BLINKERS ON OR OFF FOR 'CHROME'?

alifornia Chrome recorded his penultimate breeze in preparation for the Jan. 9 San Pasqual Stakes (gr. II), but the question moving forward appears to be how he reacts to racing without blinkers.

To prepare, trainer Art Sherman worked the 2014 Horse of the Year in company for the first time in his career at Los Alamitos Dec. 27 with jockey Victor Espinoza aboard, and the Lucky Pulpit colt covered seven furlongs in 1:25 2/5. Since his October return to the Sherman barn, every workout has been without blinkers.

"I worked him in company because I'm going to try him without blinkers now," Sherman said. "This is a new thing for him and I figure, without the blinkers, he'll be able to see horses coming up on him. He's more focused as an older horse, and I really don't think he needs the blinkers."

But Espinoza wasn't sold on the switch after the Sunday work. Asked whether he would recommend putting the blinkers back on for the San Pasqual, Espinoza said, "I think so."

The San Pasqual at Santa Anita Park is for 4-yearolds and up at 1 1/16 miles. BH

ender Agenda, fifth behind the victorious lacksquare Stormy Lucy in the Matriarch Stakes (gr. IT), turned the tables in the Robert J. Frankel Stakes (gr. IIIT) Dec. 27 at Santa Anita Park.

Owned by Keith Brackpool, Alon Ossip, and Tim Ritvo—all employed by The Stronach Group, which owns Santa Anita—Gender Agenda grabbed a narrow lead nearing the finish of the 1 1/8-mile stakes for fillies and mares and held off a fast-closing Stormy Lucy. Glory, the favorite and early leader, just failed to hold off the top two.

It was the first stakes victory for the 4-year-old Holy Roman Emperor filly bred in Great Britain by Middle Park Stud and her first race beyond one mile. Trainer Carla Gaines had considered a 6 1/2-furlong turf stakes in early January but took a gamble that paid off.

"She likes to gallop along close to the front," Gaines said. "I just told (jockey Rafael Bejarano) to nurse her along. It worked out."

Before the Matriarch, Gender Agenda finished third in the grade II Goldikova Stakes on turf. BH

GOLD ACTOR UPSETS IN ARIMA KINEN

avored Gold Ship was upstaged in his career finale when 17-1 longshot Gold Actor captured his first group I in the Dec. 27 Arima Kinen at Nakayama Racecourse, staying unbeaten in four starts this year.

The 2,500-meter (about 1 9/16-miles) Arima Kinen is deemed Japan's all-star racing event, with fans voting to determine their top 10 runners for the race. Gold Ship, the 2012 Arima Kinen winner, garnered the most votes in his bid for a seventh group I triumph in his final start, but finished eighth.

Nearing the home turn, Gold Actor moved to third along the rail with Gold Ship to his outside. When jockey Hayato Yoshida gave the cue, the son of Screen Hero lengthened stride in the final furlong while his rival failed to rally, overtook pacesetter Kitasan Black, and held off charging Sounds of Earth for a neck win.

Kitasan Black, winner of the Kikuka Sho (Jpn-I, Japanese St. Leger) last time out, stayed on for third. BH

SUDDEN SURPRISE KEEPS ROLLING IN NY

ew York sire Giant Surprise is having a very good year, much of it stemming from his 2-year-old son Sudden Surprise, who won the Great White Way

division of the New York Stallion Stakes Dec. 27 at Aqueduct.

Regular jockey John Velazquez made a rare December appearance to ride Repole Stable's Sudden Surprise to his fourth New York-bred stakes win and fifth victory in six starts.

Repole Stable bred Sudden Surprise out of the More Than Ready mare Ready and Good and also raced and owns Giant Surprise (Giant's Causeway—Twisted Sis, by A.P. Indy), who stands at Rockridge Stud. From 11 runners this year, the stallion has four winners and ranks second on the 2-year-old sire list behind Freud.

Byron Hughes, assistant to trainer Todd Pletcher, indicated he was impressed with Sudden Surprise's gritty victory over Dr. Shane in 1:11.38 for six furlongs. "The track has been playing a little slow, so I thought the time was pretty good," Hughes said. "We'll see how he comes out of it, but we'll keep him on the New York-bred trail." BH

KING'S THEATRE HAS ANOTHER BIG SEASON

/ing's Theatre looks well on course to be the leading British and Irish National Hunt sire by prize money for the fourth successive season after his flag-bearer Cue Card won his second group I steeplechase of the season, the King George VI Chase at Kempton Dec. 26.

The late King's Theatre, a son of Sadler's Wells who won the 1994 King George VI and Queen Elizabeth Diamond Stakes (Eng-I), also sired this season's group II Navan Novice Hurdle winner Bellshill and group II novice chase winner Junction Fourteen.

Owned by Godolphin, King's Theatre raced in the U.S. five times in 1995. He finished third in Saratoga's Sword Dancer Invitational (gr. IT).

Having won the group I Betfair Chase and now the King George VI Chase, the Colin Tizzard-trained Cue Card is eligible to win the Jockey Club Racecourses inaugural £1 million bonus should he also win the group I Cheltenham Gold Cup Chase in March to complete the big chase "triple crown" in the same racing season. BH

A TALE OF TWO MARKETS

s pari-mutuel wagering in the United States has plunged since 2003, a growing reliance on gaming subsidies has saved purses from the same fate.

The Thoroughbred Racing Associations found that in 2013 gaming appropriations constituted 35.5% of purses, compared with 14.2% in 2003. Blood-Horse recently reported that without gaming contributions, purses in 2013 would have been comparable to 1994 payouts.

Elected officials in casino states have increasingly begun to question why purse supports are justified and, in some cases, such as West Virginia, gaming allocations to purses have been cut. In other venues, notably Delaware, new gaming competition from bordering states has taken a toll on indigenous casino business and purses.

There is a disconnect between what has been occurring at racetracks pertaining to imperiled purse subsidies and auction price trends for Thoroughbred bloodstock. Gross, average, and median prices for racing and breeding stock over the past several years don't seem to reflect the precarious situation racing faces at the retail level. Since the global economy began to recover from the financial crisis of 2008-09, U.S. bloodstock prices at the major sales have generally shown year-over-year increases in nominal dollars or remained about the same in real dollars.

A closer examination of auction prices reveals a bifurcated market. To illustrate, while 2,575 horses were sold at the 2015 Keeneland November breeding stock sale, the 21 hips that each fetched prices in excess of \$1 million accounted for nearly 18% of the gross auction revenue. Subtract their combined prices from total auction revenue

and the sale average declines by 17.2%, from \$85,033 to \$70,432.

Wes Cowan, an auctioneer and appraiser on PBS's popular "Antiques Roadshow," explained how antique buyers have become ever more discerning in terms of what items they seek. As a result, Cowan and other experts no longer refer to the demand for antiques as a dichotomy between the "best and the rest." Instead, they now speak of the demarcation between the "very best and the rest."

The same can be said of the Thoroughbred bloodstock market.

Horse racing and breeding has always been an admixture of sporting venture and business proposition. This is why a small number of buyers are motivated to spend millions of dollars in the hopes of breeding or purchasing a classic winner—almost irrespective of anticipated purse levels—whereas the vast majority of buyers take a more commercial view, based on underlying economic fundamentals.

A sustainable racing industry requires compelling incentives for both types of buyers, encompassing psychic rewards and attractive purse levels that drive demand. BH
