F-T JULY: LOWEST STUD FEES, HIGHEST PROFIT

Though the overall average price slid 11.8% at Fasig-Tipton's July yearling sale, horses representing stud fees of \$10,000 and under managed to generate the highest percentage of profitable sales and the highest rate of return.

Stud fee ranges represented by three or more sold were considered.

Of 51 yearlings bred in 2014 on \$10,000 and under stud fees, 26 (51%) sold and 22 (85%) of those were profitable. These yearlings collectively averaged \$58,808 and were bred on an average \$6,231 stud fee. The ratio of average price to average stud fee was 8.97 for this group, and the ROR 72%.

ROR is the percent difference between the net average price (price minus a 5% sales commission) and the projected cost of breeding and raising the foal. The projected cost is two times the stud fee plus \$20,000 and is equal to a sire's break-even yearling price.

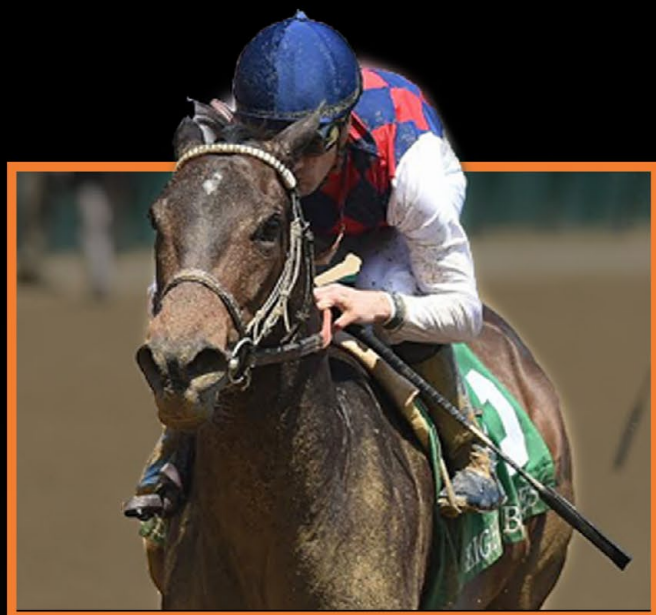

Among the most successful sires in the \$10,000 and under range were two first-crop sons of War Front: Data Link and Soldat.

Claiborne Farm's grade I winner Data Link had two yearlings average \$75,000, compared with a projected break-even price of \$35,000 off a \$7,500 fee. His ROR was a healthy 104%.

Woodford Thoroughbreds' Soldat, a grade II winner, was represented by three sold for an average \$65,000. They were bred on a \$5,000 stud fee that translates to a projected break-even price of \$30,000. Soldat's ROR was 106%.

Yearlings bred on a 2014 stud fee range of \$25,000-\$49,999 produced the second-highest percentage of profitable horses. Of 56 yearlings representing this range, 68% of the 37 sold were profitable.

Four stallions were primarily responsible for the growth in the \$25,000-\$49,999 range: Curlin, Uncle Mo, City Zip, and Midnight Lute. The profitable yearlings representing these sires accounted for 60% of 25 profitable sales for their fee range.

Among these four sires, Hill 'n' Dale Farms' Curlin generated the highest average price (\$253,333) and highest ROR (244%).

Curlin's 2014 stud fee was \$25,000, so his projected break-even price was \$120,000. His three yearlings sold for an average \$253,333. The son of Smart Strike's bestseller, a colt out of the multiple stakes producer Franscat (Stormin Fever), topped the sale at \$475,000. Randy Hartley and Dean DeRenzo bought the colt from the St. George Sales consignment.

Eight yearlings representing Ashford Stud's star second-crop sire Uncle Mo averaged \$190,000, exceeding their projected break-even price by \$115,000 and producing a 141% ROR.

Lane's End's City Zip was represented by two yearlings that averaged \$207,500 and generated a 182% ROR. **BH**

I'M A CHATTERBOX HEADLINES DELAWARE HANDICAP

Fletcher and Carolyn Gray's homebred I'm a Chatterbox, an easy winner of the Obeah Stakes in her last start, could be heavily favored versus five other fillies and mares in the \$750,000 Delaware Handicap (gr. I) July 16 at Delaware Park.

Trained by Larry Jones, I'm a Chatterbox, a 4-year-old by Munnings out of the Lost Soldier mare Chit Chatter, captured her first grade I stakes last September in the Cotillion Stakes at Parx Racing and then finished a troubled eighth in the Longines Breeders' Cup Distaff (gr. I) in October to conclude her 3-year-old season.

