EXCITEMENT GROWS AT FIRST-CROP SIRES

Few topics create more interest at the summer yearling sales than how the yearlings by first-crop sires look and will be received by the market.

Over the next six days *Blood-Horse Daily* will profile all of the first-crop sires represented in the Fasig-Tipton Kentucky July catalog, the kick-off auction for the yearling season.

In this edition are profiles of Calumet Farm's new sires: Preakness Stakes (gr. I) winner Oxbow, who has eight yearlings cataloged; Raison d'Etat, a well-related son of A.P. Indy with one cataloged; and Snappy Halo, an Argentinian-bred, Australia-based son of Southern Halo who has one yearling from his first U.S.-conceived yearling crop on offer.

Also featured in this edition are two new stallions from Adena Springs. Five-time grade I winner Point of Entry, who stands at Adena Springs Kentucky, has two yearlings cataloged for the sale, and there are four yearlings in the catalog by Breeders' Cup Classic (gr. I) winner Fort Larned, who stands at Adena Springs South in Florida.

Besides market leaders, the series will provide insight into several stallions standing outside Kentucky and a couple that may only be represented by one North American crop. **BH**

F-T SALE SHOWCASES CALUMET'S FRESHMEN SIRES

When Oxbow defeated Kentucky Derby Presented by Yum! Brands (gr. I) winner Orb to win the 2013 Preakness Stakes (gr. I), the son of Awesome Again provided an eighth win in the middle leg of the Triple Crown for historic Calumet Farm and the first classic win for Brad Kelley, the Lexington nursery's current owner.

Initially retired to Taylor Made Stallions near Nicholasville, Ky., Oxbow was popular from the beginning, his first crop producing 78 foals. As Calumet built its own stallion roster, Oxbow relocated to the farm for the 2015 season and stood for a \$17,500 fee this year.

Now, three years after his classic success, Oxbow has his first crop of yearlings selling at public auction during the July 12 Fasig-Tipton Kentucky select yearling sale in Lexington. According to

Blood-Horse's MarketWatch, the five foals from Oxbow's first crop sold as weanlings averaged \$89,000, with a \$105,000 median, ranking him fifth and third, respectively, in those categories for first-year sires.

Oxbow is by the Breeders' Cup Classic (gr. I) winner and top-quality sire Awesome Again, whose sire sons include Ghostzapper and Awesome of Course. Oxbow is out of Tizamazing (Cee's Tizzy—Cee's Song), a full sister not only to champion racehorse and outstanding sire Tiznow, but to the stakes winners Budroyale, Tizbud, and Tizdubai.

That mating also produced the mare Tizso, whose progeny include three stakes winners—Tiz West, Tizakitty, and Paynter. The latter is also by Awesome Again, and like Oxbow he has his first yearlings on the market at Fasig-Tipton July.

In addition to the Preakness, Oxbow won the Lecomte Stakes (gr. III) and finished second in the Belmont Stakes (gr. I) behind Palace Malice.

Two of the eight Oxbow offspring cataloged at Fasig-Tipton have been withdrawn. Of the remaining six, which are being sold by various consignors, three were bred by Calumet.

All of the remaining Calumet-bred Oxbow yearlings are from daughters of A.P. Indy. Hip 118 is a colt out of Alligator Style, whose dam is grade II winner Sensibly Chic, and Hip 124 is a filly out of A P's Hidden Honey, whose solid black-type family includes multiple grade II winner and grade I-placed Top Secret. Hip 259 is a colt out of \$121,828-earner Inda, a daughter of champion Queena.

The other three Oxbows cataloged were foaled in Maryland, Pennsylvania, and Kentucky. Bred in Maryland by Marathon Farms, Hip 136 is a filly out of the Gone West mare Beautiful Lu and from the family of prominent sires Ghostzapper and City Zip. Blackstone Farm bred Hip 158, a colt produced from stakes-placed Buck Trout's Niece (Waquoit), in Pennsylvania. Multiple stakes-placed Bessiepunkindo, the dam of stakes winners Lil Punkindo, is the second dam of Hip 297, a colt out of the El Corredor mare Makeitagame bred in Kentucky by Michelle, Mallory, and Matthew Morehead.

