Burning Roma won stakes races in five seasons and has passed on his durability to his progeny

BURNING ROMA THROWING DURABLE HORSES

Florida-based Burning Roma is passing his toughness as a racehorse onto his racetrack progeny, an annual list ranking the durability of a stallion's produce shows.

Among active stallions, Burning Roma ranks best by starts per runner at 23.39 on the 2015 list, one of a number published by Grayson-Jockey Club Research Foundation that spotlight commercially viable stallions performing well in soundness and durability categories (see table on page 3).

Burning Roma, who stands for \$6,000 at Richard Haisfield's Prestige Stallions near Ocala, Fla., ranks second overall to pensioned Catienus.

Durability figures for Burning Roma, who won at least one stakes race in each of the five seasons he raced and registered a 13-5-7 record from 36 starts. The grade I-winning son of champion sprinter Rubiano boasts 70% winners from horses of racing age, including five stakes winners led by grade I winner Sheer Drama.

"He's 18-years-old but looks like a 10-year-old," Haisfield said. "It's amazing. We're looking for a very, very nice year from him as the sire of Sheer Drama... Besides the toughness, which is good, his conformation is flawless." **BH**

DOMINGUEZ GETS EARLY HALL OF FAME CHANCE

Three-time Eclipse Award-winning jockey Ramon Dominguez has been given an early chance to be considered for the Hall of Fame after injury forced his premature retirement.

Dominguez won the Eclipse Award for outstanding jockey in 2010, 2011, and 2012 after leading all other North American riders in earnings in each year.

But the native of Caracas, Venezuela retired in June 2013 following a career-ending injury at Aqueduct Racetrack in January of that year.

Normally jockeys need to satisfy a 20-year North American license requirement to be considered for the Hall of Fame. If they don't meet the criterion they usually must wait five calendar years for consideration.

But Hall of Fame nominating committee chairman Edward L. Bowen said Dominguez would have become eligible in 2015 but for the injury.

"This is an appropriate use of the discretion given to the executive committee," Bowen said. Dominguez had 4,985 career wins, ranking him 32nd on the all-time list. His career earnings of \$191,620,277 have him 17th on the all-time list. **BH**



SALE SUCCESS FOR 'BIG FISH IN LITTLE POND'

O ne of the success stories at the two-day Fasig-Tipton Kentucky winter mixed sale that concluded Feb. 9 was the consignment from breeder Paul Tackett, whose five horses sold from as many offered totaled \$299,000.

Tackett's median of \$67,000 was the highest for any consignor with at least five sold. His sales included Blue Venus, a 6-year-old Giant's Causeway mare bought by Mulholland Springs for \$82,000, and Skinner Box, a Freud filly bought by Spendthrift Farm for \$80,000.

"I had some broodmare prospects that all had some upside to them," Tackett said. "The families were good; they had half sisters and brothers by the likes of The Factor and Smart Strike and Paynter, and there was quite a bit going on... I just felt like all those fillies had an upside."

Among the successes for Tackett, a small breeder with 11 broodmares on his 85-acre Fair Hill Farm near Georgetown, Ky., have been Alcibiades (gr. I) winner My Conquestadory, grade III winner Devine Wind, and Whomsoever Proud, who won seven stakes from 1993-97.


"I raise them like I'm going to race them, and I don't handicap these horses when they're young," he said. "I raise enough good horses it keeps my mares popular."

In addition to limitations on how much he can spend for mares and stud fees, Tackett is careful in placing his horses in sales, which is why the Fasig-Tipton winter mixed auction appeals to him.

"I have sold at Keeneland since the 1960s and I like selling there, but if (mares sold at Fasig-Tipton) were in the November sale at Keeneland, they would be run of the mill and not stand out. I've always realized I'm a small fish in a small pond and if I get in a bigger pond, those bigger fish are going to eat me up. I understand where I belong."

Tackett said he had somewhat of an advantage over many other consignors because he owns all the horses in his consignment, allowing him the flexibility to set reserves as he goes.

"All of these horses belong to me and it's my own money," he said. "I try to sell one horse at a time. After the first horse sells, I go set the reserve on the next one. After I sell that one, I go set the reserve on the next one. Depending on how I'm doing, I either raise or lower my reserve. To get five sold, I think I'm doing pretty well." **BH**

TOO BALD TAKES FRITCHIE DOUBLE

oo Bald was one very fast filly for Capt. Harry Guggenheim's Cain Hoy Stable.

