HIGH HOPES FOR RECRUITING READY

Recruiting Ready becomes the first U.S. winner for his sire Algorithms

After winning his maiden debut by 10 1/4 lengths May 28 at Pimlico Race Course, Recruiting Ready is scheduled to ship west for the \$100,000 Bashford Manor Stakes (gr. III) July 2 at Churchill Downs.

Sagamore Farm's Recruiting Ready will break from the outside post in the expected field of nine juveniles entered in the six-furlong test. The colt is the first U.S. winner for his Claiborne Farm-based freshman sire Algorithms.

Since his debut, Recruiting Ready has registered three timed workouts, earning the bullet in his two most recent moves at Laurel Park for trainer Horacio DePaz.

"He really ran lights out last time," DePaz said. "He's been training real well since his last effort and he's proven himself."


In those recent works, Recruiting Ready went five furlongs in 1:00 2/5 June 18 and a half-mile in :47 3/5 June 25.

"He's definitely matured after that last effort," De-Paz said. "He just does things so easily and he's really put it together. He came out of his race in such good order that we figured that we would run him here since it's a good spot for him. He gets to ship, he'll be (continued on page 3)

running up against some nice horses and we'll get a good idea of what he can really do."

Recruiting Ready is one of eight horses entered in the Bashford Manor off a career debut victory, a group that includes a trio of juveniles who won their debuts at Churchill: John Oxley's Classic Empire, by Pioneerof the Nile; Whispering Oaks Farm's Tip Tap Tapizar, by Tapizar; and, Tom Durant homebred Raising Rumors, by Sing Baby Sing.

The other four first-out winners include two trained by Danny Pish who won their debuts at Lone Star Park in Keene Thoroughbreds' My Golden Aura, by My Golden Song; and Jerry Durant and Bill Jordan's U S Officer, by U S Ranger. Patricia Hope's Riv won his debut on the Arlington International Racecourse Polytrack while Horse International's Capt. Grider will be making his first start since winning at Keeneland.

Rounding out the field is Boys From Boston, who placed in each of his first two efforts.

Saturday's card will also spotlight 2-year-old fillies in the \$100,000 Debutante Stakes, at six furlongs. The field of 10 includes Winchell Thoroughbreds homebred Tricky One, a daughter of Unbridled's Song, who scored by 4 1/2 lengths in her maiden debut June 3 at Churchill. BH



QUALITY HIGH IN SARATOGA CATALOG

asig-Tipton unveiled the catalog for its selected yearling sale in Saratoga Springs, N.Y., that company president and CEO Boyd Browning Jr. says is endowed with more quality individuals than ever as a result of the on-track successes of horses that went through the ring at the Spa.

There are 252 yearlings cataloged for the Aug. 8-9 sale that consists of sessions beginning at 6:30 p.m. each day at Fasig-Tipton's Humphrey S. Finney pavilion. The catalog is available online and will be available from Fasig-Tipton offices beginning July 1.

Gracing the cover are four superstar champions that came out of the sale over the last four years: Triple Crown winner American Pharoah, who went through the ring but was bought back in 2013 on behalf of Zayat Stables for \$300,000; Tepin, the champion turf female and \$3.5-million earner who cost \$120,000 at the 2012 Saratoga auction; undefeated champion Songbird who was a \$140,000 purchase in 2014; and Stellar Wind, the 3-year-old filly champion sold at Saratoga for \$40,000 and then re-sold a month later at the Fasig-Tipton Midlantic yearling sale for \$86,000 in 2013.


"They are special horses that have captured the imagination of folks, not just in America, but of people around the world," Browning said. "American Pharoah was the first Triple Crown winner in 37 years, Tepin not only beat the boys in the Breeders' Cup (Mile, gr. IT) but goes to England this year and wins the Queen Anne (Eng-I), and Songbird is still building a resume that is impeccable to date. It's mind-boggling those are all Saratoga sale graduates, but it's indicative of the type of horses our consignors are bringing to us."

According to BloodHorse's *MarketWatch*, the Saratoga Sale ranked at the top of all major North American yearling sales by percentage of grade I winners, graded stakes winners, and stakes winners produced from horses sold.

