$1,500 at Gulf Coast Equine. Speighter Man, by Speightstown—Sweet Damsel, by Turkoman, is a half brother to Colonel John, who is among the leading juvenile sires this year. He will stand at All Star Thoroughbreds for \$2,000.

A half brother to grade I-winning sprinter The Big Beast, stakes-placed Koh I Noor, by Harlan's Holiday—V V S Flawless, by Deputy Minister, will stand for \$2,000 at the Louisiana Center for Equine Reproduction at Copper Crowne.

Other new Louisiana stallions include Tidal Wave (Stormy Atlantic) and Podium (Pulpit). **BH**

## HOLLENDORFER MAY HIT MILESTONE AT ZIA

While trainer Jerry Hollendorfer has started horses throughout the country in his Racing Hall of Fame career, it still is a bit surprising that his 7,000th career win could come at Zia Park in New Mexico. Hollendorfer will saddle three horses in stakes at Zia Nov. 25, and classic-winning rider Martin Garcia is scheduled to ride each starter.

The Zia Park runners will appear in successive races, beginning with race eight when Never Ends goes in the Zia Park Oaks off a pair of Santa Anita Park allowance-optional claiming wins. She'll be followed by Point Piper, going for his second 2015 stakes win in the Zia Park Championship Handicap, and stakes winner Oligarch will try to extend his win streak in the Zia Park Sprint.

Hollendorfer enters the day with 6,999 wins from 30,048 career starts. His Zia entries are his only Wednesday starters; the following day he has five entered at Golden Gate Fields and one at Del Mar. **BH**

## PA RACING FUNDING BILL PROGRESSES

The Pennsylvania House Agriculture and Rural Affairs Committee Nov. 23 approved legislation that would greatly alter pari-mutuel law, in part to provide stable funding for horse racing regulation and drug testing.

The bill, a rewrite of legislation introduced earlier this year, would transfer money from the Pennsylvania Race Horse Development Fund, revenue generated from casino slot machines, to pay for equine drug testing and regulation, money that currently comes from a percentage of live pari-mutuel handle. A decade-long decline in wagering, however, created a shortfall in the State Racing Fund.

For fiscal 2015-16, \$310,000 per week would be transferred from the RHDF to cover the costs of regulation up to \$6.2 million for the period. The bulk of RHDF revenue goes to purses, so it appears owners would help pick up the tab for regulation.

The bill would also scrap the two racing com-

missions—one Thoroughbred and the other Standardbred—and create one larger commission. The regulatory agency would remain under the state Department of Agriculture. **BH**

## CHANGE IS GOOD FOR LADY LARA

Trainer Bill Mott hadn't completely decided on a race for Lady Lara when he shipped her to Payson Park in Florida for training in early November, but through some nice morning work at her new base, the grade II winner made her case.

Mott opted to enter Swettenham Stud's Lady Lara in the My Charmer Handicap (gr. IIIT) Nov. 21 at Gulfstream Park West, and the 4-year-old Excellent Art filly not

only snapped her five-race losing streak but also earned the week's top Equibase Speed Figure, 121.

"The timing from her last race worked out well," Mott said. "We shipped her down here, and we weren't sure if we were going to run her. She took the ship well and seemed like she looked good and was training good, so we decided to go ahead and run."

Lady Lara's good form is well timed as her Racing Hall of Fame trainer will have plenty of options with the Gulfstream Park championship meet about to start. **BH**

## THE ART OF MANAGING INCENTIVES

In 1995 while working in China, I visited a state-owned store. Clerks ignored me. I asked my interpreter if clerks disliked Americans, and she replied: "No, they treat everyone this way because they don't work on commission and can't be fired."

China is an economic powerhouse today because the private sector has mushroomed, but around the world sophisticated private industries—including racing and breeding in the U.S.—sometimes don't get incentives right.

Farms often use foal-share contracts to augment stallion books that don't fill at advertised prices. The resulting foals often sell for lower prices than foals for which the stud fees were paid because foal-share mares are of lower quality. (The Secretariat foal share was an exception.)

Bidding incentives also help explain lower prices for foal-share progeny. A 100% owner who has paid the stud fee has more incentive to bid than a 50% (foal share) owner. Both owners risk a no-sale, but the 100% owner who bids \$49,000 after a live \$48,000 bid will receive an extra \$2,000 if the \$49,000 bid pushes the price to \$50,000. The 50% owner cedes half of the incremental \$2,000 to the stallion owner.

Consider breed-secure deals in which breeders receive the first \$10,000 then none of the next "X" dollars where "X" equals the stud fee. Two incentives detrimental to the stallion owner come into play.

First, some mare owners will breed lower-quality mares they expect will generate proceeds of \$10,000 or less, figuring they'll pay no stud fee. And that's assuming those mares aren't refused by stallion managers.

Second, if the foal is worth \$20,000 but the stud fee is \$10,000, breeders will often stop bidding at \$10,000, as pushing the bidding toward \$20,000 makes money only for the stallion owner. I looked at sales figures for the first mares sold based on breed-secure arrangements and found they produced fewer hammer prices in the \$10,000 to \$10,000-plus stud fee range than similar non-breed secure mares.

