SONGBIRD TO CCA OAKS AFTER PURSE BOOST

Fox Hill Farms' undefeated champion filly Songbird will be pointed to the Coaching Club American Oaks (gr. I), which will feature a purse boost to \$500,000, for her next start July 24 at Saratoga Race Course.

Rick Porter, owner of Fox Hill Farms, confirmed the plans July 6 after the New York Racing Association announced the purse for the Coaching Club American Oaks would be increased from \$300,000 to \$500,000 contingent on Songbird competing in the 1 1/8-mile race for 3-year-old fillies.

"We had talked to them about it," Porter said. "It's a very fair offer by them to raise the purse from \$300,000 to \$500,000. With the slots money they have up there, it probably should be a \$500,000 or (continued on page 3)

\$600,000 race anyway."

Songbird most recently won the Summertime Oaks (gr. II) June 18 at Santa Anita Park, giving her eight wins in as many starts, including four grade I scores. She won three grade I races last year, capped by a 5 3/4-length victory in the 14 Hands Winery Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies (gr. I).

A start at Saratoga would be just her second away from Southern California; the Medaglia d'Oro filly won the Juvenile Fillies at Keeneland.

"The New York Racing Association is committed to featuring the best horses at each of our racetracks," NYRA president Chris Kay said.

Fox Hill Farms won the 2000 edition of the Coaching Club American Oaks with Jostle.

"I love racing in grade I races before the fans at Saratoga," Porter said. "I also love going to the winner's circle after those races but we'll have some work to do first."

Porter said after meeting with trainer Jerry Hollendorfer, they planned to ship Songbird to Saratoga July 19. Porter said they may consider going a bit earlier than that date.

The plan, Porter said, is for the Hall of Fame trainer to stay with Songbird at Saratoga. Porter said they'll work to keep her feeling at home by also sending her regular assistant trainer, groom, and exercise rider.

NYRA officials said the sliding scale of awards for the field would include \$300,000 to the winner, \$100,000 for second place, \$50,000 to third, \$25,000 to fourth, \$15,000 to fifth, and \$10,000 divided equally among the remaining finishers.

Nominations for the running of the 2016 Coaching Club American Oaks close July 9. Subscriptions are \$300 each. To pass the entry box is \$1,500 and an additional \$1,500 is required to start in the race.

The Coaching Club American Oaks highlights the opening week of the 148th race meet at Saratoga, which begins July 22. **BH**

GRAYDAR COLTS TOP F-T PINHOOK PROSPECTS

Two years ago partners Mike McMahon and Jamie Hill scored a major pinhook home run when a Cowboy Cal colt they bought as a weanling sold for a sale-topping \$550,000 at the Fasig-Tipton Kentucky July yearling sale.

Northwest Stud bought the colt, named Cowboy's Hero, from the consignment of Hidden Brook, agent for McMahon and Hill. The partners had purchased the colt as a weanling for \$145,000 from the Eaton Sales consignment to Keeneland's 2013 November breeding stock sale.

McMahon and Hill hope history repeats itself at this year's Fasig-Tipton sale July 12 with a gray colt from the first crop of Graydar they bought for \$185,000 from the Scott Mallory consignment to last year's Keeneland November sale.

The colt is the highest-priced pinhook cataloged for this year's Fasig-Tipton July sale that includes 58 yearlings purchased as weanlings. As a group, they were bought for an aggregate \$2,572,500, an average price of \$44,353, and a median price of \$33,500. There are also 22 horses cataloged in the sale that were sold earlier this year as yearlings, averaging \$27,227, with a median of \$25,000.

The Graydar colt, consigned as Hip 235 by Hidden Brook, is out of the unraced Ghostzapper mare Heavenly Ghost, a half sister to three stakes winners, including grade III winners Dilemma and Heavenly Ransom. Amy Bayle, Lori Allen, and Catherine Jennings bred the colt in Kentucky. Bayle purchased Heavenly Ghost, while carrying the Graydar colt, for \$37,000 from the Lane's End consignment to the 2015 Keeneland January sale.

