Topped by a Medaglia d'Oro colt that sold for \$600,000, the Fasig-Tipton Midlantic 2-year-olds in training sale got off to a rocky start May 23 in Timonium, Md., with major downturns in every key statistical category, compared with last year's strong opening session.

Fasig-Tipton reported 157 horses sold for \$10,715,700, down 17.9% from the first-session gross of \$13,047,000 a year ago. Day 1 average fell 33.6% to \$68,253 from \$102,732. The 72 not sold represented an RNA rate of 31.4%, compared with a 23% in 2015. This year's median was \$34,000, compared with \$45,000 in 2015.

"I think everything held from what we have seen in other sales," said Midlantic sales director Paget Bennett. "Quality offerings do well and others struggle."

Noting the expanded catalog this year and the (continued on page 2)

particularly strong first session last year, Bennett said Fasig-Tipton would have liked to see a lower RNA rate but noted that many of the horses that went unsold were purchased outside the ring.

Rockbridge Bloodstock/Brett Santangelo, assisted by Mike Recio of South Point Sales, bought the session-topper on behalf of an unidentified new client from California.

"He is a big, two-turn horse who makes you dream about the classics," Recio said. "He should get better as he gets older. He is still maturing."

Consigned by Cary Frommer as Hip 21, the colt is out of the stakes-placed Lemon Drop Kid mare Kid Majic, dam of multiple stakes winner Miss Mischief. Bred in Kentucky by Allen Poindexter, the colt was a \$190,000 buy-back at the 2015 Keeneland September yearling sale.

Frommer said she was glad Poindexter allowed her to enter the colt in the May sale, the second-to-last of six major juvenile sales on this year's calendar,

rather than trying to get him in an earlier sale.

With Fasig-Tipton president and CEO Boyd Browning handling the bidding in the pavilion via phone, Stonestreet Stables went to \$510,000 to purchase Hip 162, a filly by The Factor.

The bidding provided drama several times as Browning asked the auctioneer to hold dropping the hammer to finalize the sale while Stonestreet representatives on the other end of the phone decided whether to continue.

Consigned by Eddie Woods, agent, the filly was produced from the winning Roar mare Ramblin Rosie, a half sister to grade I winner Buddy Gil.

Conspicuous among the RNAs were three juveniles by leading sire Tapit, including Hip 12, a colt from the Giant's Causeway mare Jackpot Joanie consigned by Randy Miles, who was bought back for \$700,000. A fourth Tapit, Hip 247 consigned by Eddie Woods, was purchased by EQB for \$400,000. **BH**

FEVER KEEPS NYQUIST IN MARYLAND

Travel plans for Nyquist to ship to Belmont Park the morning of May 23 were canceled when it was discovered he had spiked a fever.

The Uncle Mo colt, trained by Doug O'Neill for Reddam Racing, finished third in the Xpressbet.com Preakness Stakes (gr. I) in his first career loss.

"I think he has some sort of virus we need to get under control," O'Neill's brother and assistant Dennis O'Neill said. "He ate well, but his temperature was 102 so we decided not to ship. We drew some blood and will know more tomorrow."

Reddam and O'Neill planned to ship the colt to New York for the Belmont Stakes (gr. I) for a possible showdown with Preakness winner Exaggerator, who finished second to Nyquist in the Kentucky Derby Presented by Yum! Brands (gr. I).

Exaggerator, owned by Big Chief Racing, Head of Plains Partners, and Rocker O Ranch, walked the shedrow at Pimlico. Trainer Keith Desormeaux opted to keep the Curlin colt in Maryland the week after the Preakness rather than ship him to Belmont Park.

"He didn't do anything today but walk," Desormeaux said. "We'll probably go back to the track (Tuesday) morning."

Desormeaux said the plan for Exaggerator is to ship to New York May 29, which would give him almost two weeks at Belmont before the race. **BH**

TWO F-T JUVENILES ALREADY PROVEN ON TRACK

Buyers looking for race-ready juveniles at the Fasig-Tipton Midlantic 2-year-olds in training sale will have the opportunity May 24 to buy two that already placed in high-level maiden races in New York and Kentucky.

