## TEPIN, LEXIE LOU MEET ON TAMPA TURF

Tepin, 2015's champion turf female, will face a stablemate when she begins her season in the Endeavour Stakes (gr. IIIT) at Tampa Bay Downs Feb. 13.

Tepin (Bernstein), who won five races last year including the Breeders' Cup Mile (gr. IT) versus males, will take on fellow Mark Casse-trainee Lexie Lou, who makes her second start after a one-year layoff.

Robert Masterson's Tepin has been working regularly at Palm Meadows Training Center. She hasn't raced at Tampa but won on five different turf courses last year.

"She is the same Tepin we saw last year, and we're expecting big things from her again," Casse said.

Gary Barber's Lexie Lou (Sligo Bay), the 2014 Canadian Horse of the Year and champion 3-year-old filly, was scheduled to return last summer but was sidelined with an eye injury.

She resurfaced Jan. 13 at Tampa Bay with a useful third-place finish in a one-mile allowance race, and has since worked five furlongs on the grass at Winding Oaks Farm in Ocala, Fla.

Also entered in the seven-horse field is Teresa Viola Racing Stables' Photo Call, fifth in the 2015 Breeders' Cup Filly & Mare Turf (gr. IT). **BH**

## TEXAS WILL RACE THROUGH FEBRUARY

Texas racetracks will operate at least through the end of February, but beyond that the future is far from clear.

Last month Texas Racing Commission executive director Chuck Trout declared live racing and simulcasting would stop Feb. 16.

He issued the directive after commission chairman Rolando Pablos told him to prepare a shut-down plan for the agency and the racing industry.

The commission is in a political maelstrom with state legislative leaders over the agency's adoption of rules allowing electronic gambling machines also called historical racing machines.

Because the rules have not been repealed, the commission could lose its operating funds at the end of the month.

Trout rescinded the Feb. 16 shutdown in a Feb. 11 memo. Representatives of Sam Houston Race Park, now running its Thoroughbred meet, and other racing industry leaders had appealed to Trout to keep racing going. The new shutdown date is March 1.

"The industry should take into consideration that, if the agency closes, it will not thereafter be able to release any purses until and unless it reopens," Trout's memo stated. **BH**

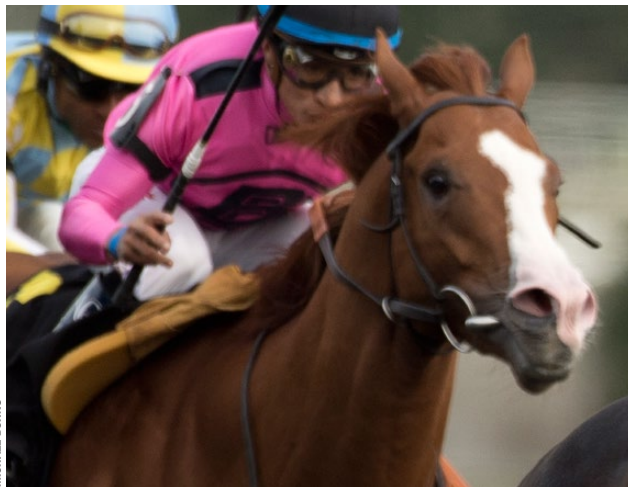

## SYNTHETIC PATH TO DERBY STILL POSSIBLE

While the 2016 Road to the Kentucky Derby by schedule includes only three points races contested on synthetic surfaces, those races are spread out enough to allow a horse to take that path to the Louisville classic.

**Kasseopia could follow Animal Kingdom and stay away from dirt on the road to the Kentucky Derby**

Enter Team Valor International and Gary Baber's promising Kasseopia, who could do just that, according to Team Valor chief executive officer Barry Irwin.

In his North American debut Kasseopia finished second in last year's Grey Stakes (Can-III) at Woodbine, the first 2016 Road to the Kentucky Derby points race offered on a synthetic surface.

