NYQUIST ARRIVES IN KENTUCKY IN GREAT SHAPE

ndefeated champion Nyquist arrived at Keeneland April 3 following his victory in the Florida Derby (gr. I) at Gulfstream Park a day earlier, and is expected to return to the track April 6 as the favorite for the May 7 Kentucky Derby (gr. I).

"Talking to the crew, he looks good and he ate up well," trainer Doug O'Neill said of Nyquist, who took his record to 7-0 when he aced his showdown with Shadwell Stables' previously unbeaten Mohaymen, who finished fourth.

Nyquist capped 2015 in the Breeders' Cup Juvenile (gr. I) and sealed divisional honors, then opened 2016 in the San Vicente Stakes (gr. II) at Santa Anita Park.

"We had this plan from after the Breeders' Cup of what we wanted to do and it's all unfolding perfectly," O'Neill said.

Trainer Kiaran McLaughlin said Mohaymen emerged from the race in good order, both mentally and physically.

"It's not going to be a tough race on him, so we'll throw it out and move on. We'll regroup and point for the Kentucky Derby and hope for the best."

Mohaymen leaves South Florida next week to train at Churchill Downs. BH

JAPANESE CHALLENGER ARRIVES IN KENTUCKY

apan's Kentucky Derby (gr. I) challenger has arrived back in the state of his birth.

Lani made it to Churchill Downs the afternoon of April 3, following a 7,200-mile April 1 flight from Dubai, a quarantine period at Arlington International Racecourse in Chicago, and a 5 1/2-hour van ride.

"There were no problems at all on the trip," said veterinarian Takano Cho, speaking through an interpreter. "He was very quiet. It was very smooth."

The Tapit colt earned his Derby slot with a determined run to win the UAE Derby (UAE-II) at Meydan March 26, in which he ended the unbeaten status of another Kentucky-bred, the Dubai-trained Congrats filly Polar River.

Bred in Kentucky by North Hills Co., Lani was sent to Japan and won two of his four starts as a juvenile. He's now earned \$1,366,618, having won three of six starts.

Lani will attempt to better the 14th-place finish of Japan's only other Kentucky Derby runner, 1995 contestant Ski Captain.

Lani is the fifth Kentucky Derby hopeful to arrive at Churchill. Already there are Gun Runner, Tom's Ready, Mo Tom, and Forevamo. BH

BIG JOHN B CLOSES AGAIN ON DIRT

jg John B may have won the \$100,000 Tokyo City Cup (gr. III) at Santa Anita Park on talent alone, regardless of the pace scenario, but a deft decision by trainer Phil D'Amato surely didn't hurt.

With a clear speed horse in second-choice Lieutenant Colonel in the 1 1/2-mile dirt test, D'Amato also entered John's Success in the Tokyo City. John's Success broke slowly, but quickly snatched the lead, ensuring Lieutenant Colonel could not open an insurmountable advantage.

Trailing the field of seven by as many as 13 1/2 lengths, Big John B cut the deficit to seven lengths after a mile and easily rallied past his rivals to win by 2 1/4 lengths under jockey Rafael Bejarano.

Also a two-time grade II winner on turf, the Hard Spun gelding has raced only twice on dirt in his last 36 starts, each graded events, winning both. His last





was a score in the Cougar II Handicap (gr. III) over the summer at Del Mar.

"We decided to try the dirt again and thought, 'Why not?'" said Bejarano, who also guided Big John B to the Cougar II victory and then the Del Mar Handicap (gr. IIT) a race later. BH

wner/breeder Ted Aroney's ride from managing the racing career of Candy Ride through his trip this year toward the Triple Crown with Danzing Candy is outlined in the April 9 issue of Blood-Horse.

Aroney was racing manager for Sid and Jenny Craig, who owned Danzing Candy's grandsire Candy Ride. At 4 Candy Ride raced three times in the U.S. and won two graded stakes, including the grade I Pacific Classic Stakes.

When Candy Ride retired to stud, both Aroney and the Craigs supported him with mares and were rewarded with grade I homebreds Sidney's Candy and Twirling Candy.

Now Aroney is living the dream with his homebred Danzing Candy, whom he races with Jim and Dianne Bashor. The Twirling Candy colt, out of the Songandaprayer mare Talkin and Singing, gave the Bashors their first stakes win by taking the San Felipe Stakes (gr. II) by two lengths.

Danzing Candy is expected to take his next big step toward the Kentucky Derby (gr. I) in the April 9 Santa Anita Derby (gr. I). BH

OPINION: FINGER LAKES IS CRITICAL TO NY

The following letter is from Jeff Cannizzo, New York Thoroughbred Breeders executive director, regarding the New York state budget, which took effect in April and excludes a hold-harmless provision for purses at Finger Lakes Gaming & Racetrack, located 30 miles from a new Lago Resort and Casino that will open in 2017.

This is extremely disappointing and nauseating news because a healthy racing program at Finger Lakes is critically important to Thoroughbred breeders. Just look at the statistics. In 2015, NY-breds were responsible for 70% of total starts at Finger Lakes

and earned 73% of all purse money distributed. Furthermore, races at Finger Lakes generated 52% of the number of breeder awards paid by the Fund.

