'BREXIT' IMPACT ON U.S. SALES UNCLEAR

Management of two major U.S. equine sales companies say it is too early to tell if the 52-48% vote in favor of Great Britain exiting the European Union and the resulting drop in currency values will impact upcoming North American yearling sales.

Once the votes were counted, the value of the British pound fell more than 10% against the U.S. dollar between its high of \$1.50, hit late Thursday, to the overnight low of \$1.32, its lowest since 1985. The vote also had ramifications throughout world financial markets, with the Dow Jones Industrial Average and Standard & Poors 500 both declining by more than 3%.

Fasig-Tipton will conduct a horses of racing age sale July 11 and a selected yearling sale July 12, both in Lexington, to be followed by the Aug. 8-9 selected Saratoga yearling sale and the Aug. 13-14 Fasig-Tipton New York-bred yearling sale, both in Saratoga Springs, N.Y. Keeneland then follows with its mara-

thon September yearling sale Sept. 12-24.

"I wouldn't anticipate it having a major impact," Fasig-Tipton chief executive officer and president Boyd Browning Jr. said. "Our sales in July and at Saratoga are predominantly for an American-based buying population. Obviously there is a lot of volatility in the financial markets today, which is not unexpected given the world we live in. A lot of these ebbs and flows tend to normalize, as there is less emotion and more rational thought and planning in the financial markets over time. I think there will be some stabilization between now and when the sales occur."

"I think it is too early to have any idea what will happen," said Keeneland sales director Geoffrey Russell. "The initial reaction in the market to the vote has been negative, but I would expect it to stabilize

over time. With the British pound dropping precipitously, there is a concern. A lot of our major buyers are international traders, so just because the pound has gone down doesn't mean it will affect them. But for the small individual buyer, it could have a huge effect."

"I wish I was smart enough to know what is going to happen with currency markets between June 24 and July 12, because if I did I wouldn't have to worry about it," Browning said with a chuckle. "We've already seen the pound dip and hit its low and have some recovery. Don't get me wrong, it had a significant downturn and if my business was denominated in pounds clearly it's had an impact today. We see market fluctuations and volatility more on a day-to-day basis today than we did 25 years ago, but I wouldn't expect it to have a major impact on yearling sales in North America. But we prefer to certainty to uncertainty." **BH**

MO TOM FAVORED IN OHIO DERBY

There are several reasons GMB Racing's Mo Tom was installed the 5-2 morning line favorite for the \$500,000 Ohio Derby June 25 at JACK ThistleDown Racino.

Mo Tom, a son of red-hot sire Uncle Mo, is the only horse in the cast who competed in this year's classics. He ran eighth behind champion Nyquist in the May 7 Kentucky Derby Presented by Yum! Brands (gr. I). He's a graded stakes winner—one of three in the field—with a victory in the Lecomte Stakes (gr. III) this winter at Fair Grounds Race Course & Slots.

He also performed well, after being checked both times, behind Gun Runner in the Veterans Ford Risen Star Stakes (gr. II) and TwinSpires.com Louisiana Derby (gr. II). Gun Runner bounced back from the Kentucky Derby last weekend to run within 0.8 of a second of Churchill Downs' 1 1/16-mile track record in the Matt Winn Stakes (gr. III).

Mo Tom also gets the services of jockey Javier Castellano, the winner of the Eclipse Award as top rider the last three years.

The Kentucky-bred will break from post 8 in his first non-graded effort since he won last year's Street Sense Stakes in Louisville.

Richard Ravin and Patricia's Hope's Coked and Loaded won last year's Iroquois Stakes (gr. III) but has failed to find the winner's circle since. The bay colt by Colonel John faded in Churchill's Pat Day Mile (gr. III) and the Arlington Classic Stakes (gr. IIIT) in his last pair of starts for trainer Larry Rivelli.

The other graded winner in the field is Thatlookonyerface, who took Woodbine's Marine Stakes (Can-III) on Tapeta May 14. The Kentucky-bred Summer Bird gelding has yet to start on dirt, but both of his wins have come around two turns.

