BAFFERT TRIES TO COLLECT PREAKNESS

One year after being the hunted when winning the Triple Crown with American Pharoah, trainer Bob Baffert will take a second turn as the hunter in the May 21 Preakness (gr. I) when he sends out Collected. The Baffert-trained Mor Spirit failed to hit the board in the May 7 Kentucky Derby (gr. I).

Campaigned by Peter Fluor and K.C. Weiner's Speedway Stable, Collected is a fast son of City Zip out of the Johannesburg mare Helena Bay who won the Sham Stakes and Lexington Stakes (both gr. III) this season. Speedway purchased him for \$170,000 at the Ocala Breeders' Sale Co.'s March auction of 2-year-olds.

He punched his ticket to the Preakness when he breezed seven furlongs in 1:24 4/5 over a track labeled "good" May 13 at Churchill Downs.

"The Preakness has been the plan since the Lexington," said Baffert. "He's a fast little horse with a lot of speed, and we figure he deserves a (continued on page 2)

shot, especially with the shorter (than the Derby) distance. We'll have fun. We have a nice, fast horse who tries hard."

Baffert, a gifted judge of talent, is not exactly talking trash when it comes to Nyquist, who will be looking to annex the second leg of the Triple Crown and figures to be sitting just behind Collected and Laoban in the Preakness. In fact, he's downright realistic about Collected's chances.

"We're all up against it with Nyquist shortening up. He's a fast horse and he's in the zone. You show up with a horse like that, and if he fires, he wins. If he wavers a bit, then we have a chance. He will be tough to beat, and the only way to beat him is if he doesn't bring his 'A' game or gets beat through racing luck.

"You have to be impressed with Nyquist. He's fast and he kept on going in the Derby. I can't knock him."

Asked to compare Nyquist with American Pharoah, Baffert stated, "They're all different. All my Derby winners were different. Pharoah did it effortlessly, with a big, long stride. Nyquist has the speed and a winning attitude. But you have to remember there have been a lot of good horses that should have won the Triple Crown and some little hiccup got them. It was 37 years, dude."

Baffert declined when asked if he had any advice for Nyquist's trainer, Doug O'Neill.

"Doug's been through it once (with I'll Have Another in 2012). He doesn't come to me for advice. The Preakness is the easiest leg of the three. You come out of the Derby and you don't have to do much with them. He just needs to come back and do it again." **BH**

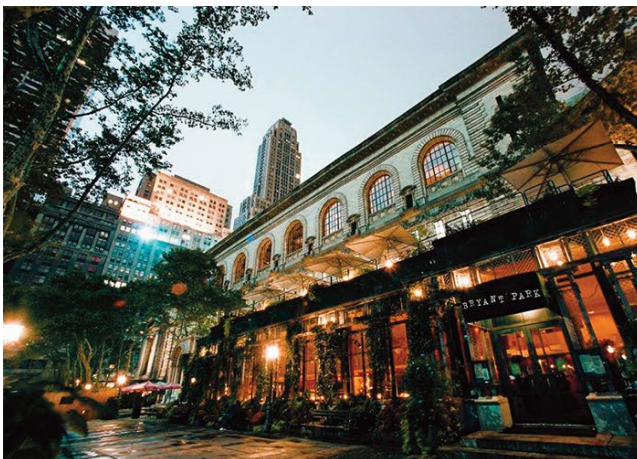

UNIFIED COULD RUN AWAY WITH PETER PAN

Centennial Farms' speedy Unified could run away with the May 14 Peter Pan (gr. II) at Belmont Park.

Unified ran the highest Equibase Speed Figure last time out—a 111—of eight entered for the Peter Pan. He looks to stretch out to 1 1/8 miles after winning the April 9 Bay Shore (gr. III) going seven furlongs, following a powerful debut score for Jimmy Jerkens at Gulfstream Park Feb. 21.

Unified worked well May 8 on the Belmont training track, a six-furlong bullet in 1:13.55.

The Candy Ride colt was a \$325,000 buy from the Lane's End consignment at the Fasig-Tipton New York select yearling sale in 2014.

Looking to spoil Unified's perfect record are key contenders General Malibu, Decorated Soldier, and Adventist.

General Malibu finished first in the 1 1/8-mile Federico Tesio April 9, but was placed second behind Preakness (gr. I) contender Awesome Speed. Decorated Soldier is another looking to stretch out

after winning the mile and 40-yard Northern Spur at Oaklawn Park April 16. Adventist was third in the Wood Memorial (gr. I), Gotham (gr. III), and Withers (gr. III). **BH**

CAVORTING TRIES A MILE IN RUFFIAN

Stonestreet Stables' grade I winner Cavorting will stretch beyond sprint distances for the first time in more than a year when she contests the Ruffian Stakes (gr. II) May 14 at Belmont Park.

