FAST START FOR MISSION IMPAZIBLE

Mission Impazible won a pair of grade II stakes and earned more than \$1.2 million in a 21-start, four-year racing career from 2009-12.

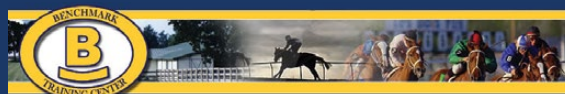
A grade I win proved elusive as Mission Impazible finished second in three top-level stakes. But he's not second in 2016, as the 9-year-old son of Unbridled's Song sits atop the first-crop sire list and already has a stakes winner in Tremont Stakes victor Silver Mission.

Mission Impazible raced for Steve Davison and Randy Gullatt's Twin Creeks Racing and stands in New York at Becky Thomas' Sequel Stallions near Hudson. Twin Creeks and Sequel offered strong support to get Mission Impazible's stud career started, and they are the breeders and owners of Silver Mission, who has earned \$161,000 in purses and an additional \$93,300 in breeders, owners, and stallion owner awards from the New York Thoroughbred

Breeding Fund.

Silver Mission is joined by fillies Proud Mission, who broke her maiden first time out May 22 at Lone Star Park; and Bourbon Lane Stable's Paz the Bourbon, who ran second in her May 26 debut at Belmont Park and is being pointed to the July 17 Lynbrook Stakes for New York-bred fillies.

"We couldn't have scripted the start any better," said Gullatt. "I'm not totally surprised. I know Mission himself was such a good, early horse from day one. We're seeing that in a lot of his babies. They're enjoying their training and are saying 'yes' every morning. We're getting the results from that, I believe."

One believer is Jamie Hill of McMahan & Hill Bloodstock, which runs Bourbon Lane Stable. Besides Paz the Bourbon, whom they paid \$150,000 for at the Ocala Breeders' Sales Co.'s March sale, they purchased a Mission Impazible Maryland-bred for a client.

"The horse has great promise," Hill said of the young stallion. "And the fact he's standing in New York is great. People are going to see that New York is a great place to make a young stallion."

Twin Creeks Racing is proud of Mission Impazible's hot start.

"With 2-year-olds, you can never count your chickens until they hatch; things happen," Gullatt said. "But when they happen like this, it's pretty awesome. It's incredible when it happens in May and June."

Mission Impazible has 48 named 2-year-olds in his first crop. He bred 105 mares his second season (yearlings of 2016) and 60 last year. He will have covered close to 100 mares this season in New York and, according to Gullatt, they've gotten some interest from Kentucky.

"The way things are going, there'd have to be some begging to put him there," he said. "As long as the New York breeders program is going, I think he's in a good spot." **BH**

NEW MA FUND DEAL FAVORS STANDARDBREDS

Thoroughbred horsemen in Massachusetts will get a significantly smaller allocation of the state's multimillion dollar Race Horse Development Fund for purses and breeders' awards as a result of a unanimous decision to revise the split between the Standardbred and Thoroughbred industries.

The Massachusetts Gaming Commission's Horse Racing Committee voted 5-0 June 20 to divide the RHDF 55% to harness horsemen and 45% to Thoroughbred horsemen, retroactive to Jan. 1, 2016. The previous split was 75%-25%, Thoroughbred to Standardbred.

Massachusetts Gaming Commissioner Gayle Cameron, the sole member of the MGC to sit on the HRC, told *Blood-Horse* that the number of current live racing days in the state for each breed affected the decision.

After the MGC in 2014 denied a license to Suffolk Downs' gaming partner Mohegan Sun to develop a \$1.75 billion casino on the racetrack grounds, there were only three days of Thoroughbred racing there in 2015. When the MGC granted a slots parlor license to Penn National Gaming Inc., the company completed the purchase of the state's only harness track and there were 100 days of live racing at Plainridge Park Casino last year.

Plans call for six days of live Thoroughbred racing at Suffolk Downs and a 15-day meet at the Brockton Fairgrounds in 2016. By state law Plainridge must increase its live meet to a minimum of 115 days this year and then 125 days annually.