Joining Oxbow among Calumet-based sires with first North American crops are Snapy Halo and Raison d'Etat.

A winner of the Gran Premio Estrellas Mile (Arg-I) in his native Argentina, Snapy Halo completed his career in Australia and entered stud there. The 12-year-old is a son of multiple leading Argentinian sire Southern Halo, best-known in the U.S. as the sire of the highly-successful More Than Ready, out of the stakes-winning Ringaro mare Esnaola, who has produced two other grade I winners to Southern Halo: champion older female Halo Ola and Sebi Halo.

Snapy Halo sired two Australian crops and entered stud at Calumet in 2014 for a \$7,500 fee that has remained unchanged. He has 21 yearlings, one of which is cataloged at the Fasig-Tipton sale.

Also with one entered is Raison d'Etat, a well-bred son of A.P. Indy campaigned by breeder Juddmonte Farms throughout most of his career. He finished second in the Curlin Stakes and third in the Discovery Handicap (gr. III) before Kelley's Bluegrass Hall Farm acquired him in November 2012. Raison d'Etat, who stood for \$7,500 this year, is out of the grade I winner Sightseek and traces back to champion filly Chris Evert. His first season at stud produced 19 horses. **BH**

FIRST YEARLINGS FROM ADENA SPRINGS STALLIONS

Fort Larned and Point of Entry had outstanding 2012 campaigns—the former on dirt, the latter on grass—but their accomplishments weren't enough for either to outpoll Wise Dan, who was voted Horse of the Year, champion older male, and champion grass male.

Fort Larned and Point of Entry went on to race another year before retiring to stand at Frank Stronach's Adena Springs Farm in 2014. Both will have representatives from their first crops at the Fasig-Tipton Kentucky select yearling sale in Lexington July 12.

A son of E Dubai, Breeders' Cup Classic (gr. I) winner Fort Larned stands at Adena Springs South near Williston, Fla., where his 2016 fee was \$7,500. He entered stud at a \$15,000 fee and had four weanlings average \$30,500 last year.

Bred in Kentucky by Frank and John R. Penn and consigned by Penn Sales, Hip 16 is a colt from the winning Eddington mare Rumpus Room, a half sister to British stakes winner Desert Phantom from an extended female family of graded winners such as Pleasant Tango.

Consigned by Bluewater Sales, Hip 65 is the first foal out of a winning Forest Wildcat half sister to grade I winner Moreno bred in Kentucky by Scotty Roy.

Hip 149, a Florida-bred filly consigned by Select Sales, agent for Machmer Hall and Broken Back Farm, is out of a winning Southern Image half sister to stakes winner Smoke Mountain and to the dam of grade I winner Secret Compass. She was bred by Milan Kosanovich.

The fourth Fort Larned yearling is Hip 302, a colt bred in West

Virginia by James Miller produced from a winning Macho Uno half sister to grade II-placed Riveting Reason and stakes-placed Bang Bang Bang. Mill Ridge Sales is the consignor.

Point of Entry, a son of Dynaformer out of the Seeking the Gold mare Matlacha Pass, who is also the dam of multiple grade I winner Pine Island, stood for \$25,000 this year, unchanged from 2014.

Two weanlings by five-time grade I winner Point of Entry sold in 2015 for a \$57,500 average, and one of those is cataloged to the F-T July sale. Consigned by Eaton Sales as Hip 245, the colt out of stakes-placed Hug It Out was bought by J C Corp. for \$15,000 at last year's Keeneland November sale. The colt was bred in Kentucky by Nursery Place, Donaldson, and Broadbent.

