NYQUIST BREEZES MILE AT KEENELAND

While he took slightly different approaches with the two horses, trainer Doug O'Neill is as pleased with Nyquist going into the Kentucky Derby (gr. I) as he was with I'll Have Another, who won the 2012 Louisville classic.

Reddam Racing's Nyquist completed his final timed Derby work before the first race at Keeneland April 29, breezing a mile in 1:41 under regular jockey Mario Gutierrez. The undefeated champion 2-year-old male was credited with splits of :27, :51, and 1:15 through six furlongs.

Since winning the Florida Derby (gr. I) five weeks before the Derby, Nyquist has breezed three times on Keeneland's main track. Before Friday's mile work, the son of Uncle Mo completed five furlongs in 1:02 3/5 April 15 and 1:01 4/5 April 23.

Before his 2012 Derby win, Reddam Racing's I'll Have Another won the Santa Anita Derby (gr. I) April 7. (continued on page 3)

He then worked twice on Hollywood Park's synthetic main track in the four weeks before the Derby. The son of Flower Alley completed six furlongs in 1:13 3/5 April 19 before going 1:13 4/5 April 27.

"Nyquist has been a lot more controlled," O'Neill said, comparing the two Derby preparations. "I'll Have Another was one that we got the brunt of our fitness from open gallops on a daily basis. This guy has told us he would like to have a good open gallop once a week and the rest of the time he can just do maintenance stuff.

"I like that. It gives his body time to recover from these good stamina-type workouts. What we've seen today is what we've seen prior to his other races. It's worked then, so I'm optimistic it will work in eight days."

During Friday's work Nyquist started a couple of lengths behind grade I-winning workmate Ralis, going one mile before several thousand fans who arrived early to watch the move.

Nyquist looked very fluid through the turn and backstretch, quickly moving to even terms with Ralis. In the stretch Nyquist was let out a notch and quickly pulled away, even as he took several glances toward the crowd.

"He does play around a little bit," O'Neill said. "He's a playboy. He knows he's good, and he likes to flaunt it a little bit I guess."

O'Neill said Friday's breeze, which was several seconds faster than his typical mile move, gives the entire team confidence going into next week.

"He looked great out there. The time he went today without much effort was wowing," O'Neill said. The plan now is to ship to Louisville April 30. **BH**

PLETCHER PLEASED WITH 'UNDER RADAR' RUNNERS

Todd Pletcher greeted a media scrum at Churchill Downs in a laid-back manner April 29, even though the Kentucky Derby (gr. I) looms.

Pleased with the final breezes of Wood Memorial (gr. I) winner Outwork and Tampa Bay Derby (gr. II) winner Destin, he has no problem leaving the lime-light to undefeated champion Nyquist and others with higher profiles.

"It seems just a little quiet in general, but I didn't say I have a problem with it," Pletcher said with a grin. "I'm sure it will intensify here later this week. It's been a seamless transition over here, and the horses have settled in well; and when your horses breeze well, I think that puts you in good spirits."

Mike Repole's homebred Outwork went five furlongs in 1:01 1/5 in company with Azar, a probable for the \$300,000 American Turf (gr. IIT). The Uncle Mo colt delivered fractions of :13 1/5 and :37 2/5, galloping out three-quarters in 1:14.

"What I really liked was the way he finished," Pletcher said. "Sometimes, as he did in the Wood, when he gets past the last horse, he kind of tends to idle a little bit. Today I thought he was much more professional, focused, and stayed concentrated throughout the gallop out."

Destin, in company with Stradivari, went five furlongs in 1:01 1/5 after producing eighth-mile fractions of :12 3/5, :24 4/5, :37 2/5, and :49 3/5, galloping out six furlongs in 1:14 1/5 and seven in 1:27.

"He's had a good series of solid works, but we wanted to make sure we got a solid one today with a strong gallop out," Pletcher said of the Giant's Causeway colt. "If we can keep him focused, I think he'll get the distance."

Twin Creeks Racing and Eclipse Thoroughbred Partners' Destin comes off an eight-week gap between starts. The March 12 Tampa Bay Derby was his last out, and he has not gone past 1 1/16 miles.

