RUSHING TO USHER DOMINGUEZ INTO HALL OF FAME

n a typical day at Saratoga Race Course Aug. 7 for jockey agent Steve Rushing his rider, Irad Ortiz Jr., won yet another race to lengthen his lead in the standings, en route to a likely second consecutive riding title at the elite meet.

But Rushing, 52, was contemplating a speech he had yet to write—the one to serve as an introduction for former jockey Ramon Dominguez's inclusion into racing's Hall of Fame Aug. 12.

A team for 13 years until Dominguez's career-ending injury in 2013, Rushing and Dominguez were a formidable duo. The rider, now 39, earned three consecutive Eclipse Awards (2010-12) while with Rushing, and was just 15 wins shy of 5,000 at the time of his retirement.

At Aqueduct Racetrack Jan. 18, 2013, Dominguez suffered severe head trauma, when his mount Convocation clipped heels with another horse and *(continued on page 2)*

hurled the rider to the ground where he was struck by another horse. Doctors delivered unthinkable news in late spring of 2013—the severe nature of his injuries would require him to retire. Rushing said the despair he felt for his friend was palpable.

"He told me to come into the house, and I could just tell by the tone of his voice that something was wrong, but I still didn't expect that," Rushing said. "We sat down on the couch and he told me, and it was just overwhelming. I felt so bad and so sad for him."

Rushing's affection for Dominguez comes without reserve. Their relationship was business-based to start, but the agent realized the rider had much more to offer out of the saddle.

"I learned really quick that he was pretty special. Ramon has a great heart; he's a great human being," Rushing said. "I tell everybody this—he's a world-class rider, but even a better person. He's just a genuine person. He is so humble."

The feeling is mutual.

"Steve is someone who will always be a great friend. ...an amazing one," said Dominguez. "He is someone I know I can always count on, and vice-versa. I was so blessed to have him as my agent. It's one thing to have someone who is as good as Steve is professionally, but as an individual, with the values he has, it was a pleasure to be around him when I was riding. He is someone with a lot of integrity.

"In the position we were in, with a lot business, it was fascinating for me to see how respectful he was of others, whether it was other agents or jockeys. Steve never crossed the line to say or do something detrimental to someone else's business. He was there to win, but at the same time, he was never there to put himself first, which is not easy."

Rushing has a knack for putting his riders on top. Before Dominguez, there was Hall of Famer and Eclipse Award winner Edgar Prado. Now there is Ortiz, who is enjoying a 2016 season that could

ALL-AROUND HORSEMAN ASMUSSEN TO ENTER HALL

good day at the track sometimes includes hitting Athe daily double. Induction into racing's Hall of Fame this year features a double play as well, as the Aug. 12 ceremony will usher Rachel Alexandra and her trainer Steve Asmussen to the other side of the velvet rope.

By the time Rachel Alexandra entered Asmussen's barn in 2009 on the way to Horse of the Year honors, he was already well on his way to the Hall of Fame, having in tow a classic win and two Horse of the Year campaigns with Curlin. Following Rachel Alexandra's career, Asmussen continued, adding four more Breeders' Cup wins and a victory in this year's Belmont Stakes presented by NYRA Bets (gr. I) with Creator.

"The horsemanship and the racing part, it's just in his DNA....and it's multi-generational," said Ron Winchell, a client of Asmussen's for more than 25 years. "He's able to read horses and know what they need in training and fitness where a lot of people don't have that."

That DNA comes from his parents, Keith and Marilyn Asmussen, true American horsepeople who raised sons Cash—the Eclipse Award-winning apprentice rider of 1979 before becoming a top rider in France—and Steve, who won Eclipse Awards as a trainer in 2008 and 2009. Keith and Marilyn continue training at their El Primero Training Center near Laredo, Texas.

Steve followed in his brother's footsteps but quickly outgrew the saddle after booting home just 63 winners. He logically took the next step to conditioning runners, and the wins came quickly, now totaling more than 7,300. He set the single-season record for victories with 555 in 2004 and has since broken that record twice. His first stakes winner, Dawns Clever Trick, came Oct. 9, 1988, in Albuquerque Downs' \$27,920 A.C. Kemp Handicap. Plenty followed, including 193 graded stakes wins, three classic wins, and five Breeders' Cup winners. He also has advanced to the second-leading trainer of all time by wins by running multiple strings across the country.