"Look, they (the Standardbreds) have the bulk of the business now and all of the numbers have flipped as far as live handle, employment, and ancillary jobs outside of the track. The only numbers that haven't changed would be the simulcast handle on Thoroughbred racing, even at Plainridge, and that was a

plus for the Thoroughbreds," Cameron said. "The Standardbred people made a pretty compelling case."

As big of a blow as the decision is to Thoroughbred horsemen, who now lose 40% of their RHDF monies allocated when the ratio is factored in, it could have been worse.

"Their (the Standardbred horsemen) original brief called for flipping the splits 75% to the Standardbreds and 25% to the Thoroughbreds," said Cameron, who noted the June 20 decision may be revisited at the next HRC meeting scheduled for late October.

Under state statute, the RHDF is fueled by a percentage of the license fees and gaming revenue from Plainridge Park Casino and two future destination resort casinos to be developed in Greater Boston and the western part of the state. There is also a Native American casino coming to the southeastern part of the state but different regulations apply to the federally recognized Mashpee Wampanoag tribe.

The RHDF monies for the racing industry, regardless of breed, are allocated 80% to purses, 16% to breeders, and 4% to backstretch welfare. There is approximately \$8 million escrowed in the fund from 2015 currently designated for the Thoroughbred horsemen. **BH**

MAJOR MILESTONE FOR STORMY ATLANTIC

Central Kentucky sire Stormy Atlantic gained his 100th black-type winner June 17 when Tahanee won the Omega (Arg-III) at San Isidro in Buenos Aires, Argentina.

A 22-year-old son of Storm Cat, Stormy Atlantic stands at John Sikura's Hill 'n' Dale Farms near Lexington for a 2016 fee of \$25,000.

Stormy Atlantic also has 39 graded stakes winners among 840 winners from 1,150 foals in 15 crops of racing age. He is the sire of six champions, including Canadian Horse of the Year Up With the Birds. His 1,179 starters, which include 72 black-type placers, have earned purses of more than \$79 million.

Other top progeny include grade I winners Get Stormy, Stormy Lucy, Stromello and group II winner Barbecue Eddie.

Los Criollos' Tahanee, a 3-year-old filly trained by Roberto Pellegatta, was bred by Phalaris Srl from the Danehill Dancer mare Tawafeej, whose foals include South African stakes-placed Titlee.

Stormy Atlantic, who stood at Bridlewood Farm in Florida before joining the Hill 'n' Dale roster in 2003, won a pair of stakes and earned \$148,126. His dam, Hail Atlantis, by Seattle Slew, was a grade I winner, and his second dam, Flippers, is one of seven stakes winners produced from 1965 co-Horse of the Year Moccasin. **BH**

DISCREETLY MINE SOLD TO URUGUAY

Discreetly Mine, sire of last year's Juvenile Dirt Sprint Stakes winner Sheikh of Sheikhs, has been sold to stand at Norman Fox's Haras Lacala in Uruguay. The deal was brokered by Chad Schumer of Schumer Bloodstock in association with Diego Mitagstein of Perhaps Bloodstock and Pablo Núñez.

Winner of five of 13 starts and approximately \$800,000 in earnings, the son of Mineshaft capped his career with a victory in the 2010 King's Bishop Stakes (gr. I) at Saratoga Race Course. He also won the Amsterdam Stakes (gr. II), Risen Star Stakes (gr. II), and Jersey Shore Stakes (gr. III), and ran second in the 2009 Champagne Stakes (gr. I).

Discreetly Mine is the sire of eight black-type placers from three crops of racing age sired during his time at Lane's End Farm near Versailles, Ky. In addition to Sheikh of Sheikhs, his progeny include multiple stakes winner Control Stake and grade III-placed Classy Class.

Discreetly Mine was bred by E. Paul Robsham out of the 1995 Alabama Stakes (gr. I) winner Pretty Discreet and is a half brother to grade I winner and Central Kentucky sire Discreet Cat and the grade I-placed Pretty Wild.

"We're pleased to acquire such a high-class race-horse," Chad Schumer said. **BH**

HISTORIC START BY UNCLE MO

Uncle Mo's remarkable start at Ashford Stud begs the question of whether he has been the most successful first-crop and second-crop sire ever in North America.