"It's pretty remarkable the quality of horses that have graduated from that sale in recent years," Browning said. "It gives sellers great confidence and buyers great confidence when you see the quality of horses that have emerged from the sale. We've had a larger pool to choose in terms of nominations this year and I think it's a fabulous group of horses both in terms of pedigree and conformation."


The catalog is replete with offspring of Tapit and Uncle Mo, who rank first and second on the General Sires' list. With 13 Tapit yearlings and 14 for Uncle Mo, those two sires are represented by 10.7% of the entire catalog.

Additional sire power is added to the catalog with three from major international stallion Galileo and two from his champion son Frankel. Also cataloged are two fillies from the final crop of Street Cry. **BH**

ABANDONED HORSES PROBE CONTINUES

Aday after 43 charges of second-degree animal Acruelty were filed against Charles "Chuck" Borell and his daughter, trainer Maria Borell, investigators with the Kentucky Department of Agriculture continue to work on identifying and locating the owners of 43 horses apparently abandoned on a Central Kentucky farm.

"We're going to be on the ground working pretty hard for a quite a while," said Shane Mitchell, lead investigator for the KDA. "It is a group effort. We're ensuring the horses are the horses they are supposed to be and we're all trying to do our part to find the names of the horse owners. My investigation is very fluid and very active."

The KDA is leading the investigation, while the Mercer County Sheriff's Office of Ernie Kealty is managing day-to-day activities at the farm and the county attorney's office is handling the legal aspects of the investigation. The three entities became involved after being called to the farm June 3 and discovering the horses had apparently been abandoned. Located about 40 miles outside Lexington, the farm is for sale for an asking price of \$499,900.

Volunteers and organizations have donated time, supplies, services, and transportation to aid the horses, with more than 400 bales of hay donated. A GoFundMe account has received more than \$22,600 in donations from nearly 300 individuals over the last five days. While he and others involved in the investigation would like to have seen the case move along quicker, Mitchell said they had to be careful not to take shortcuts that could jeopardize any legal case.

"I've got a month's work in on this, including some 16-18 hours a day," Mitchell said. "You don't want to blow an investigation. People don't realize the criminal justice system is what we have to deal with and we have to meet that criteria for everybody, regardless of the emotional aspects.


"The welfare of the horse is our number one priority. While the department is making sure of that, I have to do my job and sometimes it's a slow and painstaking process."

Meanwhile, Chuck Borell, 69, remained in the Boyle County Detention Center without bond June 30, awaiting a hearing that has been scheduled for July 5. Kentucky state veterinarian Dr. Robert Stout said Chuck Borell and his daughter Maria Borell, who has not been located, were charged after it was deemed they were the parties responsible for the horses.

According to Charles Borell's LinkedIn profile, he resides in upstate New York and is a self-employed labor arbitrator, consulting with communities in labor contracts with unions. Maria Borell is best known as the trainer of champion sprinter Runhappy when he won the TwinSpires Breeders' Cup Sprint (gr. I). Following that race, Borell was dismissed as Gallery Furniture's trainer and she filed suit against owner James McIngvale. BH

Texas Chrome and American Freedom dominate the morning-line market for the \$250,000 Iowa Derby (gr. III) July 1 at Prairie Meadows.

Keene Thoroughbreds' Texas Chrome, a Texas-bred by Grasshopper, heads the field at 2-1 for the 1 1/16-mile Derby. The J.R. Caldwell-trained colt finished third in the June 18 Matt Winn Stakes (gr. III)


at Churchill Downs behind Kentucky Derby Presented by Yum! Brands third-place finisher Gun Runner, and doesn't face anything like Gun Runner's proven quality here.

Gary and Mary West's American Freedom, a 5-2 morning-line chance, ships in from the East Coast following a victory in the LARC Sir Barton Stakes at Pimlico Race Course.

Grade II winner S'maverlous will chase his third stakes victory in four 2016 starts July 2, in the \$300,000 Prairie Meadows Cornhusker Handicap (gr. III).