Consigned by Dean's List as Hip 593, Holy Gold has finished second twice in \$100,000 maiden special weight company—one at 4 1/2 furlongs at Aqueduct Racetrack and the other at five furlongs at Belmont Park—for owner/breeder Seacoast Thoroughbreds of New England and trainer James W. Ferraro.

The New York-bred daughter of Touch Gold out of the Holy Bull mare Holy Shmoly has earned \$40,000.

"She is sound and definitely more seasoned than most at a 2-year-old sale," said Dean Purdom, who operates Dean's List. "The owner and buyers are in a perfect position with her. The owner already has her earnings and knows she can run, and the buyers know they have a horse that has shown she can race and she still qualifies as a maiden. I am glad they decided to leave her in the sale."

From the Crane Thoroughbreds' consignment, Hip 467, Makealittlelove finished second in an April 28 Keeneland maiden special weight, in which the winner set a 4 1/2-furlong track record.

Trained by Mike Maker for Three Diamonds Farm, the Warrior's Reward filly produced from the multiple stakes-winning Premiership mare Darluna was purchased by Clovis Crane for \$30,000 from the Allied Bloodstock consignment to the Fasig-Tipton Midlantic October yearling sale last year.

Earlier in 2015 Canaan Creek Stables bought the filly, bred in Kentucky by David Gilinsky, for \$45,000 from the Timber Town consignment.

Because the two had already raced competitively, they only galloped during the sale's under tack show.

"She's a really, really good filly," Clovis Crane said, adding it's not unusual for the Midlantic sale catalog to include one or two horses that have already raced.

"She's well traveled. I sent her to trainer Mike Maker at Turfway. She's been to Penn National, Churchill Downs, Keeneland, and now Timonium."

Also on offer during the May 24 concluding session are six of the fastest horses during the under tack pre-sale workouts.

Tied for the best eighth-mile work time of :10 in the Tuesday catalog were Hip 371, a Harlan's Holiday—Awesome Maneuver colt (Casse Sales); Hip 461, a Friesan Fire—Crafty Toast colt (Scanlon Training and Sales); Hip 568, a First Samurai—Grand September filly (Casse Sales); and Hip 592, a More Than Ready—Holly's Way filly (Grassroots Training and Sales).

MIDLANTIC SALE A HOMECOMING FOR BRENDEMUEHL

This year's Fasig-Tipton Midlantic 2-year-olds in training sale is a homecoming for Danzel Brendemuehl, who sells under the Classic Bloodstock banner.

The Florida-based pinhooker has been a mainstay at the Timonium sale and proudly advertises her consignments have sold at least one stakes horse each year since selling grade II winner Gimmeawink during her first year in 2002.

"For a small consignor we've had really good results across the board," said Brendemuehl, who also

sold Emirates Airline Dubai World Cup (UAE-I) winner Roses in May for \$115,000 at the 2002 Ocala Breeders' Sales Co.'s April sale.

Brendemuehl could not oversee her consignment last year because she had been diagnosed with breast cancer and had to undergo chemotherapy. Supervision fell to fellow Florida horsewoman Kim Harrison. With her health improved—a recent mammogram showed a recurrence of some cancer for which she will undergo radiation therapy—Brendemuehl is back at Timonium and spending time catching up with fellow consignors and buyers who missed her.

"It was an adventure," Brendemuehl said of her health issues. "It changes everything. I had a real temper, but now I stop and think before I cut down someone. I am more empathetic in general."

Brendemuehl credits Harrison—who has consistently overseen the consignment at the barn—and her other personnel, including Angel Moreno at the farm in Ocala, for a successful Classic Bloodstock sale in 2015.

"I had a consignment going (when diagnosed with cancer) and Kim Harrison, who has been my right hand, and my employees stepped up. I owe them so much," Brendemuehl said.

Brendemuehl, described her eight-horse consignment as a "solid group of horses."

"There will be some horses that become famous out of this sale. There always is. I think we are on an upward trend. This is a really a good place to sell a horse, and I hope that continues," she said.

The horsewoman graduated from the University of Hawaii with a degree in marketing and ended up in Florida after working in the advertising industry.

She says juvenile sales have evolved to the point where buyers are looking for the perfect horse. She also believes too much emphasis is placed on speed during the pre-sale under tack works.