"It was a tough decision (to run fresh in the Derby) because you're passing up a good opportunity in between," Pletcher said. "But we've had success in the past giving horses a little extra time. Looking

back to last year's Breeders' Cup with (grade I Breeders' Cup Dirt Mile winner) Liam's Map, he didn't run from Saratoga to Breeders' Cup. Same thing for (grade I Breeders' Cup Distaff winner) Stopchargingmaria, and even Rachel's Valentina, who didn't win (the grade I Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies) but ran a good second to Songbird. We just feel like sometimes our horses run well fresh, and that should apply to the Kentucky Derby as much as any other race." **BH**

CRANE THOROUGHBREDS SEEKS BASE HITS AT F-T

When Crane Thoroughbreds sends some 30 head to Timonium, Md. for the May 23-24 Fasig-Tipton Midlantic 2-year-olds in training sale, the partners in the pinhooking venture will be realistic in their expectations.

With a business model built around buying young horses in the \$20,000-\$50,000 price range—not hesitating to stretch a little more for more desirable prospects—Crane Thoroughbreds does not swing for the fences, but rather looks to make a profit.

“Our philosophy is to make base hits every time,” said Clovis Crane, who operates the Lebanon, Pa.-based outfit with his wife, Joanna, and partner Dr. Harry Weisleder. “Base hits win the game in the end. We are not always trying to step up and hit the home run; of course, we love it if it just happens. I try to buy a solid horse that is sound and looks fast, that will get to the next level, and make a little profit.”

Already this year Crane has made solid profits at the Fasig-Tipton March sale where a Mission Impazible filly purchased for \$40,000 sold for \$290,000, and at Barretts with a \$240,000 Majestic Warrior colt acquired for \$82,000.

Comprising 65 acres, Crane Thoroughbreds specializes in breaking and training, with about 100 head on the farm at any time. A third-generation horseman, Crane, 36, began as a jockey in his teens before outgrowing the profession and eventually graduating with an education degree from Purdue.

“Pinhooking is the meat and potatoes of our business, but the bread and butter is breaking horses; that’s what pays the day-to-day bills,” he said, noting that he and his wife previously tried breeding and foaling broodmares before narrowing their focus several years ago.

Situated in a region with a large horse population, Crane has earned a reputation as a go-to solution for problematic young horses. “When all else fails and someone is having trouble with one, send it to us, and we will straighten it out,” Crane said.

Although Crane consigns to the major juvenile sales, the Midlantic sale is its largest marketplace. Conducted the week following the Preakness (gr. I) at nearby Pimlico Race Course, the sale venue is only 1 1/2 hours from his Pennsylvania farm, so Crane can work with horses at the farm and also attend to the consignment.

“You will get just as much money at Timonium as you will anywhere else because the buyers are there,” Crane said.

“You have a captive group of trainers based in the region who are going to show up and then you have the Preakness, which draws the upper tier trainers that weekend.

“I think this is the best group I have brought to Timonium, and I think they will be well received. I have some that are not by name-brand sires, but they are lickety-split fast.” **BH**

ALL CALM AT CAMP O'NEILL

He's nicely tanned, the guy standing outside Barn 24 at Keeneland April 29, sporting a hipster beard and a sky blue dress shirt, soaking up a beautiful sunny spring day in the Bluegrass. Looking at him, you'd think trainer Doug O'Neill doesn't have a care in the world.

And maybe he doesn't. If having the favorite for the Kentucky Derby (gr. I) is putting any pressure on the California-based O'Neill, he's showing none of it.

Perhaps undefeated Nyquist is just that good. After all, his three weeks in Kentucky since winning the showdown with Mohaymen in the Florida Derby (gr. I) have gone precisely to O'Neill's plan. Obviously, Nyquist enjoys this racetrack—he won the Breeders' Cup Juvenile (gr. I) on it—and on the rainy days O'Neill was able to send him over the synthetic training track.

Now, after his third Keeneland breeze (going a mile in 1:41), Nyquist is off to Louisville to write the next chapter. O'Neill said moments before the work that he was looking for 1:47 or so but didn't bat an eye at the faster clocking. He conferred with jockey Mario Gutierrez, who was aboard, and got confirmation Nyquist did it on his own, nice and easy.