Three exit Belmont Park's Peter Pan Stakes (gr. II) that was run May 14. Peter Pan runner-up Governor Malibu, who is not entered in Saturday's race, flattered the form by running fourth despite encountering trouble in the Belmont Stakes presented by NYRA Bets (gr. I). Wild About Deb, 5-1 on the morning-line for the Ohio Derby, finished third in the Peter Pan off a maiden win at Santa Anita Park in April. The Eskendereya colt has been training at Churchill for trainer Phil D'Amato.

Treadway Racing Stable's Adventist finished three-quarters of a length behind Wild About Deb in the Peter Pan and is 3-1 second choice in Ohio Derby. The son of Any Given Saturday finished third in three graded starts in New York prior to the Peter Pan—the Withers (gr. III), Gotham (gr. III), and the Wood Memorial (gr. I).

Fifth-place Peter Pan finisher Decorated Soldier, trained by Todd Pletcher with John Velazquez up, drew the outside post for the Ohio Derby. **BH**

SARAH SIS HEADS CHICAGO HANDICAP

Sarah Sis, winner of the Lexus Raven Run Stakes (gr. II) at Keeneland last October, will seek her first visit to the winner's circle since that race when she contests the Chicago Handicap (gr. III) at Arlington Park June 25.

In four starts this year since the Raven Run, the closest to victory she has come was a second-place finish in the American Beauty Stakes at Oaklawn Park in January.

Trained by Ingrid Mason, the 4-year-old daughter of Sharp Humor comes into Saturday's race after finishing eighth in her previous start in the Humana Distaff (gr. I) at Churchill Downs, a surface over which she has failed to fire in two appearances.

Since the Humana Distaff, Sarah Sis has put in four works at Arlington, including a bullet five-furlong move June 5. In her only two starts over Arlington's Polytrack, she won her debut and followed it up with a second-place finish in the Arlington-Washington Lassie Stakes in September 2014.

"I'm pretty confident with her in the Chicago Handicap," Mason said. "I don't think there is a horse on the grounds (at Arlington) that can beat her."

Stakes winner You Bought Her, owned by Richard Perkins and Hinsley Racing Stable, is also coming into the Chicago Handicap from the Humana Distaff, where she finished sixth. The 6-year-old mare by Graeme Hall will attempt to move forward from that effort for trainer David Hinsley to get her second win of the year.

Steven E. Frum's Doug Matthews-trained Seeking Treasure finished off the board in her only try over a synthetic surface in 2014, but she has proven competitive against

stakes company on the grass in recent starts, having captured the Dahlia Stakes at Laurel Park in April. The 6-year-old daughter of Run Away and Hide had a second-place finish last out in the Miss Liberty Stakes at Monmouth Park.

"Her last three works here have been good," Matthews said. "She's in good form. Her last two groups she caught were pretty tough. I think (seven furlongs) is just perfect for her."

Five D Thoroughbreds' Kathballu will continue seeking her first stakes win after facing graded stakes company in six of her past eight starts. She also ran in the Humana Distaff, finishing ninth, and followed that up two weeks later with a win in an allowance-optional claiming event at Churchill Downs. The 4-year-old daughter of Bluegrass Cat, from trainer Ken McPeck's barn, will be making her first start on a synthetic surface if she runs. She has also been entered in the Roxelana Stakes at Churchill the same day as the Chicago Handicap.

Rounding out the field are stakes winners Athena and Minks Aprise, and stakes-placed Run Zippy Run, City of Trix, Sweetsoutherndame, and Tiz Lately. **BH**

BHA LOOKS AT IMPLICATIONS OF 'BREXIT' VOTE

Following the June 23 referendum in which Great Britain voted to leave the European Union, stakeholders in the Thoroughbred industry are working to ensure their interests are represented as the nation enters a time of transition and uncertainty. One is the British Horseracing Authority, the official governing body of racing.

"The BHA will work closely with government contacts, including in particular officials from Department for Culture, Media and Sport, as well as other sporting bodies, to represent the interests of British horse racing in the discussions and decisions that will follow on from today's result," Will Lambe, director of corporate affairs for the British Horseracing Authority said.