Blood-Horse sought the answer by compiling the first-crop and second-crop records since 1980 for the stallions that led their respective freshman sire classes. Because of the tremendous growth in mares bred and available purses, allowances had to be made, and we adjusted all progeny earnings to reflect their value in 2016 U.S. dollars.

By adjusted total earnings, Claiborne Farm's Danzig (first crop raced in 1984) still stands out as North America's most successful first-crop sire. In 2016 dollars Danzig's first-crop earnings equal \$4,962,208 compared with Uncle Mo's first-crop earnings of \$3,675,294.

Danzig continued to excel as a second-crop sire but lost the top spot by adjusted earnings to Darley's Street Cry, who had \$7,604,733 for his second-crop year. Uncle Mo, with \$7,368,722 in progeny earnings through June 16 (which includes Nyquist's \$1 million bonus for winning the Florida Derby, gr. I), is well poised to overtake Street Cry.

Uncle Mo is in good position to become the leading sire by combined first-crop and second-crop earnings. Danzig holds the lead now with \$11,951,396 in combined adjusted earnings while Uncle Mo is nipping at his heels with \$11,044,016. **BH**

OBVIOUSLY COMES UP ACES IN BELMONT DEBUT

In his first Belmont Park start, West Coast-based Obviously came within .02 seconds of Elusive Quality's course record when he completed the one-turn mile in 1:31.65 to win the Poker Stakes (gr. IIIT) by 3 3/4 lengths June 18.

With jockey Jose Lezcano aboard for the first time, grade I winner Obviously defeated two other grade I winners. With his front-running win, the 8-year-old Choisir gelding earned the week's top Equibase Speed Figure of 120—the second time in three 2016 starts Obviously has registered an ESF of at least 120.

After watching front-running Obviously get caught in the final strides of his first two starts

this year on the Santa Anita Park turf course, losing each of those grade II events by a neck, trainer Philip D'Amato opted to ship Anthony Fanticola and Joseph Scardino's Obviously east. Assistant trainer Chris Davis said Obviously has improved at age 8.

"He's coming into his own," Davis said. "He really is just maturing. He's one of those horses that you don't want to run every two or three weeks; you've got to hand pick the best races for him, but he's really doing well." **BH**



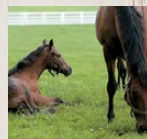

WELL-RELATED TRIO AT BELMONT PARK

Two close relations to grade I winners and a filly out of a grade II winner debut in a \$75,000 maiden special weight race for 2-year-old fillies at Belmont Park June 22.

The 5-1 morning-line favorite of this trio is Treadway Racing Stable's Coasted, whom Jose Lezcano rides for trainer Leah Gyarmati. She is by Tizway out of the Malibu Moon mare Malibu Pier, whose three graded stakes victories came in the Santa Ana Stakes (gr. IIT), Santa Barbara Handicap (gr. IIT), and the Beverly Hills Handicap (gr. IIIT).

Bred by Spendthrift Farm, Coasted was a \$210,000 purchase for Jeff Treadway at the 2015 Keeneland September yearling sale.

Sitting at 6-1 is Noble Ready, a More Than Ready filly out of the Kris S. mare Aristocratic Lady from Christophe Clement's stable. Her dam also has produced Western Aristocrat, winner of the 2011 Jamaica Handicap (gr. IT) at Belmont Park.

Bred by Grapestock, Noble Ready was a

FARISH GETS TEXAS LIFETIME ACHIEVEMENT AWARD

The Texas Thoroughbred Association held its annual awards banquet June 18 at Lone Star Park with Ivan Fallunovalot receiving the Texas Horse of the Year award to top the previously announced equine winners. The TTA's human awards weren't announced in advance, and the top honor, the T.I. "Pops" Harkins Award for lifetime achievement, went to William S. Farish.

To the general public, Farish is known as a successful businessman, philanthropist, and the former U.S. Ambassador to the United Kingdom, and on the national racing scene he is a two-time Eclipse Award winner for outstanding breeder and the 2009 recipient of the Eclipse Award of Merit for lifetime achievement. His Lane's End in Kentucky is one of the leading stallion farms in the country.

