POST POSITIONS DRAWN FOR HASKELL

entucky Derby Presented by Yum! Brands (gr. I) winner Nyquist and Preakness Stakes (gr. I) victor Exaggerator renew their rivalry July 31 at Monmouth Park in the \$1 million Betfair.com Haskell Invitational (gr. I).

Nyquist drew the rail and Exaggerator was assigned the outside post as the top two choices in a field of six for their fifth meeting in nine months, and sixth overall. In their first three races together, Nyquist won last year's Sentient Jet Breeders' Cup Juvenile (gr. I), this year's San Vicente Stakes (gr. II), and the Kentucky Derby, while Exaggerator finished fourth in the Juvenile, and second in both the San Vicente and Derby.

In the Preakness Exaggerator turned the tables on Nyquist for Big Chief Racing, Head of Plains Partners, and Rocker O Ranch, ending the champion's undefeated run at eight. But he went on to run 11th in the Belmont Stakes presented by NYRA Bets (gr. I), failing to deliver his usual closing kick for trainer Keith Desormeaux.

cell count after the Preakness, Nyquist will make his first start since that May 21 third-place finish. He has worked five times since June 17 at Santa Anita Park and Del Mar in preparation for the 1 1/8-mile Haskell, including a one-mile move in a handy 1:39 2/5 July 24.

"His last two works have been exceptional," O'Neill said. "That last one was one of the best I've seen from him in a long time."

The talent in Saturday's field of six 3-yearolds doesn't end with the two classic winners, as TwinSpires.com Louisiana Derby (gr. II) winner Gun Runner (4-1) enters off a stakes record-setting win in the Matt Winn (gr. III) June 18 at Churchill Downs. Winchell Thoroughbreds, Three Chimneys Farm, and Besilu Stables' Candy Ride colt finished third in the Derby, giving the Haskell field the top three placers from the Louisville classic.

Bob Baffert, who has won five of the last six Haskell runnings and eight overall, sends out Gary and Mary West's late-developing American Freedom (3-1). The Pulpit colt registered clear victories in the Sir Barton Stakes on the Preakness undercard and the July 1 Iowa Derby (gr. III) at Prairie Meadows.

The Haskell is a Breeders' Cup Challenge "Win & You're In" race for the Breeders' Cup Classic (gr. I). The past two Haskell winners, Bayern in 2014 and American Pharoah last year, went on to take the Classic.

Rounding out the field, Live Oak Plantation's Awesome Slew (15-1) enters off a third in the June 19 Pegasus Stakes (gr. III) at Monmouth, and grade III winner Sunny Ridge makes his first start since finishing fourth in Aqueduct's March 5 Gotham Stakes (gr. III).

"For a six-horse field, it's really very deep," O'Neill said. "(Nyquist) is going to need to bring one of his better races to win."

Toyota Blue Grass (gr. I) winner Brody's Cause, whose connections had been considering the Haskell, will opt for the Aug. 6 West Virginia Derby (gr. II) at Mountaineer Casino, Racetrack & Resort. **BH**



QUIET GUN RUNNER OVERSHADOWED IN HASKELL

The eye can't help but sometimes be drawn to the brightest of lights. And with Kentucky Derby Presented by Yum! Brands (gr. I) winner Nyquist and his Preakness Stakes (gr. I) conqueror Exaggerator both set for the \$1 million Betfair.com Haskell Invitational (gr. I) July 31 at Monmouth Park, it is understandable that Gun Runner's presence in the showdown of the weekend is slightly overshadowed.

It's a fitting role, considering the son of Candy Ride has made his mark quietly going about his business while posting nothing but solid returns. Sometimes the quiet ones end up the most dangerous, which is exactly what his connections are counting on this weekend.

With Exaggerator joining the fray July 27, the 1 1/8-mile Haskell is now framed as a renewed rivalry between the Preakness hero and Nyquist, the reigning juvenile male champion who defeated him in four prior meetings.

