



MCCAFFREY: HORSEMEN, TRACKS HAVE **MUTUAL NEED**

he new executive director of the Illinois Thoroughbred Horsemen's Association, David McCaffrey, says horsemen and tracks must negotiate while realizing how important they are to each other.

Illinois racetracks and the ITHA have been at odds over a number of issues, as they deal with problems including falling purses, a state budget deadlock, and a lack of slot machine income.

Against this backdrop the ITHA has appointed McCaffrey, a horseman involved with the Illinois Harness Horsemen's Association for many years.

"Call me crazy, but I happen to think racetracks

and horsemen need each other," he said. "We need each other to satisfy each other's businesses."

He said the ITHA should look at trying to limit "recapture," a regulation allowing tracks to compensate for revenue losses by appropriating funds allocated to purse accounts.

"The harness side is on the brink of absolute collapse because of recapture,

and the Thoroughbred side is not too far behind."

McCaffrey says Illinois purses have been on a downward spiral the past decade and the industry badly needs legislation authorizing slot machines at tracks. BH

RISEN STAR HAS MO-MENTUM

Racegoers may be used to seeing sons of Galileo routinely flood the starting gate in Irish stakes races, but there's a rarity Saturday at Fair Grounds Race Course & Slots when four—count 'em four—3-year-old sons of Uncle Mo are entered in the Risen Star (gr. II).

In addition, Shaken, an Uncle Mo filly, is set to break from the rail in the female counterpart, the grade II Rachel Alexandra.

Uncle Mo, Ashford Stud's runaway leading first-crop and juvenile sire of 2015, has seven stakes winners in his first crop, including male champion Nyquist and Risen Star 3-1 morning-line second choice Mo Tom.

Free of Mr. Prospector, Uncle Mo has Northern Dancer 5x5x4 through five generations, so it is no surprise to see Mr. P in four of the five pedigrees of his Fair Grounds stakes starters.

Both Mo Tom and Uncle Walter have Caro in their female families, mirroring Uncle Mo's greatgreat-grandsire. Shaken and stakes-winning Risen Star runner Forevamo have Seattle Slew close up in their female families. **BH**

OAKLAWN SEES BENEFITS OF GOOD WEATHER

wners racing horses at Oaklawn Park are set to reap the benefit of a great meet for the Arkansas track.

Good weather and large fields boosted betting at Oaklawn Park to a level where the track has raised purses for the remainder of its 2016 meet.

Three stakes get \$50,000 boosts: The Honeybee Stakes (gr. III) will go to \$200,000 while the Razorback (gr. III) and Azeri (gr. II), both on the March 19 Rebel Stakes (gr. II) undercard, have been raised to \$350,000.

The Rebel card will be worth nearly \$2 million, making it the second-richest day for Oaklawn behind Arkansas Derby day, April 16.

Allowance races have been increased to a minimum of \$74,000, and maiden allowances to \$70,000. The minimum purse is \$21,500.

The \$70,000 maiden allowance purse compares favorably nationally. Open maiden special weight races at present have purses up to \$60,000 at Aqueduct Racetrack, \$56,000 at Santa Anita Park, and \$50,000 at Gulfstream Park.

"From day one Oaklawn has benefitted from great weather, and, more importantly, the quality of our races has been tremendous, with a lot of full fields," said director of racing David Longinotti. **BH**

BUENA VISTA PRODUCES TOP BROODMARES

ew races have produced as many high-class broodmares among its winners than the Buena Vista Stakes (gr. IIT) at Santa Anita Park Feb. 20—and few were better than 2004 winner Fun House.

The 5-year-old was best of a seven-horse field, winning by 2 3/4 lengths under Gary Stevens.

Bred by Verne H. Winchell in Kentucky and owned by Winchell Thoroughbreds, Fun House is a daughter of Prized out of Bistra, a Winchell-bred mare by their homebred Classic Go Go and out of their foundation mare Carols Christmas.

