UNCLE MO COLT HEADS BARRETT'S PINHOOKS

Homebreds and pinhooks at just about every price range constitute the catalog for the Barretts May sale of 2-year-olds in training and horses of racing age May 27 at Del Mar. It begins at 1 p.m. PDT.

With California-based Nyquist having won this year's Kentucky Derby Presented by Yum! Brands (gr. I), Hip 61 should attract interest. By Nyquist's sire Uncle Mo, the colt is the catalog's most expensive pinhook, having sold for \$360,000 at last year's Keeneland September yearling sale. Earlier, he sold for \$240,000 at the 2015 Keeneland January mixed sale.

Raul Reyes' Kings Equine consigns the colt, who equaled the second-fastest furlong time of :10, at the May 25 under tack preview. Marathon Farms bred the colt in Maryland from the stakes-winning Dayjur mare Lucette. The mare has already produced 2009 Hirsch Jacobs Stakes (gr. III) winner Everyday Heroes (Awesome Again).

The Kings Equine consignment includes several other six-figure pinhooks, including Hip 18, a Kentucky-bred Kitten's Joy filly, who sold earlier this year for \$125,000; and Hip 99, a Kentucky-bred Speights-

town colt, who sold as a yearling for \$155,000.

"I think our top end might be a little better this year," Barretts general manager Kim Lloyd said. "We love the fact that we can have a wonderful sale here at Del Mar."

Horse of the Year Ghostzapper has a colt and a filly in the catalog. John Brockleback, agent for Vern Dickman's Legacy Ranch, brings Hip 2, a Kentucky-bred son of the stakes-placed Arch mare Aide. The colt sold for \$18,000 at the Keeneland September yearling sale.

Andy Havens' Havens Bloodstock Agency is consigning Hip 95, a Ghostzapper filly named Awesome Form. Bred in California by Premier Thoroughbreds and Alan Klein from the stakes-placed Dynaformer mare Quarayed, the filly has not been through a prior sale.

Other major sires represented in the catalog include Candy Ride, City Zip, Lucky Pulpit, Malibu Moon, More Than Ready, Pioneer of the Nile, Tale of the Cat, Unbridled's Song, and Unusual Heat.

A combination of sale scheduling across the country and events taking place at Del Mar have led to the late May date for the sale in 2015 and 2016, since Barretts moved to Del Mar. Previously, the company conducted its sales at Fairplex Park in Pomona, a racetrack that has since closed, and the date was earlier in the month, usually between the Kentucky Derby and Preakness Stakes (gr. I).

"We would love to have it back to that date in the future," said Lloyd.

The main catalog comprises 138 2-year-olds, with several other juveniles and a few older horses of racing age added as supplemental entries. **BH**

DRAFT BEER IS FIRST WINNER FOR TAPIZAR

Gainesway's grade I-winning freshman stallion Tapizar got his first winner May 26 in a \$40,000 maiden special weight race at Gulfstream Park.

Draft Beer, out of Henny Blues (Hennessy), broke quickly in the 4 1/2-furlong race and never got a serious challenge from any of the field's other eight contenders. He won by 4 1/2 lengths in :51.65.

Both the colt and his dam were bred in Florida by Harriet Finkelstein and Hartley/de Renzo Thoroughbreds. Draft Beer was offered through the Four Star Sales consignment at the 2015 Keeneland September yearling sale, where agent Tom Haughey bought the colt for PTK for \$23,000.

Dane Kobiskie trains Draft Beer for PTK along with a colt named I Shod the Sheriff, who became freshman sire Caleb's Posse's first

winner April 28.

Draft Beer is the first foal out of Henny Blues, a half sister to grade II stakes winner Blues Street (Street Cry) and grade III-placed Beal Street (Street Cry).