"He had a good gallop in, and a good gallop out, and picked it up in the middle," O'Neill said. "Just like the plan. In fact, he exceeded expectations."

O'Neill draws his confidence from his team, which is captained by owner Paul

Reddam, and the fact that he is now moving over a path he successfully walked with I'll Have Another four years ago.

"We have a great team and a family atmosphere, and that helps keep everything calm," O'Neill said just after Nyquist got his post-work bath. "We're able to enjoy it together."

And then, because he loves a punch line, O'Neill added, "Or the calm could be from the tequila."

O'Neill is packing quite a few less pounds than he has previously carried, which he attributes to daily doses of Bulletproof Coffee—a mixture of black coffee, grass-fed butter, and "brain octane oil." Well, the California has to come out of him at some point.

His one worry—and you have to drill down to have him verbalize it—is keeping his athlete injury-free over the next week. Outwardly, though, it's all sunshine.

"We're just trying to slow it down and soak it all in," O'Neill said of his team.

As for Nyquist, "He's a Ferrari," according to his trainer. Just pour in the octane oil and bring on the Derby. **BH**

OLORDA LEADS ALL THE WAY IN BEWITCH

The 4-year-old German-bred filly Olorda seems to like racing on the front-end and that's just fine with trainer Chad Brown and jockey Julien Leparoux.

Olorda, who won Gulfstream Park's The Very One (gr. IIIT) in March, followed up with another gate-to-wire win in the 1 1/2-mile Bewitch Stakes (gr. IIIT) April 29 at Keeneland.

"That's what we're learning," Brown said of the filly's preferred running style. "She runs best that way. We did that in her last race and it worked out. Asking a mile and a half of her was a lot today, but Julien carved out decent fractions knowing how headstrong this particular horse can be. He just executed it perfectly, and the filly ran a huge race."

Owned by Martin Schwartz, Olorda made her U.S. debut last July at Belmont Park. Though she won a group III stakes in France, her recent form is the best of her 10-race career.

Al's Gal, claimed for \$35,000 early last year, fin-

ished second for owners Ken and Sarah Ramsey, who took their 17th overall Keeneland leading owner title at the meet that ended April 29. **BH**

SHERMAN'S MISHEGAS IN FOR CALIFORNIA CHROME

It just wouldn't seem right if Art Sherman didn't have an entrant in the inaugural California Chrome Stakes April 30 at Los Alamitos.

Named after the Orange County racetrack's most famous resident and Sherman trainee—who will return to his home at Los Al May 1 after some rest and relaxation at Taylor Made Farm following his Dubai World Cup (UAE-I) win—the California Chrome Stakes features last-out winner Mishegas in his toughest task yet.

The Include gelding figures to be a longshot but has some intriguing past performances that might fit. Last time out he defeated fellow California Chrome entrants Rare Candy and Curlin Rules. He also has a standout victory at Los Alamitos Dec. 11, when he won another optional claimer by 13 1/4 lengths.

Mishegas may be the sentimental pick, but Malibu Sunset looms the favorite.

After a 10 1/2-length score in his debut at Fair

Grounds for trainer Wayne Catalano, Malibu Sunset was sent west to trainer Bob Baffert. In his first start for the Hall of Fame trainer, the Bernardini colt won a mile allowance optional claimer at Santa Anita Feb. 28. **BH**

AIR FORCE BLUE DOMINATES GUINEAS MARKET

The War Front colt that topped the 2014 Keeneland September yearling sale along with Mohaymen has a classic engagement of his own this weekend—the Two Thousand Guineas (Eng-I).

However, it's a less expensive son of War Front, Air Force Blue, that the Guineas contenders fear most.

Air Vice Marshal, bought from the consignment of Claiborne Farm, near Paris, Ky., fell to a \$2.2 million bid at Keeneland, just as Kentucky Derby (gr. I) contender Mohaymen did.

Air Vice Marshal goes into the April 30 race with a 1-1-1 record in three starts but hasn't run since July 11, finishing second in the Superlative Stakes (Eng-II). He's widely available at 40-1 with English bookmakers.

Air Force Blue, set to start at odds-on in the Guineas, is also a Keeneland September buy; he cost a "mere" \$490,000 from the Stone Farm consignment.

