BAFFERT DUO TARGETS LOS AL FUTURITY

Hall of Fame trainer Bob Baffert hit the jackpot with misspelled American Pharoah, and his 3-year-old star for 2016 could come with similarly odd names—perhaps Toews On Ice, named after Blackhawks captain Jonathan Toews, or Mor Spirit, shorted an "e" but not short on talent.

Both 2-year-olds look to step up Dec. 19 in the \$350,000 Los Alamitos Futurity (gr. I). Worth 10 points to the winner on the Road to the Kentucky Derby, the 1 1/16-mile test is in its second renewal at Los Alamitos after 33 runnings at Hollywood Park. Baffert has won a record seven editions, including last year with Dortmund.

Toews On Ice (post 4, Martin Garcia) has three stakes wins at three different tracks, including the Bob Hope Stakes (gr. III) at Del Mar. The Archrarcharch colt races beyond seven furlongs for the first time.

An Eskendereya ridgling, Mor Spirit (post 5, Gary Stevens) returns to California, having finished second in Churchill Downs' Kentucky Jockey Club Stakes (gr. II) at the Futurity distance. **BH**

LADY ELI BACK ON THE TRACK

The collaborative effort to return multiple grade I winner Lady Eli to the track following a serious bout with laminitis came to fruition Dec. 15 when the undefeated 3-year-old filly jogged at Palm Meadows Training Center in Florida.

"She went back to the track and started jogging and is doing well," trainer Chad Brown said. "We have always handled this in stages with realistic goals, and so far she has hit every one of them."

Bred in Kentucky by Runnymede Farm and Catesby Clay, Lady Eli races for Sheep Pond Partners, which bought the Divine Park filly for \$160,000 at the 2014 Keeneland April 2-year-olds in training sale. She has won six starts and earned \$1,449,800.

Brown said the filly's recovery is the result of a team effort, including veterinarians, farriers, podiatrists, his staff, and personnel at Dell Ridge Farm. "Through everyone's efforts, and most importantly Lady Eli's efforts to overcome it, so far we're in a great place," Brown said. **BH**

BETTER DRUG-TESTING PRACTICES SOUGHT

Racetracks and regulators are working to ensure drug-testing laboratories are not only capable of performing at a high level but asked to provide the

proper level of service.

At the recent Global Symposium on Racing and Gaming in Arizona, National Thoroughbred Racing Association Safety and Integrity Alliance executive director Steve Koch said the current code of standards requiring regulators to send samples to labs accredited by the Racing Medication and Testing Consortium has been updated to ensure contracts mandate the desired level of testing and that states conduct quality assurance programs.

RMTC executive director Dr. Dionne Benson noted the group has prepared a document to help states ensure they call for a proper level of testing when they formulate contracts with labs. Benson said in the nine months the document has been in place, several states negotiating new lab agreements have used it.

Koch said racetracks will be asked to work with their state regulatory agencies to ensure testing programs are at the proper standard. Laboratory accreditation is part of the National Uniform Medication Program. **BH**

TALENTED JUVENILES POINT TO MM CLASSIC

Interest is growing in the Aus\$2 million Magic Millions 2-Year-Old Classic, a race reserved for graduates of the renowned Magic Millions yearling sale. The 1,200-meter race (about six furlongs) is scheduled for Jan. 9, 2016, at the Gold Coast Turf Club.

Two serious contenders emerged last weekend when the exciting colt Sundance (I Am Invincible) won the Phelan Ready Stakes at Doomben and the undefeated Zelady's Night Out (Myboycharlie) won the filly equivalent, the Calaway Gal Stakes.

Sundance won by nearly five lengths, but the filly ran a faster time and has rocketed up the pre-post markets into second favoritism behind Capitalist (Written Tycoon), a dominant winner of the Breeders Plate in his career debut.

The Peter and Paul Snowden-trained Capitalist, who was given a short break immediately after that race, barrier trialed in explosive fashion at Rosehill

the week of Dec. 7 and looks poised to pick up where he left off in the \$200,000 Magic Millions Wyong 2-Year-Old Classic Dec. 17. The colt out of Kitalpha sold for Aus\$165,000 (\$133,287) at this year's Gold Coast auction. **BH**

TEXAS RACING ON COLLISION COURSE

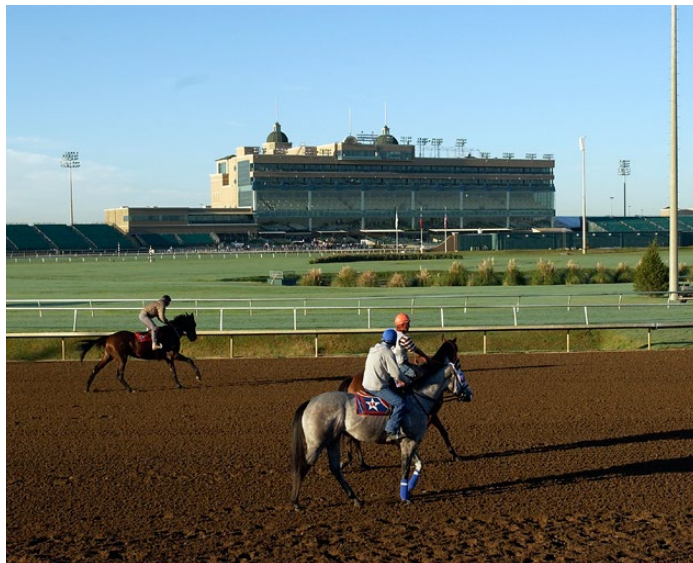
The Texas horse racing industry and the Texas legislature are on a high-speed collision course that could potentially devastate a \$5.5 billion industry.