Tapizar, a son of Tapit who won the Breeders' Cup Dirt Mile (gr. I), stands at Gainesway for \$15,000. **BH**

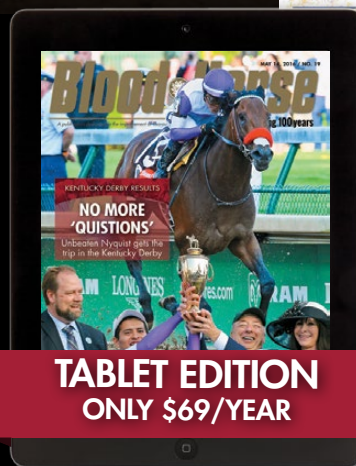

MACLEAN'S MUSIC HAS FIRST WINNER

Freshman sire Maclean's Music was represented by his first winner when Glen Hill Farm homebred Is Everybody Happy won his debut at Delaware Park May 25.

The 2-year-old colt trained by Tom Proctor was sent off as the 2-5 favorite and did not disappoint, winning by 3 1/2 lengths over Howbouthemcowboys in final time of :52.39 for 4 1/2 furlongs. The track record is :51.80.

Is Everybody Happy is the second foal and the first winner out of the Medaglia d'Oro mare Water in the Pond. He descends from the female family of grade I stakes winner Condo Commando and multiple graded stakes winner Yearly Report.

An 8-year-old son of Distorted Humor, Maclean's Music won his only race, a six-furlong maiden special weight at Santa Anita in

1:07.44, but had to be retired due to complications from the removal of a fractured splint bone.

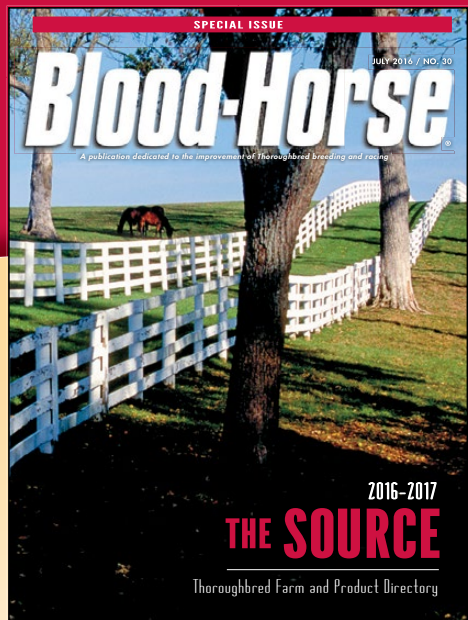
He is a half brother to the grade III winner Kentuckian, and his second dam Defer West produced the stakes winners Shooter, Ghost Vapors, and Mclean's Music's grade-II winning dam, Forest Music.

Maclean's Music stands at John Sikura's Hill 'n' Dale Farms near Lexington for a 2016 fee of \$6,500. **BH**

EXAGGERATOR: THE HORSE WHO KEPT GAINING

The Exaggerator who won the Preakness Stakes (gr. I) is better than the Exaggerator who ran second in the Kentucky Derby Presented by Yum! Brands (gr. I).

The Derby edition of Exaggerator was better than his Santa Anita Derby (gr. I)-winning model, which was better than his Sentient Jet Breeders' Cup Juvenile (gr. I) version, which was better than his Saratoga Special (gr. II)-winning form, which...

The above is the Equibase Speed Figure assessment of Exaggerator, who has steadily improved through a rather demanding race schedule.

In winning the Preakness, Exaggerator earned his highest ESF to date, 107, which for the son of Curlin is nothing new. He has failed to register a career-best ESF only once in his 11 starts; a winning run in the slop of the Santa Anita Derby (gr. I)—he earned a 103.

Since that effort Exaggerator earned a 106 in the Derby; then the Preakness 107. He had closed 2015 with a 103, winning the \$1,000,000 Delta Downs Jackpot Stakes (gr. III) before opening his 3-year-old season with a 104 second to Nyquist in the San Vicente Stakes (gr. II) and a 105 third in the San Felipe Stakes (gr. II).

His first five ESFs last year were 71 (debut), 87 (maiden win), 88 (Saratoga Special win), 95 (Claiborne Farm Breeders' Futurity [gr. I] second), and 97 (Breeders' Cup Juvenile fourth).

The steady improvement is impressive for both Exaggerator and trainer Keith Desormeaux, who calls Exaggerator an exceptional talent. The Preakness marked the fifth start since mid-February for Exaggerator, following a 2-year-old season in which he raced six times.