I'm a Chatterbox returned to the races in April at Keeneland and finished second, 2 1/4 lengths behind Brooklynsway, in the grade III Hilliard Lyons Double-dogdare Stakes. She then won the 1 1/8-mile Obeah at Delaware Park by 8 1/2 lengths June 11 in her prep for the 1 1/4-mile Del Cap.

"She has been doing well," Jones, who bases his stable at Delaware Park for the summer, told track media officials. "We have worked her one time since the Obeah, but she got enough out of that race to cover her a long way. She should be ready to go.

"We kind of had to go into Obeah one work short of what I intended; needless to say it worked out OK. She won and ran well, but the Obeah should have us ready and where we need to be."

I'm a Chatterbox, a winner of \$1,384,614 in 13 starts, will be ridden by Florent Geroux, who has been aboard for nine of her starts, from post 4 in the six-horse field. Gabriel Saez rode her in the Obeah, which went in a soft 1:53.20 on a tack rated fast; Geroux, who watched the replay, contacted Jones after the race.

"She opened a sizable lead, and (Geroux) said she just started losing focus," Jones said. "When she gets a lead like

that, you just have to keep her really focused if you want her to do more. He told me I shouldn't worry about it."

Klaravich Stables and William Lawrence's lightly raced Paid Up Subscriber, winner of the 1 1/8-mile Fleur de Lis Stakes (gr. II) June 18 at Churchill Downs in her first start around two turns, drew the rail position with Ricardo Santana Jr. named. The 4-year-old Candy Ride filly should be well-suited for the Del Cap distance, trainer Al Stall Jr. said.

The lone entrant exiting a grade I event is Godolphin Racing's Penwith, a 5-year-old Bernardini mare trained by Kiaran McLaughlin. Penwith, to be ridden by Joel Rosario from post 6, finished sixth and last in the La Troienne (gr. I) at Churchill May 6 but earlier in the year won the grade II Royal Delta Stakes at Gulfstream Park. **BH**

UNCLE MO COLT TOPS F-T PROFITABLE PINHOOKS

Although she was not the most expensive horse at the Fasig-Tipton July selected yearling sale, an Uncle Mo filly sold by Gerry Dilger's Dromoland Farm, as agent, to Cary Frommer for \$250,000 provided the highest percentage of return among 67 pinhooked horses in the auction.

Bred in Kentucky by Machmer Hall, the filly, Hip 217, produced from the winning Grand Reward mare Flowers Atthefinish, was purchased by Nitiosagan Farm for \$50,000 at the 2015 Keeneland November mixed sale. After deducting the sales company's 5% commission and factoring in the \$10,000 estimated upkeep costs from time of purchase to sale, the filly returned an estimated 296% on investment.

Consigned by VanMeter-Gentry Sales as Hip 102, a filly from the first crop of Spendthrift Farm stallion Liaison yielded the second-highest Fasig-Tipton ROI of 239%, as a \$100,000 purchase by Steven A. Shahinian, agent for Clark and Braverman. The filly had been an \$18,000 purchase as a weanling at Keeneland by Rayben Stable.

The filly was bred by JLC Horses, which bought her stakes-placed dam Whiletheirons' shot for \$8,000 at the 2015 Keeneland January sale

with the Liaison filly in utero.

According to *Blood-Horse MarketWatch*, 42 of the 67 Fasig-Tipton pinhooks were sold, with 30 of them profitable. As a group, the Fasig-Tipton pinhooks had a 47% ROI. **BH**

CHERRY WINE FAVORED FOR INDIANA DERBY

Cherry Wine headlines a field of 12 3-year-olds in the \$500,000 Indiana Derby (gr. II) July 16 at Indiana Grand Racing & Casino.

Hot off the Triple Crown trail, the son of Paddy O'Prado is seeking his first graded stakes victory for owners Frank Shoop, Frank Jones Jr., and William Pacella.

The Dale Romans trainee is the morning-line favorite at 5/2 and will have Luis Saez in the irons from post 2. After failing to make the field for the Kentucky Derby Presented by Yum! Brands (gr. I), the gray made a name for himself edging out Nyquist for runner-up behind Exaggerator in the Preakness Stakes (gr. I). He shares a 124 pound co-highweight assignment with grade III winner Cocked and Loaded, who finished fourth in the Ohio Derby in his last start. Cherry Wine ships to Indiana for his first start since finishing seventh in the Belmont Stakes presented by NYRA Bets (gr. I), beaten nine lengths.

