DRESSED IN HERMES RETURNS TO DEL MAR

Dressed in Hermes likes Del Mar, where he won the Cecil B. DeMille Stakes (gr. IIIT) last year to claim his greatest victory to date.

The 3-year-old son of Hat Trick returns July 15 on Del Mar's opening day with a drop in class to the \$100,000 Oceanside Stakes, but will face a loaded field as he seeks a return to the winner's circle.

A full field of 14 plus two also-eligibles entered the one-mile Oceanside for 3-year-olds, with Dressed in Hermes named the 124-pound co-highweight along with the comebacking Hollywood Don.

Hall of Fame jockey Mike Smith will be aboard Dressed in Hermes for trainer Janet Armstrong from post 9; he rode the bay gelding in his DeMille victory and to take the March 13 Pasadena Stakes at Santa Anita Park, Dressed in Hermes' only win from four starts this season. Those

included a last-out sixth—albeit by just 1 3/4 lengths—in the June 4 Pennine Ridge Stakes (gr. IIIT) at Belmont Park and a seventh in the May 7 American Turf (gr. IIT) at Churchill Downs.

Prior to his Pasadena score, his connections tried him back on dirt for a fourth in the Robert B. Lewis Stakes (gr. III); he also gave a good account for himself one month prior with a fifth in the Breeders' Cup Juvenile Turf (gr. IT).

Hollywood Don, winner of the 2015 Del Mar Juvenile Turf Stakes on the grass for trainer Peter Miller, makes his return after going to the sidelines following a sixth in the Dec. 19 Los Alamitos Futurity (gr. I). The Tapit colt went from that Del Mar victory to a third on dirt in the FrontRunner Stakes (gr. I) behind eventual Kentucky Derby Presented by Yum! Brands (gr. I) winner Nyquist, then ran ninth in the Juvenile Turf before his return to dirt at Los Al.

Brice Blanc, who rode him in his first four starts, gets the return call for Calumet Farm and Rockingham Ranch from post 10.

One intriguing contender is Bienstock, Winner, and Williford's Moonlight Drive, an Italian-bred son of Red Rocks who won his stateside debut for Hall of Fame trainer Bob Baffert Feb. 15 in a one-mile allowance race on the Santa Anita grass after five runs in France. Rafael Bejarano, who rode him to that first U.S. win, will be aboard again from post 2. **BH**

SHE'S NOT HERE DEFENDS IN YELLOW RIBBON H.

G. Watts Humphrey Jr. and St. George Farm Racing's She's Not Here did some of the best running of her career last summer at Del Mar and she'll look to find that form again July 16 in the Yellow Ribbon Handicap (gr. IIT) at the seaside racetrack.

The Street Cry mare trained by Victoria Oliver won the 1 1/16-mile Yellow Ribbon as a 4-year-old last year and will look to defend her title at 5.

She's Not Here came into last year's race off a standout turf allowance score, also at Del Mar, but hasn't finished better than sixth since. She wrapped up her 2015 campaign with a seventh-place run in the First Lady (gr. IT) at Keeneland and an eighth in the Matriarch (gr. IT) back at Del Mar, and hasn't been close in three graded tries this year in the Jenny Wiley (gr. IT), Churchill Distaff Turf Mile (gr. IIT), and the Arlington Matron (gr. III).

Her five-race winless streak does come with some context, as three of the races have come against the recently untouchable Tepin.

The main threat in the nine-horse field of fillies and mares appears to be Hronis Racing's Royal Heroine (gr. IIT) winner Nancy From Nairobi, who broke through for her first graded score May 5, then followed that effort with a sixth-place run (only 2 1/2 length behind the winner Illuminant) in the Gamely (gr. IT) May 30.

The rest of the graded turf winners are looking to regain their top form.

Ike and Dawn Thrash's Her Emmy-nency, winner of the Queen Elizabeth II Challenge Cup (gr. IT) at

Keeneland in October while trained by Mike Stidham, has yet to hit the board in three starts for new trainer Kristin Mulhall. Keri Belle closed to win the Megahertz (gr. IIIT) in January but has been winless in three starts since, including an eighth in the Royal Heroine and a positive step forward last time out in the Gamely, when she finished third. Queen of The Sand last reached the winner's circle in the 2015 Santa Barbara Handicap (gr. IIIT), but has finished second in three grade II events since.

Prize Exhibit is the only multiple graded winner in the field, but her last score came five starts back in the Jan. 3 Monrovia (gr. IIT).