She said, "It is very competitive and it's picky, a lot of the best horses on the track are not perfect. The problem with the 2-year-old market is the clock. I think we should do away with the clock. Frank Stronach has a really good system. He has had really consistent results by only galloping his 2-year-olds."

As for her health issues, the resilient Brendemuehl is optimistic. "Cancer can't beat me," she said. **BH**

TWO CLASSIC RUNNERS TO REGROUP

Following his seventh-place finish in the Xpressbet.com Preakness Stakes (gr. I), Uncle Lino returned to California May 22 for some time off and to be evaluated for a tendon injury.

Tom Mansor, Purple Shamrock Racing, and trainer

Gary Sherlock's Uncle Lino (Uncle Mo) dueled with favored Nyquist until the top of the stretch then steadily dropped back.

"He ran his ass off until he was injured," Sherlock said. "At the head of the lane, I started to say, 'C'mon.' I thought he was going to go. Then you could see he was beat. I didn't know he had an injury (because) he finished the race and galloped out. They stopped him on the turn coming back."

An equine ambulance transported Uncle Lino off the track where veterinarians diagnosed a minor tendon inflammation.

"We will evaluate him at home," Sherlock said. "He definitely has an injury, but it's not life-threatening. He probably will need some time, but he's not that bad. He'll live to fight another day."

Meanwhile, trainer Eric Guillot said McCormick Racing and Southern Equine Stable's maiden Laoban, sixth in the Preakness, will spend time at Keeneland.

The Uncle Mo colt usually shows speed, but raced evenly throughout. Guillot has no regrets. "I always take my shot," he said.

Guillot added he would "take it easy with him and try to break his maiden. I just wish he had handled the track." **BH**

ANOTHER FEAT FOR CURLIN

As if Curlin needed any more exclusive groups to belong to, the victory by his son Exaggerator in the May 21 Xpressbet.com Preakness Stakes (gr. I) just inducted him into one more. The 12-year-old son of Smart Strike became the 10th Preakness winner to sire a Preakness winner.

Standing at Hill 'n' Dale Farms for \$100,000, Curlin has made a career out of accomplishing the rare feat. As a racehorse, he retired with record earnings for a North American-based racehorse of \$10,501,800. He was also one of 10 horses since 1939 to win two or more Horse of the Year titles and one of nine to win their titles consecutively.

Curlin won the 2007 Preakness after finishing third in the Kentucky Derby Presented by Yum! Brands (gr. I) behind Street Sense and Hard Spun. He would go on to finish second in the Belmont Stakes (gr. I) to the filly Rags to Riches.

Among the 10 Preakness winners to sire a Preakness winner, six of the Preakness-winning sons would win the Belmont with four of those sweeping the Tri-

ple Crown. The two who won only the Preakness and Belmont were Native Dancer, who finished second in the Kentucky Derby, and Risen Star, who was third in the Derby.

Exaggerator plowed his own ground in the Preakness by becoming the new chief earner for Curlin with \$2,971,120 in purse money to date. Exaggerator, out of the Vindication mare Dawn Raid, heads into the Belmont with four graded stakes wins to his credit, including the Santa Anita Derby (gr. I) and last year's Saratoga Special (gr. II) and Delta Downs Jackpot Stakes (gr. III). Curlin's previous earnings leader was Palace Malice, who won the 2013 Belmont Stakes.

Curlin is solidly planted in the middle of the top 10 leading sires on the general sire list through May 23. Besides Exaggerator, the sire has been represented so far by two other graded stakes winners this year in Curalina, winner of the grade I La Troienne Stakes, and Terra Promessa, who won the Honeybee Stakes and Fantasy Stakes (both gr. III) at Oaklawn Park. Curlin is the co-leading sire with two grade I winners this year. He is tied with Uncle Mo, Medaglia d'Oro, and the late Unbridled's Song. **BH**

RE-ELECTION OF NYRA CORPORATE OFFICERS

The New York Racing Association board of directors will consider a resolution for election or re-election of its corporate officers May 25.

The meeting will include the usual reports from NYRA officials. At a meeting in April, the board approved a resolution recommending Gov. Andrew Cuomo and the state legislature return NYRA to private control after a three-year state oversight period.

The corporate officer resolution lists the following nine individuals who serve or will serve "at the pleasure of the NYRA directors," according to the meeting agenda packet.