Asmussen's entry to the Hall of Fame wasn't without a speed bump. A finalist in 2014, his nomination was tabled when a video from the People for the Ethical Treatment of Animals surfaced, alleging cruelty to animals in his care. Two states—Kentucky and New York—launched investigations, both of which exonerated him. While some owners switched trainers, Winchell remained a staunch supporter of Asmussen.


"I knew it wasn't right," Winchell said. "My experience with him and what was being said were complete opposites. I wasn't going to abandon him under pressure from outside people. I'm glad it all got proven out to be false."


Even as the firestorm roared, Asmussen and Winchell won the Longines Kentucky Oaks (gr. I) with eventual 3-year-old filly champion Untapable. The Oaks win made for a double for the connections; Summerly captured the race for them in 2005.

But it takes more than winning big races to make the Hall of Fame—just ask Asmussen's mother.

"He can gallop one; he can ride one," she said. "He was a jockey. He can clean their stalls. He can do their feet. He can lead them. He can saddle them. Whatever it is that goes on in a barn, Steve Asmussen has done it." BH

RACHEL ALEXANDRA SET FOR HALL OF FAME

n the days leading up to the 2009 Kentucky Derby Presented by Yum! Brands (gr. I), the best 3-yearold in the country was drawing large crowds outside trainer Hal Wiggins' barn at Churchill Downs as bath time came around each morning.

The horse they were watching wasn't a male and wasn't even running in the Derby.

After Rachel Alexandra won the Kentucky Oaks (gr. I) by a record 20 1/4 lengths things changed drastically. Her breeder and majority owner, Dolphus Morrison, who didn't believe in running young fillies against the boys, sold her to less lackson's Stonestreet Stables and Harold McCormick, who had no such misgivings.

At 2 the daughter of Medaglia d'Oro—Lotta Kim, by Roar won three of six races, including the Golden Rod Stakes (gr. II) at Churchill Downs in late November.

"The progression started there," Wiggins noted. "It

was her first time around two turns, and she showed speed and broke the stakes record. We thought she might be something special there."

Wiggins told jockey Calvin Borel before the Feb. 15 Martha Washington Stakes if she got a little tired, not to push her.

You don't have to push much when you win by eight lengths.

Two weeks and a day after her Oaks victory, Jackson and her new trainer Steve Asmussen sent Rachel to the BlackBerry Preakness Stakes (gr. I). There, she defeated Derby victor Mine That Bird by a length, becoming the first filly to take the middle jewel of the Triple Crown since Nellie Morse in 1924.

Sent back with fillies, Rachel had two opponents in the Mother Goose Stakes (gr. I), and scared those off by 19 1/4 lengths. In the Haskell Invitational Stakes (gr. I), she defeated Belmont Stakes (gr. I) winner Summer Bird by six lengths.

The race that would define Rachel, though, was the Sept. 5 Woodward Stakes (gr. I) at Saratoga in which she faced older males. Pressing a testing opening quarter of :22.85, she grabbed the lead from 2008 Belmont winner Da' Tara and turned back one bid after another, the final one from Stephen Foster Handicap (gr. I) winner Macho Again, whom she defeated by a head, setting off a celebration that shook the timbers of the famed Spa.

In winning the Woodward, Rachel became the first filly to beat males three times in grade I races on dirt in a single season. No other 3-year-old filly had ever defeated older males in a two-turn, grade I dirt race.

While Stonestreet's Barbara Banke acknowledged the Woodward was a highlight of Rachel's season, she quickly added, "I have to say that race made me quite nervous at the time. I still don't watch it often because I know how hard it was on her."

Indeed, Rachel Alexandra would never be the same. Put away until March of her 4-year-old season, she lost her first two races to fillies she would have dusted in her prime.

Rachel Alexandra was retired to broodmare duty at Stonestreet. Sent to Curlin and then Bernardini, Rachel produced Jess's Dream, a winner of his only race; and grade I-winning filly Rachel's Valentina. Both foalings were difficult, however, and there are no immediate plans to breed Rachel Alexandra again. BH

HALL OF FAME TO WELCOME ZENYATTA

rainer Bob Baffert didn't need a scorecard to know whom he was watching on the track one morning at Churchill Downs the week of the 2009 Kentucky Derby Presented by Yum! Brands (gr. I).

The gargantuan Zenyatta had been shipped to Kentucky to run in the Louisville Distaff Stakes (gr. II) until wet conditions jettisoned the plan.