He is entered in the second, the Feb. 13 El Camino Real Derby (gr. III) at Golden Gate Fields (also a 10-4-2-1 points race). And if he runs well Saturday, the son of Showcasing would be considered for a start in the April 2 Spiral Stakes (gr. III) on Turfway Park's Polytrack (a 50-20-10-5 points race).

Kasseopia also marks the return of Graham Motion as a trainer for Team Valor.

## The Road

**An in-depth look at horses targeting Triple Crown races**

Team Valor and Motion won the Kentucky Derby Presented by Yum! Brands (gr. I) in 2011 with Animal Kingdom, who made his dirt debut in the Louisville classic after making his first four starts on synthetic and turf surfaces. He punched his Derby ticket with a win in the Spiral at Turfway and a strong six-furlong, pre-Derby work on Churchill's main track.

Kasseopia began his career in England, where he raced on turf and all-weather surfaces three times before being purchased by his current owners to race in North America. Motion said he considered starting Kasseopia on dirt at Gulfstream Park, but he liked the timing of the El Camino Real Derby.

Hollywood Park's closing, and the return to dirt from synthetic surfaces at Meydan, Santa Anita Park, and Keeneland, have reduced the number of Road to the Kentucky Derby prep races offered on synthetic surfaces. Meydan, Santa Anita, and Keeneland between them stage 10 races on dirt worth points toward the 2016 Derby. **BH**

## POLAR RIVER, MARKET RALLY ROLL IN DUBAI

A return to the United States is a possibility for UAE star Polar River after she kept her perfect record intact with an impressive 13-length rout in the One Thousand Guineas on Meydan's Feb. 11 card.

Valentin Bukhtoyarov and Evgeny Kappushev's Polar River posted her third victory in as many starts while again defeating Godolphin's group II-winning Promising Run (Hard Spun), who finished second to Polar River in the UAE Guineas Trial.

Next up for the Kentucky-bred daughter of Congrats: the UAE Oaks (UAE-III) March 3, with a victory there possibly securing an invitation to the UAE Derby (UAE-II) on the March 26 World Cup card and perhaps a trip to the United States and a matchup with 2-year-old filly champion Songbird.

"She was very impressive," trainer Doug Watson said. "I would love to bring her to America. I watched Songbird; it would be a huge task."

Bred by Bob McCann, Mark Kelder, and Doug Richards, Polar River was purchased by Watkins Bloodstock for \$40,000 at last year's Ocala Breeders' Sales Co.'s April 2-year-olds in training sale; she had been bought by Eisman Equine from Pope McLean's 2014 Keeneland September yearling sale consignment for \$25,000.

Polar River's time of 1:37.09 for the mile on dirt bettered Market Rally's 1:38.08 Two Thousand Guineas (UAE-II) win at the same dis-

tance, in which the 3-year-old son of Unbridled's Song was untested in a front-running six-length victory.

"Making the running was not actually the plan," said Market Rally's jockey Chris Hayes. "He was fractious in the stalls though, and I was worried we might miss the break and did not want that to happen."

Trained by Dhruba Selvaratnam for Sheikh Ahmed bin Rashid Al Maktoum, Market Rally was making his second start in Dubai; the colt had run fourth in the Two Thousand Guineas Trial. He will also be pointed toward the UAE Derby.

Bred in Kentucky by Ashview Farm, Colts Neck Farm, and the Unbridled's Song syndicate, Market Rally was purchased for \$210,000 by Ben Glass, racing manager for Gary and Mary West, from Ashview's draft to the 2014 Keeneland September yearling sale.

In his lone start for the Wests and trainer Wayne Catalano, the colt was an easy 4 3/4-length maiden winner at Monmouth Park last August before re-emerging in Dubai in January with new connections. **BH**

## FOREIGN JOCKEYS SET RECORD PACE IN JAPAN

Two foreigners—Frenchman Christophe Lemaire and Italian Mirco Demuro—are tied for the top spot for Japan's leading jockey as of Feb. 11 at a record-setting pace, with 22 wins.