The wildcard of the graded horses to run is Seltzer Thoroughbreds' Finest City, winner of the Great Lady M. (gr. II) on dirt at Los Alamitos Race Course. The City Zip filly finished third—2 1/4 lengths behind Beholder and three-quarters back of Stellar Wind—in the June 4 Vanity Mile (gr. I) and has only made one start on grass. She finished fourth in the Unzip Me, her stakes debut, down the Santa Anita Park hillside turf course in September.

Graded stakes-placed Fresh Feline and last-out allowance winner Majestic Heat complete the field. **BH**

ZENYATTA'S FULL BROTHER DEBUTS IN IRELAND

The Curragh in Ireland will be highlighted July 16 by Even Song's appearance for trainer Aiden O'Brien in the Darley Irish Oaks (Ire-I), but it's the last race on the card where another O'Brien trainee will gain attention.

Michael Tabor, Derrick Smith, and Susan Magnier's De Coronado is scheduled to make his first start in the Kilsaran maiden going 1 1/2 miles in a field of 21 3-year-olds and up.

Bred by Chelston and Wynatt Orpendale in Kentucky, De Coronado is a full brother to champion mare Zenyatta. Their dam Vertigineux not only produced Zenyatta, but multiple grade I winner Balance (Thunder Gulch) and stakes winner Where's Bailey (Aljabr), as well as two other winners.

Zenyatta and 3-year-old De Coronado are the only two foals from Vertigineux resulting from matings to 2002 Dubai World Cup winner Street Cry.

Zenyatta won 19 of her 20 starts. Her only loss was in the 2010 Breeders' Cup Classic (gr. I), her final-

race, where she ran second to that year's champion older male, Blame. She won the 2009 Breeders' Cup Classic over notable colts Gio Ponti, Summer Bird, Colonel John, and Mine That Bird. She was named champion older mare from 2008-2010 and was named the 2010 Horse of the Year. **BH**

'CHROME' PURSE PERCENTAGE TO V FOUNDATION

Majority owners Perry and Denise Martin and Taylor Made Stallions announced July 14 that a portion of purses earned by 2014 Horse of the Year California Chrome through the remainder of his career will be donated to the V Foundation for Cancer Research.

California Chrome is currently pointed to the \$200,000 San Diego Handicap (gr. II) July 23 and the \$1 million Pacific Classic (gr. I) Aug. 20, both at Del Mar.

The California Chrome team will also hold other special events to raise donations for The V Foundation, the first of which will be an auction following the San Diego that will offer California Chrome's blinkers and jockey Victor Espinoza's silks from the race, as well as a co-branded Chrome and V Foundation saddle blanket worn during the horse's final pre-race work.

"We were looking for a charity that has the same values as Taylor Made Stallions," said Taylor Made president Duncan Taylor. "I went back and listened to Jim Valvano's ESPYs speech while he was fighting for

his life against cancer. The wisdom from his speech perfectly matched what our company's founders and parents Joe and Mary Emily Taylor instilled in our family growing up. ... FROSTED MOVES UP IN WORLD RANKINGS

After winning the Mohegan Sun Metropolitan Handicap (gr. I) by 14 1/4 lengths June 11 at Belmont Park, Frosted finds himself as co-second-highest rated horse in the world and is the biggest mover in the fifth edition of the Longines World's Best Racehorse Rankings for 2016.

Frosted, who spent much of 2015 running against eventual 2015 Longines World's Best Racehorse American Pharoah, began his 2016 campaign in the United Arab Emirates before returning to the United States. He originally was rated at 120 after he won the Al Maktoum Challenge Round 2 Sponsored by EGA (UAE-II) by five lengths in February. The Met Mile was his first start since finishing fifth behind California Chrome in the Dubai World Cup Sponsored by Emirates Airline (UAE-I).

As is to be expected, a number of horses featured in this edition of the rankings earned their ratings at Royal Ascot.

Leading the way is Galileo Gold, who improved his rating from 120 to 123 after winning the St James's Palace Stakes (Eng-I).

The Longines World's Best Racehorse Rankings are compiled by the Longines World's Best Racehorse Rankings Committee and published by the International Federation of Horseracing Authorities. **BH**

DIVINING ROD RETURNS TO TRAINING

Lael Stables' Divining Rod, a grade III winner who has not raced since last August, worked five furlongs at Fair Hill Training Center July 14 in preparation for his 4-year-old debut.

The Tapit colt won the 2015 Coolmore Lexington Stakes (gr. III) and finished third in the Preakness Stakes (gr. I), Ohio Derby, and Indiana Derby (gr. III). After a fifth-place finish in the Smarty Jones Stakes (gr. III), an August prep for the Pennsylvania Derby (gr. II), he was sent to Rood and Riddle Equine Hospital and diagnosed with some "wear and tear," trainer Arnaud Delacour said.