Nine of those 11 career starts have been in graded stakes. Exaggerator has started at seven different tracks and raced in five different states.

"The most important thing is this horse is—I've repeated this for two weeks—is his ability to recover from his efforts. And he recovered from the Derby quickly," Desormeaux said after the Preakness. "Even today, first comment when he pulled up here at the winner's circle was, 'Keith, he cooled out already.'"

"And the horse has his heart rate down again. His respiratory rate was almost too normal, and you could see a real calm look in his eyes. Most horses when they run that huge effort, they're bug-eyed and rattled and sweated up even. He was totally calm."

Triple Crown winner American Pharoah improved his ESF in each of his classic races last year. Exaggerator will try to follow suit with a planned start in the Belmont Stakes (gr. I). **BH**

RULERSHIP FILLY SETS SALE RECORD

A record-breaking price for a filly from the first crop of Rulership (King Kamehameha) highlighted an active market at the Hokkaido Training Sale of 2-year-olds at Sapporo Racecourse May 24.

Maurice, the reigning Japanese Horse of the Year, was bought at the 2013 HBA Training Sale for ¥10,000,000 (\$98,000).

Despite a 13% smaller catalog than last year's, the sale's ¥1,035,800,000 (\$9.42 million) gross was up 2.7% over 2015, and the ¥6,814,473 (\$61,950) average rose 12.1%. The ¥5,000,000 (\$45,455) median was unchanged.

The record-setting Rulership filly, the sale's highest price, is Hip 80, sold to JS Company for ¥46,000,000 (\$418,182). The filly, who clocked the fastest two-furlong breeze-up of :21.83 at the training preview was consigned by Haruya and Masashi Yoshida's Oiwake Farm.

The seventh foal out of Salvador (Sunday Silence), the filly is a granddaughter of the U.S.-bred Curitiba, a multiple graded stakes winner in Brazil.

Rulership won five graded stakes, including the Audemars Piguet Queen Elizabeth II Cup (HK-I). **BH**

BARN QUARANTINED AT THISTLEDOWN

Officials at JACK ThistleDown Racino have quarantined one barn because two horses recently tested positive for strangles.

In a notice on the track overnight sheet, officials said Barn 24 was quarantined and disinfected. Two horses in the barn were removed from the property at the northeast Ohio track, and all other horses in the barn are being monitored on a daily basis.

Strangles, a bacterial infection in the upper respiratory tract of horses, causes fever and swelling of the jaw.

Officials said PCR tests performed on the two horses came back positive for the condition.

Any horses that were in contact with the two removed from the grounds have had negative PCR test results.

ThistleDown officials adjusted training hours in light of the situation. Regular training is permitted from 5:30-8 a.m. EDT and 8:30-9:30 a.m. From 9:45-10:30 a.m., only horses stabled in Barn 24 are permitted on the racetrack. **BH**

KNOWING WHEN TO STAY IN

Tom VanMeter, owner of VanMeter Sales, is the co-breeder of the Uncle Mo—Dream Street, by Tale of the Cat filly that Pike Racing sold for \$1 million to become the sale-topper at the May 24 Fasig-Tipton Midlantic 2-year-olds in training sale at Timonium, Md. VanMeter talks about the decision to mate Dream Street to Uncle Mo and why he retained an interest.

MarketWatch: The fifth foal out of Dream Street is by Indian Charlie, and that filly, Lassofthemohicans, is grade II-placed. Is that why you bred her to Uncle Mo, because he was a promising new sire or because he was a son of Indian Charlie?

Tom VanMeter: Because of Indian Char-

lie, no question about it. I have a history with Indian Charlie. John Gaines, Don Beaver, and I all bought half of Indian Charlie right before the Santa Anita Derby (gr. I). (*Indian Charlie won the Santa Derby by 2 1/4 lengths.*) At the three-eighths pole in the Kentucky Derby (gr. I), I thought we had it, and he wound up getting passed by two eventual champions. (*Dual Classic winner Real Quiet was named champion 3-year-old male that year, and Kentucky Derby second-place finisher Victory Gallop was champion older male in 1999.*) Indian Charlie was such a cool horse that we lost too soon.