So far this year the Japan Racing Association has held 30 race days out of 288. If they keep up their current pace, both Lemaire and Demuro could potentially win 211 races by year's end.

In 2005 Yutaka Take won 212 races in one season, a feat that has not been replicated. However, if Lemaire and Demuro remain consistent, it is quite possible that these foreigners could break the Japanese record.

The JRA amended regulations on jockey licensing in 2015, which made it possible for non-Japanese riders to apply for a year-round, full-term license. Although not a first, this was seen as a historic turning point in Japanese racing.

On Feb. 5 of that year, Lemaire and Demuro were the first granted full-term licensure and

both started riding in March.

Following this pair's exploits through the rest of the year will certainly be interesting. **BH**

## MARKETWATCH INTERVIEW: BILL FARISH

Bill Farish: Demand is solid for the 2016 season, but breeders are favoring young, commercially attractive sires

**T**his week's MarketWatch interview is with Bill Farish, one of the principals of Lane's End Farm, a leading Central Kentucky stallion operation near Versailles, and chairman of the Breeders' Cup board of directors.

**MarketWatch:** How would you assess the health of the Kentucky breeding industry?

**Bill Farish:** The health of the breeding industry in Central Kentucky seems pretty good. The Jockey Club's numbers of mares bred report has bottomed and is trending slightly up. The numbers of mares boarded at our farm are as high as they have ever been, and we are very happy with how our stallions are booking up. I'm very aware that it is not

as good everywhere, but we are seeing some positive signs.

**MW:** With the breeding season upon us, what is your impression of the level of interest from broodmare owners for 2016?

**BF:** With the backdrop of a very large number of new stallions for 2016, and more than double the number of stud fees in excess of \$100,000 from 2015 to 2016, it appears clear that some fees might have gotten a bit ahead of the market. As is often the case, the very hot stallions have filled up quickly, and the more mature, slightly less sexy ones have taken a little more time to fill. Overall, we have seen solid demand.

**MW:** Three of the best older horses from 2015 are joining your stallion ranks: Honor Code, Liam's Map, and Tonalist. How has the interest been in them—and in your other first-season sire, Mr Speaker—compared to your more established stallions?

**BF:** The demand for seasons in all four of our first-year stallions has been very gratifying. We generally like to target a book size in the 140 mare range for our first-year horses and all four should be right around that number. Honor Code and Liam's Map got a bit of a jump on Tonalist, as Tonalist didn't retire until after his Cigar Mile (gr. I) victory, but things have evened out. The response to Mr Speaker has also been very strong.

**MW:** Are there any new trends noticeable with breeders for 2016?

**BF:** The major trend that we are seeing is not new. Breeders continue to flock to young, commercially attractive stallions, often at the expense of proven successful sires. This has been the case for quite some time, but I feel it's been exaggerated in 2016 with the big jump of some of the high-end stud fees. **BH**

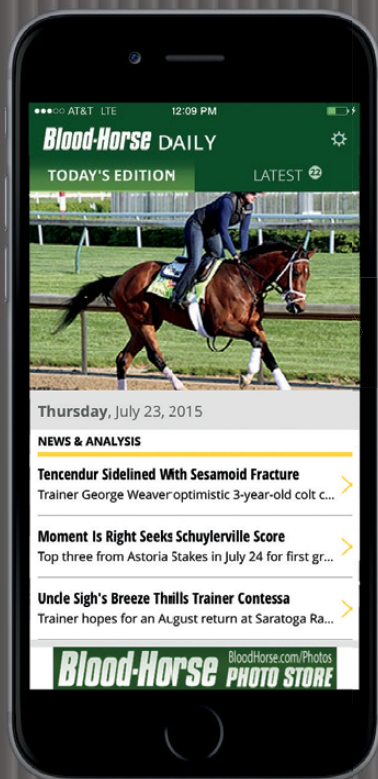