Divining Rod worked five furlongs on the Tapeta surface at Fair Hill in 1:01, the fastest of five at the distance. It was his fifth breeze since June 9.

"I thought he did good," Delacour said. "It was the kind of breeze we were looking for his first five-eighths (work since his return to training). He had a good blowout of it and seemed to come back well. He was great. He was aggressive, more aggressive with the company, and I was pleased with what I saw."

Delacour said the colt could return to the races in mid-August. **BH**

HORSEPLAYERS EMPHASIZED AT TRAINING PROGRAM

Horseplayers will determine the success or failure of racing, regulators were told during a two-day training program held recently at Emerald Downs and the Seattle Thompson Hotel in Washington.

The program, coordinated by the Association of Racing Commissioners International, was held to ensure that regulators and staff understand what has been described as "the many moving parts of the sport of horse racing," ARCI president Ed Martin said. Regulatory jurisdictions in Canada, the Caribbean, and the United States sent regulators to participate in the training, which is offered periodically by the ARCI.

ARCI chair Judy Wagner, a member of the Louisiana State Racing Commission who is also the horseplayer representative on the National Thoroughbred Racing Association board of directors, spoke to the group about the importance of horseplayers and urged regulators to always consider the fact horseplayers ultimately will determine the success or failure of the sport.

"The players want to be able to trust that they are participating in an honest, fair game," she said.

Regulators participated in sessions that dealt with drug testing, pre-race veterinary examinations, the role of various track officials, rulemaking, ethics and conflict of interest matters, tote system operations, licensing, transparency, statutory limits on jurisdiction, and the conduct of hearings. **BH**

LOS ALAMITOS QH DRUG RULES ALTERED

Following a court ruling in March that found "house rules" banning the use of drugs like clenbuterol and albuterol for Los Alamitos Race Course Quarter Horse races to be in conflict with California Horse Racing Board rules, the regulatory agency made "emergency amendments" to allow the practice to continue through the conditions of races during a board meeting July 14 at Del Mar.

Three measures—one to dismiss a prior approval for the "house rules" to move in line with the court ruling, and two more to establish new verbiage for the rule, allowing Los Alamitos to continue its testing program—were approved unanimously by the CHRB and will now be evaluated by California's Office of Administrative Law.

Although the impact is not directly related to Thoroughbred racing in the state, California Thoroughbred Trainers executive director Alan Balch opposed the new rule, citing "broad" wording that could, in the future, be applied to Thoroughbreds, if a racing association gets an agreement from "the acknowledged horsemen's organization."

"I don't think it's prudent to develop medication rules, standards, methods of testing, and so forth, that are decided upon or developed by a subset of the (CHRB), because that goes around the processes that are set in law for everyone," Balch said.

The change essentially allows for the conditions of a race to be "based on a participating horse's use or non-use of a drug substance or medication." Testing of "a biological test sample" would be done by the racing association that sets the condition of the race.

"If OAL approves it, it will change how medication testing is done in the

state," Balch said. "That's another part of Pandora's box."

CHRB members and chief counsel Robert Miller attempted to reassure Balch about the regulation and its "emergency" nature, meaning it has to be readopted by the board "in six months to a year" to continue beyond that time period, according to Miller.

Earlier in the meeting, representatives from Golden Gate Fields put forward a proposal to eliminate its use of the Alameda County Fair racing facility at Pleasanton as an "auxiliary stabling" venue for its meet running Oct. 16-Dec. 25, in an effort to save an estimated \$500,000.

Representing The Stronach Group, which owns Golden Gate, Joe Morris and Scott Daruty said the Bay Area track will expand from 1,431 stalls to 1,500 to accommodate incoming horses if the move gets approved when Golden Gate applies for its racing license at the August CHRB meeting.

Daruty made the case that, while Pleasanton houses around 200-300 horses during that time, the cost of keeping the facility open as an auxiliary stable exceeds the benefit of keeping race horses there to race at Golden Gate.

Balch and Thoroughbred Owners of California president Nick Coukos both opposed the plan, because they felt 1,500 stalls at Golden Gate is not enough. **BH**

WAGERING UP IN IRELAND

Horse Racing Ireland July 14 reported positive economic indicators in the first half of 2016.

Off-course betting on Irish racing through Tote Ireland increased 39.5% to €36.4 million compared with the same period in 2015, while on-course tote wagering dropped 5.9% to €4.8 million. Betting through on-course bookmakers fell 9.8% to €31.3 million.