The other Point of Entry yearling cataloged is Hip 101, a filly produced from What'smineis-mine, a Mineshaft half sister to grade III winner Holiday Star who earned \$250,035. Consigned by Shawhan Place, the filly was bred in Kentucky by Adena Springs, Shawhan Place, Dr. Perry Wornall, and Billy Thomson. **BH**

PARX DASH ATTRACTS TOP TURF SPRINTERS

A pair of sharp turf sprinters owned by Colts Neck Stables, along with The Jim Stable's Ben's Cat and recent grade III winner Pure Sensation, are among 10 entered in the \$200,000 Parx Dash (gr. IIIT) July 9 at Parx Racing.

Four of the 10 entered for the Dash, run at five furlongs on the turf, are coming off victories in stakes or allowance races.

The Colts Neck Stables entrants are Take Cover (War Front), who won the Pennsylvania Governor's Cup at five furlongs on grass June 4 at Hollywood Casino at Penn National Race Course, and Pool Winner (Broken Vow), who captured an allowance on the turf at Parx.

Ben's Cat, a 10-year-old Parker's Storm Cat gelding, won his first two starts of 2016—an open allowance event at Laurel Park and the Jim McKay Turf Sprint at Pimlico Race Course—before his close third-place finish at Penn National. Ben's Cat seeks his 33rd career victory and has a record of five wins, two seconds, and a third at Parx.

Patricia Generazio's homebred 5-year-old gelding Pure Sensation (Zensational) won the Jaipur Invitational (gr. IIIT) at six furlongs on the turf at Belmont Park June 11 and won the Turf Monster Stakes (gr. IIIT) at Parx last September. **BH**

NEW HIGH NOTE FOR OUTSIDE NASHVILLE

Eighth early after breaking a bit slowly under Ricardo Gonzalez, Outside Nashville picked up momentum into the turn then circled rivals four wide on his way to a clear victory in the Oak Tree Sprint Stakes July 4 at Oak Tree at Pleasanton.

Outside Nashville posted the week's top Equibase Speed Figure after completing the race in 1:08.85. His 119 ESF was two points better than United Nations Stakes (gr. IT) winner World Approval's and a career-best for the six-time stakes winner.

"I felt like I was loaded," Gonzalez said, regarding the strength of his horse in the turn.

HANDLE DOWN, PURSES UP IN JUNE

With June's biggest race day seeing a significant decline in pari-mutuel handle, wagering on United States races for the month also declined compared with the same month in 2015, according to the Thoroughbred Racing Economic Indicators released by Equibase July 5.

Without a Triple Crown on the line this year, wagering on the Belmont Stakes (gr. I) day program fell 27% compared with 2015 when American Pharoah completed a sweep of the three classics. With that drop on its biggest day, handle for the month on U.S. races was off 2.96% to \$897,747,758.

Purses, on the other hand, were up 5.88% to \$102,589,376, spurred, in part, by a 2.39% increase in races to 3,986.

Both of those trends bucked the year-to-date trend where purses are down 0.73% to \$490.7 million and handle is up 1.24% to \$5.5 billion. For the year, race days are down 4.69% to 2,176, which means average wagering per race day is up 6.21% to \$2,548,125 and average purses per race day are up 4.15% to \$225,519.

Beginning in July, the Thoroughbred Racing Economic Indicators offer expanded numbers that include average field size, average handle per race day, and average purses per race day. **BH**

Rated R Superstar wins the Carry Back Stakes

FORTY NINER STILL GOLDEN

Clairborne Farm's Forty Niner, champion 2-year-old male of 1987 and a top 3-year-old the following year, was 1992's leading freshman sire. As fickle as the breeding game is, by 1995 the son of Mr. Prospector had been sold to the Japan Bloodhorse Breeders' Association.

While Forty Niner's name will live on American pedigrees through his sons, mainly through Distorted Humor (the sire of 140 stakes winners), his name has been prominent in the pedigrees of graded stakes winners the last two weekends.

Sarah Sis, winner of the June 25 Chicago Handicap (gr. III) at Arlington, is inbred 3x4 to Forty Niner, being a daughter of Sharp Humor (Distorted Humor) out of a daughter of a mare from the second crop of Forty Niner's End Sweep. End Sweep's first crop produced a record 33 juvenile winners in 1998.

