HEILIGBRODTS' PINHOOKS ON OFFER AT OBS

ill and Corinne Heiligbrodt have worn many hats in the horse business for more than two decades.

They were among the most prominent owners and breeders in North America before their 2011 dispersal, owning more than 200 Thoroughbreds.

Among the top horses representing the Texans were grade I winners Lady Tak and Appealing Zophie, as well as a host of grade II and III winners that included Bwana Charlie, Posse, and Inca King.

At the time they dispersed their Thoroughbred holdings, the couple held out the possibility of some day returning to the Thoroughbred industry.

Now, the Heiligbrodts have ventured into a new aspect of the business. Among the horses being offered at next week's Ocala Breeders' Sales Co.'s spring sale of 2-year-olds in training are five from their pinhooking venture.

"All five were bought privately or at auction as short yearlings, and they are exceptional individuals, with very good physicals and are sound," said Susan Montanye, who is offering the Heiligbrodt horses through her SBM Training and Sales Consignment.

Included are a \$70,000 Dialed In colt bought at *(continued on page 2)*

the 2015 Keeneland January sale, whose second dam is grade II winner and multiple grade I-placed Private Treasure; and a Gemologist colt, acquired for \$25,000 from the 2015 Fasig-Tipton Kentucky February sale, whose second dam is grade I winner Wildcat Bettie B.

Montayne said the horses were located at Taylor Made when she met with the Heiligbodts during last year's Keeneland September yearling sale, when the couple decided to send their pinhook prospects to her to be broken and offered for sale.

Of the seven sent to Montayne, two have been bought back and are in training with Steve Asmussen at Keeneland, and should be making their first starts soon, the consignor said.

"They are wonderful people, and I am glad I have an opportunity to break and train those yearlings and hope it continues," Montayne said. "If they don't sell them, then they will go on and race them. They are in a position where they don't have to sell them, but they are all here to sell.

"If he (Bill Heiligbrodt) sells all of them, he would be tickled. He has a lot of money invested in them and he would definitely like to turn some of that investment into cash flow." BH

SHACKLEFORD COLT FASTEST AT UNDER TACK

April 14 in :20 2/5, the fastest at the distance over the course of the first four under tack sessions for the Ocala Breeders' Sales Co's spring 2-year-olds in training sale.

The previous best time for the distance, :20 3/5, was set by nearly a dozen juveniles, including some Thursday, but the colt consigned as Hip 790 by Ciaran Dunne's Wavertree set the bar.

Named Chief Ruling, the Shackleford colt was produced from a winning half sister to San Juan Capistrano (gr. IT) winner Ringaskiddy and hails from a solid black-type family. The colt has been through a sales ring twice previously, initially purchased by Summerfield Sales for \$70,000 from the Taylor Made consignment to the 2014 Keeneland November sale, and then by Redwings for \$50,000 from Summerfield's 2015 Keeneland September yearling offerings.

Four fillies shared the best eighth-mile time

Thursday of :09 4/5, equaling the best time of the first three sessions:

- Hip 631 a filly by Tiz Wonderful out of the stakes-winning Marquetry mare Christmas Lily bred in Kentucky by Spendthrift Farm and consigned by King's Equine;
- Hip 692, a War Front filly from the female family of champion Countess Diana, bred in Kentucky by Gabriel Duignan and Crosshaven Bloodstock, a \$180,000 Keeneland September yearling

purchase from the Eddie Woods consignment;

- Hip 789, an Awesome of Course half sister to grade II winner Express Tour from the Eisaman Equine consignment, purchased for \$42,000 from the 2015 OBS August sale;
- Hip 798, a filly from the first crop of Overdriven, produced from the winning Distant View mare Far Sighted Sal, consigned by Sugar Hill and bred in Florida by the University of Florida Foundation.

Spread out over six days, the under tack show has more than 1,200 horses cataloged and can take its toll on the participants. However, the previous protocol of four days of pre-sale workouts was even more taxing.