Zenyatta was bigger than life, literally and figuratively. Her trainer, John Shirreffs, loved telling how Baffert showed up at Zenyatta's stall with a tape measure, intent on proving the filly was no bigger than his own charge, Midnight Lute. Baffert stretched the tape up to Zenyatta's withers, and then silently retreated.

Zenyatta was fortunate to have gotten into the right hands. Purchased as a yearling for a bargain-basement \$60,000 because she had a skin rash, Zenyatta was placed under the patient handling of Shirreffs, which the oversized filly would certainly need to succeed. And succeed she did, winning her first 19 races and performing just as proudly and brilliantly in her lone defeat, leading to her induction Aug. 12 into racing's Hall of Fame.

Named by owners Jerry and Ann Moss for an album recorded by The Police (Moss having been a founder of A&M Records), Zenyatta became celebrated not only for marvelous racetrack exploits but for her unusual affinity for humans.

"When she went to the racetrack, she was very strong and hot-blooded," Shirreffs said. "But once she cooled down and the tack was off and she relaxed, she was very kind. Total opposite. She engaged with whoever was around."

Zenyatta didn't start until late in her 3-year-old season, breaking her maiden and winning an allowance, her only career races not in grade I or II company. Bred by Eric Kronfeld's Maverick Productions, Zenyatta (Street Cry—Vertigineux, by Kris S.) established her style

right off jump street—sitting in last place until she gathered herself and made a monstrous move to pass her opponents.

At 4, Zenyatta traveled to Oaklawn Park and defeated reigning champion older female Ginger Punch in the Apple Blossom Handicap (gr. I). Racing at Hollywood Park, Del Mar, and Santa Anita, she won four additional graded events before a hand-ridden victory in the Breeders' Cup Ladies' Classic (gr. I).

At 5 she won four more graded stakes and at Santa Anita, became the only female to win the Breeders' Cup Classic (gr. I), running her perfect slate to 14.

At 6, Zenyatta won her second Apple Blossom, third Vanity Handicap (gr. I), third Clement L. Hirsch Stakes (gr. I), and third Lady's Secret Stakes (gr. I).

Zenyatta's undeniable charisma brought legions of new fans to the sport. Whether it was her size, her pawing the ground and prancing about the paddock, or her dramatic come-from-behind adventures, she was a magnet for affection.

Sent to Churchill for a repeat try in the 2010 Breeders' Cup Classic, Zenyatta was taken farther off the pace than usual by regular pilot Mike Smith, and her express-train late run fell a head short of Blame.

Zenyatta's final ledger stands at 19 victories from 20 starts, good for \$7,304,580 in earnings. BH

MOTION'S GHOSTZAPPER FILLY PROFITABLE **PINHOOK**

inhookers who deal in the upper end of the bloodstock market had a profitable Fasig-Tipton Saratoga selected yearling sale in Saratoga Springs, N.Y., Aug. 8-9.

According to *BloodHorse MarketWatch*, of 22 Fasig-Tipton sale horses sold this year that were purchased as weanlings, 20 were profitable. As a group, the weanling-to-yearling pinhooks were bought for an average \$182,273 and averaged \$313,636 as yearlings.

Twelve of those yearlings bought earlier this year were sold at Saratoga, with 10 posting a profit. This group was purchased for an average price of \$112,667 and averaged \$238,8933 at the Fasig-Tipton sale.

The one-horse consignment from Andrew Motion's Old Chapel Farm, a Ghostzapper filly produced from the winning Elusive Quality mare Amber Grace consigned as Hip 202, was the sale's most profitable pinhook.

Out of a half sister to multiple group I winner Russian Rhythm and group II winner Perfectperformance, the filly was purchased for \$65,000 from the Paramount Sales consignment at the Keeneland November

breeding stock sale.

After deducting the sales company's 5% commission, the filly's net price at Saratoga was \$270,750. Subtracting Old Chapel's total investment (previous sale price plus upkeep, estimated at \$10,000 from weanling to yearling) left Motion with a \$195,750 profit, an impressive 261% return on investment.

Motion, who began his pinhooking venture four years ago, said having a yearling in the Saratoga sale was part of his effort to upgrade the quality of horses he was buying and selling.

"You give yourself a much better shot if you have better quality horses," the consignor said. BH

LADY AURELIA TO FRANCE, ACAPULCO STAYS IN US

ady Aurelia put in her final U.S. work Aug. 11 at Keeneland in preparation for the group I Darley Prix Morny Stakes in Deauville.

