

Brody's Cause gets post position 19 at the Kentucky Derby draw

NYQUIST IN FAMILIAR POST FOR DERBY RUN

ndefeated Nyquist drew post 13 and was tabbed the 3-1 morning-line favorite for the May 7 Kentucky Derby (gr. I) during the May 4 post position draw at Churchill Downs.

The Uncle Mo colt and champion 2-year-old male of 2015—owned by Reddam Racing, trained by Doug O'Neill, and to be ridden by regular jockey Mario Gutierrez—tops the 20-horse field, with Exaggerator (post 11) as the 8-1 second choice and Creator (post 3), Gun Runner (post 5), and Mohaymen (post 14) all 10-1 co-third choices.

"Breaking from 13 is fine," O'Neill said. "He was No. 13 when he won the Breeders' Cup Juvenile (gr. I) at Keeneland. The post didn't matter to us a ton, but we're happy with the outside, for sure."

Likely speed horses Danzing Candy and Outwork will both be outside in post 20 and post 15, respectively.

Maiden Trojan Nation drew the unenviable position on the rail, which statistically isn't the worst position based on win percentage (9.3%), but hasn't seen a winner since Ferdinand in 1986. As a closer, Trojan Nation figures to be unhampered by the inside post. Steve Asmussen, trainer of fellow closer and (continued on page 3)

NYQUIST IN FAMILIAR POST FOR DERBY RUN

Arkansas Derby (gr. I) winner Creator, was also unfazed by the inside draw.

"I don't think post position matters much for him," Asmussen said. "It's probably better that he's down there and not out on the far outside, where he could possibly get completely disinterested."

Asmussen also trains Gun Runner, and was content with his draw as well.

"It doesn't appear that there's much pace near him so hopefully he'll have a nice, clean break and a good 150-200 unimpeded yards for (jockey) Florent Geroux to decide how much of him he wants to use," he said.

Post 17, occupied by Bob Baffert-trained Mor Spirit, hasn't had a winner in 37 starts.

"The last time I had the 17 post was with Point Given and Gary Stevens, and here we are again," Baffert said. "It's funny, the way all the speed is on the outside, so it'll probably be two different races going on."

O'Neill was similarly interested in how the race would play out with the speed seemingly concentrated in the outside half of the gate.

"The most interesting thing is Danzing Candy in the 20 hole," O'Neill said. "Is he going to send hard and try to clear? If he does, that may affect his energy late. If he doesn't send hard, is that going to make us make the lead? I wouldn't mind (the lead) at all. He's shown versatility to win on the lead or off the pace, so we've got options."

'BRODY' BEAUTIFUL FROM THE BEGINNING

By all accounts, Brody's Cause, a two-time grade I winner and contender for the Kentucky Derby (gr. I), has been a good one from the start.

By three-time leading sire Giant's Causeway, Brody's Cause is out of the stakes-placed Sweet Breanna, by Sahm, and was bred by Gabriel "Spider" Duignan, Bill Arvin Jr., and Charlie O'Connor's Petaluma Bloodstock.

"For a Giant's Causeway he was built like a dirt horse," said Duignan. "The mare was a tough race mare in Canada (second in the 2006 Woodbine Oaks), and he's quite a bit like her."

Sweet Breanna is out of Sweet Roberta, the runner-up to Go for Wand in the 1989 Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies (gr. I).

Good-looking enough to be offered on the second day of the 2014 Keeneland September yearling sale as part of the Paramount Sales consignment, Brody's Cause was purchased for Dennis Albaugh by Steve Castagnola's Kempton Bloodstock.

"Mr. Albaugh would buy one or two horses to race at Prairie Meadows (Albaugh lives in Iowa), and in 2012 he ran Cozzetti in the Preakness Stakes (gr. I)," said Castagnola. Cozzetti, by Cozzene, was third in the Tampa Bay Derby (gr. II) and fourth in the Arkansas Derby (gr. I) before running seventh at Pimlico. "That gave him a taste. He understands it is a numbers game, and in 2014 he made his first big commitment. He bought nine horses that year."

Castagnola, with horsemen Barry Berkelhammer and Lisa McGreevy, as well as pedigree analyst Ryan Pezzetti, devised a system and sifted through the September sale for prospects.

Pezzetti devised an algorithm that combined Dosage, Class Index, and nick ratings, and the others looked at yearlings. Brody's Cause was on the short list.