Finishing third, however, behind Nyquist and Exaggerator in the May 7 Kentucky Derby was multiple graded stakes winner Gun Runner—who admirably hung tough after rating just off the swift opening fractions Danzing Candy reeled off that day.

Instead of immediately trying to turn the tables during the remainder of the Triple Crown, Gun Runner was given the rest of the classics off by trainer Steve Asmussen, who let his chestnut frame fill out for the second half of the year. The colt's gate-to-wire run in stakes record fashion in the June 18 Matt Winn Stakes (gr. III) at Churchill Downs showcased a noticeably stronger specimen.

If Gun Runner's tactical ability has progressed along with his physical growth, the Twinspires. com Louisiana Derby (gr. II) and Veterans Ford Risen Star Stakes (gr. II) winner could be ready to own some top-level spotlight for co-owners Winchell Thoroughbreds, Three Chimneys Farm, and breeder Besilu Stables.

"I think mentally he's always been pretty solid," said David Fiske, Winchell's racing manager. "Earlier in the year, I think (jockey) Florent (Geroux) made some comments that he could pretty much place him anywhere he wanted in the body of a race and the colt was more than happy to do that. Physically he's gotten bigger and stronger like most 3-year-olds do, and hopefully he's gotten a little faster.


"(The Matt Winn) was a race that we felt like he got something out of, running in stakes record time. It wasn't like it was a cakewalk where he beat a bunch of tomato cans. He's kind of like, 'No drama, Obama!' He just goes out there and does his job and goes home."

The Haskell figures to have no shortage of early speed, with Nyquist and Iowa Derby (gr. III) winner American Freedom expected to do some of the dirty work up front. Strategy wise, Fiske said he expects the same old, same old where Gun Runner is concerned—lay close up and make his foes have to dig deep to beat him.

"The Triple Crown prep season is pretty grueling and he was pretty much set up to run the best race he could in the Derby and that didn't quite work out for him," Fiske said. "It was a case of fall back, regroup, and try to get ready for late summer and fall." **BH**

HASKELL HITS STRIDE AS CLASSIC STEPPINGSTONE

Bayern is one of the past two Haskell winners to take the Breeders' Cup Classic

The winner of this year's \$1 million Haskell Invitational Stakes (gr. I) will pick up a welcomed torch, as the past two winners of the 1 1/8-mile test have gone on to win the Breeders' Cup Classic (gr. I).

The Haskell, set for July 31 at Monmouth Park, is the lone Breeders' Cup Challenge race restricted to 3-year-olds that carries "Win and You're In" status to the Classic. The other seven "Win and You're In" races that automatically qualify the winner to the Classic are for older horses or 3-yearolds and older.

As it turns out, the past two Haskell winners have made good on their Challenge berths. Bayern and American Pharoah both went on to win the Classic. Of course both horses are trained by Bob Baffert, who has saddled five of the past six Haskell winners and eight overall.

Interestingly, Baffert accomplished different goals with his two most recent Haskell winners. For American Pharoah, the Haskell marked his

return from a successful Triple Crown sweep. For Bayern, the often kind-to-speed surface at the Oceanport, N.J. track provided a good fit for the frontrunner to tackle 1 1/8 miles after winning the seven-furlong Woody Stephens (gr. II) in his previous start. The son of Offlee Wild landed his first grade I score in the Haskell.

American Pharoah and Bayern then competed in the Travers Stakes (gr. I), where they both fell short. The Triple Crown winner was caught in deep stretch by Keen Ice in the only loss of his 2015 season, while Bayern stopped after leading through six furlongs. Baffert opted to train American Pharoah up to the Classic; Bayern started once more, picking up another confidence-building win in the Pennsylvania Derby (gr. II).

This year Baffert will send out a late-developing colt in American Freedom off back-to-back stakes wins. The field also features a pair of classic winners making their first starts since the Triple Crown races in Kentucky Derby Presented by Yum! *(continued on page 5)* An in-depth look at the Breeders' Cup Challenge races

Brands (gr. I) winner Nyquist and Preakness victor (gr. I) Exaggerator.