After the Texas Racing Commission failed Dec. 15 to get a majority vote to repeal rules for implementing electronic gaming machines called historical racing, new commission chairman Rolando Pablos directed commission staff to prepare an agency shutdown plan.

"This vote will incense the legislature, and we won't know our plight until February (when temporary funding for the agency expires)," Pablos said. "Will we see another shutdown? Well, we already have, so the responsible thing to do is to operate as if it will."

Gov. Greg Abbott and Lt. Gov. Dan Patrick both believe the commission exceeded its authority in adopting rules for historical racing and directed commissioners to end the pursuit of alternative gaming. Horsemen contend historical racing is Texas' only hope to compete with racetrack casinos in surrounding states.

"Everyone has dug in their heels—on both sides—and that is very dangerous," Pablos said. **BH**

THROWBACK: A.P. INDY'S FUTURITY WIN

No one doubts the impact that Lane's End's pensioned 26-year-old A.P. Indy has made on the Thoroughbred industry. He was bred to do so, and his whole career from sale ring (a \$2.9 million Keeneland July purchase) to track to breeding shed has been about living up to expectations.

Twenty-four years ago the handsome product of Triple Crown winners Seattle Slew and Secretariat, through the mare Weekend Surprise, was a promising 2-year-old. When he entered the starting gate for the 11th running of the Hollywood Futurity (gr. I), he was undefeated in two starts.

Facing 13 stakes-caliber rivals for the first time, he proved his mettle, winning by a neck and becoming a contender for the following year's classics.

Scratched from the Kentucky Derby (gr. I) the morning of the race, A.P. Indy returned to win the Belmont Stakes (gr. I) and added the Breeders' Cup Classic (gr. I) on his way to Horse of the Year. Twice U.S. leading stallion, A.P. Indy has sired 169 stakes winners, seven from his final crop. **BH**

BEWARE OF POLITICAL CORRECTNESS

After two uninspiring outings at Turfway Park in the winter of 1998, Bluegrass Warrior was retired at age 13. A local marathon specialist with three track records at distances from 1 5/8 miles to two miles, the Navajo gelding raced 125 times, won 21 races, and earned \$231,533.

Trained his entire career by Joanie Cook, Bluegrass Warrior spent his final 10 years at a local farm, just being a well-cared-for horse. He died of an aneurysm while running around the paddock at age 23 while Cook was there for one of her visits.

In a story written about the gelding in the mid-1990s, Cook explained Bluegrass Warrior had a preference for racing on surfaces with a hard base. "He likes to hear his bones rattle," she said.

Most horsemen and racing fans would find that humorous. But 20 years later, with political correctness running amok, how would that comment be interpreted? Would there be attacks by animal rights' groups and pressure for what was an old but sound racehorse to be retired?

Society has changed, but the fact the overwhelming majority of people entrusted with racehorses care about them and treat them well hasn't. It just doesn't get much attention in an environment polluted by other agendas.

When the New York State Gaming Commission released its findings in late November in the drawn-out case involving an "undercover investigation" of trainer Steve Asmussen by the People for the Ethical Treatment of Animals, the regulatory agency thanked the animal rights' group for bringing about changes to make Thoroughbred racing safer and fairer. I respectfully disagree with that assessment.

First, the racing industry shouldn't need PETA or any other similar organization to identify the need for reforms. In fact, as far as equine medication goes, much has been accomplished the past three years. Second, the PETA investigation, which produced little

of substance, damaged lives.

Over the past 10 years Thoroughbred racing has made substantial progress in equine care, both on and off the track. The aftercare movement, which started with a handful of committed people, has become a major force as evidenced by the umbrella Thoroughbred Aftercare Association and its accreditation program; racetrack-based retirement programs funded by horsemen and tracks; support for aftercare by stallion farms; the Thoroughbred Incentive Program, which rewards former racehorses that move to other disciplines; and the Retired Racehorse Project, to name a few.

There's a lot of good, all of it tied to the horse, going on in this industry. It's incumbent upon the stakeholders to educate the non-racing public about these programs, drive home the message that racehorses—no matter the level of competition—are cared for and their health closely monitored, and expose and sanction those found to have neglected, abused, or illegally drugged horses.

Be proactive, educate, and fight for horse racing. Don't throw it under the bus by allowing others to dictate the message and agenda. **BH**