Thursday's historic referendum and unexpected 52%-48% outcome caused Britain's pound to drop to its lowest level since 1985 and also impacted global economies, including the United States stock market, which nosedived. David Cameron also announced his resignation as prime minister of Britain.

Lambe said that while it's too early to assess the overall impact of the vote on the Britain's Thoroughbred industry as a whole, racing has been proactive in considering the implications of a vote to leave the EU—known as "Brexit" (British Exit)—and identifying what areas of the industry would be affected, such as trade, betting regulation, equine welfare, the movement of horses, and employment laws.

"The expectation is that there will not be a substantial impact on most of these areas, or the overall regulation and running of the sport, certainly in the short term," Lambe said. "DCMS is continuing to work towards the replacement of the (Horserace Betting Levy,

an arm of the DCMS) by April 2017. This work is at an advanced stage in a number of areas, with significant groundwork already laid, and the key piece of domestic and primary legislation, which provides for an income stream for British racing from all forms of betting activity, including that through offshore remote betting operators, has already been passed.

"It is likely that there will still be a requirement for some degree of European clearance, but this will still be based on the clear precedent in France."

Lambe said the replacement of the Levy remains a government commitment, "with full cross-party backing and support right across the Conservative Party. There is strong, and still growing, recognition of the sport's economic, cultural, and social importance right across the country."

Newmarket-based trainer Hugo Palmer tried to put the historic vote in perspective when he tweeted: "The frustrating point that everyone is missing is that this vote doesn't mean we are 'out.' It means the very long process of getting out now begins.

"It's not as simple as cancelling your season ticket because you think the team sucks!" **BH**

WINNING RETURN BY FAR FROM OVER

In his first start in more than 16 months, Black Rock Thoroughbreds, Madaket Stables, and James Covello's Far From Over kept his undefeated record intact in a June 24 allowance optional-claiming race at Belmont Park.

The son of Blame won the Withers (gr. II) in February 2015 and was training toward the Wood Memorial (gr. I) when he was knocked off the Triple Crown trail with a non-displaced condylar fracture in his left hind leg.

On Friday at Belmont, in the one-turn 1 1/16-mile main-track test, Far From Over settled into fourth on the outside early behind blazing fractions, moved to the rail late in the turn, and won by 1 1/2 lengths.

The Todd Pletcher-trained 4-year-old ridgling now has a three-for-three record with one win apiece at age 2, 3, and 4.

"We're very happy that we got the win and excited that he's back," said Steven Marshall of Black Rock Thoroughbreds. "It's been about 16 months since his last race and he's come back very strong. We're just happy that he's healthy."

"Even though he's a little green, he put on a good run," winning jockey John Velazquez said. "The talent is there. He just needs to put it together." **BH**

LOFTY TARGETS FOR ARROGATE

Juddmonte Farms' Arrogate had the look of something special June 24 at Santa Anita Park.

The 3-year-old Unbridled's Song colt won a 1 1/16-mile allowance by 5 1/4 lengths under Rafael Bejarano and trainer Bob Baffert expressed lofty aspiration for him after the race.

"We've got a lot of options with him. ... The Jim Dandy (gr. II) is there. ... The plan is to get him to the Breeders' Cup (Classic, gr. I)," Baffert said.

The \$560,000 Keeneland September yearling purchase was hustled from his rail post and led at every point of call to finish off the race in 1:41.14.

"He's made a lot of progress," Baffert said of the lightly raced colt. "He had some shins, so we stopped on him and the race at Los Al (a third-place finish in his debut, a maiden special weight race April 17) just didn't work out.

"I just told Rafael, 'From the (inside post), you need to be a little aggressive.' Distance isn't an issue with

this horse. When he came back right now, he wasn't blowing at all."

A 4 1/2-length maiden winner at Santa Anita June 5, Arrogate went off as the 3-5 favorite. **BH**

EUTROPHIA FARM DISPERSAL SET FOR F-T JULY

Elisabeth “Betty” Alexander, who with her late husband, Quentin, was consistently among the leading owners and breeders in Ohio, will disperse most of her Thoroughbred holdings at the Fasig-Tipton July selected sale of horses of racing age sale July 11.