The most recent two Haskell winners to go forward to win the Classic follow Skip Away, who won the 1996 Haskell before taking the Classic in his 4-year-old season. Oddly enough, no Travers winner has ever gone on to win the Classic at age 3 or as an older horse. In 2013 Travers winner Will Take Charge nearly became the first, but fell a nose short in that year's Classic to Mucho Macho Man.

Two Who Figure: The first two Challenge races conducted in Europe this year were won by horses who could well make the trip to Santa Anita Park for this year's Breeders' Cup. Both are campaigned by owners associated with John Magnier's Coolmore operation and trained by Aidan O'Brien. They, of course, have long supported Breeders' Cup.

Highland Reel secured a spot in the Longines Turf (gr. IT) with a clear victory in the QIPCO King George VI and Queen Elizabeth Stakes (Eng-I) July 23 at Ascot. The 4-year-old continent-hopping Galileo colt already has successfully competed in the U.S., landing last year's Secretariat Stakes (gr. IT).

The Gurkha then nailed down a spot in the Mile (gr. IT) when he forged between foes late to win the Qatar Sussex Stakes July 27 at Goodwood. While the connections did not offer long-term plans for the 3-year-old Galileo colt, they mentioned Breeders' Cup as a possibility and winning jockey Ryan Moore noted that The Gurkha likes firm turf.

The previous four Sussex winners trained by O'Brien all competed in Breeders' Cup races the same year, three going in the Classic. After capturing five group I races including the Sussex in Europe in 2000, Giant's Causeway finished second in the Classic.

English-Irish classic winner Rock of Gibraltar won the 2002 Sussex and finished second in the Mile.

Henrythenavigator, winner of the 2008 Sussex, finished second in the Classic. Rip Van Winkle followed with a 2009 Sussex win and off-the-board finish in the Classic.

Quick Start for Galileo: The wins by Highland Reel and The Gurkha give Galileo the distinction of being the first sire to have two Challenge winners this year. It's a familiar position for the dominant European-based stallion; he led all sires in Challenge winners last year with five. **BH**

HARTMAN'S "HEAD DOG" CHASES GRADE I SCORE

Chris Hartman brought his first sizeable string to Del Mar this year, and one in that group stood out. The trainer calls Black Hawk Stable's Alsvid the "head dog" of his stable and the gelding will try to earn his first top-level score in the \$300,000 Bing Crosby (gr. I) July 31 at Del Mar.

The 7-year-old son of Officer very well could be in the top form of his career, following back-to-back scores in the Aristides (gr. III) and Kelly's Landing stakes at Churchill Downs, but he's in against the toughest group he's seen since he ran 13th in the 2015 TwinSpires Breeders' Cup Sprint (gr. I).

"He's the best horse we've got," Hartman said. "If we're going to take a stab at them, you should take it with your best horse. I know this is a tough spot for the horse and it's very competitive, but you don't get a lot of opportunities like this."

Spendthrift Farm's last-out Triple Bend (gr. I) winner Lord Nelson will almost surely be the favorite in the six-furlong Bing Crosby, but Hartman is most concerned with second-place Triple Bend finisher Subtle

Indian, who defeated Alsvid by 3 3/4 lengths in the April 10 Count Fleet Sprint Handicap (gr. III) at Oaklawn Park.

The speedy son of Indian Charlie has finished second in two graded starts for trainer Robertino Diodoro since relocating to Southern California, but neither was at his ideal distance of six furlongs. Subtle Indian has five wins in seven starts at three-quarters of a mile.


"I know Lord Nelson beat him at seven furlongs, but three-quarters is a whole different story for that horse," Hartman said.

Hartman was initially hesitant to commit to a race for Alsvid upon arrival at Del Mar, somewhat concerned with how the gelding would handle the main track, but he got the go-ahead when his top trainee worked a bullet half-mile in :46 2/5 at the seaside racetrack July 16.