Graydar, who stands at Taylor Made Stallions near Nicholasville, Ky., was one of the hottest first-

crop sires of weanlings sold at auction last year with 16 sold for an average of \$93,813 from a 2016 fee of \$15,000. A son of Unbridled's Song and winner of the grade I Donn Handicap, Graydar also stood for \$15,000 when the current yearling crop was conceived in 2014.

McMahon said he and his partner have no trepidation about going to the first yearling sale of the year with such an expensive pinhook prospect from a first-crop sire.

"He's a really, really nice colt," McMahon said. "A number of people who have come by the farm to see our yearlings have commented he is the best of his sire's first crop they have seen. And that's what we thought last November."

Hip 160, also a son of Graydar, is the second-highest weanling purchase cataloged at Fasig-Tipton, as a \$110,000 purchase by Springdell Farm from Taylor Made Sales Agency's consignment at the Keeneland November auction. Produced from the stakes-winning Johannesburg mare Burg Berg, the colt was bred in Kentucky by Twin Creeks Racing, which also raced Graydar. Taylor Made Sales again consigns the colt to the sale. **BH**

LOADED FIELD FOR BELMONT DERBY INVITATIONAL

Ken and Sarah Ramsey homebred Camelot Kitten will face familiar 3-year-old rivals, as well as international newcomers, when the Kitten's Joy colt tries to secure a third straight graded stakes score in the \$1.25 million Belmont Derby Invitational Stakes (gr. I) July 9 at Belmont Park.

Since adding blinkers Camelot Kitten has registered narrow victories over other 3-year-olds in the American Turf Stakes (gr. IIT) May 7 at Churchill Downs and the 1 1/8-mile Pennine Ridge Stakes (gr. IIIT) June 4 on the inner turf at Belmont. The Pennine Ridge serves as the local prep for the Belmont Derby Invitational, which saw 13 enter the 1 1/4-mile race on the inner turf.

Like most of the U.S.-based horses entered Saturday, Camelot Kitten will be trying his longest distance to date. Camelot Kitten boasts three wins and two seconds from six lifetime starts, including two victories over Belmont's inner turf course. His only off-the-board finish came in the Breeders' Cup Juvenile Turf (gr. IT), where he raced wide and

faded to 12th.

"He likes Belmont," said trainer Chad Brown, noting the colt's local record. "And he is undefeated with the addition of blinkers."

John Oxley's Airoforce will look to take a major step forward on Saturday for trainer Mark Casse following a game effort in the Penn Mile where he finished second to filly and stablemate Catch a Glimpse, who is entered in the Belmont Oaks Invitational (gr. IT) Saturday. The versatile Colonel John colt was a winner on both grass and dirt as a 2-year-old, garnering attention last fall as an early candidate for the classics.

"He was off form at the beginning of the year, but he needed the race on Derby Day and I thought he had a tough trip in the Penn Mile," said Norm Casse, head assistant to his father, Mark Casse. "I really think he's sitting on a big one on Saturday."

Trainer Aidan O'Brien will be represented by a pair of runners in Long Island Sound and Deauville, set to headline the European contingent.

Long Island Sound, a Kentucky-bred colt by War Front, will bring his talents stateside for the first time. An \$800,000 weanling purchase, Long Island Sound has amassed three wins from four races since debut-

ing as a 3-year-old in April at Dundalk. Breaking his three-race win streak in his most recent start, Long Island Sound was third in the group III Tercentenary last month at Royal Ascot.

Shoring up the international delegation is Humphrey Bogart for trainer Richard Hannon. The Tagula colt proved a game winner of the Betfred Derby Trial this spring before following up with a fifth-place effort in the Investec Derby (Eng-I).

Other U.S.-trained starters of interest include Ralis and Surgical Strike. **BH**

EFFINEX SEEKS SUBURBAN REPEAT

Effinex looks to rebound from an off-the-board finish in his previous start and defend his title July 9 in the \$500,000 Suburban Handicap (gr. II) at Belmont Park, while Eagle aims to break through after two consecutive runner-up efforts in graded stakes.

Tri-Bone Stables' Effinex, a 5-year-old son of Mineshaft—What a Pear, by E Dubai, comes into the 1 1/4-mile test off a subpar effort in the June 18 Stephen Foster Handicap (gr. I) at Churchill Downs.