"The Belmont is the Belmont. It's a classic race. He ran mid-pack and didn't embarrass himself. But he probably doesn't want to go a mile and a half," Romans said. "I really didn't think I'd run him back this quick. I was going to give him a little bit more time, run in the Haskell or Jim Dandy, but we're right here at home, in our backyard. This is where some horses will step up and start looking like the top horses for the last half of the year."

Romans will also run Cherry Wine's stable-mate Takeittotheedge, a Broken Vow colt who is making his second start for Jim Bakke and Gerry Isbister's Bakster Farm since sustaining an injury after stumbling badly at the start of the Xpressbet.com Florida Derby (gr. I). He made his return finishing third in a June 26 Churchill Downs allowance race behind Forevamo and Pinson—both were nominated to run in the Indiana Derby, but neither passed the entry box.

"He ripped part of his foot off," Romans explained. "It took him a long time to get back to the races. I just think he's a horse with a lot of talent and worth taking a shot at a good 3-year-old race. He can run."

Trainer Bob Baffert will send Michael Tabor, Susan Magnier, and Derrick Smith's grade II Rebel winner Cupid to this year's Indiana Derby. Lackluster performances in the Arkansas Derby (gr. I) and Easy Goer Stakes derailed the Tapit colt's momentum.

"This is a very important spot for him to regain form. The last two races were a disappointment. It was very surprising he didn't run well," Baffert said. "His last race was too fast for him and he was chasing, so he should be better off going two turns. This is a great spot for him to get back to where he was in the Rebel."

Indiana Grand's Saturday card boasts six stakes races worth over \$1 million, including the \$200,000 Indiana Oaks (gr. II), which rounds out the duo of 3-year-old showcases. **BH**

RAMSEY'S BROTHER TO REAL SOLUTION DEBUTS

Kitten's Solution, a juvenile son of Kitten's Joy and a full brother to multiple grade I winner Real Solution, will be making his first start on the Belmont turf July 14.

Ken and Sarah Ramsey's homebred Kitten's Solution is out of Reachfortheheavens (Pulpit). The mare won only a maiden race but has produced three winners from four runners, including a stakes-winning full sister, Ava's Kitten.

Kitten's Solution was sent to the 2015 Keeneland September sale but was an RNA at \$95,000.

Trainer Wesley Ward sends out the colt in the six-furlong maiden special weight, coupled in the betting with stablemate Don't Gild Th Lily (Kitten's Joy), also a Ramsey homebred.

The two colts ship from Keeneland where Kitten's Solution worked four furlongs July 7 in :47.8, posting the fastest time of 24 horses.

The coupled entry is the morning-line favorite. Gary Contessa-trained Giant Brownie is listed at a slightly higher price.

The son of Big Brown out of the Woodman mare Elbow is a half brother to five-time grade II winner D'Funnybone and a full brother to winner H Town Brown.

STORMY LUCY WILL GO TO FRANKEL

Grade I winner Stormy Lucy, who topped the Fasig-Tipton July selected horses of racing age sale July 11 selling for \$575,000, will be bred to Frankel on Southern Hemisphere breeding time this year.

The decision to breed the 7-year-old daughter of Stormy Atlantic, who initially went through the ring unsold on a final bid of \$650,000 before being bought privately, was made after a half interest in the mare was sold to Bruce Neill's Cressfield Stud in Australia.

SF Bloodstock's Tom Ryan said Stormy Lucy was purchased with the intent to breed her to Newgate Stud's Capitalist, the Australian champion 2-year-old that won the country's prestigious Golden Slipper (Aus-I) and will stand at Newgate Stud.

"She's a beautiful mare who has been racing at the highest level for a long time," Ryan said. "We have been sourcing high-quality mares from around the world to support Capitalist. After we purchased the mare, the opportunity was presented to partner with Cressfield in Australia, who are incredibly established and fantastic breeders.

"The suggestion was made to breed her to Frankel on Southern Hemisphere time, send her her to Australia, foal the Frankel, and breed her to Capitalist the second time around."

The European champion older horse, who retired with a record of 14 wins in as many starts, Frankel stands at Banstead Manor Stud Farm in England and has seven winners from his first crop which are 2-year-olds. **BH**

SEATTLE SLEW ON SALE

At the recently completed Fasig-Tipton July sale, the first of the yearling season, the highest-priced horse was the \$475,000 paid for the son of two-time Horse of the Year Curlin.

If the most successful graduate of the Fasig-Tipton summer sale went through the same sale ring some 41 years ago, the question comes to mind as to where he would rank today on the results list.