NYTB pursued all available avenues to protect the Finger Lakes Horsemen's Benevolent and Protective Association and the Fund for over a year from the competing Lago casino, from Delaware North, and even the state. The gaming tax relief helps only the bottom line of Delaware North, which made \$16 million in profit last year. The budget assures it making the same profit. The FLHBPA formally supported Delaware North receiving this relief. In addition, Delaware North is not required to give anything to purses from this bail out—unfathomable as it runs

the racetrack. It's as unfathomable that Lago doesn't have to follow the same rules as the rest of the state's casinos.

NYTB will now pursue protection for the FLHBPA and the Fund through stand-alone legislation in the upcoming session. Passing these matching Senate and Assembly bills on purse protection will be an uphill battle. Although the Governor's office, Senate, and Assembly have committed verbally to working on the problem, the obstacles thwarting our earlier efforts remain. Governments only seem to react to a crisis, and it's apparent it feels that crisis is a year away.

Every 10% decrease of video lottery terminals revenue reduces the Finger Lakes purses by \$1.1 million and 65% of purses come from VLT revenue. Finger Lakes purses are likely to be somewhere between \$12-14 million next year after accounting for losses from the Lago casino. On-track live handle at Finger Lakes is down more than 50% in the last decade, export to NY OTBs is down more than 70%. When the daily live handle is less than \$50,000, it accelerates purse declines because the live handle contributes up to five times more than export. We must ensure that racing is viable at Finger Lakes, which plays an essential role in New York's racing industry. NYTB has routinely requested Delaware North investigate the installation of a turf course, which would help field size and the population. NYTB even identified funding. These discussions all have resulted in no action. Perhaps now these types of long-term strategies can happen to better racing. It's a must for New York. BH

FIRST GROUP I WINNER FOR GO DEPUTY

o Deputy, who won the 2006 Sword Dancer Invitational (gr. IT) for trainer Todd Pletcher and owners/breeders Alain and Gerard Wertheimer, was represented by his first group I winner as a sire when his son Abashiri won the SA Classic (SAf-I) at Turffontein April 2.

Bred by Lammerskrall Stud (which stands Go Deputy) and owned by Adriaan and Rika Van Vuuren, Abashiri has won five of his seven starts. He is on track to complete the South African Triple Crown, having previously won the Gauteng Guineas (SAf-II).

Go Deputy won six of 19 outings racing in North America and more than \$1.1 million.

A son of two-time U.S. leading sire Deputy Minister, Go Deputy is from the Secretariat mare Partygoer, and thus a half brother to Pacific Classic (gr. I) winner and sire Dare and Go. Go Deputy's third dam, Cequillo, is also third dam of Metropolitan Handicap (gr. I) winner and major sire Fappiano.

Abashiri is from his sire's fifth crop, which also includes the stakes-winning filly Flying Ice. Go Deputy's earlier foal crops include the talented gelding Changingoftheguard and group winners Current Event and Pessoa. BH



IMPACT OF DEL MAR MOVE HARD TO JUDGE

f you're looking to find what impact the move from Fairplex to Del Mar has made for the Barretts sale company in California, it's not easy.

Barretts has now had a full year of sales since its move from Fairplex following its select 2-year-olds in training sale March 30, and the results have been varied.

The select sale offered 64 horses, of which 43 sold. Last year at Fairplex 65 were offered, 44 of which sold. The 2016 gross was \$5,356,000 compared to \$5,848,000 last year (down 8.4%); the average fell from \$132,900 to \$124,558 (down 6.3%), and the median rose from \$97,500 to \$100,000 (up 2.6%).

This year's sale figures would have been better had Dickman Legacy Ranch sold colts by Union Rags, Unbridled's Song, and City Zip (all consigned by John Brocklebank), rather than buying them back at \$725,000, \$350,000, and \$340,000, respectively. However, four horses at last year's sale were bought back at prices

between \$300,000 and \$500,000, so not much changed there either.

The Barretts sale, however, has fallen back from 2012-14. In those years 77, 61, and 60 horses, respectively, were sold, with grosses exceeding \$8 million in each year. Many factors could be at play with this, but there have been notable changes since 2014 in competing Florida sales: the move of the Fasig-Tipton sale from late March to Gulfstream Park in early March, and Ocala Breeders' Sales Co.'s dropping the selected sale format for its March sale in favor of a greatly expanded catalog. Barretts, which traditionally held its sale in early March, sold in late February in 2015 before moving to late March this year.

There have been mixed results at two other Barretts sales held at Del Mar that had comparable previous sales at Fairplex. Its 2015 May sale of 2-year-olds, the first after its Del Mar move, had a vastly increased catalog; 70 horses sold at Fairplex in 2014 for a \$3,031,500 gross whereas 94 sold at Del Mar in 2015 for a \$4,216,000 gross. However, the January mixed sale had a catalog about half the size of 2014's sale.

The varying results seem to indicate factors other than the Del Mar move are impacting the sales. In the long-term, however, Barretts is hoping the change of venue will be positive.

"We believe we can create a new marketplace in the San Diego area, which is an equine-rich area," Barretts sales and racing general manager Kim Lloyd said. "We feel the Select sale will grow into a destination sale, just like Fasig-Tipton has at Gulfstream Park." BH

Big John B relished the return to dirt to win his fifth graded stakes. He settled well back and encountered some traffic problems around the final turn but once clear the classy gelding had too much speed at the end of 1 1/2 miles for Class Leader, taking his earnings to \$849,770.—A.B.