In his home state of Texas, Farish has been a vital part of the industry, as he served on the TTA board of directors and as TTA president in the 1980s before pari-mutuel wagering was legalized again in the Lone Star State. His Lane's End Texas, located in Hempstead and formerly known as Huisache Farm, stood all-time leading Texas stallion Valid Expectations and stands current leading Texas stallion Too Much Bling.

Farish has been a perennial top breeder and owner in Texas, and he has been a major donor to the Texas Thoroughbred Educational Fund, which provides grants to TTA members and their children to help them reach their educational goals. Several scholarship recipients were on hand to present the trophy for that night's Lane's End Stallion Scholarship Stakes for Texas-breds.

Other awards went to Dallas and Donna Keen's Remember Me Rescue as the Thoroughbred Charities of America Award of Merit winner for Texas. Remem-

ber Me Rescue helps find new careers and homes for retired racehorses. The Allen Bogan Memorial Award went to Denis Blake for his efforts to promote the TTA and Texas racing and breeding through *American Racehorse* magazine. The Blood-Horse leading breeder award went to Eileen Hartis, breeder of Ivan Fallunovalot.

A son of Valid Expectations, Ivan Fallunovalot won four of seven starts in 2015 with earnings of \$312,200. Trained by Tom Howard and owned by Lewis Mathews Jr., the gelding won the King Cotton Stakes at Oaklawn Park and the David M. Vance Sprint and Remington Park Sprint Cup in Oklahoma. He ended his season as the only Texas-bred to compete in the 2015 Breeders' Cup, and he finished ninth in the Breeders' Cup Sprint.

At the TTA board meeting earlier in the day, Phil Leckinger of Tioga, Texas, was elected as president of the association. Leckinger brings 30 years of business experience and 20 years in the horseracing industry. **BH**

BIG TWO WEEKS FOR SCAT DADDY

Few stallions have made more of an impact on world racing in the past two weeks than Ashford Stud's late sire Scat Daddy.

The son of Johannesburg—Love Style, by Mr. Prospector, had two graded stakes winners during racing at Belmont Park June 10-11. He was represented by Celestine in the Longines Just a Game Stakes (gr. IT) and Chilean-bred Dacita in the New York Stakes (gr. IIT).

The following week, he had two juvenile stakes winners at Royal Ascot in England. He has a budding superstar in Lady Aurelia, the 2-year-old filly who romped in the Queen Mary Stakes (Eng-II) June 15 at Royal Ascot by seven lengths, while hopes are also high for Caravaggio, already rated favorite for the 2017 Two Thousand Guineas (Eng-I) after winning the Coventry Stakes (Eng-II) June 14 for trainer Aidan O'Brien.

Celestine was bred in Kentucky by Phoenix Rising Farms and bought as a yearling for \$100,000 by James Bryan Jr.'s Phaedrus Flights, which tried to sell her as a 2-year-old, but the fall-of-the-hammer price was not enough. Bryan races her and has now won five stakes, including two graded stakes this year. Celestine is the second stakes winner and first graded winner out of her dam Mona Mia. She has won six times in 12 starts and earned \$784,755.

Dacita is a gem that has dazzled on two continents. She was a multiple group

I winner in Chile and the champion 2-year-old filly of 2014 and champion 3-year-old filly of 2015 before she was brought to the U.S. in 2015 by Pete Bradley's Bradley Thoroughbreds. The filly is co-owned by Bradley and Sheep Pond Partners. Her dam, Daja, has produced 10 winners from 10 foals to race, including two graded stakes winners out of three black-type winners and two group I-placed runners. Dacita was bred by Haras Paso Nevado, which stood Scat Daddy during the 2009-11 Southern Hemisphere breeding seasons.

Scat Daddy has sired 73 black-type winners to date, of which 45 won graded/group stakes.