On July 2 Rated R Superstar, inbred 4x3 to Forty Niner, captured Gulfstream's Carry Back Stakes (gr. III). Rated R Superstar is by Kodiak Cowboy, who is out of a mare by Forty Niner's son Coronado's Quest. His dam, Wicked Wish, is a daughter of Forty Niner's son Gold Case.

Kodiak Cowboy, champion sprinter of 2009, is also the sire of dual grade I winner Melatonin. **BH**

FRANKEL GETS FIFTH WINNER FROM SIX STARTERS

Juddmonte's undefeated champion and young sire Frankel gained his fifth winner from his first six starters when Al Asayl Bloodstock homebred Majoris led late to win July 5 at Brighton in England.

Majoris' dam, the Kingmambo mare Drops, is out of champion filly Alexandrova, who won the 2006 Epsom Oaks (Eng-I) and Irish Oaks (Ire-I). Majoris, who was making his second start, is the first foal out of Drops, who was sold for 750,000 guineas (\$1,287,956) with him in utero at the 2013 Tattersalls December mare sale.

More than three years after Frankel retired with 14 wins from as many starts, the son of Galileo got his first winner with his first runner when Cunco (out of Chrysanthemum, by Danehill Dancer) won May 13 at Newbury.

Since then the 2012 European Horse of the Year has been represented by three other debut winners. Queen Kindly (Lady of the Desert, by Rahy), became his second winner June 3 at Catterick; Juddmonte homebred Fair Eva (African Rose, by Observatory) won her first run June 8 at Haydock; and Frankuus (Dookus, by Linamix) scored June 9 at Haydock. He currently ranks in the top 10 freshman sires in England and Ireland.

Frankel's sixth starter, Rise Eagle (Rose of Summer, by El Prado), an \$800,000 Keeneland September yearling purchase, finished a creditable fifth of 16 in his debut July 2 at Chukyo Racecourse in Japan. **BH**

MICROCHIPPING, TIME TO RIDE DISCUSSED

Presentations and discussions about the successful Time to Ride campaign and benefits of microchipping highlighted the American Horse Council's annual meeting that wrapped up June 14 with the National Issues Forum, sponsored by Luitpold Animal Health.

Also, Sen. Pat Roberts, a Kansas Republican, also spoke on the importance of the industry and hearing from constituents.

Matt Iuliano, executive vice president and executive director of The Jockey Club; Mary Babick, vice president of the United States Hunter Jumper Association; and Summer Stoffel, who serves on the United States Equestrian Foundation Horse Recording and ID Task Force Committee spoke on a panel about the benefits of microchipping.

"With microchipping, you don't have to worry about spelling the name correctly or what year the horse was born," Iuliano said. "This would be a lot more efficient than dragging a clipboard around saying, 'Who is that horse again?' and being told, 'That's the horse we call Skippy.' Hospitals have leveraged this type of technology for years. You get a band and your entire history is attached to that band."

Iuliano also discussed how pedigree, performance, and breeding histories could be attached to the horse's microchip number to create greater ease of information transfer after sales.

Christie Schulte of Lead Change Management Inc. and marketing manager of the AHC Time to Ride campaign kicked off the session by providing an overview of the program and its goal to not only grow the horse

industry but make the equine experience attractive and accessible to newcomers.