"I don't know what happened last time," said trainer Jimmy Jerkens. "He ran kind of wide, maybe he didn't like that but we'll give it another go. In some of his previous races where he's not run his best, I feel he might have been over-trained so we're careful not to do that this time."

Jerkens said the day before the Stephen Foster, Effinex went faster than intended around the Churchill oval.

"So we'll take it a little easier this time to see if he has more left in the tank," Jerkens said. "The fact that he's run very well at the distance in the past is encouraging. If anybody should be able to handle it, it should be him."

Effinex also has a good record at Belmont, with two wins and three thirds in eight starts. His victories include last year's Suburban, which he won by a head

over Tonalist.

Hall of Fame rider Mike Smith has the mount. He'll break from post 5 carrying high weight of 122 pounds. Smith piloted Effinex to victories in the 2015 Clark Handicap (gr. I) and in this year's Oaklawn Handicap (gr. II).

Jerkens will also send out Stronach Stables homebred Shaman Ghost, who enters off an easy win in the Brooklyn Invitational Stakes (gr. II) June 11 at Belmont.

Meanwhile, William S. Farish's homebred Eagle is looking for his second graded stakes win of the year out of five graded stakes starts. The 4-year-old son of Candy Ride—Sea Gull, by Mineshaft, has only been off the board once in his past nine starts. He followed his win in the grade III Ben Ali Stakes at Keeneland in April with second-place finishes in the Oaklawn Handicap and the Stephen Foster.

Running for owner John Oxley is multiple graded stakes winner Noble Bird, who comes into the race off a sixth-place running in his Belmont debut June 11 in the grade I Metropolitan Mile Handicap. Prior to that race, the 5-year-old son of Birdstone—Anyhow, by Tiznow, won the Pimlico Special Handicap (gr. III) by 11 1/4 lengths.

The race will mark the first start for Mubtaahij since he finished second to California Chrome in this year's Dubai World Cup sponsored by Emirates Airline (UAE-I). **BH**

HILL 'N' DALE HAS TRIO WITH FIRST YEARLINGS

Hill 'n' Dale Farms is hoping yearlings from the first crop of three sires it stands—the Gary and Mary West-owned grade I winners New Year's Day and Power Broker, and the popular CashCall Futurity (gr. I) winner Violence— will make their mark at the Fasig-Tipton Kentucky July sale.

New Year's Day is a son of Street Cry and winner of the 2013 Breeders' Cup Juvenile (gr. I). He was the top weight on the Experimental Free Handicap and stood for \$12,500 in 2014. Only a few of New Year's Day's first crop of 52 foals were offered at auction as weanlings, with four averaging \$25,250.

New Year's Day will be represented by three yearlings cataloged to the Kentucky July sale. Two of the yearlings are in the Paramount Sales

consignment—Hip 98 and Hip 274. The third, Hip 171, is consigned by Select Sales as agent for Machmer Hall.

Hip 98, a colt out of winner Vindicated Ghost (Vindication), is likely to garner attention as the colt's second dam is stakes-placed Dixie Ghost, whose six foals have all become winners and include graded stakes winners Salute the Sarge and Chelokee along with stakes winner Mymich.

Power Broker, a son of Pulpit, won the 2012 FrontRunner Stakes (gr. I), the grade II Indiana Derby, and finished second in the William Hill Haskell Invitational Stakes (gr. I). He stood for \$10,000 in 2014. Power Broker had fewer of his 56 first crop foals sell as weanlings, with three bringing an average of \$15,333.

The three Power Broker yearlings cataloged to the Kentucky July sale are offered by Paramount Sales as agent—Hip 169, Hip 246, and Hip 309. Hip 169 is sure to attract attention as a filly whose second dam is Chase It Down (by Polish

Numbers), the dam of Love the Chase, who produced 2014 Horse of the Year and dual classic winner California Chrome.

Breeders of sale yearlings by New Year's Day and Power Broker will be keen on seeing them wind up in the best hands considering both are backed by a bonus program worth \$2.5 million. The breeder of the first grade I winner by each stallion will receive \$250,000, and a \$1 million bonus is available if one of their runners win the Breeders' Cup Juvenile or the Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies (gr. I).