The sire power lost when Scat Daddy collapsed and died suddenly Dec. 14, 2015, at age 11 was substantial, but he has six sons standing at stud. They are No Nay Never at Coolmore Stud in Ireland (€17,500); Handsome Mike at Pleasant Acres Stallions in Florida (\$5,000); Daddy Long Legs at Stroud's Lane Farm in Florida (\$4,000); Frac Daddy at Park Stud in Ontario (Can\$4,000), Daddy Nose Best at BG Thoroughbred Farm in California (\$2,500); and Finale at Hunter Creek Farms in New Mexico (\$2,500). **BH**

OUT-OF-COMPETITION TESTS SET FOR WV

The West Virginia Racing Commission plans to launch its out-of-competition program in conjunction with the \$750,000 West Virginia Derby (gr. II) Aug. 6 at Mountaineer Casino, Racetrack & Resort.

WVRC executive director Joe Moore June 21 said officials met at Mountaineer "to continue working on (developing) an out-of-competition testing program. The desire is to have the program in place for the West Virginia Derby. We'll also be going to Charles Town to meet with employees in the hope of having the procedures in place for the Charles Town Oaks."

The Oaks, a grade III event at Hollywood Casino at Charles Town Races, is scheduled for Sept. 17.

Kelli Talbott, senior deputy attorney general who serves as legal counsel for the WVRC, said a basic out-of-competition testing rule has been on the books for a few years, and that rule will be used for the two graded stakes this year.

The Racing Medication and Testing Consortium is hoping the more comprehensive regulations for out-of-competition testing are adopted by all

racing jurisdictions.

"The goal is to get that rule in place in every jurisdiction," RMTTC executive director Dr. Dionne Benson said. "It would lead to a much more aggressive (program). So it's good to see the (WVRC) willing to take on that responsibility." BH

LA CRESSONNIERE LATEST STAR FOR YOUNG SIRE

When Le Havre retired in 2010 to stand at Haras de la Cauviniere, he took with him excellent credentials as a racehorse. He won four of his six starts and ended his brief career with a victory in the Prix du Jockey Club (French Derby, Fr-I).

Le Havre's sire Noverre (Rahy), rated the best 3-year-old miler in Europe, made a disappointing start at stud and was sold to stand in India. Subsequently, he was represented by Le Havre and the group/grade I-winning fillies I'm A Dreamer, Music Show, and Enora. It probably didn't help that Noverre was a three-quarter brother to Arazi, a brilliant juvenile but disappointing sire.

On the distaff side, Le Havre's dam Marie Rheinberg was a half sister to group I-winning sprinter/miler Polar Falcon, the sire of the outstanding English stallion Pivotal. On a less positive note, Marie Rheinberg was by Surako, a German-bred group III winner who ran second in the BMW 127 Deutsches Derby (German Derby, Ger-I). At stud Surako sired just one minor stakes winner.

In recent times, however, some less than obvious stallion prospects have emerged in France; other examples include multiple leading sire Linamix, Chichicastenango, and Kendargent. In the case of Le Havre, who began his career at €5,000 but stood for €35,000 in 2016, his cause was helped by connections who ensured that he received not only numbers but some mares that gave his offspring some clever pedigrees.

That support was rapidly rewarded: Le Havre's first crop contained 10 stakes winners

from 89 foals, headed by Avenir Certain (inbred to three-quarters relatives from the Native Partner family), who captured the 2014 Poule d'Essai des Pouliches (French One Thousand Guineas, Fr-I) and Prix de Diane (French Oaks, Fr-I). Le Havre has two stakes winners in his second crop, and in his third there are already four, including La Cressonniere, who at the weekend emulated Avenir Certain by adding the Prix de Diane to her Poule d'Essai des Pouliches victory.

If there were questions concerning Le Havre's pedigree, the same can't be said of La Cressonniere's dam Absolute Lady (Galileo), who might be described as royally bred, both literally and figuratively. La Cressonniere's sixth dam is King George VI's One Thousand Guineas heroine Hypericum, and her fourth dam Light O'Battle is a full sister to The Queen's Highclere, successful in the One Thousand Guineas (Eng-I) and Prix de Diane.

A minor winner, Light O'Battle never produced a stakes winner, but her Mill Reef daughter Lobmille left three, including Le Cressonniere's granddam, the Shadwell Stud Nell Gwyn Stakes (Eng-III) scorer Lil's Jessy. La Cressonniere's unplaced dam Absolute Lady is a sister to Paris Winds, who took the Revidere Stakes at Monmouth Park. **BH**