"Overall tote betting continued its trend of double-digit growth in recent times," HRI chief executive Brian Kavanagh said. "As well as rising turnover in traditional markets, particularly Britain, Irish pools have been boosted by growth in other international markets, most notably the U.S. and Israel.

"Growth has been most notable in win betting, which has increased 38%, and also Pick 6 betting, which has increased 205%. More international customers are taking note of the substantial daily guarantees and outstanding returns offered on this pool by Tote Ireland."

Total purse money increased 6.5% to €25.5 million,



Irish Racing continued its positive trends in the first half of 2016

and race sponsorships were up 8% to €3.2 million.

Average field size for flat races increased from 9.9 last year to 10.5 this year; average attendance at race meets remained flat at about 3,300; total horses in training increased 4.5% to 7,024; and the number of new owners increased by 10.7% to 382. **BH**

DEEP IMPACT CONTINUES HIS RULE

Deep Impact continues to dominate the Japanese market, something highlighted at the JRHA Select sale at Northern Horse Park July 11-12.

The July 11 yearling session ended with all 20 lots offered by the sire selling for ¥2,289,000,000 (\$22,775,550), while 13 of the 15 lots offered during the July 12 foal session sold for ¥1,875,000,000 (\$18,233,750).

Deep Impact's progeny accounted for 27.9% of the sale's turnover at ¥4,164,000,000 (\$41,019,300). In 2015 his progeny accounted for 23.4%. The average price of the offspring by Deep Impact, ¥126,181,818 (\$1,243,009), has also increased 45.5% from ¥86,722,359 (\$675,795) in 2015.

The second most popular sire at the market was Heart's Cry, whose progeny sold for ¥1,552,000,000 (\$15,292,800) and made up 10.4% of the market. Orfevre ranked third with offspring that sold for ¥1,228,500,000 (\$12,068,805) in total, 8.2% of the total sales.

The highest percentage sold by a single stallion at JRHA was recorded by Sunday Silence in 2000, when buyers did not have a variety of stallions to choose from. Twenty lots by Sunday Silence were sold for ¥2,497,000,000 in total, which was 41.2% of the gross revenue of the sale. **BH**

GRAYDAR OWNER ASSESSES FIRST YEARLINGS

Bloodstock Editor Eric Mitchell caught up with Randy Gullatt, co-owner of Twin Creeks Racing Stables, to talk about the first yearling crop of Graydar, a son of Unbridled's Song who Twin Creeks raced and now owns in partnership with Taylor Made Stallions and others.

MarketWatch: What was your impression of Graydar's yearlings at the Fasig-Tipton Kentucky July sale?

Randy Gullatt: There were big, athletic-looking colts with a lot of length to them. They seemed, too, to be precocious-minded horses. By that I mean a horse that is kind to their handlers and shows good focus. They're good doers with good energy, but they are also good to work with. That sale was kind of a mixed bag, though. I think you'll see some of his better colts and fillies at Keeneland in September.

MW: You bought two Graydar yearlings at the July sale. How important is it for you, as the stallion owner, to also race his progeny?

RG: It is so important to get these young stallions off to a good start. We made a big effort with Mission Impazible and it's paid off. Now everyone can see what he is capable of doing, and our plan is to do the same thing with Graydar. We bred good mares to him, we bought horses by him as weanlings and yearlings, and we plan on racing a big group of them. Todd Pletcher will get the majority of those good colts.

You can't just sit back and let the public do it. We know more about the horse than anyone, so we are putting our money where our mouth is and are leading the way. Right now it looks like we will have six really outstanding colts and fillies to race, and it would not surprise me if we added a couple more either at Keeneland September or through a 2-year-old sale.

MW: Is Mission Impazible the first stallion

you've tried to make?

RG: We've owned shares but nothing like this. We raced these guys. We own a major share in Mission Impazible and have always believed in him. We bred 20 mares to him and will race seven or eight every year. We've raised a bunch, and we're going race a bunch. He is getting it done.

I expect he'll have the favorites in both the New York-bred stakes this weekend. Silver Mission (entered in the July 23 Rockville Centre Stakes) won the Tremont Stakes, so he comes into the race with big credentials. Paz the Bourbon (entered in the July 24 Lynbrook Stakes), who we bred and sold as a 2-year-old, we were very high on her when we sold her. She got left in the gate in her first start, came flying, and finished a huge second. I think if she breaks, she'll stand above that group. **BH**

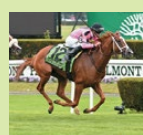