"We worked him over the track—and he's a funny kind of horse—but he went :46 2/5 and galloped out strong," Hartman said of Alvsvid, who he envisions getting an off-the-pace trip in the Bing Crosby. "The horse is doing good and the pace scenario could be favorable to us."

Lord Nelson is one of two entries from the barn of Bob Baffert, who is seeking his fourth Bing Crosby victory. Also entered is Zayat Stables' Justin Squared, exiting the only loss of his career—an 11th-place run in the June 11 Woody Stephens (gr. II). The swift son of Zensational broke his maiden by 5 1/2 lengths at Del Mar in September before an allowance score at Los Alamitos Race Course in April to kick off his 3-year-old campaign and a twolength win in the Chick Lang Stakes at Pimlico Race Course May 21.

Two-time grade III winner Home Run Kitten, graded stakes-placed Dream Saturday and Indexical, stakes-placed Kaabraaj, and allowance victor Bluegrass Bronco complete the field. **BH**

EXCELLENT TIMING FOR FRANKEL SALE YEARLINGS

Sometimes it's all about timing. And for two yearlings sired by Frankel entered in the Fasig-Tipton Saratoga selected year-

ling sale, the Aug. 8-9 auction could not come at a better point in the season.

Frankel, the Juddmonte homebred named for the late Hall of Fame trainer Bobby Frankel, was rated the World's Best Racehorse when he retired undefeated—and he's off to a phenomenal start at stud. The son of top-class international stallion Galileo has been represented by eight winners from 10 starters (through July 27) and has group III winner Fair Eva from his first crop racing this year.

Despite Frankel's impeccable credentials when he was retired to Juddmonte's Banstead Manor Farm, those who sent mares to him in 2014 did so at a considerable financial risk since his £125,000 fee was the equivalent of about \$200,000.

"It couldn't be any better," said Nancy Mazzoni, the breeder of a Frankel colt produced from the

champion millionaire She Be Wild (by Offlee Wild) consigned as Hip 148 by Meg Levy's Bluewater Sales. "He's a lovely, classy colt. He's very intelligent. We are absolutely thrilled to have this colt."

Mazzoni—who along with her husband, Mike, hit a home run at the Saratoga sale two years ago when a Tapit filly out of She Be Wild was sold for \$1.15 million said consultant Les Brinsfield advised the best mating for the mare would either be Tapit or Frankel. With the assistance of David Ingordo, who also advises the Mazzonis, the mare was accepted for Frankel's first book. "When we heard the news she was accepted, we were overjoyed," Mazzoni said. "Of course, there was the factor of the 2-year-olds not getting out there and running the way they are. If he didn't prove himself right out of the gate it could have been a risky situation. Fortunately he has done better than anybody could have expected."

Breeder Lawrence Goichman is also pleased with the outcome of the risk he took when he sent his mare J'ray, a daughter of Juddmonte stallion Distant View, to be bred to Frankel, resulting in the filly consigned by Indian Creek as Hip 65.

"You have to be lucky and send over a wonderfully qualified mare," Goichman said of J'Ray, a grade II winner in Canada who won nine of 26 starts and earned nearly \$970,000. "Frankel had impeccable credentials. He was by Galileo and was undefeated and from a pedigree point of view, with her bloodlines I felt it would work well.

"It was about \$200,000 for the stud fee and that was a big risk. I couldn't be happier. We have a lovely individual and hopefully the market will appreciate her as much as we do. She has great balance, is a great mover, is out of a great broodmare, and by a great sire." **BH**

LADY ELI TARGETS BALLSTON SPA


ndefeated turf star Lady Eli will make her comeback in the Aug. 27 Woodford Reserve Ballston Spa Stakes (gr. IIT) at Saratoga Race Course if all goes according to plan, trainer Chad Brown said July 28.