In 1975 a foursome of newcomers to Thoroughbred racing plunked down \$17,500 on a fun July Saturday night for a dark bay son of Bold Reasoning—My Charmer, winner of the Fair Grounds Oaks in 1972. It was a time when the sale's highest-priced

horse brought \$110,000.

Consigned by his breeder Ben S. Castleman, the colt became the property of Karen and Mickey Taylor and their partners Jim and Sally Hill. The colt they named Seattle Slew changed their lives forever.

Undefeated at 2, Seattle Slew, trained by Billy Turner, won the Champagne Stakes (gr. I) by nearly 10 lengths, an impressive enough performance to earn him a championship title even though he only started three times.

Seattle Slew reeled off victory after victory at 3 and remains the only horse to win the Triple Crown undefeated. He was voted champion 3-year-old male and Horse of the Year for his efforts.

At 4, he won the grade I Marlboro Cup Handicap and Woodward Stakes but lost the Jockey Club Gold Cup (gr. I) before regrouping in the grade III Stuyvesant Handicap his final start.

Under ordinary circumstances this might have been good enough for a second Horse of the Year title, but there was a new sheriff in town, Triple Crown winner Affirmed, so Slew had to settle for the champion older male title.

He took his \$1,208,726 in earnings to Spendthrift Farm, where half of him had been syndicated for \$6,000,000.

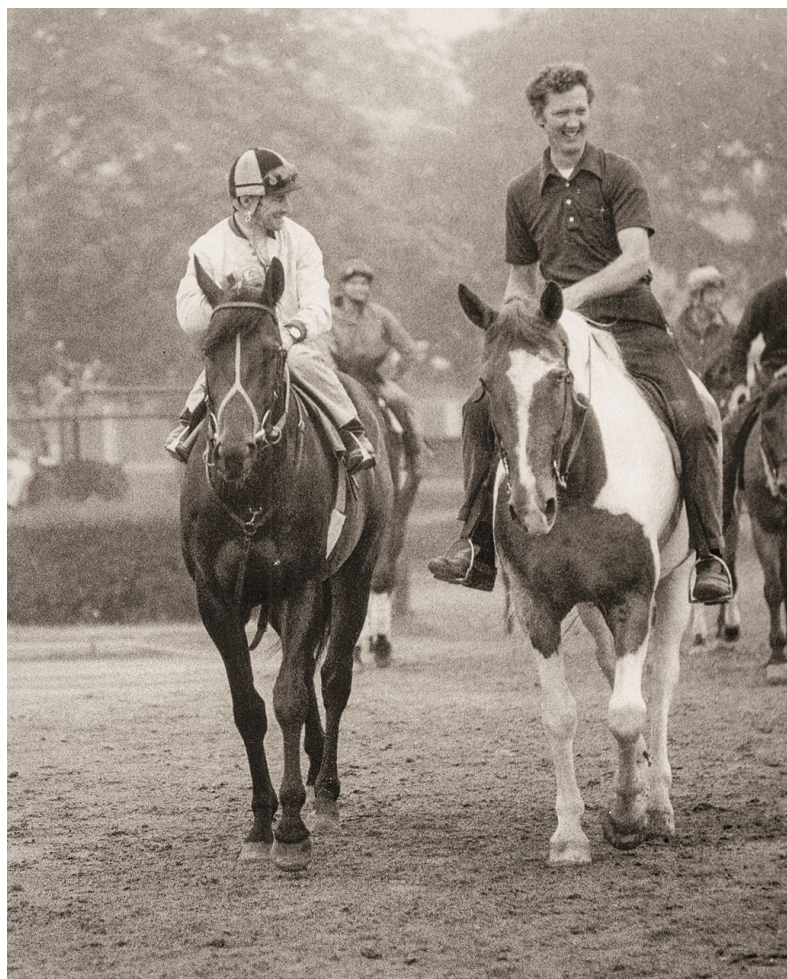
As a sire, he was an unqualified success and the main conduit for the Bold Ruler branch of the Nasrullah sire line. His best son A.P. Indy put forth a pretty strong branch through Pulpit and his son Tapit, who is well on his way to earning a third leading sire title.

In 24 crops Seattle Slew sired 114 stakes winners from 1,103 foals (10%) and progeny that earned more than \$84 million.

Seattle Slew died in 2002 and is buried at Hill 'n' Dale Farms near Lexington.

Coincidentally, My Charmer, the dam of the bargain colt also produced the most expensive yearling ever sold at public auction. In 1985 at the across-town Keeneland July sale, her Nijinsky II son sold for \$13.1 million.