"Two years ago we went to the six days rather than four and it has been kinder on both buyers and sellers, and it's kinder on the horses too," said OBS sales director Tod Wojciechowski. "We get done early enough it keeps everyone fresh and it allows time to look at the horses following the under tack show. And it gives consignors a little bit of a break. It has been well received by everyone." BH

MOTION CHASES HISTORY WITH MISS **TEMPLE CITY**

rainer Graham Motion has taken unusual routes to victory before, as when winning the Kentucky Derby (gr. I) with Animal Kingdom in his dirt debut.

The British expat chases history April 15 in Keeneland's Maker's 46 Mile (gr. IT) with Miss Temple City the first female to contest the mile turf event.

Assigned 113 pounds under featherweight Drayden Van Dyke, Sagamore Farm, Allen Rosenblum, and The Club Racing's 4-year-old Temple City filly starts after a layoff, her most recent start a second in the Oct. 10 Queen Elizabeth II Challenge Cup (gr. IT). Her rivals spot her five to seven pounds.

"I wanted to run this weekend; it was always in the cards," Motion said. "I think this filly is bigger and stronger than she was last year. I'm not sure her past performances tell the whole story. I thought she should have won the QEII. I thought that race was a little bit odd."

Motion cross-entered in the April 16 Jenny Wiley (gr. IT), but chose to tackle males rather than face champion Tepin.

"I entered for Saturday just because you want to see how things pan out, (who gets which) post positions, and see for sure who was going to run, and if something happened with Tepin, who clearly is the horse most people would rather not run against," Motion said. "But ultimately it just makes more sense to me to run on Friday.

"If Drayden hadn't ridden her before and couldn't do the weight, I don't think I'd be doing it. But the fact that he's ridden her and can do the weight, to me, that's a

bit of a game-changer."

Miss Temple City sports a 3-3-2 record from nine starts and was second in Keeneland's Appalachian (gr. IIIT) last spring. Her only off-the-board finish was a Coronation Stakes (Eng-I) fourth at Royal Ascot last June.

"The fillies that came out of her race in England have come back and won group Is, most of them against the boys," Motion said. "Numbers-wise the boys are good, but they don't look like grade I horses, whereas the fillies look like grade I horses to me. There's a good pace (in the Maker's), where there's not really that scenario in the Jenny Wiley."

A return to Royal Ascot could be in Miss Temple City's future as well.

"I think everybody would be game if she runs well," Motion said. "We wouldn't run against Tepin, because she'd run in (the group I Queen Anne Stakes). We'd run against the girls there." BH

FOREVER UNBRIDLED SEEKS FIRST GRADE I

harles Fipke's homebred Forever Unbridled seeks her first grade I victory when she takes on five fillies and mares April 15 in a strong renewal of the Apple Blossom at Oaklawn Park.

The 4-year-old is a full sister to another Dallas Stewart trainee, Unbridled Forever (Unbridled's Song-Lemons Forever), who won the 2015 Ballerina (gr. I) at Saratoga Racecourse.

According to Stewart's assistant trainer Bentley Coombs, it's not only their names that can be easily confused.

"A lot of class is what they have in common, and now, too, with their 3-year-old half brother, Forever d'Oro. Unbridled Forever and Forever Unbridled practically even look identical," said Coombs.

He continued, "I feel great about the way she's coming in to this race. She's galloped three days over the

track and handled it well, and she's fresh."

The field also includes 2014 champion 3-year-old filly Untapable, who hasn't won since this race last year; Tara's Tango, another Unbridled's Song filly who won the Santa Margarita (gr. I) at her last start; and Call Pat, whose late closing finish won her the March 19 Azeri Stakes (gr. II) over Untapable. BH

CATCH A GLIMPSE EMOTIONAL WINNER FOR CARROLL

↑ /ith a massive grin, David Carroll found the Keeneland winner's circle following the victory of Canadian Horse of the Year Catch a Glimpse in the \$125,000 Appalachian Stakes (gr. IIIT) April 14.

The Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies Turf (gr. IT) winner has been in Carroll's care at the Lexington oval since he recently retired from a longtime public training career. She is his first graded winner as an assistant for Mark Casse's far-flung operation.

"Oh my God, I'm so excited," Carroll said. "This is really a dream opportunity. ... I'm rejuvenated. It's an unbelievable team. I think I'm in Disney World, I really do."

Catch a Glimpse held off Ava's Kitten by three-quarters of a length to claim her fifth straight victory, and her fourth consecutive graded stakes. It was the second score of the season for Gary Barber, Michael James Ambler, and Windways Farm's 3-year-old City Zip filly, who finished a mile

in 1:37.27 on firm turf under regular rider Florent Geroux.

"David's become a really big, important part of this team. He's very passionate, and when you're passionate you do great things," assistant trainer Norm Casse said, BH



AN INTERESTING DERBY BUBBLE

sing the first three seasons of the Road to the Kentucky Derby qualifying points system as reference, the connections of Mo Tom, Fellowship, Adventist, and Laoban probably find it hard to believe they haven't already clinched a spot in the 2016 Kentucky Derby (gr. I).

But thanks to an already all-time high mark for the 20th spot on the qualifying points list used by Churchill Downs to determine the maximum 20 Derby starters, connections of grade III winner Mo Tom, Florida Derby (gr. I) third-place finisher Fellowship, Wood Memorial (gr. I) third Adventist, and Blue Grass (gr. I) fourth Laoban will spend April 16 on the Derby bubble. (By tiebreaker, Mo Tom is 18th, Fellowship 19th, Adventist 20th, and Laoban 21st.)

Each of these horses has 32 points. In the first three years of the points system, 32 points would have ranged from 16th to 18th on the final list, putting those horses safely in the field. Horses with the lowest points in the Derby field the past three years were: Giant Finish with 10 in 2013; Commanding Curve with 20 in 2014; and Frammento, off the also-eligible list last year, with 20.

This year, connections who are on the bubble will watch the final Derby points races April



15 with more than passing interest. The Arkansas Derby (gr. I) offers points on a 100-40-20-10 schedule to the top four finishers while the Lexington Stakes (gr. III) awards a 10-4-2-1 schedule.

For on the bubble horses, all concern lies in Arkansas because the 10 points awarded to the Lexington winner is not enough to put any of those horses in the Derby points list top 20.

In the Arkansas
Derby, anywhere
from one to four
horses could move
ahead of the 32-point
mark. A top performance by Arkansas
Derby favorite Cupid
would not affect
Derby eligibility, as he
is already 11th on the
points list.

But if Cupid were to finish out of the top two, the 100 and 40 points awarded to first and second **Arkansas Derby** finishers would vault both of them into the field and cost bubble horses two spots. Whitmore (24 points) could bounce horses with a third- or fourthplace finish. Dazzling Gem (20 points) could bounce horses with a third. BH

'CHROME', WINX ATOP WORLD RANKINGS

wo horses from different hemispheres head the Longines World Thoroughbred Rankings through the early months of 2016.

California Chrome (Lucky Pulpit) received a 126 rating for his 3 3/4-length Dubai World Cup (UAE-I) victory, earned on the Meydan dirt despite jockey Victor Espinoza's saddle slipping.

Joining him at 126 is superstar Australian mare Winx (Street Cry), who is on a nine-race winning streak. In her most recent victory, she conceded up to 6.5 kilograms (about 14.3 pounds) to win the Doncaster Mile (Aus-I). Azkadellia, third in that race while in receipt of the full 6.5 kilograms, won the weight-for-age Queen of the Turf Stakes (Aus-I) a week later.

Postponed (Dubawi) was rated third at 124 after winning the Dubai Sheema Classic (UAE-I), while fourth is Australian sprinter Chautaugua (Encosta de Lago) following his victory in the T J Smith Stakes (Aus-I).