Stonestreet Stable's homebred daughter of Scat Daddy is scheduled to ship Aug. 13 to make her third start in the Aug. 21 Prix Morny in France. The undefeated filly won the Queen Mary Stakes (Eng-II) by seven lengths in June during Royal Ascot. Stonestreet races her with partners George Bolton and Peter Leidel.

Lady Aurelia worked in company with stakes-winning sprinter Hooligan, going four furlongs on the turf in :48.

"She broke off right behind (Hooligan)," said Ward. "She eased out and cruised right on by and had a beautiful, beautiful gallop out. She cooled out good and sound, so we're very excited."

Ward also planned to ship group winner Acapulco to York for another try at the Coolmore Nunthorpe Stakes (Eng-I), a race she placed second in last year, but those plans changed.

"She is doing very well, but she has a little bit of a foot issue so she's going to need more time to come around," Ward said. "She is not ready to put on

a plane and go over there, yet."

Acapulco's next start could either be the Sept. 10 Kentucky Downs Ladies Sprint or the Woodford Presented by Keeneland Select Stakes (gr. IIIT) Oct. 8 on Keeneland's Fallstars opening weekend.

Acapulco is owned by Susan Magnier, Michael Tabor, and Derrick Smith, who bought the 3-year-old daughter of Scat Daddy for \$750,000 out of the 2015 Ocala Breeders' Sale's March 2-year-olds sale. She's run twice so far this year and won both times, taking the Unbridled Sidney Stakes at Churchill Downs May 14 by 3 1/2 lengths in her most recent start. Acapulco finished second in last year's Nunthorpe Stakes. BH

CHALLENGE SERIES TURNS FOCUS TO TURF RACING

his week's Breeders' Cup Challenge series will focus on turf racing beginning with the Arlington Million Stakes (gr. IT) and Beverly D. Stakes (gr. IT) Aug. 13 at Arlington International Racecourse, followed by three European races.

In all, this week's races will award five Breeders' Cup spots, two to the Turf (gr. I), two to the Filly & Mare Turf (gr. I), and one to the Mile (gr. I).

In the Arlington Million, popular veteran The Pizza Man will try to defend his title. Already the first Illinois-bred to win the Million, The Pizza Man could join John Henry as the only two-time winner of the race. Last year The Pizza Man went on to finish fifth in the Turf.

With The Pizza Man off form so far this year, group I winner Tryster is the 7-2 morning-line choice to win his U.S. debut.

While last year's Beverly D. Stakes winner Watsdachances, who was put up by the stewards after interference

by first-to-the-wire Secret Gesture, will not defend her title; her trainer Chad Brown is back with 7-5 morning-line favorite Sea Calisi, a group II winner in France and grade II winner in the U.S. While Watsdachances went on to finish sixth in the Filly and Mare Turf, Brown has saddled the past two winners of that race in Stephanie's Kitten and Dayatthespa.

Both Arlington races have come up big in the Breeders' Cup in recent years as 2012 Million winner Little Mike took the Classic and 2013 Beverly D. winner Dank won the Filly & Mare Turf. Stephanie's Kitten was last year's Beverly D. runner-up as Secret Gesture was placed third. BH

A homebred for Amy and Jim Elliott, Sung drew off in the stretch during Friday's eighth race, which was restricted to Indiana-breds sired by registered Indiana stallions. A gelding out of the Gone West mare

Goin for the Green, Sung completed the 5 1/2-furlong race in 1:04.42 on a fast track.



JUVENILE FILLIES TO SQUARE OFF IN ADIRONDACK

learview Stable's Ever So Clever, from the barn of new Hall of Fame trainer Steve Asmussen, has some things in her favor for the Aug. 13 Adirondack Stakes (gr. II) at Saratoga Race Course.

The 6 1/2-furlong race for juvenile fillies drew just six and none of them have won over the local strip.

Ever So Clever broke her maiden first time out July 1 going six furlongs at Churchill Downs, leaving from the rail in a nine-horse field and earning a field high 93 Equibase Speed Figure in the process. The daughter of top sire Medaglia d'Oro has the outside post for the Adirondack and gets the services of John Velazquez.

Ever So Clever is out of Foxy Danseur, who ran third in the 2007 Sorrento Stakes (gr. III) for juvenile fillies and was later grade III-placed. She's already produced a pair of stakes horses in Miss Centerfold (by Tiznow) and Tathqeef (by Tapit, in England).