"We liked the way he 'profiled', and he stood over a lot of ground," Castagnola said. "He had a presence and looked intelligent. He had a loose walk and he kind of marched up and back while being shown. I went back to see him multiple times and watched while others had him pulled out. He showed himself the same way every time."

With a range of \$200,000-\$250,000 for each horse, the team quickly found themselves being outbid.

"We decided we'd have to start looking at different horses or stretch a bit on the ones we liked," Castagnola said.

They stretched to \$350,000 for Brody's Cause, who later stood out in his early training at Berkelhammer's AbraCadabra Farm in Florida.

Brody's Cause has already earned \$1,123,138 after winning the Breeders' Futurity (gr. I) and Blue Grass Stakes (gr. I). He was third behind Nyquist and Swipe in the Breeders' Cup Juvenile (gr. I). BH

ALLIED/ELKSTONE RIDE WITH MOR SPIRIT

When trainer Bob Baffert shopped the 2015 Fasig-Tipton Florida sale of 2-year-olds in training for future classic prospects, his short list included a son of Ashford's first-crop sire Uncle Mo and a colt by Eskendereya.

He eventually settled on the son of Eskendereya, who was already off to a good early start at Taylor Made Stallions.

Baffert purchased Mor Spirit for \$650,000 in the names of clients Bernard Schiappa and Michael Lund Petersen, while Dennis O'Neill paid \$400,000 for the Uncle Mo colt, subsequent champion juvenile male Nyquist.

"Mor Spirit was very athletic and worked really well, while Nyquist looked good, too, but he was by Uncle Mo, who was a first-year sire, and he looked like he was going to be a sprinter to me, being out of a Forestry mare," Baffert recalled.

Produced from the multiple stakes-winning Dixie

Union mare Im a Dixie Girl, Mor Spirit was bred in Pennsylvania by Stuart Grant's Elkstone Group. He was purchased by pinhooker Ciaran Dunne as a yearling for \$85,000 from the Allied Bloodstock offerings at the Fasig-Tipton Kentucky October sale.

Clark Shepherd, partner with Bret Welker in Allied Bloodstock which plans matings for Elkstone Group, said Mor Spirit was initially entered in the Fasig-Tipton Kentucky July yearling sale but was withdrawn after developing a few problems.

"He was always a good horse and that is why we pointed him to the July sale," said Shepherd, who also planned the mating that produced Derby winner Animal Kingdom. "When he was a baby he was good. You just know when a good horse is a good horse. When we made the decision to scratch (from the July sale) we were very disappointed."

But by the time he was eventually sold, Eskendereya's offspring were performing well on the track and Mor Spirit's brother In for the Money had won two of his three starts.

"We're more about making a good racehorse than (planning for) the commercial market," Shepherd said of Allied's philosophy. "If you get a good baby on the ground or if you have a stallion that has a good runner or two, that's what makes your commercial market. It is a degree of luck, but I like to call it designed luck because it all begins with the mating and there are so many other variables from that point."

Dunne said Mor Spirit, who is a ridgling, "was the

pick of our group" consigned to Fasig-Tipton as part of his Wavertree Stables consignment. He estimated Mor Spirit would bring a final bid between \$200,000-\$300,000, perhaps as much as \$400,000, with the final price likely reflecting Eskendereya's early success.

"What we really liked about him is that he was kind of a leggy, twoturn horse and was a lovely horse to train," Dunne said. BH

BREEDING GIVING REPOLE EXTRA KICK

Racing will always be Mike Repole's first love, but as he segued to breeding Thoroughbreds and standing stallions, that side of the business is providing extra thrills.

Repole's homebred Outwork is entered in the May 7 Kentucky Derby (gr. I) at Churchill Downs off a narrow victory in the Wood Memorial (gr. I).

The colt is by Repole's 2010 Breeders' Cup Juvenile (gr. l) winner and champion 2-year-old male Uncle Mo, who in 2015 registered record earnings for a leading freshman sire.

"The Breeders' Cup Juvenile (gr. I) with Uncle Mo

was the best win of my life, and the Wood Memorial was the most special win of my life. To do it with a son of Uncle Mo, and the dam, Nonna Mia, who is named for my grandmother who will be (at the Derby). She's 90 years old this year. It was a special win in so many areas," Repole said.

"When it's a homebred where you raced the mom, you owned the dad, raced the dad, then you get that baby? It makes it even more special."