Taylor Made Sales Agency will consign 23 horses as part of the reduction, which consists of mares and foals, yearlings, 2-year-olds, and horses of racing age.

The Alexanders, who operated the 200-acre Eutrophia Farm near Hunting Valley, Ohio, raced Magna Graduate—winner of seven graded stakes at five different tracks and earning more than \$2.5 million. As a 4-year-old he placed third in the 2006 Emirates Airline Dubai World Cup (UAE-I) and he was the runner-up in the 2007 Stephen Foster Handicap (gr. I). He has been among leading sires in Oklahoma since 2015.

The couple also bred and/or raced five Ohio champions.

Mares will be offered alongside their 2016 foals by Candy Ride, Curlin, Gio Ponti, Magna Graduate, Scat Daddy, and Verrazano.

Covering sires include Competitive Edge, Declaration of War, Hard Spun, Lookin At Lucky, Magna Graduate, Midshipman, Munnings, and Verrazano.

Also being offered are yearlings and 2-year-olds by Lemon Drop Kid, Smart Strike, Stay Thirsty, Speights-town, Tale of Ekati, Tapizar, and Union Rags.

“We are flattered that Mrs. Alexander has entrusted the sale of her breeding and racing stock with Fasig-Tipton,” said Fasig-Tipton president Boyd Browning. “She, along with her late husband Quentin, operated a breeding and racing operation at the highest level for nearly five decades, and the quality of her stock is reflective of her passion for racing and love for all things equine.”

“It is bittersweet because she is a true horsewoman,” said Kim Valerio, the Alexanders’ racing and bloodstock manager. “She’s been a wonderful owner.”

Valerio said Alexander will retain 10 homebreds to race following the Fasig-Tipton reduction. The farm was sold earlier.

In addition to her Thoroughbred breeding and racing operation, Alexander, her daughter Emily, and her granddaughter Lizzie are accomplished in the show horse world. Among their successes have been Geste, winner of the hunter equivalent of the Triple Crown, Valerio said.

The Alexanders had also shown Cape Crusader, a Thoroughbred registered under the name Oscar Time

(Academy Award). He was a half brother to graded stakes winner Judge Smells and was active in the show ring for more than two decades. **BH**

OVERNIGHT PURSES DECREASE AT DEL MAR

Del Mar will drop overnight purses for a second consecutive year, according to Del Mar Thoroughbred Club vice president of racing and industry relations Tom Robbins.

Robbins said the drop will be "about 10% across the board." The most noticeable decrease in the first condition book for the summer meet is in maiden special weight events, which will dip from \$70,000 to \$63,000, the lowest those races have been since 2011.

"The reasoning is we can only pay out what we generate from handle," Robbins said. "We've paid out, in the last two years, a little more than we've generated. This is not only set by us, but also the (Thoroughbred Owners of California)."

Robbins pointed to several factors to explain the decrease—including heavy rains during Del Mar's opening weekend in 2015 and the first season of dirt racing after an extended period of racing on a synthetic main track—but the most influential aspect, as it has been for the whole Southern California racing landscape, appears to be how the region adapts to carrying more racing dates without the presence of Hollywood Park, which closed in 2013. Santa Anita Park has taken the largest chunk of Hollywood Park's dates in the first half of the year, but Del Mar has taken over a month in the fall, outside of its traditional summer slate.

"We're trying to recover a little bit," Robbins said. "If we didn't have a fall meeting, we wouldn't be in this position."

Robbins stressed, however, that the overnight purses are still the highest in California and high on the national level, when considering other jurisdictions get funding from outside revenue streams.

"We're still paying more—you can't compare us with New York or other states that have the benefits of slots or casinos," Robbins said. "We're doing it the old-fashioned way."

Using maiden special weight races as a barometer, Del Mar reached \$75,000 in purses for 2013 and 2014 and dropped to \$70,000 in 2015 before this year's decrease. Maiden special weight purses were \$63,000 in 2011 and \$70,000 in 2012.