The 4-year-old has been off for more than a year since stepping on a nail on the Belmont Park backstretch on her way back to Brown's barn after winning the July 4 Belmont Oaks Invitational Stakes (gr. IT) and contracting laminitis last season. Lady Eli progressed to the point where she was placed back in training this past winter in Florida, but some minor setbacks pushed her schedule back.

The bay filly has been training regularly at Belmont, posting four timed works in July that have gotten progressively better. On July 3 she worked four furlongs on the turf in :52.22. A week later she covered the same distance in :49.50, and on July 17 she recorded a time of :48.36. On July 24, Brown stepped her up to five furlongs on the turf and Lady Eli fired a bullet in 1:00.63, the fastest of six works at the distance that day.

"She's doing well," said Brown. "That five-eighths move was one of her top works. She looked verv good, and if she continues to develop it looks like she'll be back to her old self. If all goes well she'll end up in the Ballston Spa."

The \$400,000 Ballston Spa is a 1 1/16-mile turf event for 3-year-old and up fillies and mares.

Lady Eli (Divine Park—Sacre Coeur, by Saint Ballado) has won all six of her races, including the 2014 Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies Turf (gr. IT) at Santa Anita Park, with earnings of \$1,449,800 for Jay Hanley and Sol Kumin's Sheep Pond Partners. She was bred in Kentucky by Runnymede Farm and Catesby W. Clay. BH

FLINTSHIRE HEADS BOWLING GREEN FIELD

The well-traveled Flintshire, a group I winner in Europe and Hong Kong, is attempting to add a third U.S. victory to his resume in the July 30 Bowling Green Handicap (gr. IIT) at Saratoga Race Course.

The horse by Dansili, a homebred for Juddmonte Farms, comes into the race off of a winning 2016 debut in the Woodford Reserve Manhattan Stakes (gr. IT) at Belmont Park June 11. The Chad Brown trainee has five group or graded stakes wins to his credit.

He will face five-time graded stakes winner Twilight Eclipse, who is looking to get back to winning at that level for the first time since last year's Man o' War Stakes (gr. IT) May 9. The gelding owned by West Point Thoroughbreds and bred by Epona Thoroughbreds recorded his first victory since that race in his last start, a July 8 turf allowance at Belmont.

Multiple graded stakes winner Grand Tito captured the Mac Diarmida Stakes (gr. IIT) earlier this year at Gulfstream Park for trainer Gustavo Delgado and owner Grupo Seven C Stable. The son of

Candy Ride—bred by Hargus, Sandra Sexton, and Ben P. Walden Jr—also is trying to return to graded stakes winning form after coming home fourth in the Manhattan in his last start.

The field is rounded out by multiple stakes winner Danish Dynaformer and allowance winner Can'thelpbelieving. **BH**

LEXIE LOU HEADLINES VICTORIANA STAKES

Gary Barber's Lexie Lou, who won the 1 1/8-mile Dance Smartly Stakes (Can-IIT) July 3 on the Queen's Plate program at Woodbine, returns July 30 for the \$125,000 Victoriana Stakes for fillies and mares at 1 1/16 miles on grass.

Lexie Lou, a 5-year-old Sligo Bay mare who was voted Canada's Horse of the Year for 2014, is one of seven entered in the Victoriana.

The Dance Smartly victory was her second grade II stakes win in Canada this year.

"I was in tears after the race. It was so emotional seeing her run," said Kathryn Sullivan, assistant to trainer Mark Casse. "She tried so hard and she wasn't going to let anyone get past her. She was switching her tail and I thought she was caught. I actually sat down. But when she came back on, we all jumped back up again."

Sullivan said Lexie Lou, a nine-time winner who also was voted champion 3-year-old filly and turf mare in 2014, is getting better with age.

"She's a quirky little filly and the feistier she is, the better she runs," Sullivan said. "Sometimes that's how it is with fillies; they need that determined streak in them to really be a good horse and to win. In that way, it's hard to say she has really matured, but I do think she just keeps getting better and better." **BH**

KY BREEDERS' INCENTIVE FUND CONSISTENT

The Kentucky Thoroughbred Breeders' Incentive Fund accumulated \$10.36 million from the state's 6% sales tax on stallion fees for fiscal 2016 and expects the number of mares registered to the program to be similar to that of fiscal 2015.