The Bernardini filly was a finalist for 2015 champion female sprinter honors after wins in the Test (gr. I) and Prioress (gr. II), both at Saratoga Race Course.

In her last race at a mile, she finished ninth in the Davona Dale (gr. II) at Gulfstream Park Feb. 21, 2015.

"She's doing really well, and we haven't stretched her out," trainer Kiaran McLaughlin said. "She's bred to go a mile, so we're going to give her a try."

Phipps Stable's Carrumba, also by Bernardini, comes into the race for trainer Shug McGaughey off a win in the April 10 Top Flight (gr. III) at Aqueduct Racetrack. Undefeated at a mile, she has won two of three starts at Belmont Park.

Cavorting and Carrumba will also face Tim Thornton and Brererton Jones' multiple graded stakes winner Include Betty (Include).

Rounding out the field are Delaware Oaks (gr. III) winner Calamity Kate (Yes It's True), Chilukki (gr. II) winner Spelling Again (Awesome Again), and stakes winner Welcome Aboard (Rock Hard Ten). **BH**

CUNCO IS FRANKEL'S FIRST WINNER

The number of firsts associated with two-time European Horse of the Year Frankel just keep coming.

In Newbury's second race May 13, the first-born foal by Frankel, named Cunco, made his debut against six challengers going six furlongs on soft-to-good ground. He won by three-quarters of a length with seeming ease in a time of 1:16.40.

"I think he ran a big race, a good race," said Fernando Diaz-Valdes, racing manager and adviser to owner/breeder Don Alberto Corp. "He has a nice turn of foot."

Don Alberto became Cunco's breeder of record after acquiring his group-winning dam Chrysanthemum (Danehill Dancer) soon after she'd sold at the 2013 Tattersalls December Mare sale for 800,000 guineas (\$1,373,820) to Eaton Sales.

Cunco was foaled at Coolmore Stud in Ireland and Chrysanthemum was bred back to Frankel's sire, Galileo. The mare has a yearling Galileo colt, a weanling filly by Australia, and has been confirmed back in foal to Galileo.

Royal Ascot may be the next venue for Cunco, though trainer John Gosden has yet to make that call. **BH**

Q&A WITH DARLEY FLYING START STUDENT

Madison Scott, a former intern at *Blood-Horse*, has been accepted to the Darley Flying Start program, a two-year management course in the global Thoroughbred industry. Soon to be rebranded Godolphin Flying Start, the scholarship offers recipients unique opportunities.

Blood-Horse Daily: What are your aims in the Thoroughbred industry?

Madison Scott: My career goals included working in bloodstock for a prominent farm, but ultimately my aspirations stretch further. With marketing and equine degrees from the University of Kentucky, I aim to use my education and experiences to attract new industry participants, particularly by creating additional resources for young people interested in horses. Barriers to entry are high in racing, even to simply become a fan. I hope to combat that by welcoming more youth into the sport and equipping them with the tools to transition from fans to participants.

BHD: What has your experience in the industry been to this point?

MS: I have diversified my work and internship experience in an effort to gain exposure to many areas of the industry. I have spent time on the track, worked in sales offices, made rounds with a track vet, prepped yearlings, handled mares and foals, and formed a pinhook syndicate I manage with a partner. To gain international experience prior to applying for the course, I spent a semester studying and working in Ireland.

This breadth of involvement has allowed me to network and narrow my career ambitions while staying focused on the Thoroughbred industry. Living in Lexington while attending college was key; that gave me many more options and opportunities than I would have had attending school outside of Kentucky.

BHD: How did you feel when you were informed of your acceptance?

MS: Of course I was elated, but I immediately began thinking of all the logistics associated with leaving for the course. It is a bit overwhelming – there is much to do when you will be living a transient lifestyle for two years.

BHD: What does it mean to be accepted?

MS: Admittance to the course has been an am-

bition since 2009, and it feels wonderful to have accomplished that goal. It was not that long ago that I was at high school, with dreams of living in Lexington and working in the Thoroughbred industry. My acceptance provides an opportunity to look back and realize how fortunate I have been, and to thank all of those who have supported and mentored me along the way. In my case I've learned that passion pays off. People take notice of a young, enthusiastic racing fan and will do what they can to help.

Darley Flying Start is an incredible scholarship, and I hope to repay the generosity of Godolphin and Sheikh Mohammed by ultimately bettering the industry in some capacity.

BHD: What do you expect from the course?