Repole retained a "healthy" percentage in Uncle Mo, who stands for \$75,000 at Ashford Stud near Versailles, Ky.


On May 4 Repole watched Outwork on the track in the morning, then headed to Ashford to see Uncle Mo and to WinStar Farm to see Nonna Mia.

"For me to spend the morning with Outwork and the afternoon with Uncle Mo and Nonna Mia, it's a pretty special day, a very special day," Repole said.

A bout of cholangiohepatitis saw Uncle Mo scratched from the Derby and prevented the son of Indian Charlie from racing in the Triple Crown.

From that low point in his racing life, Repole sees the three horses by Uncle Mo entered in this year's Derby as some level of vindication. Joining Outwork in the field are expected favorite Nyquist and Mo Tom.

"I love that Uncle Mo is a part of this Derby, not only for me personally, but he has three horses that are running and people are talking about him like they did in 2011. On one side I say we'll never know what would have happened. On the other side, you see three horses here from his first crop; we can all pretty much guess what would have happened." BH

NO DERBY PARTNER FOR RAMSEY

t turns out that Ken Ramsey's mystery partner in Oscar Nominated is...Ken Ramsey.

After Oscar Nominated unexpectedly (at 23-1) won Turfway Park's Spiral Stakes (gr. III) April 2, Ramsey let it be known that anyone willing to pay the \$200,000 supplemental Kentucky Derby (gr. I) entry fee could share in the colt's earnings through the Triple Crown series. As soon as he announced the plan, Ramsey said he had a taker. However, negotiations continued into Derby week without anything being signed.

"I told the man's agent that it was time to paint or get off the ladder," said Ramsey. The man decided to come down off the ladder. A Midwestern trainer then called Ramsey and said he had a client interested in the offer, but that, too, dried up.

"People think I'm making this all up, but it's real," said Ramsey, who declined to name the people involved in the failed negotiations.

But Ramsey isn't about to let these minor issues stop him from running in the Derby, a race the Kentucky native would dearly love to win. Ramsey and his wife, Sarah, are perennial leading owners at major race meets across the country, and also stand top stallion Kitten's Joy at their Ramsey Farm near Nicholasville, Ky., but the Derby is one achievement to elude them thus far.

Ramsey, who recently turned 80, wants to add that trophy to his case. But many of his runners are by Kitten's Joy, who excels with turf horses. So the Derby has proved elusive for the operation, which has started six horses in the Run for the Roses but has failed to finish better than eighth (Ten Cents a Shine in 2003).

"I could make a better case for Oscar Nominated if we would get more rain, but it's supposed to be 80 degrees with the sun shining brightly on my old Kentucky home," Ramsey said. "I think he'll run OK, but we didn't see a crystal ball that had Derby written all over it for him. Which is why Oscar Nominated wasn't Derby nominated."

So the Ramseys have had to transfer some funds from their horsemen's accounts at other tracks to Churchill Downs to cover the \$200,000 tab, which would make for one great story should Oscar Nominated pull another upset May 7.

"I saw Gov. Matt Bevin at an event last week," said Ramsey. "Since he hands out the Derby trophy, I told him I hope I have an appointment with him for the first Saturday in May." BH

STRONG DRAW FOR YEAR'S FIRST JUVENILE STAKES

The first open 2-year-old stakes of the year, run May 5 at Churchill Downs, is loaded with interesting stories.

Not usually the stepping-off point for juvenile stakes, Churchill is out front this year with the five-furlong \$100,000 Kentucky Juvenile Stakes. The race has attracted a particularly strong field of nine horses, including four fillies.

Wesley Ward conditions three of the fillies, all winners in their first starts at Keeneland by a combined 15 lengths.

The heaviest hitter, and 8-5 morning-line favorite, is Lady Aurelia, a Stonestreet Stables homebred daughter of Scat Daddy who won her April 21 debut wire-to-wire by 7 1/2 lengths.

She blazed through opening fractions of :22.57 and :44.93 before crossing the wire in track-record time of :50.85 for 4 1/2 furlongs. Lady Aurelia, co-owned by George Bolton and Peter Leidel, is expected to ship to England in June for the Royal Ascot meet.

Ward's other contenders are Con Te Partiro and Silvertoni.

Con Te Partiro, also by Scat Daddy, is owned by Gatewood Bell's Hat Creek Racing and was bred by K.C. Garrett Farm. She won her first race by 5 1/2 lengths in :52.03.