Violence, a son of Medaglia d'Oro, won the Cash-Call Futurity (gr. I) at 2 and became a winter book favorite for the Kentucky Derby Presented by Yum! Brands (gr. I) after finishing second in the 2013 Besilu Stables Fountain of Youth Stakes (gr. II) by half a length to eventual Derby winner Orb. His Derby journey got sidetracked, however, by a fractured sesamoid.

Violence has 128 foals in his first crop, produced from a solid group of mares with 1.72 CI and 2.68 CPI. His first weanlings were well received at the sales last year when 24 sold for an average of \$73,875. His weanling median is \$75,000 against a 2014 stud fee of \$15,000.

Two of the 10 Violence yearlings cataloged to the Kentucky July sale have been withdrawn. The eight still due to be auctioned are spread among the Hill 'n' Dale Sales Agency (Hip 224), Lane's End (Hip 4), Burleson Farms (Hip 6), Taylor Made Sales Agency (Hips 61, 196), Warrendale Sales (Hip 203), Bluewater Sales (Hip 219), and Select Sales (Hip 298) consignments.

Three of the Kentucky July entrants are out of stakes-winning mares: Hip 4, a gray colt out grade III-placed Queen's Triomphe (by Cure the Blues); Hip 6, a colt out of Reddy For Rubys (Precise End); and Hip 224, a colt out of grade II winner Frolic's Dream (Smoke Glacken). Frolic's Dream is also the dam of Bode's Dream, who became 2016 freshman sire Bodemeister's first winner May 11 at Gulfstream Park.

Three yearlings have been cataloged to the Saratoga select sale. They will be consigned by Hill 'n' Dale Sales (Hip 115), Paramount Sales (Hip 173), and Taylor Made Sales Agency (Hip 197). **BH**

MARKET ALREADY BULLISH ON ORB

Claiborne Farm's Orb, winner of the 2013 Kentucky Derby Presented by Yum! Brands (gr. I), is the early market leader among sires with first yearlings in 2016.

Stuart Janney III and Ogden Mills "Dinny" Phipps' homebred son of Malibu Moon had 16 of his progeny sold as weanlings, which generated an average of \$120,313. Their value in the market was backed up by a median price of \$120,000.

These yearlings were produced from a solid group of mares as indicated by a Comparable Index (CI) of 2.17, the second-highest for this sire class, and a Class Performance Index (CPI) of 4.88, which is the highest for the class. The CI indicates how good a stallion's book of mares is as producers, while the CPI indicates how good those mares were as racehorses.

Orb will be represented by two yearlings at the Fasig-Tipton Kentucky July sale (Hips 163, 312) and eight at the Fasig-Tipton Saratoga select sale (Hips 36, 66, 79, 91, 129, 150, 172, and 206).

The Kentucky July offerings include a filly out of the unraced Horse Chestnut mare Castanea (Hip 163), whose dam Yarn produced group I winner Minardi, graded stakes winner and sire Tale of the Cat, and stakes winner and graded stakes producer Spunoutofcontrol.

Yarn is also the dam of Myth, who produced European champion and top sire Johannesburg. The filly is being consigned by Indian Creek as agent.

The other July yearling by Orb, consigned by Four Star Sales as agent, is a colt out of the unraced Speightstown mare Mullins

Bay, who is a full sister to graded stakes winner Bridgetown.

Claiborne is also offering the first yearling crop of grade I turf runner Data Link, a son of top international sire War Front. Data Link, bred and raced by Janney, won the Maker's Mark 46 Mile Stakes (gr. IT), set a new course record in the Monmouth Stakes (gr. IIT), and also won the Citation Handicap (gr. IIT) and Canadian Turf Stakes (Can-III).

Standing for \$7,500 in 2014, Data Link offered a solid return on his weanlings, which averaged \$29,431 for 26 sold. His weanling median is \$20,500.

Data Link has three yearlings cataloged for the Kentucky July sale. They are consigned by Bernard McCormack's Cara Bloodstock (Hip 43), Shawhan Place as agent for Austin and Brenda Paul (Hip 306), and Bill Murphy as agent (Hip 335).

