UNDER TACK WORKOUTS KEY AT F-T SALE

or consignors at Fasig-Tipton's 2-year-olds in training sale, months of planning and weeks of sale preparation all come down to a judgment of several seconds.

While potential buyers have seen some sale prospects gallop and train over the track, the real test hinges on the short breezes during the Feb. 29 under tack workouts that precede the March 2 sale at Gulfstream Park.

"Once that (under tack show) is over with, you can breathe a sigh of relief," said Ciaran Dunne of Wavertree. "That's what it's all about."

Observers say probably more important than breeze times is how individuals look as they "gallop out" following the works.

"Sometimes that gallop out can make up for a slower time," said Mark Roberts of Hidden Brook, adding that a time range over the entire work from start to finish, rather than just the short breeze, is more important to some.

Not all consignors breeze their offerings—Frank Stronach's Adena Springs consignees will only gallop during the under tack show, as they did in 2015. BH

MALIBU SUNSET EASY WINNER

fresh-faced Bob Baffert trainee may have announced his arrival on the Triple Crown trail Feb. 28 at Santa Anita Park.

But the connections of Malibu Sunset, an easy 1 1/2-length winner in a mile allowance optional claiming race, are mum about a potential run in an upcoming Kentucky Derby (gr. I) prep.

"We'll see how he comes out of this race," Baffert said. "We know two turns is not going to be a problem for him. He'll let me know."

Previously with trainer Wayne Catalano, the Bernardini colt was moved to the West Coast by owners Gary and Mary West following a 10 1/2-length debut score going six furlongs at Fair Grounds Race Course & Slots.

On Feb. 28, he settled just off the early pace of Xingontothebone, took over in the second turn, and inched away in the stretch with little asking from jockey Flavien Prat.

"You never know until they turn for home if they can go that extra distance," Baffert said. "It was a good race for him. He needed something like that to get some bottom into him." BH

CONSIGNOR BRENNAN NOT MAKING PREDICTIONS

inhooker Niall Brennan is not one for self-promotion, nor for grandiose claims about the horses he offers at 2-year-olds in training sales.

Instead, the Ocala, Fla.-based horseman brings solid horses to the venue he believes is the best fit, he hopes buyers appreciate them, and the horses go on to excel at the track.

That was certainly the case last year at the Fasig-Tipton Florida sale, when Brennan grossed \$1,775,000 for four horses sold, including eventual champion 2-year-old male Nyquist, who is a leading contender for this year's Kentucky Derby (gr. I). Dennis O'Neill purchased the son of Uncle Mo for \$400,000.

Brennan, who has seven cataloged in

this year's Fasig-Tipton sale March 2 at Gulfstream Park, says he does not believe he, nor other consignors should proffer potential best, or buzz horses, before a sale.

"Everyone says this is the best horse I've ever brought here and then you see how they end up doing, so I don't try to get into that kind of thing," Brennan said. "I don't try to be so bold as to predict that. I know what makes a very nice horse, and the horses we have here are very nice."

While not making predictions about which horses will top his consignment, Brennan said he sees no reason this year's sale will not mirror last year's as well as other similar boutique sales with a small number of horses.

"There are going to be a lot of nice horses here. The high end will do very well and the others will either not be sold or withdrawn," he said.

Brennan said the 2-year-old sales market has changed, and not necessarily for the best—particularly the continued emphasis on fast workout times during under tack shows.

"It's no secret I don't enjoy the 2-year-old sales like I used to," Brennan said. "(A horse's ability) is all judged against the clock. You are asking these young horses to do something they will never be asked to do again—go an eighth of a mile in ten seconds or so. At the end of the day, I would like to see that change, but it's not going to."

Despite that negative trend, Brennan does not push his horses to post fast breeze times and says he still loves buying and developing yearlings to get them placed in the right juvenile sales.

"It is very high risk, but we (pinhookers) love doing what we do. I love taking care of these young horses and doing the right thing by them." BH

'STREET' CRED CONTINUES TO BUILD

Street Cry is second on Australia's sires list, and his sire sons are continuing his legacy

he Street Cry dynasty had a big day Feb. 27, as offspring of Darley's late sire won three group races in Australia and his son Street Boss was represented by unbeaten Cathryn Sophia in the Davona Dale (gr. II) at Gulfstream Park.

Street Cry's daughter Winx, winner of the 2015 W.S. Cox Plate (Aus-I), notched a seventh successive stakes victory, defeating males in the Chipping Norton (Aus-I) at Randwick, where his daughter Solicit also took the Guy Walter (Aus-II). Street Cry's son Tally won the Autumn Classic (Aus-II) at Caulfield.

Street Cry is second among Australia's leading sires this season.