By leading sire Tapit, Silvertoni is owned by Bonnie and Tommy Hamilton's Silverton Hill and was bred by Clearsky Farms. She won her first-out by two lengths in :52.31 April 14.

The fourth filly is Cold Hearted Pearl, a daughter of Parading, trained by William Helmbrecht. The filly, owned by Jon Jazdzewski and bred by Ralph Kinder and Erv Woolsey, made her first start at Keeneland April 28, finishing fourth.

The Kentucky Juvenile field also includes potential first winners for freshman sires Stay Thirsty and Gemologist.

Thirstforlife will be Stay Thirsty's first starter. The colt out of grade II winner Promenade Girl (Carson City) is owned by Gary Barber and Vincent and Teresa Viola's St. Elias Stable and was bred by Camas Park Stud. Trained by Mark Casse, Thirstforlife is the only first-time starter in the field. He comes into the race off a :47 four-furlong bullet work April 26 at

Keeneland.

Stay Thirsty stands at Ashford Stud for \$10,000.

Bluegrass Gem, Gemologist's first starter, has already been tested once. Owned by Blue Checker Thoroughbreds, the colt finished second in an April 8 maiden special weight at Keeneland. He was bred by the Lyster family of Ashview Farm and is trained by John Hancock.

Gemologist stands at Win-Star Farm for \$15,000.

Another contender coming into the Kentucky Juvenile off of a win is Hey Mike, a son of Cape Blanco, who owned Keeneland's 4 1/2-furlong record for a day until Lady Aurelia broke it. Hey Mike is a Michael Hui homebred, trained by Mike Maker. BH

WAVELL AVENUE, TARIS MEET AGAIN

avell Avenue and Taris, first and third in last year's Breeders' Cup Filly & Mare Sprint (gr. I), meet again May 7 in the Humana Distaff (gr. I) at Churchill Downs, with the latter hoping for a cleaner trip this time.

Wavell Avenue (Harlington), owned by Michael Dubb, David Simon, Head of Plains Partners, and Bethlehem Stables, overcame a bit of trouble when she rallied outside from near the back of a 14-horse field to take the Breeders' Cup race at Keeneland.

Wavell Avenue finished a closing third in the seven-furlong Madison Stakes (gr. I) at Keeneland, her 2016 debut.

Taris (Flatter), a \$2.35 million Fasig-Tipton November purchase owned by Michael Tabor, Derrick Smith, and Susan Magnier, never really got a chance to run in the Breeders' Cup.

Taris didn't break sharply and ended up in contention along the inside. She never found room but still ran on well for third.

Since the Breeders' Cup Taris has won two graded stakes and finished second in a grade I event at distances of one mile to 1 1/8 miles; she cuts back cuts back to seven furlongs at Churchill Downs. BH

BIG BLUE KITTEN, SLUMBER RENEW RIVALRY

had Brown's stable companions Big Blue Kitten and Slumber, first and second in three grade I races last year, face each other again when they begin their 2016 campaigns in the Woodford Reserve Turf Classic (gr. IT) at Churchill Downs May 7.

Big Blue Kitten (Kitten's Joy), now racing for Calumet Farm, got the upper hand over Slumber in the Joe Hirsch Classic (gr. IT) and the United Nations (gr. IT) on the way to an Eclipse Award as champion turf male.

Michael Dubb, Sheep Pond Partners, and Bethlehem Stables' Slumber (Cacique) had his sole triumph over Big Blue Kitten when he won the Manhattan (gr. IT).

The pair haven't run since the Breeders' Cup Turf (gr. IT) at Keeneland, in which Big Blue Kitten finished third and Slumber fourth behind European raiders Found and Golden Horn.

Bolo (Temple City) and Tourist (Tiznow) both run after group I placings in their previous starts, Bolo in the Frank E. Kilroe Mile at Santa Anita Park, and

Tourist in the Maker's 46 Mile at Keeneland.

Two sons of Candy Ride, Grand Tito and Chocolate Ride, come into the race having recorded graded victories this year; as does Reporting Star (Circular Quay). BH

'HORSE COUNTRY' OFF TO SOLID START

orse Country, a Kentucky-based organization that launched its first Thoroughbred farms tours last fall in connection with the Breeders' Cup World Championships at Keeneland, sold about 8,000 tickets from January through May this year, executive director Anne Sabatino Hardy said May 4.