Hip 306 is a filly out of the unraced Bernardini mare Miss Patchouli, who is out of the stakes-placed and graded stakes producing mare Snow Forest. Miss Patchouli is a half sister to grade I winner and sire Snow Ridge and to stakes winner Pavarotti. The filly's family also includes connections to graded stakes winners Afleet Express, Fifty-shadesofhay, Materiality, and My Miss Sophia. **BH**

BUCKPASSER'S SUBURBAN HANDICAP

What is the probability the two horses that won the same top-drawer stakes would be the sire and dam of a winner of that same race, who would then go on to sire two winners and be the maternal grandsire of another?

No one has probably ever calculated those odds but they must be astronomical. Nevertheless, between 1951 and 1990, it happened with the historic Suburban Handicap (gr. II), which celebrates its 130th renewal July 9 at Belmont Park.

First run at Sheepshead Bay in 1884, the Suburban became a must-stop for older horses as it progressed through the centuries, and its list of winners is a Who's Who of the finest names in racing history. Along its journey into the present it joined the equally historic Metropolitan Handicap and the Brooklyn Handicap to become known as the Triple Crown of Handicaps.

Only five females have graced the winner's circle in the race's previous 129 runnings, the last being Ogden Phipps' Busanda in 1951. Acquired in utero when Phipps, John Hay Whitney, and Robert Kleberg purchased the E.R. Bradley estate, Busanda was a daughter of War Admiral out of a Blue Larkspur daughter of the matriarch of all matriarchs, La Troienne. She won the Alabama Stakes as a 3-year-old and had her best year at 4, winning the Saratoga Cup and Suburban over male rivals.

Two years later Greentree Stable's Tom Fool had his 10-for-10 Horse of the Year season. After winning the Metropolitan Handicap, he faced six rivals and as the 128-pound highweight, won the Suburban by a nose. Two months later

he added the Brooklyn Handicap to become only the second winner of the Handicap Triple Crown.

The paths of Busanda and Tom Fool crossed in the Greentree breeding shed in 1962, and in 1963 Busanda foaled a beautiful, well-conformed bay colt for Phipps. Named Buckpasser, he rarely set a foot wrong and earned championships each year he raced. He was Horse of the Year in 1966, when he won 13 of 14 starts.

At 4, he picked up the family mantle from both parents and won the Suburban by a half-length. Already a victor in the Metropolitan, he failed to emulate his sire's Handicap Triple Crown, finishing second in the Brooklyn.

Retired to stud at Claiborne Farm, Buckpasser sired 36 stakes winners from 312 foals (12%) in a career cut short by an early death. Among those stakes winners were State Dinner, winner of the Suburban in 1979 and Silver Buck, the 1982 victor. Both homebreds for C.V. JAY WOW FIRST WINNER FOR JERSEY TOWN

Presque Isle Downs juvenile victor Jay Wow became the first winner for Darby Dan Farm sire Jersey Town.

Starting as the favorite in a field of five for a five-furlong maiden claiming race for juvenile fillies, Jay Wow went straight to the front for jockey Arlenne Cox and cleared out for a two-length victory.

Bred by Charles Fipke, Jay Wow was a \$2,500 bargain buy for owner-trainer Wayne Rice. She is the first foal of Ima Soul Miss (Perfect Soul), a winner of three races.

By Speightstown, Jersey Town is out of multiple grade I winner Jersey Girl (Belong to Me), and traces back to Fool-Me-Not, the dam of Kentucky Derby (gr. I) winner Foolish Pleasure.

Second in the British Columbia Derby (Can-III) at 3, Jersey Town emerged as a topliner at 4. He won the Hill 'n' Dale Cigar Mile (gr. I) and placed in three other graded races at that age. He placed three times at 5,

including a second in the Forego Stakes (gr. I), and at 6 he won the Kelso Handicap (gr. II).

MY IMPRESSION IMPRESSES IN CHRISTIANA

Stuart S. Janney III's Kentucky homebred My Impression, the favorite in a field of 10, rated nicely just off the pace, took over in the stretch and pulled away to win the \$50,635 Christiana Stakes for 3-year-old fillies July 9 at Delaware Park.

My Impression, by Sky Mesa out of the Broad Brush mare Impressionism, won for the third time in five starts—all on turf—and earned her first stakes victory. She's trained by Shug McGaughey and was ridden by Jose Ortiz.