So then Uncle Mo comes along, and he was brilliant at 2 and trained on a bit at 3. Now he's become this amazing horse. If Nyquist had won the Preakness (Stakes, gr. I), Uncle Mo would have become the leading sire, with just his first crop doing the running.

MW: The Uncle Mo 2-year-old filly was bought back for \$80,000 as a yearling, and you eventually sold her privately but also retained an interest. Why?

TVM: Al Pike also bought the 3-year-old out of this mare, a son of Malibu Moon named Cad-eyrn that we also put through the same Midlantic sale last year. He was a great big colt out of a proven sire, but he had a blemish and we sold him for \$160,000. The filly wasn't like the big guy, but she was well put together and typey. We just felt good about her.

When she got to the sale, she was some kind of special. Go back and watch her under tack work; the rider taps her once but otherwise doesn't move on her. (*The filly worked the co-fastest quarter of a mile in :21 2/5.*)

MW: Who has Dream Street been bred to this year? Another visit with Uncle Mo?

TVM: She's been bred back to Malibu Moon. But if this girl goes on to do something special like we all expect she can, then, yes, I would think we're looking at another trip back to Uncle Mo. **BH**

LEAR'S PRINCESS HALF SISTER TO START

Pretty City Dancer, a half sister to grade I winner Lear's Princess, will attempt to win her first race May 27 at Churchill Downs.

The filly is making her second start for trainer Mark Casse and owner John Oxley after finishing third in a May 5 4 1/2-furlong maiden special weight race, where she stumbled at the start and ran greenly through the stretch. She stayed with the leaders and held on to third, finishing 8 1/4 lengths in front of the fourth-place finisher.

Gainesway Thoroughbreds bred the daughter of Tapit out of the Carson City mare Pretty City in Kentucky. Oxley purchased Pretty City Dancer for \$825,000 at last year's Keeneland September yearling sale from Gainesway's consignment.

In addition to Lear's Princess, Pretty City has produced two other winners from 10 foals of racing age. She is the dam of two other foals by Tapit, including

an unnamed yearling and a 3-year-old colt named Conviction.

Owned by Alto Racing, Conviction is currently in training with Todd Pletcher. The colt has only started twice, both this year, finishing third in each.

Lear's Princess (Lear Fan) won the 2007 Gazelle Stakes (gr. I), beating that year's champion 3-year-old filly Rags to Riches by a half-length, and finished second in both the Coaching Club American Oaks and the Alabama Stakes (both gr. I). **BH**

Lear's Princess defeats Rags to Riches at Belmont Park

MELAIR FEATURES IMPRESSIVE MAIDEN WINNER

On a busy May 28 Santa Anita Park card that features a number of stakes races, many are interested to see the outcome of Enola Gray's second start.

It wasn't just that Nick Alexander's homebred won her debut April 10 in a 6 1/2 furlong maiden special weight race for California-bred 3-year-old fillies, it was how the daughter of Grazen cruised to victory.

The Phil D'Amato-trained filly set the pace early, then hit another gear in the turn and sped away from the field to win by 16 1/4 lengths at odds of 4-1. Under the guidance of Tyler Baze, Enola Gray hit the wire in a sizzling 1:13.71, not far off the track record of 1:13.11 set by Square Eddie in 2011.

In her first start since that breakthrough effort,

Enola Gray will be one of the headliners on a card featuring five stakes for California-bred or California-sired horses with purses totaling \$775,000. Off her eye-catching debut, the gray or roan filly is likely to be the favorite in the field of six for the \$200,000 Melair Stakes for 3-year-old fillies, but it will also be her first start around two turns at 1 1/16 miles. **BH**

THOROBEAM FARM'S CRAIG BEAM JOINS OHIO PANEL

Craig Beam, owner and operator of Thorobeam Farm in Sabina, Ohio, has been named by Gov. John Kasich to the Ohio Thoroughbred Race Fund three-member committee.