Hardy, who spoke during the University of Kentucky National Conference on Equine Law, said 18 locations, most of them horse farms, are now booking tours through the program, which is designed to elevate awareness of the breeding business and farm lifestyle—hopefully creating racing fans.

Tours of Ashford Stud, where 2015 Triple Crown winner American Pharoah stands, were sold out in a matter of days for the November-through-May period.

During Breeders' Cup week there were about 1,100 tours of 23 locations. Hardy said about onethird involved "extended" local stays.

"That's the really exciting thing, not only for Breeders' Cup but because of the effect it had on Central Kentucky," she said. "It really speaks to the

PITTSBURG PHIL: TEMPERANCE IS A VIRTUE

or Kentucky Derby week, we offer handicapping tips from Racing Maxims and Methods of Pittsburg Phil, edited and published by Edward W. Cole in 1908.

"Pittsburg Phil" was actually George Smith, a methodical gambler, never laying a bet unless he was certain that a horse was a substantial underlay. We could all learn from his wisdom:

"All consistently successful players of horses are men of temperate habits in life. Speculation on the turf, as in all other kinds of business, requires the best efforts of its devotees. You cannot sit up all night, drink heavily, and dissipate otherwise and expect to win money at the race track.

"You could not do it in Wall Street, and you could not do it running a store, so why do you expect to do it there?

"I do not mean that you are not to have any diversion whatever. If a man does not get it, he becomes what in turf vernacular would be called 'brain sour.' If a horse is continually worked and raced he loses his speed, health and ambition and has to be freshened with a rest. He is 'track sour' and stale." BH

CALUMET'S RICH CHURCHILL DOWNS HISTORY

he week's big grade I races presented a problem for Throwback Thursday: choosing between two races with 141 uninterrupted years of history.

On one hand is the Kentucky Oaks (gr. I); on the other, the Kentucky Derby (gr. I). The logical thing would be some kind of close connection between the two; therefore, the place to start would be Calumet Farm.

Established in the 1930s when Warren Wright converted his father's Standardbred facility to Thoroughbreds, Calumet has long been a fixture in the Louisville classics.

As owner and breeder, Calumet has more Oaks wins than any other with six. It leads Derby wins as owner, with eight, and as a breeder, with nine.

The farm's first Oaks win came in 1943 with Nellie L., a daughter of Blenheim II out of Nellie Flag, Calu-

met's first Derby entry who, coincidentally, started in the 1935 Derby as the favorite but finished fourth.

Calumet won again in 1949 with Wistful, a daughter of Sun Again— Easy Lass, who added the Pimlico Oaks and the Coaching Club American Oaks to become the first winner of the unofficial filly Triple Crown.

She produced Calumet's Gen. Duke, who would have been the favorite for the 1957 Derby if not for an injury the morning of the race. Calumet also won the 1949 Derby with Ponder.

Back-to-back Oaks winners by Calumet's Bull Lea—Blue Delight full sisters came in 1952 and 1953.

Real Delight took the 1952 running on her way to a second filly Triple Crown. As it was in 1949, Calumet also won the Derby, this time with Hill Gail. Still a more parallel connection than direct, even though Real Delight is the third

dam of Derby runner-up Alydar. Real Delight's sister Bubbley added a fourth Oaks the following year.

Having produced two Oaks winners, Blue Delight scored the hat trick in 1956 when Real Delight's and Bubbley's half sister Princess Turia, by Heliopolis, won the 82nd running of the Kentucky Oaks.

Ridden by Bill Hartack, the chestnut filly with a thin blaze battled Claiborne Farm's Doubledogdare the last eighth-mile of the Churchill stretch, winning by the narrowest of noses.

Princess Turia's fourth foal was by Calumet stallion On-and-On, a Nasrullah half brother to Calumet's 1958 Derby winner Tim Tam. The bay colt with a blaze resembling his dam's was named Forward Pass.

In 1968, Forward Pass became Calumet's eighth Derby winner when he was awarded the 94th renewal on the disqualification of Dancer's Image.

This made Princess Turia the only Kentucky Oaks winner to produce a Kentucky Derby winner.

Calumet's sixth Oaks win came in 1979 with Davona Dale, BH

WAGERING, PURSES RISE IN APRIL

horoughbred racing in the United States is enjoying a good year, having recorded its fourth consecutive month of increased wagering.

