## PLETCHER REGISTERS WIN 4,000

Todd Pletcher enjoys nothing more than seeing his racing stars go on to become successful stallions and broodmares, a motivating factor the seven-time Eclipse Award winner talked about March 18 after registering win 4,000.

Pletcher picked up the milestone win at Gulfstream Park—where in 1996 he had registered his first win—when WinStar Farm-homebred Eagle Scout won the fifth race, a one-mile maiden event.

Amazingly, 1,102 of Pletcher's first 4,000 wins (27.6%) have come in stakes. Pletcher boasts classic winners Super Saver, Rags to Riches, and Palace Malice, along with nine Breeders' Cup winners.

"I'm proud of the fact that we've been able to develop a lot of stakes horses, and I think over 25 percent of those wins are in stakes," Pletcher said, "and, the fact that we've developed some stallions that are doing well is even more important to us. When you see the Uncle Mos and Super Savers coming up, having a lasting impact on the breed, that's what's great." **BH**

## UNTAPEABLE SEEKS RETURN TO WINNING WAYS

Hoping to bring Untapable back to her phenomenal exploits of 2014, the Winchell family will give their champion another season at the races, beginning in the March 19 Azeri Stakes (gr. II) at Oaklawn Park.

Untapable was virtually unbeatable as a 3-year-old two years ago, winning six of seven starts, including the Breeders' Cup Distaff and Kentucky Oaks (both gr. I) en route to her championship.

Last year, which began with a second in the Azeri, was a different story, however. Although she was never worse than third in her six starts, she registered only one victory, the Apple Blossom Handicap (gr. I).

Racing as a homebred for Ron and Joan Winchell's Winchell Thoroughbreds, the mare has banked \$3,816,725 from 17 starts, and David Fiske, who manages the Winchell family's racing and farm operations, reported March 18 that the daughter of Tapit—Fun House, by Prized, "is doing great. She's never looked better."

In the Azeri, Untapable will have to contend with graded stakes winners Call Pat, Sarah Sis, and High Dollar Woman. **BH**

## STRONG FIELD FOR REBEL STAKES

**T**rainer Bob Baffert has dominated the Rebel (gr. II) at Oaklawn Park, winning five of the last six years, but his lightly raced Cupid will be up against a tough crowd March 19.

"Are there big expectations for this horse? Absolutely," said Baffert's head assistant Jimmy Barnes. "I've been here for all of the Rebels. I think it's a wide-open race, but since we do that quite often people expect you to win."

Favorite Suddenbreakingnews, never worse than second, may have drawn the outside post, but he overcame that bad luck last time out with his late-running style to win the Southwest (gr. III).

Southwest runner-up Whitmore is also contending as co-second choice with Baffert's Cupid. Ron Moquett, trainer and co-owner of Whitmore, expressed, "I just want a better trip this time."

While five other entrants also ran in the Southwest, several horses are coming into the race off maiden or allowance wins, including Cherry Wine—a son of Paddy O'Prado who won his last two races

at the Rebel's 1 1/16 miles by a combined 15 1/4 lengths—and Creator who also won impressively at the distance. **BH**

## WOODBINE'S TAPETA GETS HIGH MARKS, SO FAR

**W**oodbine Race Course's new Tapeta surface received rave reviews March 18, when the main track opened for training.

The Toronto track installed Polytrack all-weather surface in August 2006, which was scraped off last November and replaced with more than 10,000 tons of Tapeta, a synthetic surface developed by trainer Michael Dickinson.

"We took a horse who had been training on dirt and a really nice grass filly, the stakes winner Bear's Pride, and they just floated over the surface," said Leroy Trotman, assistant trainer for Reade Baker, who is currently in South Florida. "The filly has nice action anyway, but I could not believe how nicely she was moving, really floating."

The surface was rain-tested this week, getting almost an inch over several days. A temperature test comes Friday night/early Saturday morning when the

low is expected to drop to 24 degrees. A chance of rain and snow is forecast for March 22.

"It is only the first day, but I give it five stars off the bat," said Trotman. **BH**

Starcraft gelding sells for near-record price in Hong Kong

### STARCRAFT GELDING TOPS HONG KONG SALE

An athletic Starcraft gelding was the standout at the March 18 Hong Kong International Sale at Sha Tin Racecourse when the hammer dropped at HK\$8.5 million (US\$1,103,896) on the purchase by Liu Yu Wen.

Cataloged as Lot 17, the price fell short of the HK\$9 million sale record set in March 2012. The Australian-bred 3-year-old is out of the speedy Anabaa mare Top Cuban.

New Zealand-bred Starcraft earned champion or highweight honors in Australia, New Zealand, England, and France. The son of Kentucky-bred French classic winner Soviet Star boasts eight graded stakes winners from his first seven crops of racing age, including two-time Australian group I winner and champion Star Witness.

Seven lots sold for more than HK\$5 million, among them Lot 19, a Manhattan Rain half brother to Wandjina and Inspiration sold for HK\$7 million (\$909,091) to Ho Ka Kui Boniface.