The KTBIF Advisory Committee met July 28 to review the history of the program inaugurated in 2006 and discuss projections for the next cycle of awards. The overall Kentucky Breeders' Incentive Fund—80% of which goes to Thoroughbreds, 13% to Standardbreds, and 7% for other breeds—earned \$12.95 million from the stud fee tax in fiscal 2016, down about \$88,000 from 2015.

Jamie Eads, director of incentives and development for the Kentucky Horse Racing Commission, said that historically about 55% of mares bred to Kentucky stallions are registered with the program. The number of mares registered to the program this year is within 100 of the same period last year.

About 30% of mares bred to Kentucky stallions foal elsewhere to take advantage of other state-bred incentive programs. The KTBIF has attempted to get the remaining 10%-15% registered in the program.

The program has held up well given the sharp downturn in mares bred nationally that began in the late 2000s. There were 9,517 registrations for 2015, up almost 600 from 2014 and the highest number since 2009. After a brief discussion, the advisory committee opted to stick with an early nomination fee of \$60 by Aug. 15 of the year of conception. The fee increases to \$150 for late registrations through Dec. 31.

"I think \$60 has been a great number," Eads said. "It's a great selling point for (the program)."

For 2015 the average award collected for wins in allowance and maiden special weight events in Kentucky was \$2,615, according to KTBIF statistics. The average payout for wins in those races outside of Kentucky, but in the United States, was \$2,129.

Because a large number of Kentucky-bred horses race out of state and overseas, about 81% of total awards for 2015 were paid on races held outside the state. Overall, awards last year were paid on 3,934 races with an average payment of \$2,680.

"It definitely gets spread around pretty well," Eads said.

Patricia Cooksey, assistant director and horse inspector for the KBIF, outlined procedures for farm inspections to check on registered mares. The advisory committee suggested covering more farms but fewer mares rather than more mares at fewer farms when spot checks are conducted.

In other business, the advisory committee—it now has five members instead of eight—tabbed Doug Hendrickson of Limestone Associates to serve as chairman. The other members are Dr. Stuart Brown II of Hagyard Equine Medical, Kerry Cauthen of Four Star Sales, Neil Howard of Gainesway, and Matt Koch of Shawhan Place. **BH**

ELLIS RACE ATTRACTS QUALITY FILLIES

uality juvenile fillies have gathered in a \$38,000 maiden special weight race at one mile on the Ellis Park turf that includes four half siblings to graded stakes winners, two of which are grade I winners.

First time starter and Nelson McMakin homebred Cha Cha Magic (Mizzen Mast) is a half sister to Hot Cha Cha (Cactus Ridge), winner of the Queen Elizabeth II Challenge Cup (gr. IT) at Keeneland and runner-up in the Beverly D. Stakes (gr. IT).

Their dam Reduced Sentence, also a McMakin homebred, has produced two other winners from five runners, including grade II stakes-placed Paroled, by Flatter.

Trained by Phil Sims, Cha Cha Magic has posted consistent workouts at Keeneland and was second-best of 18 July 22 when she completed four furlongs in :47.

The other half to a grade I winner is Normandy Farm homebred Daddys Lil Darling (Scat Daddy), out of the graded stakes-placed mare Miss Hot Salsa (Houston). The dam produced Mongolian Saturday, who won last year's Breeders' Cup Turf Sprint (gr. IT).

The second-time starter's last three works over four furlongs at Keeneland were her fastest, including a July 16 bullet in :48. She finished fourth in her first start at Churchill Downs June 24 for trainer Kenny McPeak.

From the family of grade II winner Family Tree (Smart Strike) comes Rigney Racing's Candy Ride filly Clearly Claire, a half sister making her first start for trainer Philip Bauer. Clearly Claire was a \$220,000 purchase from the Lane's End consignment to the Keeneland September sale last year; her dam, the stakes winner Giant Mover (Giant's Causeway), has only produced two foals.