Gata Racing Stable's 6-year-old gelded son of Tiz Wonderful—A.P. Petal, by A.P. Indy, won the New Orleans Handicap (gr. II) and the June 4 Mountainview Handicap at Hollywood Casino at Penn National.

The only other horse in the 1 1/8-mile Cornhusker who has won a graded stakes in 2016 is Spendthrift Farm's Cyrus Alexander, a half brother to 2010 Kentucky Derby winner Super Saver who won the Lone Star Park Handicap (gr. III). **BH**

RED RIFLE SHOOTS FOR DOMINION DAY REPEAT

Red Rifle blasts his opponents in last year's Dominion Day Stakes

fter scoring a clear victory in his Woodbine debut in last year's Dominion Day Stakes (Can-III), Red Rifle will try to defend that title July 1 in the 1 1/4-mile main-track race.

Woodbine's main track has changed since last year, as the Polytrack was swapped for Tapeta, but surface has never been a concern for Red Rifle. The 6-year-old Giant's Causeway gelding owns graded stakes wins on dirt, turf, and synthetic surfaces.

After a pair of off-the-board finishes racing on turf this spring to open the season, Twin Creeks Farm's Red Rifle looked better in his previous start, finishing second to S'maverlous June 4 in the \$200,000 Mountainview Handicap on the main track at Hollywood Casino at Penn National Race Course.

Since that effort, the five-time stakes winner breezed twice at Saratoga Race Course for trainer Todd Pletcher, including a half-mile move June 24 in :48.88, which ranked second-fastest of 47 at the distance that day.

Four other horses are entered in Friday's \$150,000 race, including Stephen Chesney and Cory Hoffman's grade III winner Melmich, who enters off a third-place finish in the Eclipse Stakes (Can-II) in his 5-year-old debut May 28 at Woodbine. BH

SCHETTINO PAIR WORTH WATCHING

Dominick Schettino sends out a pair of runners by promising freshman sires for his partners Brooklyn Boyz Stables and MeB Racing Stable, Fillet of Sole and Always Dreaming, in a \$75,000 maiden special weight at Belmont Park July 1.

The field of seven first-time starters will race five and a half furlongs.

Coupled in the betting with his stablemate at 5-2 on the morning-line, Always Dreaming (Bodemeister) is a half brother to grade I winner Hot Dixie Chick. Bodemeister is currently second on the leading firstcrop sires list. Santa Rosa Partners bred Always Dreaming from Above Perfection (In Excess), a grade I-placed and grade III winner with a 7-1-0 record from 10 races who has produced six winners from six starters.

His stablemate Fillet of Sole, a Union Rags half brother to grade III winner Senor Rojo (Out of Place) and grade I-placed Connie and Michael, is out of the Devil's Bag mare Detect.

Both colts were \$350,000 purchases from the 2015 Keeneland September sale.

On the West Coast, five 2-year-old fillies will go up against 6-5 morning-line favorite Tap It All in a \$56,000 maiden special weight at Santa Anita.

The Tapizar filly is the first foal out of Yawkey Way (Grand Slam), and was an \$800,000 purchase from the Fasig-Tipton Florida sale—her sire's highest-priced offspring to date.

Owned by Reddam Racing and ERJ Racing, Tap It All has finished second in her only two starts. **BH**

I'LL HAVE ANOTHER WINNER RATED HIGHLY

Since he was a yearling, Un Autre—who became the first winner for I'll Have Another when he won a maiden at Tokyo June 25—has been very highly regarded by his owner, Shigeyuki Okada of Big Red Farm.

Okada is responsible for more than 130 2-year-olds, including horses belonging to Ruffian Thoroughbred Club and Win Racing Club, racing clubs run by his two sons.

Of those juveniles, he nominated only two for the 2017 Investec Epsom Derby (Eng-I) at the December 2015 initial entry stage. One was Un Autre.

I'll Have Another launched his stud career at Big Red Farm in 2013, when he served 152 mares. Of the 105 foals born the following spring, 101 are registered in the Japanese Stud Book. It is believed Okada inspected every single lot by I'll Have Another, and bought Un Autre privately as a yearling from his breeder, Yamagiwa Farm. The Epsom Derby entry indicates Okada regards Un Autre as one of I'll Have Another's best.