The Hong Kong Jockey Club reported 24 offered lots reaped an aggregate of HK\$100.5 million (\$13,051,948), a 5.9% increase on last year's HK\$94.9 million (\$12,227,806) return. BH

### CYCLIST STEALS THE SHOW IN CHELTENHAM

A £1 million bonus for winning Britain's premier jumps race couldn't stop Cheltenham Festival publicity from being dominated by an Olympic champion cyclist who had never been on a horse a year ago.

Double gold medalist Victoria Pendleton took up a sponsored challenge from Betfair to try to make the 3 5/16-mile Foxhunter Chase for amateur riders. To the astonishment of many, she rode well enough in prep races to earn the March 18 ride.

Pendleton didn't get the fairytale finish aboard leading trainer Paul Nicholls' runner Pacha Du Polder, a longshot in the 24-horse field, but it was a creditable effort. She settled last on the doubtful stayer but made strong headway up the Cheltenham hill to finish fifth. She has indicated she wants to keep riding.

The £1 million (\$1.45 million) bonus was available for Cue Card (King's Theatre) if he added the 3 5/16-mile £575,000 (\$832,450) Cheltenham Gold Cup to his earlier Betfair Chase and King George VI Chase triumphs. But he fell (later deemed uninjured) when challenging three fences out.

Victory went to favorite Don Cossack—by Irish Derby (Ire-I) runner-up Sholokhov—who had fallen when challenging Cue Card in the King George VI Chase. BH

## WV GROUP SEEKS TO PROTECT, GROW FUNDS

Though the immediate threat to funding passed with the end of the regular legislative session in mid-March, West Virginia racing representatives are working to protect their interests in advance of a special budget session that will be scheduled in the spring.

Lawmakers rejected several measures that would have reduced the funds racing receives from gaming revenue or would have removed live racing requirements for tracks offering casino-style gambling. They also failed to strike a deal on the fiscal 2017 budget, and revenue projections have dropped by \$92 million.

The legislature has dipped into gaming-generated purse revenue in the past to pay for other programs. West Virginia Racing United—composed of horsemen, breeders, and jockeys—said it will monitor developments this spring and also prepare a proactive agenda for the 2017 legislative session.

The group's wish list includes restoration of purse money used to pay down a workers' compensation

debt since the mid-2000s; authorization of advance deposit wagering; creation of boutique off-track wagering parlors; approval for historical race wagering; and consideration of EquiLottery, which would tie pari-mutuel races to the state lottery system. **BH**

## NY SENATE: EXAMINE CASINO IMPACT

While bills in the New York legislature that would protect purses and breed development funds at Finger Lakes haven't progressed, the Senate's budget document signals support for the concept.

The budget resolution for fiscal 2016-17 includes more recommendations for protecting revenue for the horse racing industry, given impending competition from full-scale casinos. Whether they materialize remains to be seen; there will be negotiations with the House of Representatives and the governor's office in advance of an April 1 deadline for passage.

The Senate suggests an "impact study" of revenue losses at racetrack video lottery terminal facilities on horse racing and breeding funds as a result of competition from new casinos. Finger Lakes, at which 70% of starters are New York-bred, is near the site of the planned Lago Casino & Resort, which won a license in 2015.

It's anticipated VLT revenue at the track, which this year will offer 153 days of racing, will drop an

estimated 40% when the Lago facility opens in 2017. Purses at Finger Lakes earn 8.75% of VLT revenue while the breed development fund gets 1.25%. **BH**

## SLOW PROGRESS ON ODDS TRANSPARENCY NOT ENOUGH

According to the 2015 Thoroughbred Racing Protective Bureau annual report, expedited odds cycles have only marginally improved pool and odds transparency for bettors.

According to a 2015 TRPB study, seven tracks that adopted the swiftest odds updates available were still unable to account for 15% of win pool money when the gates opened. Sadly, this is progress from the 23% not accounted for at those seven tracks before they expedited odds updates.

It's a small improvement but falls well short of what would be possible had tracks signed on for the approach the TRPB initially advocated to address the problem: an independent odds production and dissemination network.

According to the annual report, the latter approach has not moved forward because, "the proposed development and costs of an independent odds production and dissemination network became onerous." In short, tracks didn't want to pay for it.

Instead the TRPB worked to have tote companies expedite odds cycles as a way of addressing the lag in reporting. According to an October presentation by TRPB vice president of operations and wagering analysis Curtis Linnell, a study of 10 TRA-member tracks showed that money displayed in win pools in the final odds before "off" time represented 76% of the final pool, up from 71% in 2014. He said tracks such as Saratoga Race Course and Woodbine were at 95%.

Linnell and other experts said expanded bandwidth for tote

companies would continue to improve the ability to update odds cycles and account for more of the final pool.

Still, this is slow progress for an industry that accepts the vast majority of its wagers from off-track outlets, including one in five dollars from sophisticated computer-robotic wagering players. This off-site betting, especially CR-W wagers, should be more scrutinized.

The independent network is designed to provide tracks instant information about where money in their pools is coming from. According to the pari-mutuel committee of the California Horse Racing Board, details on Santa Anita Park wagers are only available on about 60% of wagers through the TRPB. The other 40% require a time-consuming process of requesting those details from outlets not providing the TRPB information.

A Santa Anita representative said track officials are working to persuade that 40% to start automatically providing transaction files to the TRPB.

Somehow, I'm thinking that effort will need more than a strongly worded letter. **BH**