Del Mar opens its summer meet July 15.

Meanwhile, JACK ThistleDown Racino will lower its takeout rate on multi-race pools for the remainder of the season, starting June 25, which is Ohio Derby day.

The new takeout rate will be 15%, down from 22.5%, on every live racing day, effective for Pick 4 and Pick 5 wagers.

ThistleDown offers Pick 4 wagers in the first and fifth races. It's Pick 5 begins with race four. **BH**

BIG DAY FOR ARGENTINE RACINGBy *Diego Mitagstein*

Argentina's equivalent of the Breeders' Cup, the Carreras de las Estrellas, will be staged for the 26th time June 25, with the best horses in the nation converging on Hipódromo de Palermo's dirt track.

Created by the Fundacion Equina Argentina, "las Estrellas," as the Thoroughbred industry likes to call it, features seven races with 6,600,000 Argentine pesos in purses.

The Gran Premio Estrellas Classic (Arg-I), at 2,000 meters (about 1 1/4 miles), is the big race of the card, with Don Inc the one to beat. By Include, the bay owned by Camilo Bautista's Stud Las Monjitas easily won the Gran Premio 25 de Mayo (Arg-I) last time out and looks like the heavy favorite. Saltarin Dubai (E Dubai) and Romano (Roman Ruler) are two major challengers.

The Gran Premio Estrellas Distaff (Arg-I) for fillies and mares appears to be one of the most exciting races, but it doesn't have a superlative star. Kiriaki

(Catcher In The Rye), a nose second to Corona del Inca (Luhuk) in the Gran Premio Criadores (Arg-I), is racing well and could achieve the most important success of her racing career.

Undefeated Le Ken (Easing Along) was the heavy favorite for the Gran Premio Estrellas Juvenile (Arg-I) but will not be at the track because of a fever, opening the door for horses such as group I winner Hat Puntano (Hat Trick), In the Dark (Mutakddim), Equal Councillor (Equal Stripes), and In Your Honor (Asiatic Boy).


In the Juvenile Fillies (Arg-I), which like the Juvenile is run at 1,600 meters (about one mile), two undefeated fillies will be the focus: Schoolmistress (Equal Stripes), winner of the Gran Premio Jorge de Atucha (Arg-I), and Kononkop (Pure Prize), victress in the Gran Premio de Potrancas (Arg-I). Silver Look (Archipenko) is the third choice.

Five of the 10 entries in the Gran Premio Estrellas Mile (Arg-I) are group I winners. Touareg (Easing Along), Argentina's champion 2-year-old of 2015 and recent winner of the Gran Premio de las Americas-OSAF (Arg-I), will try to remain atop the division against classic winner Le Blues (Roman Ruler), 2014 Estrellas Classic winner Tantos Anos (Mutakddim),

Eragon (Offlee Wild), and Fantastic Four (Forestry).

The 1,000-meter (about five-furlong) Gran Premio Estrellas Sprint (Arg-I) features Humor Acido (Emperor Richard) as the horse to beat. The bay finished first in the Gran Premio Ciudad de Buenos Aires (Arg-I) May 1 over Nashville Texan (Forestry), who will try to get his revenge.

The series begins with the Clasico Estrellas Junior Sprint, for colt and fillies, and with Don Mengano (El Corredor), Timberline (Easing Along) and Flandegam (Easing Along)—full sister to Estrellas Mile entrant Touareg—as the favorites. **BH**

ARAPAHOE PARK QUARANTINED DUE TO EIA POSITIVE

Arapahoe Park in Aurora, Colorado is responding to a positive test result for equine infectious anemia at the racetrack.

According to the Colorado Department of Agriculture website, the horse in question was "a non-racing horse" who "has been in Colorado less than 60 days and came from an out-of-state track."

"It appears that the horse was infected prior to coming to Colorado and previously tested negative for the disease in May of 2015," a release from the Colorado Department of Agriculture said. "Because the disease is most commonly spread by biting flies and it is very early in Colorado's fly season, the risk of disease transmission to other horses at the track appears to be relatively low."