Another promising I'll Have Another 2-year-old makes her debut at Fukushima July 3. Wink Back, a filly owned by Big Red Farm, is entered in a maiden over 1,800m (about 1 1/8 miles) on turf. Okada also regards her highly. **BH**

THOROUGHBRED CLUB TO HONOR MCCARRON

Retired Hall of Fame jockey Chris McCarron has been selected by the board of directors of the Thoroughbred Club of America as its 2016 Honor Guest. McCarron will be honored by the TCA at its 85th testimonial dinner at Keeneland Sept. 25.

"We are thrilled to honor Chris as the 2016 Thoroughbred Club of America Honor Guest," TCA president Shannon Arvin said. "His accomplishments as a world-class jockey, competing for nearly three decades with Thoroughbred legends including Alysheba, John Henry, Sunday Silence, and Tiznow, as well as his tremendous contributions to the Thoroughbred industry and jockey profession by founding the North American Racing Academy, certainly make Chris worthy of this distinct honor."

Born in Dorchester, Mass., in 1955, the son of Herbert and Helen and one of nine children, McCarron was introduced to the racing world by his brother Gregg, who was already a jockey. In the summer of 1971, McCarron started on the track as a hot walker for trainer Odie Clelland and rode his first race at Bowie Race Course in January of 1974. As an apprentice McCarron rode a record 2,199 races, scoring a record 546 wins. Eventually he became the first jockey to reach the \$200 million earnings mark.


Inducted into the National Racing Museum Hall of Fame in 1989, McCarron competed for 28 years with two victories each in the Kentucky Derby (gr. I), Preakness (gr. I), and the Belmont (gr. I). He also won the Breeders' Cup Classic (gr. I) five times and was victorious in three other Breeders' Cup races, as well as the Japan Cup (Ipn-I) and the Canadian International Stakes (Can-IT). Notable mounts include John Henry, Alysheba, Tiznow, Precisionist, Lady's Secret, Sunday Silence, Glorious Song, Bayakoa, Paseana, Flawlessly, Turkoman, Northern Spur, and many others.

After he retired from race riding, McCarron began appearances as a racing analyst for major races on ABC, NBC, ESPN, HDNet, and TVG. He was also the race designer and technical advisor for the feature film "Seabiscuit" and played the role of War Admiral's jockey Charlie Kurtsinger.

McCarron served as general manager of Santa Anita Park from March of 2003 to February of 2005. He is the founder and lead instructor of the North American Racing Academy in Lexington, Ky., which he established to help develop young jockeys. The academy also offers a horseman's career path to qualify young men and women for other jobs in the industry.

McCarron's many awards include the George Woolf Memorial Jockey Award, Eclipse Award for outstanding apprentice jockey (1974), best jockey ESPY Award, two Eclipse Awards for outstanding jockey (1974 and 1980), and Mike Venezia Memorial Award. In 1995 McCarron also won the ESPY award for outstanding achievement in racing. He is a member of The Jockey Club, American Horse Council, Kentucky Thoroughbred Farm Managers Club, and TCA. McCarron also serves on the board of directors for the High Hope Steeplechase Association.

PA HOUSE OKS BREEDING FUND ADJUSTMENTS

The Pennsylvania House of Representatives June 30 approved substantive changes to the Thoroughbred breeding fund, from which some payments have been suspended for months because of problematic language in a horse racing reform bill that became law in February.

The Republican-controlled House, which passed the measure on a 193-2 vote, June 29 called the bill for consideration on the floor. The bill was then sent to the House Appropriations Committee, which sent it back to the House the morning of June 30 after no members questioned the fiscal aspects of the bill.

It now goes to the Republican-controlled Senate for concurrence.