His short odds reflect a dominant juvenile campaign in which he won four of his five starts, including three group Is: the Phoenix and National (both in Ireland), and the Dewhurst, on the same Newmarket course he returns to April 30.

The biggest doubts expressed about Air Force Blue have been that he is tackling a mile for the first time, and the possibility of wet ground.

His trainer Aidan O'Brien said he'd prefer the ground to dry out, but that he trained well through winter and spring.

O'Brien trains both War Front colts. Susan Magnier, Michael Tabor, and Derrick Smith have shares in both Air Force Blue and Air Vice Marshal. Joseph Allen is also a partner in Air Vice Marshal.

Air Force Blue and Air Vice Marshal are among

three U.S.-bred colts contesting the Guineas. The third is Kentuckyconnection (Include), a 200-1 chance.

He was a \$22,000 Keeneland November weanling purchase, a \$19,000 RNA at the Fasig-Tipton Kentucky October sale, and subsequently bought at the 2015 Tattersalls Guineas breeze-up and horses in training sale for 60,000 guineas (\$96,724).

The best chance to beat Air Force Blue, according to bookmakers, is British-bred Stormy Antarctic, a son of Stormy Atlantic, who stands at Hill 'n' Dale Farms near Lexington, Ky.

Stormy Antarctic won two of his five juvenile starts, ran second in the Grand Criterium (Fr-I), and was an easy winner of the Craven Stakes (Eng-III) in his only 3-year-old start. He is also proven on wet ground.

Also well-backed are Galileo Gold (Paco Boy), Mas-saat (Teofilo), and Marcel (Lawman).

Favored in the One Thousand Guineas (Eng-I) May 1 is another O'Brien runner, Minding (Galileo), winner of the Fillies Mile (Eng-I) last year. **BH**

OAKLAWN TAKES DIFFERENT ROUTE TO SUCCESS

With one of every five dollars in U.S. pari-mutuel pools coming from players who use computer-robotic wagering, one can understand the financial concerns involved with banning these players who enjoy advantages not available to most.

But Oaklawn Park is committed to keeping CRW players out of its pools and the sky has not fallen.

Oaklawn is proving tracks concerned about the detrimental effects on winning payouts and fairness issues brought by CRW bettors can prohibit these players and still register strong pari-mutuel handle numbers.

At the meet that concluded earlier this month, Oaklawn all-sources handle increased 4% to \$180,582,197 as field size increased to 9.62 per race, among the largest in the nation.

CRW players use algorithms to scan pari-mutuel pools for value, have the advantage of being able to bet a large number of wagers instantly to take advantage of any detected value, and receive large percentage rebates. With those advantages, many of them consistently win, effectively lowering payouts for all other players.

By not allowing CRW bettors, Oaklawn believes its on-track players benefit from larger payouts and churn that money back into the pools. At the recently concluded meet, on-track fans wagered \$38,173,563 on the Oaklawn races, up 8% from 2015. On-track wagering is

important because a larger percentage of that handle goes to tracks and purses than any other handle form.

Oaklawn also moved more wagers into the high-percentage industry return category through Oaklawn Anywhere, the track's account wagering service for in-state residents that has already generated more than \$1.5 million in purses. Handle for Oaklawn's races at Oaklawn Anywhere grew 35% over last year to \$8.9 million.

Oaklawn's field size is especially impressive because the track does not offer turf racing, which often brings large fields. The large fields can be explained, at least in part, by three purse increases during the meet that saw maiden special weight purses grow to \$76,000 from \$68,000 and allowance purses

increased to \$85,000 from \$75,000.

The successful meet goes against bleak scenarios painted by Dick Powell, who spoke on behalf of Racing and Gaming Services—a hub for some CRW players, at this year's Association of Racing Commissioners International conference.

"The data has shown that tracks that deny access to computer bettors have seen dramatic declines in their on-track business," Powell said.

After listening to that presentation, Arkansas Racing Commissioner Mark Lamberth quickly pointed out that those handle declines have not occurred at Oaklawn, which fared well despite added casino competition in recent years. That positive Oaklawn trend continued in 2016. **BH**