A Cain Hoy homebred top and bottom, the dark bay was a daughter of Bald Eagle, 1960's champion older horse after winning his second consecutive Washington, D.C., International Stakes.

Her dam, Kentucky Oaks winner Hidden Talent, was a daughter of Guggenheim's Dark Star, who marred Native Dancer's perfect record by defeating the "Grey Ghost" in the Kentucky Derby.

Too Bald won four stakes in the Cain Hoy colors, including back-to-back editions of the Barbara Fritchie Handicap, which celebrates its 65th renewal at Laurel Park this weekend. Her six-length victory in 1968 equaled the existing stakes record of 1:21 4/5 for the seven furlongs.

In 1969 she topped the Keeneland November sale in foal to Turn-to, selling for \$225,000.

Her broodmare record is filled with all-caps black type: juvenile champion male Capote (Seattle Slew), multiple grade I millionaire Exceller (Vaguely Noble), excellent sire Baldski (Nijinsky II), graded winner Vaguely Hidden (Vaguely Noble), and American Standard (In Reality). **BH**

EXTREME CHOICE NEW BLUE DIAMOND FAVORITE

Australia's first juvenile group I of the season, the Blue Diamond Stakes (1,200 meters, about six furlongs) at Caulfield is less than 2 1/2 weeks away.

Staking a serious claim Feb. 6 was Extreme Choice (Not A Single Doubt), who utterly dominated the 1,000-meter (about five furlongs) Chairman's Stakes (Aus-III).

Prepared by Mick Price, the unbeaten colt won by 4 1/2 lengths in fast time and has been elevated to Blue Diamond favoritism.

An Aus\$100,000 (\$77,970) purchase from last year's Inglis Classic Yearling Sale—which returned phenomenally good results earlier this week—Extreme Choice is a grandson of Canadian stakes winner Going to Extremes.

The 1,100-meter (about 5 1/2 furlongs) Blue Diamond preludes (both group races) will be run Feb. 13 and key runners include star fillies Calliope (Exceed And

Excel) and Zamzam (Redoute's Choice) as well as promising colts Star Turn (Star Witness) and Defcon (Choisir).

The 2015 Blue Diamond winner, Pride Of Dubai (Street Cry), was retired this week and will stand at Coolmore. **BH**







Average field sizes are trending up and could account for a slight bump in January wagering

HORSES PER RACE TRENDING UP

The first month of 2016 was productive from the economic indicators standpoint. Total pari-mutuel handle rose 2.2% from January 2015 even though U.S. race days, number of races, and number of starts were down year-over-year.

Average January field size for 2,392 races was 8.46, according to the Thoroughbred Racing Economic Indicators produced by Equibase. That's a modest increase of 1.8% from 8.31 in January of last year.

There were 25 fewer race days this January, and almost half can be attributed to Parx Racing being dark the whole month as part of a schedule readjustment. There were 25 full-card cancellations versus 27 in January 2015.

Field size arguably played a role in the slight bump in wagering. Average handle per race in January was \$347,210, up 8.8% from \$319,034 last year.

One month does not a year make, but the January 2016 field size figure was up 7.7% from all of 2015's at 7.85. Last year's average field size rose 1.8% from 7.71 in 2014.

Based on Equibase statistics, the leader by field size for a regular pari-mutuel meet in 2015 was Kentucky Downs at 10.60 horses per race over a five-day meet with all races on turf. Revenue from historical racing machines also made Kentucky Downs the leader by average daily purses at \$1,313,091.

Meadowlands in New Jersey placed second at 9.90 horses per race over 10 days—all the races were on the grass. Of tracks that offer racing on dirt, Oaklawn Park led the way with 9.36. The top track with a synthetic surface was Turfway Park in Kentucky with 8.81 horses per race over 52 programs.

Though the Thoroughbred foal crop has leveled off the past two years, the impact of the steep decline from 2008 to 2011 will be felt for years. The industry has made some adjustments by reducing the number of racing days to compensate for having less stock while also preserving purse levels.

During a panel discussion at the recent National Horsemen's Benevolent and Protective Association winter convention, it was stated that, for the most part, bettors would prefer a seven-race card with 10 horses per race versus a 10-race card with seven horses per race.

Owners and trainers, however, may think differently. They noted that racetracks, in an effort to maximize field size and handle, are increasingly using substitute races rather than primary races listed in condition books. Horsemen said it's becoming harder to map out race schedules or get horses into races. BH