The Christiana, at 1 1/16 miles on a turf course rated firm, attracted a quality field of fillies, most of which had competed in stakes.

April Gaze and It's the Truth duelled for more than seven furlongs through modest fractions of :23.90 for the opening quarter-mile, :49.04 for a half-mile, and 1:13.84 for six furlongs with Involuntary just behind along the inside. My Impression, wide on the final turn, swept by the leaders to win by 3 1/4 lengths over Involuntary, who held second over a rallying Outsider Art.

The final time was 1:44.48. My Impression re-

turned \$7.40 to win.

My Impression, who trains locally at the Fair Hill Training Center in Maryland, finished fifth in her last start, the Memories of Silver Stakes in late April at Aqueduct Racetrack. **BH**

LITTLE MIKE'S PLANNED COMEBACK AT GULFSTREAM

With an ongoing horse neglect case involving trainer Maria Borell and her father grabbing headlines, owner/trainer Carlo Vaccarezza hopes the return of his turf star Little Mike to racing after a two-year hiatus sends a different message—that most racehorse owners care.

Vaccarezza, a South Florida businessman-turned-trainer, is aiming his multiple grade I winner for a 1 1/16-mile allowance optional claiming race July 9 on the Gulfstream Park grass. If the race fills, Little Mike will make his first start since May 17, 2014, when he won the Flying Pidgeon Stakes.

After that last race, however, Vaccarezza said the multi-millionaire gelding by Spanish Steps—Hay Jude, by Wavering Monarch, just wasn't himself.

"Really, he needed some time," Vaccarezza said. "He had some tendonitis, some wear and tear on his suspensory, but nothing that required surgery. The trip to Dubai wasn't bad, but I think the trip to Hong Kong really took it out of him."

After a strong 2012 season that saw Little Mike in the winner's circle of the Woodford Reserve Turf Classic, Arlington Million Stakes, and the Breeders' Cup Turf (all gr. IT), he followed up the next year with a bigger international grade I schedule that included the Dubai Duty Free Sponsored by Dubai Duty Free at Meydan, the Arlington Million, the Joe Hirsch Turf Classic Invitational Stakes at Belmont Park, Breeders' Cup Turf at Santa Anita Park, and the Longines Hong Kong Cup. His only win came in the Joe Hirsch Turf Classic.

During his nearly 26-month layoff, Vaccarezza had Little Mike evaluated a couple times by renowned surgeon Dr. Larry Bramlage, and he sent him to Win-Star Farm in Central Kentucky for hyperbaric treatments, then to Ocala Stud where he went through a swimming regimen.

"I know I overdid it, whatever needed to be done," Vaccarezza said. "The acupuncture, the vibrating floor, the swimming—I did it all. We didn't spare any expenses because the horse deserved it. If he had another owner, he might have started a couple of times already, but I took my sweet time."

Since returning to Palm Meadows Training Center

in December, Little Mike appears to be refreshed and his training progressing, Vaccarezza said. He knows that doesn't necessarily translate to success in the afternoons.

"It is good for the sport for him to come back, and I hope it works," he said. "I don't want to jinx him, but if it doesn't work out, then he'll have a great retirement somewhere, whether it is Old Friends, or the Kentucky Horse Park, or with Richard Migliore and the TRF in New York."

"For now, we are focusing on keeping him healthy, and I hope he makes a good showing on Saturday." **BH**

DISAPPOINTING START FOR FIRST-CROP SIRES

With less than a month left of the Australian racing season, the current group of first-crop sires have been largely disappointing.

These stallions were the talk of the sale ring 18 months ago. Champion 2-year-old Sepoy (Elusive Quality) in particular hit home runs with a Aus\$1.2 million (\$984,360) Magic Millions sale topper and a Aus\$1.6 million (\$1,221,280) Inglis Easter colt.

At the top of the Australian first-crop sires list is Epsom Derby (Eng-I) winner Pour Moi (Montjeu), who shuttles to New Zealand's Windsor Park Stud. His four Australian starters produced one winner, JJ Atkins Stakes (Aus-I) victor Sacred Elixir, placing him 25th among all 2-year-old sires.