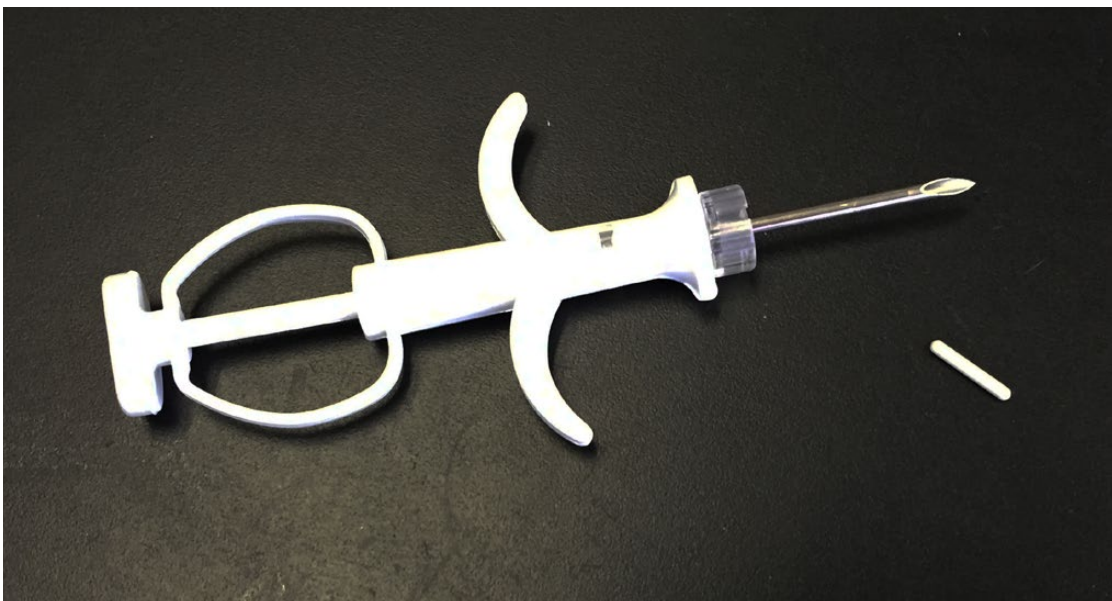
She also gave an update to meeting attendees on the progress of Time to Ride in 2016, as well as the new programs and sweepstakes that were introduced this year. Time to Ride will be working with the United States Equestrian Federation on the First Lady's "Let's Move" campaign to engage youth in as many Olympic sports as possible, she said.

"I was delighted to share the success of Time to Ride over the last two years, which has introduced over 60,000 new people to horses," Schulte said.

Roberts closed out the forum by addressing one of the priorities that the AHC has been working on: the National Forest System Trails Stewardship Act.

"The Agriculture Committee intends to take action on forestry related legislation, such as the National Forest System Trails Stewardship Act, which utilizes volunteers to help maintain access to priority trails on National Forest land," Roberts said. "I understand that the American Horse Council supports this legislation along with a broad coalition of stakeholders.

"As you can see, we clearly have our work cut out for us over the next several months, and I look forward to continuing to work with our agriculture sector constituents to find resolution on these outstanding issues." **BH**

COUP DE GRACE STUD FEE SET

Coup de Grace, the first son of Tapit to stand in South Africa, has had his service fee set at 50,000 rand (\$3,390), putting him among the 12 highest-priced stallions in the region.

John Koster, owner of Klawervlei Stud, where Coup de Grace will stand, said the 5-year-old son of America's multiple leading sire is a good value.

"We were very keen on him as he is out of a Storm Cat mare (Home Court) and showed loads of speed running at Saratoga over the Amsterdam distance," Koster said, referring to the 6 1/2-furlong grade II stakes Coup de Grace captured by three lengths in 2014.

Coup de Grace is now owned by a partnership between Klawervlei, Highlands Stud, and Gainesway. Tapit stands at Gainesway.

"It should also be noted the A.P. Indy/Weekend Surprise line has done extremely well here," Koster said. "The Tapit sire line will offer a plethora of opportunities for South Africa, particularly to daughters of Captain Al—our resident sire."

Captain Al, whose sire Al Mufti is a Roberto half brother to Weekend Surprise, was the Equus champion sire for 2014/15 and has been South Africa's leading sire of 2-year-olds for seven consecutive years.

Tapit has done well when crossed with mares carrying sons and grandsons of Roberto, having produced 14% stakes winners from starters. **BH**

PURSES SET TO FALL IN WEST VIRGINIA

Though the numbers will vary depending on revenue generated by video lottery terminals, purse accounts at West Virginia racetracks will take another hit because of a legislature-mandated reduction to help support the fiscal 2016-17 budget.