Beam joins previous appointees Kimpton Williams and Daniel J. Gutterman on the OTRF advisory committee. The OTRF supports breeding in the state and has grown substantially because of racetrack-based video lottery terminals.

Beam, 64, and his wife Cathy have been racing horses since 1992.

"We bought a yearling at the 1992 Keeneland sale and also bought a racehorse at the track," Beam said. "We went to some of the Ohio Thoroughbred Breeders and Owners seminars early on and things just evolved from there."

One of Beam's top horses was the filly Amen Hallelujah, who was named 2009 Florida-bred champion 2-year-old filly. The multiple graded stakes winning daughter of Montbrook—Sara's Success, by Concorde's Tune was bred by Thorobeam Farm and

earned \$610,081.

Beam also stood the multiple stakes-winning Concorde's Tune stallion Mr. Silver in Ohio for several years.

"One of the reasons I am looking forward to my new position is that I hope to further the breeding program in Ohio," Beam said. **BH**

HALF SISTER OF HAVRE DE GRACE BREAKS MAIDEN

Mademoiselle Coco, a half sister to champion Havre de Grace, broke her maiden in her third start May 25 at Delaware Park.

Owned and bred by Nancy Dillman and trained by Larry Jones, the 3-year-old filly Mademoiselle Coco made her first start around two turns and grabbed the early lead under Gabriel Saez. She never looked back en route to a two-length victory over Sherini, covering the one mile and 70 yards in 1:45.12 on a track rated fast.

Mademoiselle Coco, by Medaglia d'Oro out of the Carson City mare Easter Bunnette, finished seventh and sixth in her first two starts at sprint distances at Fair Grounds Race Course & Slots and Churchill Downs, respectively.

Havre de Grace, by Saint Liam out of Easter Bunnette, also was bred by Dillman. She was purchased for \$380,000 at the 2008 Keeneland Sep-

tember yearling sale by Fox Hill Farm.

Havre de Grace, also trained by Jones, went on to win three grade I stakes, including the Woodward against males in 2011, and earn \$2,586,175. She was voted champion older female and Horse of the Year for 2011, and in 2012 was purchased for \$10 million by Mandy Pope's Whisper Hill Farm at the Fasig-Tipton Kentucky November sale. **BH**

UNDERAGE GAMBLING RULES TIGHTENED IN NY

The New York State Gaming Commission May 23 approved a regulation to standardize and increase penalties against gambling operations—including racetracks—that let any minor under age 18 place wagers on their products.

The move by the NYSGC is the latest attempt to address betting-related problems, including the expected rise in compulsive gamblers as the state expands wagering opportunities with the opening next year of three new, large commercial casinos. The commission also approved a uniform self-exclusion rule for compulsive gamblers at casinos.

The underage betting penalties affect operators of racetracks, video lottery terminal casinos at racetracks, lottery vendors, and groups that are allowed to offer charitable gambling.

The action came despite concerns from the New

York Gaming Association, whose members include racetrack operators of VLT casinos. The group said the rule isn't necessary, calls for unduly harsh penalties, and removes consideration of mitigating circumstances, according to a transcript of the NYSGC meeting.

A second group representing supermarkets, taverns, restaurants, gasoline shops, and convenience stores urged a number of changes, including the state agreeing not to enforce the rule until lottery vending machines are equipped with identification card readers. The NYSGC didn't change the rule to address the group's opposition.

The rule doesn't address casinos now under construction in three parts of the state because the process began before the casino rules were devised. Officials said new, underage gambling sanctions are being developed to apply to the casinos.

The new rule imposes penalties for underage betting on a graduated scale against licensed track, VLT, and other gambling operators.


For racetracks, the NYSGC will penalize association of corporate owners whose facilities permit someone under the age of 18 to place a wager. There would be a \$1,000 fine for the first violation, a \$5,000 fine if a second violation occurs within a year of the first, and a \$10,000 fine for a third violation.

A fourth violation that occurs within a year of another violation calls for a \$25,000 fine and "such action as the commission may deem appropriate," including suspension or revocation of any license or privilege to operate or manage a track in this state, the rule states. **BH**