Second is Sepoy, but his four winners from 26 starters (plus one in New Zealand) are well shy of what was expected from a Golden Slipper (Aus-I) winner. Darley halved his service fee for 2016, which speaks volumes.

Ninth on the first-crop list is Uncle Mo. From a first Australian crop of 62, he has two winners from nine Australian starters, and one stakes-placed horse.

Only four first-crop sires have a stakes winner: Pour Moi, Moshe, Poet's Voice, and Helmet.

The jury is still out on many of these stallions and the next 12 months may tell a different story. **BH**

EURO CHARLINE RETIRED FROM RACING

Euro Charline, the first 3-year-old to capture the Beverly D. Stakes (gr. IT) for fillies and mares in 2014 at Arlington International Racecourse, has been retired from racing and will be entered in the Tattersalls December sale, owner Team Valor International said July 6.

Euro Charline, also second in three group I events and third in another, earned \$2,352,563. The 5-year-old mare by Myboycharlie out of the Common Grounds mare Eurolink Artemis was bred in Great Britain by Brian Liversage.

"In the lead up to the group I Falmouth Stakes (July 8), she has done a tendon breezing on the all-weather gallop, which last week took a lot of rain," Team Valor chief executive officer Barry Irwin said.

In three starts this year, Euro Charline finished second three times, twice against males in the \$6 million Dubai Turf (UAE-I) and the Lockinge Stakes (Eng-I) at Newbury in her last start. She retires with a Timeform master rating of 119 and as the highest-earning filly or mare in Team Valor history.

Marco Botti, who trained Euro Charline and will consign her for the Tattersalls sale, said: "Euro Charline was one of the best horses I have trained. She was not the luckiest horse to be fair, and a couple of her seconds very well could have been firsts. While her family is not out of the top drawer, she will prove popular with breeders at the sale because she looks the part." **BH**

IN ONTARIO, A WORTHWHILE ENDEAVOR

As the Ontario horseracing industry attempts to reinvent itself after the government pulled the plug on its slots-at-racetracks program in 2013, another organization is pushing for regulatory changes it says could help the industry grow.

The Alcohol and Gaming Commission of Ontario in April 2016 took over racing regulation from the Ontario Racing Commission. Part of its mission, according to chief executive officer Jean Major, is to provide tools to move racing toward a new environment.

"We want our approach to horseracing regulation to ensure fairness and safety in racing, while also serving to support a modern and thriving industry," Major said in a message to the industry. "At the same time, we want to eliminate any unnecessary administrative burden and artificial barriers to growth and industry development."

The AGCO has launched an endeavor called "Moving Ahead: Horse Racing Regulation in Ontario," which seeks "common sense" changes to regulatory rules and procedures. In doing so, the organization is asking for input from racing industry stakeholders.

An outline focuses on the following: integrity, safety, ensuring the well-being of racehorses, and protecting the public interest; reducing the provinces' regulatory burden; supporting economic development and industry innovation; and developing a "modern" regulatory framework.

Feedback from the industry led to the out-

reach effort. The AGCO said it already has been told that Ontario's "approach to equine drug testing could potentially be made more effective."

As for regulation, the AGOC is soliciting comments on simplifying licensing rules, limiting the right to appeal for "low-level violations," and scrapping outdated rules regarding racetrack operations. It noted individuals who race more than breed—Ontario offers Thoroughbred, Standardbred, and Quarter Horse racing—must have licenses for each track.

The AGCO compared the initiative with those undertaken in the gaming and alcohol sectors in the province. It said the resulting policy adjustments "remove barriers to new investment and innovation."

The response from racing stakeholders could prove interesting, because questions in the consultation document are rather broad. For instance, one reads: "What do you believe are the most important factors to

ensuring the long-term economic sustainability of Ontario's horseracing industry?"

That's a loaded question given the following statistics for Thoroughbred racing alone: The 2014 Ontario foal crop was half what it was in 2007; the number of stallions in the province fell from 102 to 70 during that same period, and the number of mares bred in 2014 was 871 compared with 1,453 eight years earlier, according to The Jockey Club statistics.

Those trends are common in many United States racing jurisdictions. Uncommon in the U.S., however, are attempts to remove obstacles to growth and industry development. **BH**