Handle, purses, and number of race days all showed increases last month, compared with April 2015. Total handle rose nearly 8.1% to \$929,101,792, and total purses paid increased more than 6.9% to \$90,184,575.

The total number of races also increased 4.5% to 3,138 and the total U.S. starts were up nearly 6.4% to 24,056. Keeneland was a significant contributor to the

growth. The Lexington track credited full, competitive fields for a nearly 23.8% increase in the all-sources handle to \$145,592,372. The average daily handle also rose just more than 16% to \$9,099,523, from \$7,841,141 during April 2015.

Keeneland registered an all-time, single-day handle record of \$21,736,983 April 9, the day of the Blue Grass Stakes (gr. I).

Year-to-date, handle is tracking ahead 4.4%, compared with the first four months of 2015. Purses are nearly even, despite a 4.15% decline in race days and a nearly 3% decline in races. BH

SPENDTHRIFT COLTS WIN IN DEBUTS

pendthrift Farm has made no secret of its admiration for Australian racing, investing heavily in yearlings as well as launching a breeding operation in Victoria last year, where it stands four stallions.

The investment paid off last week when two high-profile 2-year-old colts by leading sire Redoute's Choice, both prepared by Hawkes Racing, won their bows under Spendthrift's famed colors.

Redouble won at Canterbury April 27, and was followed three days later by Swear, who was successful at Hawkesbury in the Claret Stakes at 1,300 meters (about 6 1/2 furlongs).

Redouble was a A\$200,000 (\$164,060) Magic Millions purchase while Swear cost a little more, secured for A\$725,000 (\$553,393) from Inglis Easter.

Spendthrift has been active at Australian sales,

targeting colts with potential to develop as stallion prospects, and has struck early.

Both colts are by a stallion that has no peer as a sire of sires in this part of the world, and if they can translate talent into black type, they will fill the role they were purchased for.

Spendthrift purchased an additional eight yearlings this year at the Magic Millions and Inglis Easter sales. BH

SYNTHETIC SURFACES NOT DEAD YET

It was no surprise that, after the New York Racing Association Franchise Oversight Board said May 3 it would at least plan a 2017 capital budget expense of \$9-\$12 million to install a synthetic surface at Aqueduct, the reaction on social media was lopsidedly negative.

Such has been the case since the first such surface was used for a race meet in the U.S. at Turfway Park in 2005, where the Polytrack—despite some ups and downs over the years—remains in place, probably giving the wintertime racing facility extended life.

Elsewhere in North America four other synthetic tracks remain in use: Golden Gate Fields in California, Arlington Park in Illinois, Presque Isle Downs in Pennsylvania, and Woodbine in Ontario.

Criticism of synthetic surfaces largely stemmed from prominent racing writers and handicappers who didn't like the switch and the way they changed the dynamics of how races in the

dirt-obsessed U.S. were run.

The industry, for the most part, eventually backed away from synthetic surfaces. The California Horse Racing Board's horrible decision to mandate their installation at major tracks in 2006 provided the biggest setback for an effort that began with good intentions but was destroyed by politics and poor planning.

Based on reported data, synthetic surfaces at several tracks facilitated growth of field size and pari-mutuel handle. And perhaps more importantly, from the perspective of equine safety

they have done their job.

Claims that synthetic surfaces cause non-catastrophic injuries not typical on dirt were never proven or publicly quantified by the Thoroughbred industry. Public data, however, clearly suggests they fulfilled their original intent.

The Equine Injury Database confirms that from 2009-15, the catastrophic injury rate per 1,000 starts was lowest on synthetic surfaces.

The average for four tracks last year—Arlington doesn't make public the information it provides to the EID—was 1.19 per 1,000 starts while the three-surface average was 1.62.

This is not an indictment of dirt surfaces.

The EID shows the number of racing fatalities on dirt continues to decline, presumably because more attention has been paid to the way the surfaces are maintained, meaningful changes in equine medication policy, and improved pre-race exams.

A synthetic surface on what is now the inner-dirt

track at Aqueduct could be very useful for winter racing in New York—it could end talk of discontinuing it—as well as offer a better option for off-the-turf races during the spring and fall meets at the track.

It would be the only such surface in the Northeast and Mid-Atlantic region from December through most of March, which could prove advantageous when it comes to attracting horses.

Many questions must be answered before NYRA proceeds on the plan. But it shouldn't be so quickly panned or dismissed. BH