MS: Incredible opportunities. Whether that means networking, going racing, visiting farms, or work placements while on the course, Flying Start offers trainees insight and experience into numerous facets of the industry globally. **BH**

**SOUTH AFRICAN CHAMPION RETIRES***By Sarah Whitelaw*

Legislate, South Africa's 2014 Horse of the Year, has been retired to Drakenstein Stud following a disappointing run in the Drill Hall Stakes (SAF-II). He leaves the racetrack having won seven of his 19 outings and more than 5.76 million rand (\$521,889).

Legislate's victories included four grade I triumphs: the Durban July (which he won on disqualification of original winner Wylie Hall), the Cape Derby, Daily News 2000, and Gold Challenge. He placed in three other grade I races, including this year's Queen's Plate, and he set a track record at 1,600 meters (about a mile) at Kenilworth.

Legislate will join former stablemate Futura at Drakenstein, as well as Duke of Marmalade, Kingsbarns, Philanthropist, Trippi, and What a Winter. He begins his stud career in the Southern Hemisphere spring later this year.

Legislate, a four-time champion, is a son of former Horse of the Year Dynasty and the Restructure mare Changers. Dynasty, currently one of South Africa's top stallions, is also responsible for two other Horse of the Year winners; Futura and Irish Flame. **BH**

Demonstrative seeks a third Iroquois Hurdle in Nashville May 14**IRISH PAIR TAKES ON LOCALS IN IROQUOIS***By Alastair Bull*

Irish jumps racing trainer Willie Mullins has sent two horses to Tennessee for the \$200,000 Iroquois Hurdle May 14, with a possible \$500,000 bonus in mind.

Any horse that wins both the three-mile Iroquois at Nashville and the three-mile World Hurdle at the March Cheltenham Festival within 12 months will earn the bonus, and the horses Mullins has sent are top-class hurdlers.

Nichols Canyon finished third this year to the Mullins-trained Annie Power in the Champion Hurdle at Cheltenham, the most important race of the year for two-mile hurdlers. He will be ridden in the Iroquois by champion Irish jumps jockey Ruby Walsh.

Shaneshill finished second to 2016 World Hurdle winner Thistlecrack in the Liverpool Stayers Hurdle at Aintree April 9.

Mullins knows what it takes to win at Cheltenham, having won 48 times at the festival.

"I think we need to internationalize jump racing, so I am happy to support the Brown Advisory Iroquois-Cheltenham Challenge," he said.

Leading the home team is Demonstrative (Elusive Quality). The 2014 Eclipse Award winner for champion steeplechaser won the Iroquois in 2013 and 2015. **BH**

POOR TECHNOLOGY STRIKES AGAIN

In an industry where 90% of money is wagered off-track, one would think speed, efficiency, reliability, and integrity of the pari-mutuel system are paramount. Sadly, one of racing's biggest days provided another reminder that such an emphasis doesn't exist.

TVG crashed more than an hour before the Kentucky Derby (gr. I) and did not come back online until after the race. The Derby registered its second-highest handle at \$192.6 million, leaving one to wonder how many millions failed to make it into pools as TVG customers were, at best, sent scrambling to other sites or outlets, or at worst, sat this year's race out.

Not all blame deserves to fall on the current pari-mutuel system as TVG said human error within the company caused the crash. But a better system to begin with would be less susceptible to such problems. ADW providers acknowledge huge efforts are made days and weeks in advance to prepare for large-handle days. Shouldn't a system be in place that can routinely handle Derby-day-level action?

Keep in mind the current system continues to fall short on integrity, despite repeated efforts. In October, a California Horse Racing Board committee acknowledged that tracks have real-time information on just 60% of wagers that show up in their pools.

Companies such as TVG, Churchill Downs, and The Stronach Group certainly believe in the possibilities of technology in their ADW operations as well as areas outside of pari-mutuel wagering. This month TVG parent company Betfair US launched an exchange wagering platform in New Jersey that is being marketed to bettors accustomed to the high-speed world of Wall Street. It will also offer in-race wagering.

Where is this same belief in technology from these companies and racetrack owners when it comes to the pari-mutuel product? Sure technology upgrades cost money, but there would be benefits in areas that have either not been possible, or hindered, by limitations of the current set-up.

Just a few benefits:

- More future wagers could be offered with unlimited fields. Imagine the Kentucky Derby future wager going from its current 24 betting interests to every single 3-year-old nominated to the classic.
- In horizontal wagers when scratches or surface changes occur, instead of refunds or forcing bettors to take the favorite in place of their scratched horse, bettors would be able to scan their live tickets and update them to the horses they want.
- Real-time monitoring would become a reality.
- Players would have instant access to pool information. This system would be able to list will-pays for every trifecta, every superfecta. **BH**