Hollywood Casino at Charles Town Races faces about a \$1 million reduction in purse funds, while Mountaineer Casino, Racetrack & Resort could lose up to \$500,000. Two dog tracks will take a combined hit of \$500,000-\$600,000, according to numbers discussed during a recent West Virginia Racing Commission meeting.

"Overall, the numbers stay the same (as the last cycle), but depending on how VLTs perform at each track the numbers will fluctuate," WVRC executive director Joe Moore said.

The state legislature has been shifting VLT-generated funds from purse accounts for about 10 years to pay for other programs.

Through July 3, Charles Town purses averaged \$140,992 per day, down 10.5% from the same period

in 2015, according to The Jockey Club Information Systems. Purses at Mountaineer averaged \$83,699 a night, down 6% from last year.

In 2006, before casino gambling in Ohio and just as casinos began opening in Pennsylvania, Charles Town averaged \$198,890 in average daily purses the first half of the year, and Mountaineer \$149,929. Both tracks have trimmed their racing schedules in recent years. **BH**

HAWKBILL ADDS TO KITTEN'S JOY'S RECORD

It's generally believed that in recent times the balance of sire power has tilted from Kentucky to Europe. Perhaps, however, winds are beginning to shift just a little.

Three weeks ago at Royal Ascot, Britain's premier race meeting, five U.S.-sired runners won group events, including Tepin, who defeated Europe's top older milers in the Queen Anne Stakes (Eng-I), and the week's two most impressive juvenile scorers, Lady Aurelia and Caravaggio, both sired by the late Scat Daddy.

Another U.S.-bred to score at Ascot was 3-year-old Hawkbill, who captured the Tercentary Stakes (Eng-III). This was the first group foray for Hawkbill but his fifth straight victory in eight starts, the sequence stretching back to when he broke his maiden at Lincoln last July.

Hawkbill faced a much sterner task in the July 2 Coral-Eclipse Stakes (Eng-I)—one of the first major contests that provide opportunities for 3-year-olds to tackle their elders—and proved well up to the task, rebuffing the challenge of his fellow sophomore The Gurkha, with 4-year-old Time Test third.

A \$350,000 Keeneland September yearling purchase by John Ferguson for Godolphin, Hawkbill is by Kitten's Joy—one U.S. stallion who certainly has the profile to attract European attention. Champion U.S. turf male of 2004 and leading U.S. sire of 2013, Kitten's Joy has been the leading U.S. turf sire for the last three years and heads that category again in 2016.

Kitten's Joy is by 2002 leading sire El Prado, the champion 2-year-old in Ireland who is by the legendary Sadler's Wells out of the Irish One Thousand Guineas (Ire-I) winner Lady Capulet. Kitten's Joy's dam, Kitten's First, is a daughter of Lear Fan, a son of Epsom Derby (Eng-I) victor Roberto.

There is also a European element to the distaff side of Hawkbill's pedigree as his dam, the graded stakes-placed Trensa, is a daughter of European Horse of the Year Giant's Causeway. Trensa is a three-quarter sister to Storm Cat's daughter

Batique, winner of three graded stakes. Hawkbill's second dam, Ballerina Stakes (gr. I) winner Serape (Fappiano), is a product of the famed Fappiano/In Reality cross—she is out of In Reality's stakes-winning and multiple grade I-placed daughter Mochila, a half sister to champion turf male and leading sire, Cozzene.

Hawkbill is one of three grade/group I winners and 10 stakes winners by Kitten's Joy out of Storm Cat-line mares, and one of three stakes winners from 12 starters by Kitten's Joy from daughters of Giant's Causeway. He's also one of 16 stakes winners from 100 starters by Kitten's Joy with a duplication of Roberto; the others include champions Big Blue Kitten and Stephanie's Kitten and other grade I winners Real Solution and Admiral Kitten. **BH**