Street Boss' dazzling daughter Cathryn Sophia, a leading Kentucky Oaks (gr. I) candidate, has won all four starts by a combined margin of 41 1/2 lengths.

Street Cry, who died in 2014 at age 16, has 98 blacktype winners, including 2010 Horse of the Year Zenyatta.

His daughters have produced 19 stakes winners and three champions, and with at least 20 sire sons in the U.S. and elsewhere—topped by Darley's Kentucky sires Street Sense, with 44 black-type winners, and Street Boss, with 21—his influence looks to continue far into the future. BH

SISTERS PRODUCE PEPPERS PRIDE EXACTA

he Thoroughbred marketplace loves high-achieving full siblings, but they seldom face each other

on the racetrack. A 1-2 finish in a stakes race is even more rare.

So the Peppers Pride Handicap for New Mexico-breds Feb. 27 at Sunland Park, where sisters Zasha and Desert Stepper finished first and second, was one for the record books.

The 5-year-old former New Mexico Breeders' Oaks winner Zasha was 12-1 after showing poor form in 2015. But she rallied after being headed in the stretch by her 4-year-old sister, the 9-5 favorite, to win by a head. Both are by now-deceased Desert God (Fappiano) out of Thanks for Smokin, by Smoke Glacken.

Both also have strong links to the race's namesake, Peppers Pride—undefeated in 19 starts in a career restricted to New Mexico, she, like the sisters, was sired by Desert God, bred by Joe Allen, and trained by Joel Marr.

IN D.C., ANY BILL FACES OBSTACLES

presidential election, a battle over a Supreme Court vacancy, and the lack of an industry consensus make it difficult for pari-mutuel racing-related legislation to gather any momentum in Congress this year, American Horse Council president Jay Hickey said Feb. 28.

Hickey, who provided an update on the federal outlook during the United States Trotting Association board of directors meeting in Columbus, Ohio, said the current climate in Washington, D.C. isn't conducive to progress—on just about any issue.

"It will be very difficult to get anything passed, even if it might be necessary," he said. "I think there is little likelihood action will be taken on (the Thoroughbred Horse Racing Integrity Act) because it's difficult to pass any legislation unless an industry coalesces around it."

The bill, supported by the Coalition for Horse Racing Integrity, would grant the United States Anti-Doping Agency oversight of equine medication policy, enforcement, and testing.

Though a House committee has yet to hear the bill, the coalition Feb. 26 said sponsors are encouraged the measure will pick up more co-sponsors, and that a Senate version is forthcoming. BH

STOCK MARKET TURMOIL **AND 2-YEAR-OLDS**

he United States' financial markets have been in turmoil since November, with the Dow Jones Industrial Average taking an undulating path—primarily downward. Toward the end of January, the Dow was 14% lower than its most-recent peak of 18,312 on May 19, 2015.

Slowing economic growth in China, bottom-ofthe-barrel oil prices, and some uncertainty about Federal Reserve actions have all contributed to a climate of uncertainty.

With so much upheaval one might assume poor timing as the Thoroughbred commercial market rolls into the 2-year-olds in training segment of the auction cycle. Recent history, however, seems to indicate that high-quality bloodstock influences the health of the juvenile market more than the value of a stock portfolio.

To look for patterns between the stock market and the 2-year-old in training sales, MarketWatch compiled a list of the closing Dow Jones Industrial Average on the first of each month since March 2013 and compared the trend with the average prices reported by the major domestic juvenile sales.

During this period the stock market generally trended upward, regaining losses from the Great Recession. This upswing would be expected to generate optimism overall, and the average 2-year-old price (juvenile sales and mixed sales) rose steadily from \$47,464 in 2011 to \$68,250 in 2013.


Focusing exclusively on the nine leading juvenile sales (eight in 2015 due to the Keeneland April sale's hiatus), the average juvenile price in 2013 was \$76,089. The average for these sales dipped to \$74,923 in 2014, and then rose substantially to \$86,513 in 2015.

The stock market, though trending

up overall, was starting to show some instability in 2015. In the first six months of the year, three months started with a DJIA lower than the previous month. In all twelve months of 2015, six began with the DJIA lower than the previous month. By comparison, in 2014 only three out of eight months started with a lower DJIA and one month was unchanged.

As uncertainty crept into the financial markets, the Thoroughbred juvenile market grew by average price. The stability continued through the 2015 yearling sales, which ended with an overall average price up 7.5% from the previous year to \$68,504, a record average for North America.

The caveat for the 2016 juvenile sales, which begin March 2 with Fasig-Tipton's Florida sale, will be the buy-back rate. Horses that work well and have the right pedigree should command premium prices, while many on the margins may go back home and be raced by their owners. BH