In May the Senate approved a bill designed to correct mistakes in the omnibus racing reform bill, but the House Agriculture and Rural Affairs Committee amended it June 27 with language intended to increase the percentage of revenue—most of it from casino slot machines—that goes toward breeders' awards. The amendment would also potentially change oversight of the Thoroughbred breeding fund by allowing the state Department of Agriculture, through the Pennsylvania Horse Racing Commission, to decide whether to continue its contract with the

Pennsylvania Horse Breeders Association, which currently administers the fund, or go in another direction.

The PAHB, Pennsylvania Thoroughbred Horsemen's Association, and Pennsylvania Horsemen's Benevolent and Protective Association supported an amendment offered June 29 by Democratic Rep. Mike Carroll that would have reverted to the Senate's version of the bill. But that amendment and four others were withdrawn before the legislation was sent to the House Appropriations Committee.

A memo from the Pennsylvania Equine Coalition, of which those three organizations are members, called the revised bill passed by the House Agriculture and Rural Affairs Committee "fundamentally flawed." "It would essentially eliminate restricted races for Pennsylvania-bred horses because there would be no funds left available to support the programs," the memo said. "It would also eliminate the owner bonus program which incentivizes horse owners to purchase Pennsylvania-bred horses."

Supporters of the language passed by the House earlier said the impact wouldn't be that dramatic. The number of Pennsylvania-breds has declined substantially in recent years; therefore, breeders' award money that is paid has also dropped in tandem.

The breeding fund provisions in the omnibus racing reform bill were expected to be carried over, but somehow the language was altered. The changes weren't noticed before Democratic Gov. Tom Wolf signed the bill into law Feb. 23.

The Department of Agriculture, which oversees the racing and breeding, found the language regarding the Thoroughbred breeding fund problematic and suspended payments to breeders in late March. Brandi Hunter-Davenport, communications director for the department, said it's in the hands of lawmakers.

"The legislature will need to take action authorizing the payments to be made," she said. "As soon as that occurs, we will work to honor those payments as quickly as possible. We will continue working with the members of the legislature to rectify this situation." **BH**

INTERVIEW

TOP-SIDE VIEW OF THE YEARLING MARKET

Consignor statistics compiled by MarketWatch for yearlings offered at 2011-13 sales and published in the July 2 issue of Blood-Horse showed Neal Clarke and Conor Doyle's Bedouin Bloodstock as the only consignor (among those selling five or more) with double-digit percentages for stakes winners, stakes horses, and graded stakes winners from yearlings offered. Market-Watch Editor Eric Mitchell talked with Clarke about his strategy and expectations for the upcoming yearling sale season.

MarketWatch: Bedouin Bloodstock is a boutique consignment. How has the polarized market we're seeing affected your business?

Neal Clarke: For the day-to-day business it seems more that the lower end of the market needs to be well covered; it pushes everything up. Last year it appeared the bottom came out of the market and horses that had been bringing \$20,000-\$30,000 were bringing \$10,000. There is just no return. If you are making

\$30,000 to \$40,000, at least you're paying a feed bill; it makes the whole thing work better.

Having said that, the top end of the market is usually the safest. There is always risk, but when you get it right, the rewards are wonderful and make up for a lot of mistakes.

Also what is affecting us now is that people are willing to take a smaller share of a bigger horse than to take all of a lesser horse. People now feel the very, very nice horses that jump through all the hoops are the less risky area to go to, and they are willing to pay a premium for that. So it becomes a matter of what do you do with everything else, which is the big question. Sadly, there are a lot of very nice horses that are not in that top 5% or 8%. You scramble and hope for good luck.

MW: What is your expectation for the 2016 yearling sales?

NC: Overall I think people are reasonably positive about the Thoroughbred industry. There are some hard numbers indicating we're due for some more tightening up but with that I do believe people feel good about the industry and are willing to spend the money. No question, though, we are in a polarized market where it can be all or nothing. You are just hoping to make enough on the good horses to compensate.

MW: How does that influence how you place horses in specific sales?

NC: It can be difficult with a boutique consignment. You don't want your horses on any particular day competing too hard with one another. If you only have four or five horses in a session, you don't want them to be fairly equal types of horses by pedigree or conformation or whatever criteria you want to look at. You try to spot them where each one can stand out on its own merits. **BH**