Another of interest is aptly named Kitten Squared, a daughter of Kitten's Joy out of the Tale of the Cat mare Little Cat Feet. The Edward Seltzer and Beverly Anderson homebred is a half sister to grade III winner Customer Base (Lemo Drop Kid).

On the also eligible list, Conquest Sweetride (Candy Ride), is a half sister to grade II winner Spelling Again (Awesome Again).

On the 3-year-old watch list is Race 3 at Gulfstream Park, a \$43,000 allowance optional claiming event where Billion Star (Bernardini—Pilfer), the full brother to both the grade I-winning Gainesway stallion To Honor and Serve and Central Bank Ashland Stakes (gr. I) winner Angela Renee, makes his sixth start after breaking his maiden last out. **BH**

OAKLAWN PLANS WORLD CUP PREP SCHEDULE

The track with the richest Triple Crown prep schedule will greatly enhance its handicap division in 2017.

Oaklawn Park will offer a lucrative alternative to horsemen looking for a race in advance of the Dubai World Cup (UAE-I) by increasing the purse of the Razorback Handicap (gr. III) from \$350,000 to \$500,000 and moving the race from March to Monday, Feb. 20, where it will share the card with the \$500,000 Southwest Stakes (gr. III).

The Essex Handicap purse has also been bumped from \$100,000 to \$250,000 and will now share the March 18 card with the \$900,000 Rebel Stakes (gr. II) and the \$350,000 Azeri Stakes (gr. II).

"We've become known for attracting the best 3-year-olds in the nation," director of racing David Longinotti said. "Now, we want to complement that by attracting the best older horses, too. And not just for the Oaklawn Handicap. We want our fans to be able to see them in February and maybe they'll get to see them again in March and April." In addition to the Razorback and Essex, the purses of 10 other stakes have been increased by at least \$25,000. Two—the Bayakoa (gr. III) for older fillies and mares Feb. 18 and the Honeybee (gr. III) for 3-year-old fillies March 11—each received a \$50,000 increase to \$150,000 and \$200,000 respectively.

The highlight of the 2017 season will again be the Racing Festival of the South, which will run April 13-15, the final three days of the meet. It will feature the \$150,000 Bachelor Stakes on April 13, the \$600,000 Apple Blossom Handicap (gr. I) and \$400,000 Fantasy Stakes (gr. III) on April 14, and conclude with the \$150,000 Northern Spur Stakes, \$400,000 Count Fleet Sprint Handicap (gr. III), \$750,000 Oaklawn Handicap (gr. II) and \$1,000,000 Arkansas Derby (gr. I) on April 15.

"Multi-stakes days have proven successful here over the past several years," Longinotti added. "By combining our biggest races on select days, we heighten the racing excitement for our fans. It also makes it more convenient for horsemen shipping to Hot Springs from all over the country."

Overall, Oaklawn will offer 31 stakes worth \$8.25 million next year. The 2017 live meet begins Jan. 13 and continues through April 15. **BH**

Mountaineer's leading trainer has been suspended

LEADING TRAINER SUSPENDED AT MOUNTAINEER

dward Clouston, the runaway leader in the trainers' standings at Mountaineer Casino, Racetrack and Resort, has been fined \$1,500 and suspended 15 days for a medication violation, with an additional 30 days added as a result having two offenses within a 365day period.

According to stewards at the West Virginia track, Clouston-trained So Frank, the second-place finisher in the fifth race June 12, tested positive for the medication betamethasone, a corticosteroid categorized as a Class 4 drug that carries a Class C penalty. Class 4 drugs "have a more limited ability to influence the performance of a racehorse," according to the stewards.

Clouston, whose 70 wins far outpace second-leading trainer Jay Berardini's 31 victories, elected not to send a split sample of the positive test to another lab for testing.