As a broodmare, Fun House is carrying on Carols Christmas' blue-hen tradition with two grade I-winning millionaires from five foals to race: Paddy O'Prado (El Prado) with \$1,721,297, and champion 3-year-old filly Untapable (Tapit) \$3,816,725.

In addition to Fun House, winners of the Buena Vista, first run in 1988, historically have done well as broodmares.

Of 20 winners to have foals of racing age, 10 have produced first-generation stakes horses, including Gold Fleece, Dance Parade, Blue Moon, Skimble, Media Nox, and Jibboom, all with graded stakes-winning offspring. The last three named are Juddmonte Farms homebreds. BH

ANOTHER EL PRADO MAKES AUSTRALIAN MARK

edaglia d'Oro is not the only son of El Prado making an impression in Australia. Last weekend the spotlight shone on Breeders Cup Mile (gr. IT) winner Artie Schiller, sire of the exciting colt Flying Artie.

The Mick Price-trained 2-year-old zoomed to second favoritism for the Blue Diamond Stakes (Aus-I) Feb. 27 behind stablemate Extreme Choice (Not A Single Doubt) with a powerful win in the Blue Diamond Prelude (Aus-III), his second start.


Free of Danzig blood, Flying Artie is out of stakes winner Flying Ruby, who comes from the family of Australian Horse of the Year, Better Loosen Up.

New Zealand-bred 5-year-old mare Suavito (Thorn Park) captured the 1,400-meter C.F. Orr Stakes (Aus-I) at Caulfield Feb. 13, but her win was overshadowed by the performance of Cox Plate winner Winx (Street

STATUS QUO NOT OPTION IN FLORIDA?

It took more than 90 minutes of a two-hour Florida senate committee meeting for the pari-mutuel racing industry to get this message: Change is coming, and it's on you to make the most of it.

The Florida Senate Regulated Industries Committee passed two major pieces of legislation Feb. 17—one that authorizes the state to enter into a \$3 billion compact with the Seminole tribe, which operates seven casinos in the state, and another that could change the racing landscape by allowing most tracks to decide whether

to offer live racing.

The tracks permitted to "decouple" under the bill are those that offer greyhound, Standardbred, and Quarter Horse racing, as well as jai alai frontons. Sen. Joe Negron noted a "summer Thoroughbred permit" also would be decoupled, later acknowledging reference to

the Calder license; owner Churchill Downs Inc. has been leasing its minimum number of 40

Negron said there are provisions in an amendment—it passed the committee—for the Seminoles to supplement purses by \$20 million a year, as well as for \$25 million a year for a "purse pool" funded by revenue from decoupled pari-mutuel facilities.

days to Gulfstream Park for the past two years.

United Florida Horsemen has opposed any form of decoupling. Florida lawmakers, however, appear headed in another direction.

"We have generous purse pools that frankly are coming from people involved in another

activity," Negron said during the committee meeting. "We're taking money from them to subsidize people that want to race and raise horses. We've bent over backward to accommodate their interests."

Negron said current pari-mutuel law is "outdated and arbitrary," and that businesses should be allowed to decide how they operate. If they want to offer live racing even though decoupling is permitted, they can, he said.

"There's nothing in this bill that stops greyhound racing from continuing," Negron said. "Some folks in greyhound racing, despite decoupling, are going to continue racing."

> Palm Beach Kennel Club, which at times has total pari-mutuel handle of \$600,000 on a Monday afternoon program of dog racing, could be one track opting to continue. And under the bill, it's one of several facilities allowed to add slot machines.

It's pretty safe that Gulfstream Park and Tampa Bay

Downs have every intention of continuing their regular Thoroughbred meets. But an uneasiness—particularly in the racing and breeding sector—remains over the proposed changes in law. It appears they may just have to accept it; some already have.

"We recognize and appreciate the efforts of the amendment to promote live racing and support its purse structure," Tom Ventura, president of the Ocala Breeders' Sales Co., told the committee. "We support full year-round racing for our horses and the people involved with the horses." BH