No-guarantee seasons generate earlier farm cash flows and obviate collection problems. A fair price for the average Kentucky mare is about 65% of the live-foal price. But if you price no-guarantee seasons at 65 cents on the dollar, expect that mares with 80% probability of getting in foal will pile in.

The racing side also has its incentive issues. How do we compensate a trainer for claiming a broodmare prospect? If we pay a fee for haltering the horse, we provide an incentive to claim anything with four legs. Consider paying a lower "due diligence" fee regardless of whether we get the mare. **BH**

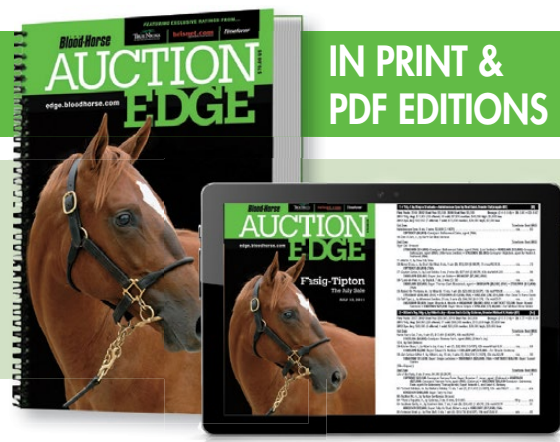

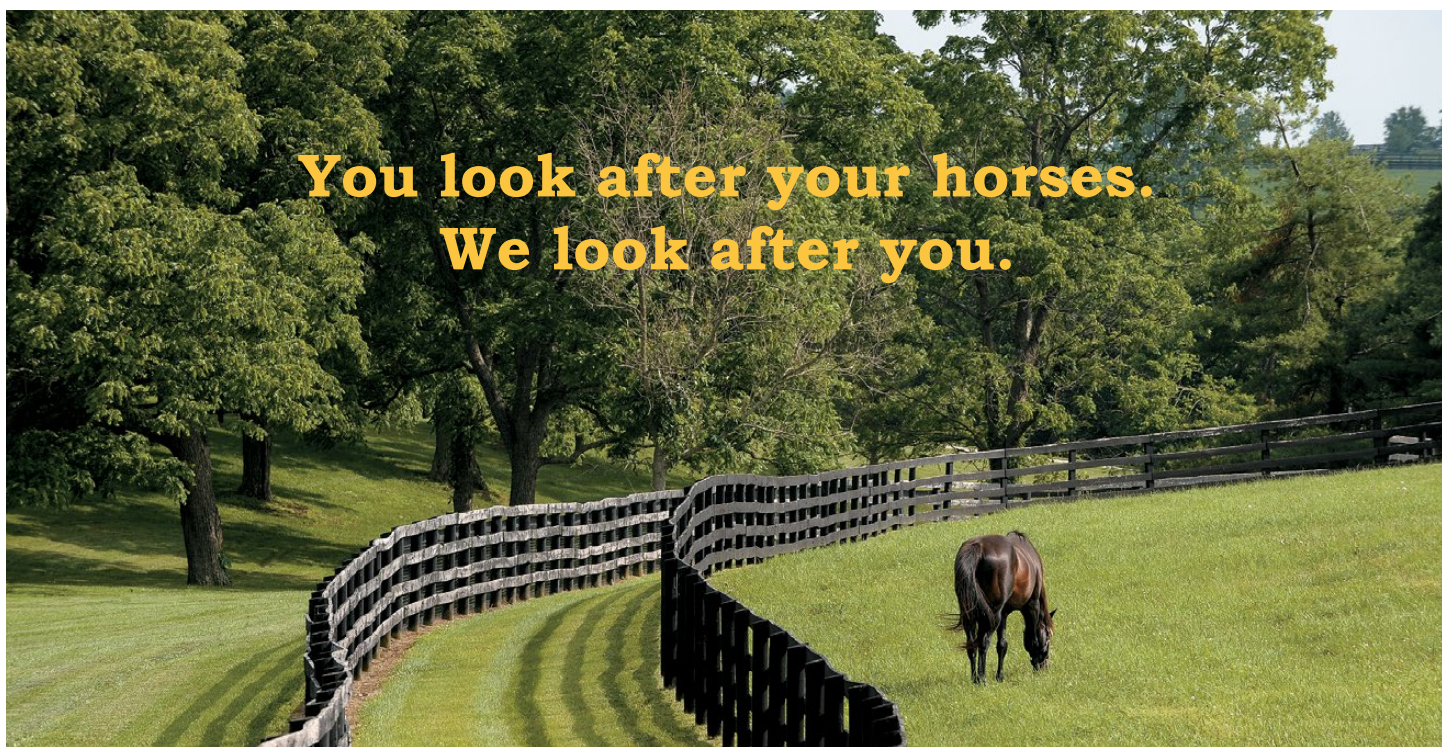