The ruling states that Clouston had a horse test positive for the Class 4 medication carbazochrome in 2015, and under the multiple medication violation system, was assessed the additional 30-day suspension. So Frank was disgaulified from any purse monies.

Clouston has appealed the suspension, scheduled to run July 21-Sept. 3, and a hearing has been scheduled for Aug. 15.

According to The Jockey Club Information Systems, Clouston is winning at a 26% rate, with 73 victories from 281 starts this year and stable earnings of \$441,872. BH

SOUL STIRRING SET FOR JAPANESE DEBUT

he summer meet at Sapporo Racecourse starts this weekend, and the eagerly awaited debut of a well-bred juvenile filly is set for July 31.

The potential star named Soul Stirring-entered in a 1,800-meter (about 1 1/8 miles) maiden race on Sapporo's grass course—was bred by Teruya Yoshida of Shadai Farm and is owned by his racing syndication Shadai Race Horse.

Soul Stirring, by Frankel, is the second foal out of Stacelita, who won four group I stakes in France before she shipped to the U.S., where she added two more grade I wins and was named champion turf female in 2011. Yoshida purchased her privately from owner Martin Schwartz at the end of her racing career.

Stacelita's first foal, Southern Stars, a 3-year-old Smart Strike filly, is a winner in the United Kingdom for Yoshida and trainer John Gosden.

Frankel was recently represented by his first graded stakes winner, Fair Eva, in Ascot's July 23 Juddmonte Princess Margaret Stakes (Eng-III).

Soul Stirring has been highly regarded by her breeder since she was born. She is now trained by Kazuo Fujisawa, who sent Casino Drive to Belmont Park and won the Peter Pan Stakes (gr. II) in 2008. Fujisawa was happy with the way she moved July 21 in a five-furlong breeze on the grass at Sapporo. Christophe Lemaire is booked to ride. BH

INTERVIEW

BREEDER GILES FOCUSED ON CLASS

D^{r.} Charles Giles' eight-head broodmare band is on a roll, having produced two graded stakes winners in as many years. His most recent graded stakes score as a breeder came July 23 at Del Mar when Mokat won the grade II San Clemente Handicap by 3 3/4 lengths. Last year his star was Acapulco, winner of the group II Queen Mary Stakes at Royal Ascot. Giles talked with Bloodstock Editor Eric Mitchell about the breeding of Mokat.

MarketWatch: Mokat's dam Flashy Frolic was bought back for \$105,000 at the 2009 Keeneland January sale. How did you acquire her?

Dr. Charles Giles: I bought her privately.

(Pat Payne and I) had not been able to pick up a mare in the price range I wanted to buy, and Taylor Made had consigned this mare that was a graded stakes producer. I went and looked at her and was really impressed. She had a terrific body. She had a deep shoulder and was a well-balanced mare with good bone that looked like she could throw quite a bit of speed.

MW: You bred her to Uncle Mo his first year at stud. No one knew at that point what he would do, why did you choose him as a mate?

CG: I like a precocious sire, one that could run as a 2-year-old, and he was obviously one heckuva 2-year-old. I saw him two or three times at the track, and I was impressed by his athleticism and his desire to win. He was a game racehorse, and I liked the way he moved across the racetrack. Physically, Uncle Mo complements Flashy Frolic quite well. They are very similar types, actually.

MW: How long have you been breeding and have you developed any theories that guide your decisions?

CG: I've been in the breeding business since 1994. I've found the breeding business to provide a more stable flow of income than the racing side of it.

I am a big believer that certain nicks work. I won't go into all the background, but they do work, and I believe in the ratings. They make the likelihood of producing a stakes winner much higher. A line may not start out as an A++ but once people recognize it and start using it, the rating usually improves.

MW: You've sold some brilliant runners. Do you ever regret not racing them yourself?

CG: I never second-guess that. As long as I still own the mare, I am always happy. When there is seller's remorse is when you no longer own the mare and fortunately that hasn't happened to me yet. **BH**