They are Christopher Kay, president and chief executive officer; Joseph Lambert, senior vice president, chief administration officer, general counsel, and corporate secretary; Lynn LaRocca, senior vice

president and chief experience officer; Martin Panza, senior vice president of racing operations; David O'Rourke, vice president and chief revenue officer; Bob Hughes, vice president and chief information officer; Glen Kozak, vice president of facilities and racing surfaces; Robert Sica, vice president of security; and James Ranton, vice president and chief human resources officer.

BUSHRANGER GETS FOURTH STAKES WINNER

Danetime's son Bushranger is enjoying a good year so far, siring four European stakes winners.

Mobsta looks to be a progressive sprinter following up a recent listed stakes win to land the Weatherbys Ireland Greenlands Stakes (Ire-II) by a head at the Curragh May 21.

Bushranger's daughter Now Or Never—recent Derrinstown Stud One Thousand Guineas Trial (Ire-III) winner—finished third in the Tattersalls Irish One Thousand Guineas (Ire-I) May 22.

Another daughter, Ridge Ranger—a half sister to Saturday's Temple Stakes (Eng-II) winner Profitable (Invincible Spirit)—followed her recent stakes win with a second in the Cecil Frail Stakes at Haydock.

Bushranger's fourth stakes winner of the year comes via this month's Prix Texanita (Fr-III) winner Ross Castle.

A dual group I-winning juvenile, Bushranger was relocated from Ireland to the Turkish Jockey Club's

Izmit Stallion Station for the 2016 season.

He is not the only son of Danetime son enjoying a notable season. Myboycharlie has sired two stakes winners this year, including the recent Pour Moi Coolmore Prix Saint-Alary (Fr-I) runner-up Camprock, while grade I winner Euro Charline ran second in the Al Shaqab Lockinge Stakes (Eng-I). **BH**

CASTLES BUILT ON SAND

It's a good thing for racing that Frank Stronach already exists.

Otherwise, the comparatively timid souls running the balance of the American Thoroughbred industry would find themselves in the uncomfortable position of needing to invent him.

To this observer, Stronach's best attribute is that he seems hellbent on dragging racing into the 21st century, even if—outside of upscale shops, fine dining, and jackpot bets—he's not quite sure how to get that accomplished.

Case in point—Stronach's new baby—the Pegasus World Cup. Maybe I just lack the vision necessary to see how flipping the old Donn Handicap into a 12-part syndicate for high-rolling owners makes for better racing.

Still, one must admire Stronach's salesmanship. Do the Pegasus partners realize that one of them just spent one million dollars for the dubious honor of leaving the starting gate from the 12-hole for a nine-furlong race at Gulfstream?

The clash between racing's traditions and Stronach's vision of the future made it into the *New York Times* last week. Tom Pedulla reported that Timothy Ritvo—the chief operating officer for The Stronach Group's racing development business—seemed resigned to disappointing "traditionalists" with the group's plans for racing in Maryland.

Ritvo's statements to the paper—he noted that Pimlico was a broken-down 19th century palace "built on sand"—hinted that the storied racetrack's days were numbered. Ritvo made it seem all but inevitable that the Preakness will eventually find a new home at nearby Laurel Park.

Also owned by Stronach, Laurel is roughly three times larger than

Pimlico and is more suitable for a Gulfstream-like entertainment complex makeover.


Whither Pimlico? The good people of Baltimore would almost certainly view moving the Preakness to Laurel as a sacrilege similar to allowing the Colts to escape to Indianapolis. But "sacred ground"—a notion popular with certain sentimental sports fans—is regularly trumped by cold, hard cash.

"Listen," Ritvo told Pedulla, "they moved Yankee Stadium".

For now, this budding controversy has been put on ice. Officials from The Stronach Group moderated their previously stated positions May 21, and Pimlico's future will be studied over the coming year on behalf of the Maryland Stadium Authority.

Meanwhile, well over 100,000 pilgrims braved stormy skies and a decrepit and inconveniently located racetrack to see Exaggerator turn the tables on a valiant Nyquist.

This rank sentimentalist hopes Stronach and the city of Baltimore can find a solution that works for everyone. It would be a shame for Pimlico to be reduced to the Starbucks where Afleet Alex once went to his knees, or the McDonalds where that infield drunk once tried to punch Artax. **BH**