Arapahoe Park, in cooperation with the Colorado and U.S. departments of agriculture and the Colorado Division of Racing Events, placed the horse with the positive Coggins test—used to detect EIA—in isolation and has quarantined the facility.

No horse will be allowed to enter or leave Arapahoe Park until the quarantine is lifted. Racing is scheduled to proceed with horses already at Arapahoe Park.

"We are trying to be as proactive as possible to make sure this remains an isolated case," said Arapahoe Park executive director Bruce Seymore. **BH**

GULFSTREAM, TAMPA DONATE TO OCALA INITIATIVE

Two of Florida's premier Thoroughbred tracks, Tampa Bay Downs and Gulfstream Park, each donated \$10,000 in support of the Ocala Initiative—a project designed by the Grayson-Jockey Club Research Foundation to advance equine medical research in Florida.

They join Double Diamond Farm, Florida Thoroughbred Breeders' and Owners' Association, Glen Hill Farm, Ocala Breeders' Sales, Ocala Stud, and Payton Training Center as partners in the initiative.

"Tampa Bay Downs and Gulfstream are two of the bedrock Thoroughbred racetracks not just of Florida but throughout the U.S., so their commitment to research is setting an example for stewardship of equine health and welfare," said Garrett Gleason, director of development and major gifts for Grayson.

The Grayson-Jockey Club Research Foundation is working with organizations in the equine community throughout Florida to raise \$100,000 and will solicit matching funds.

"Gulfstream and our partner tracks have long been committed to equine research," said P.J. Campo, vice president of racing at Gulfstream Park. TOTE SYSTEM OVERHAUL NEEDED

Imagine a horseplayer hitting a superfecta for \$1 million only to be told they would not be receiving that prize because the payout was inaccurate thanks to a computer glitch.

In that type of situation, I doubt a simple apology would suffice. In fact, a public relations nightmare for horse racing, along with litigation, would likely follow. Just such a scenario nearly occurred last year at Laurel Park, where officials say a United Tote glitch sent \$24 million in bogus money into a superfecta pool.

This mistake was caught before wagering opened. The errant money was removed.

With most superfecta pools at the Laurel fall meet collecting less than \$30,000, if such an inflated pool had not been noticed—depending on how the wagers were made—it could have resulted in listed payouts that may have reached that \$1 million number because of the error.

I'd like to report with that potential disaster averted, tote companies and tracks breathed a sigh of relief and quickly fixed the problem. But that didn't happen.

The same glitch cropped up April 28 at the Massachusetts harness track Plainridge Park, causing more than \$109,000 in phantom money to be inserted into a daily double pool. And this time the bogus money stayed in the pool. Lucky winners received \$321.40 for each \$2 wagered.

The glitch even assigned the errant wagers to an outlet, the Red Mile in Lexington. A Red Mile official said United Tote has acknowledged the problem and agreed to pay the settlement.

While United Tote is at the center of this mistake, the problem goes beyond a single tote company. The time for patches and quick fixes of North America's tote system has passed. The tote system needs a reboot from the ground up.

Many in the industry agree there's a need but determining how such an upgrade would be funded has been difficult. I think a logical place to turn would be the profitable advance-deposit wagering companies that don't face the expenses of racetrack operators.

There would be positives to an improved tote system. Positives that would benefit pari-mutuel wagering overall and particularly the ADW outlets.

Improved technology would allow more information for players. Trifecta and superfecta projected payouts could be readily available. Changing odds could be tracked like a stock ticker tape. Future wagers wouldn't have to be limited to 24 outlets. New bets would be possible.

All these ideas—not to mention the ones that would

emerge from the sharp minds of those ADW companies competing for the betting dollar—would be innovative additions to a sport that relies on pari-mutuel wagering for funding.

Instead, potential creativity in pari-mutuel wagering continues to be anchored by an outdated system. The most recent glitch figures to cost a tote company a six-figure payment; the next could cost the entire industry. Come to think of it, the entire industry is already paying; paying every day. **BH**