Songbird is rated fifth-equal at 120, a high mark for a 3-year-old filly, following her Santa Anita Oaks (gr. I) victory April 9. Despite an unplaced Dubai World Cup effort, Frosted retains his 120 mark based on his lead-up victory in the Al Maktoum Challenge Round Two (UAE-II). BH

THREE HEAD FIRST TRIPLE CROWN RACE

hampion 2-year-old Leontes will face two undefeated colts in what is expected to be a thrilling Satsuki Sho (Japanese Two Thousand Guineas, Jpn-I)—the first leg of the Japanese Triple Crown—April 17 at Nakayama.

The highly regarded son of King Kamehameha is the fifth foal out of American Oaks (gr. IT) winner Cesario. Leontes won the Asashi Hai Futurity (Jpn-I) last December in his second start, earning a mark on the Japanese Thoroughbred Rankings of 116—the highest given to a 2-year-old in 18 years.

Though he experienced his first defeat in the Yayoi Sho (Jpn-II) March 6, finishing second to Makahiki, it was obvious he needed the race.

Makahiki is steadily following his sire Deep Impact's footsteps, remaining unbeaten through three starts, which include the Wakagoma Stakes.

Satono Diamond, another son of Deep Impact, is also undefeated in three starts, which include the Kisaragi Sho (Jpn-III) Feb. 7. Christophe Lemaire, who rode Makahiki in the Yayoi Sho and Satono Diamond in the Kisaragi Sho, chose Satono Diamond as his mount for Sunday.

Northern Farm bred all three of these Triple Crown hopefuls. BH

TERENCE COLLIER ON THE FLORIDA **DERBY BONUS**

Terence Collier says the \$1 million bonus for Fasig-Tipton Florida sale graduates that win the Florida Derby created huge pre-race publicity

arketWatch spoke with Fasig-Tipton's **W** director of marketing Terence Collier about the impact of the inaugural \$1 million bonus offered to any Fasig-Tipton Florida Sale graduate that went on to win the Florida Derby (gr. I). The bonus was paid to Kentucky Derby Presented by Yum! Brands (gr. I) front-runner Nyquist.

MarketWatch: With a promotion like this, do you actually hope a horse wins the bonus?

Terence Collier: There are a lot of similar promotional programs; get a hole in one at some golf courses and win a Mercedes Benz. Most companies make the decision, not on it being paid out but on what kind of buzz it creates around the event with people trying to win it. The ideal is for the horse to come in second (he said laughing). Really, I don't know that the bonus had any effect on the bottom line this year, but it created a huge amount of pre-race press coverage in areas that we have never seen press coverage before. That is a benefit.

MW: Would you consider the bonus an extension of the race sponsorships Fasig-Tipton had previously at Gulfstream Park?

TC: We sponsored the Fountain of Youth Stakes for a few years (2010-12), but the race sponsorships were more for corporate entertainment and to garner some publicity. The bonus was not for corporate entertainment but to encourage people to come to the sale.

The bonus will be offered for a couple more years at least because you have got to build some momentum.

MW: What kind of impact do you expect from the publicity surrounding the bonus?

TC: Well, it would be great to have a Kentucky Derby winner come out of our first sale held at Gulfstream Park.

We have struggled to get footing in our new location in South Florida, and we needed something to match the weight of the occasion. Mr. Stronach thinks big, so it had to be a grand gesture—a million dollars was an obvious place to start. But we didn't just offer the bonus because The Stronach Group suggested it, we did it because it reflected what we're all trying to do. Gulfstream is trying to plant the winter meet very firmly on the map, and we wanted more awareness about the Florida sale and for people to try harder next year to win it. The fact it was won is lagniappe. We all felt we got very good publicity value out of the bonus.

I would say 2018 is when we will really see more people focused on the Florida Sale. To have the bonus paid two years in a row would be a dream come true, though it is certainly a long shot to expect it to happen. BH