So, the question remains, where would Seattle Slew have ranked in this year's Fasig-Tipton results list. In 2016, the \$17,500 price tag would have cost Slew's buyers \$79,753, and Slew would have been 67th of the 183 yearlings sold. **BH**

NEW LANGUAGE URGED FOR PARI-MUTUEL TAXES

Two members of Congress who support pari-mutuel tax changes submitted a joint letter July 12 urging the United States Department of Treasury to finalize new language.

The House earlier passed the 2017 Financial Services and General Government Appropriations bill, which includes "Guidelines for Pari-Mutuel Winnings." The proposed regulations redefine the amount of a wager to include all of a bettor's investment into a single pari-mutuel pool rather than the base amount of the winning combination.

The House Appropriations Committee urged the Treasury Department to expedite the regulations, which are included in a Senate version of the bill that cleared committee.

In their letter to the Treasury Department, Democratic Rep. John Yarmuth of Kentucky and Republican Rep. Charles Boustany Jr. of Louisiana encouraged the department and the Internal Revenue Service to "modernize the pari-mutuel tax treatment by alter-

ing the definition of a bet or wager to better reflect today's pari-mutuel wagering products."

The congressmen said the proposed guidelines have bipartisan support, and that pari-mutuel wagering supports "tens of thousands of jobs from the farm to the racetrack."

In 2015 there were about 12,000 comments submitted to the Treasury and IRS in support of the proposed change. **BH**

ASIAN INVESTORS BOOST AUSSIE RACING

Growing Asian investments in Australian racing and breeding has been highlighted in recent times by the success of China Horse Club, Sun Stud, and Aquis Farm with Yulong Investments now also signalling its intention to become a major player.

Owned by Chinese billionaire Zhang Yeusheng, Yulong Investments purchased a stud farm in Victoria and is steadily building a bloodstock portfolio spanning both hemispheres.

Yeusheng's colors featured at Tipperary in Ireland last weekend in a juvenile stakes race won by promising filly Yulong Baobei (Choisir) while in Australia his unbeaten 2-year-old colt Yu Long Sheng Hui (Sebring) shows stakes potential.

INDIANA GROWS IN REGIONAL STATURE

Indiana Grand Racing & Casino, which held its first Thoroughbred meet in 2003 before racetrack slot machines were authorized, heads into its biggest program of the season leading the way among regional tracks in terms of average daily purses and field size.

The July 16 program, with the \$500,000 Indiana Derby (gr. II) as the centerpiece, will offer \$1.23 million in total purses.

Of the nine tracks currently racing in Illinois, Indiana, Iowa, Kentucky, Michigan, Minnesota, and Ohio, Indiana Grand had the highest average daily purse payout at \$205,487 and the highest average per race at \$25,034 through July 12. It was also the only track in the region to average more than eight horses per race with 8.07.

The importance of the state-bred program to Indiana racing is shown by this alone: Of the \$9.86 million in purses paid for the meet's first 48 programs, \$5.38 million, or 54.5%, was for restricted races. Of the total 394 Thoroughbred races, 52% were reserved for state-bred runners.

The Indiana-registered foal crop was at its highest point from 2010-12 with a three-year average of 738, according to Jockey Club statistics. The number began falling in 2013, and registrations for 2015 were about 400.

Changes made this year are designed to encourage more participation in the program. There are an additional \$1.4 million in the Thoroughbred Breed Development Program; 20 stakes, each worth \$100,000, up from \$85,000 last year; and approval for Indiana Grand to increase the number of state-bred races throughout the meet by 15%.

Many factors have caused the slippage of Arlington International Racecourse, which has gradually lost ground in the region and nationally. Though average daily purses were up substantially for the first 33 days of this year's meet compared with the same period in 2015, a purse reduction is slated for the next condition book.

The Illinois track's daily purse average of \$192,826 so far this year is up 39.5% compared with the same period in 2015, and average field size is up slightly to 7.69 from 7.56. But effective July 21,

the purse for a maiden special weight event will drop 20% from \$32,000 to \$25,600; the pots for other races will drop 10%-20%.

Ellis Park in western Kentucky is fourth in average daily purses with \$189,645 for the first five days of its meet. But despite the 21.6% increase from last year, the average number of horses per race has dropped from 8.33 in 2015 to 7.93.

Things are thin at the bottom as well, which was almost unheard of years ago. Fairmount Park in Illinois and Hazel Park in Michigan, which cater to lower-level stock, are averaging 6.66 and 6.40 horses per race, respectively. **BH**