Asmussen won last year's Adirondack with Just Wicked and the 2011 edition with My Miss Aurelia. Silverton Hill's Silvertoni broke her maiden at

Keeneland in April and won the Kentucky Juvenile Stakes at Churchill Downs in early May before trainer Wesley Ward tested the waters at Royal Ascot in England, where she was ninth behind Caravaggio.

A \$230,000 Keeneland September sale buy, she's the first foal out of the Johannesburg mare Somasach and is also by leading sire Tapit. Somasach is out of grade I winner Easy Now, herself a daughter of champion and Broodmare of the Year Relaxing. Easy Now's half sister Cadillacing won Saratoga's seven-furlong Ballerina Stakes (gr. I) in 1988. It's a grand Phipps family.

What's a 2-year-old stakes at the Spa without Todd Pletcher, or his mentor, Hall of Famer D. Wayne Lukas?

Pletcher, a three-time Adirondack winner, will saddle St. Elias Stable's Nonna Mela, a 7 1/4-length maiden winner second time out at Monmouth Park July 2. The daugher of Arch was a \$310,000 Keeneland September yearling buy. She is out of Cool Storm, by Storm Cat, who also is from another Phipps family, that of Get Lucky, who has been responsible for too many top runners and sires to mention here. Javier Castellano has the call on Nonna Mela from post 2.

Lukas has Churchill Downs Racing Club's Dial Me, a winner at Ellis Park July 23 in her second start. Dial Me, with Luis Saez up, will break from the rail. Lukas has six career Adirondack wins dating back to Nervous Baba in 1985.

The field also includes Olive Branch, fifth in the Schuylerville Stakes (gr. III) July 22. The daughter of Speightstown is the first foal out of Venetian Sonata, a full sister to grade II winner Wilburn and a half to Beethoven and La Appassionata.

Libby's Tail, by Tiz Wonderful, came from seventh to win first time out at Belmont going 5 1/2 furongs July 2. She was a \$375,000 Ocala Breeders' Sales Co. spring sale buy and is trained by Rudy Rodriguez. BH

SIX JUVENILES FACE OFF IN BEST PAL

Six 2-year-old males have been entered for the \$200,000 Best Pal Stakes (gr. II) Aug. 10 at Del Mar, and every one has taken a different path to their first attempt at a graded stakes.

Only one entrant,

Rockingham Ranch's Big League, enters without a loss. The Speightstown colt tipped trainer Peter Miller's hand before his standout debut—a 3 1/4-lenth victory at Del Mar July 30—with a trio of bullet works out of the gate at San Luis Rey Training Center leading into the race, and did not disappoint. He dueled for the lead and pulled away with ease to win the 5 1/2-furlong event under a hand ride by jockey Norberto Arroyo, Jr.

Others have more experience and just as impressive maiden victories. To Big League's inside, in post 5 is Kaleem Shah's Klimt, a Quality Road colt trained by Bob Baffert. Klimt finished an even fourth as the

9-5 favorite in his June debut at Santa Anita Park, but took a sizeable step forward in his next start at the Arcadia, Calif., racetrack. In his second try, Klimt took a 5 1/2-furlong event by 5 1/4 lengths.

Another colt who thrived in his second attempt is Kentucky shipper Thirstforlife. The Mark Cassetrained son of Stay Thirsty debuted in the Kentucky Juvenile Stakes and finished third, then stalked and pounced to win a five-furlong maiden special weight event at Churchill Downs by 6 1/2 lengths in June.

Also shipping in from the East is Godolphin's Drafted, who broke his maiden by 2 3/4 lengths in his debut on the dirt at Keeneland in April, then shipped to England and ran 17th in the Windsor Castle Stakes on soft turf at Royal Ascot in June. The ridgling is a son of Field Commission trained by Eoin Harty.

On the inside are two California-based starters with stakes experience from the barn of Doug O'Neill. Secret House, a Tiznow colt, broke his maiden at Santa Anita in May and ran second in the Santa Anita Juvenile July 9. Rinse and Repeat, a son of Square Eddie, earned a stakes placing as a maiden in the July 3 Everett Nevin Stakes at Pleasanton, then broke through in a five-furlong maiden special weight event at Del Mar July 16. BH

JOCKEY CLUB TO HOLD ROUND TABLE

The Jockey Club will use its Aug. 14 Round Table Conference to discuss ways to build upon existing programs, and to continue its advocacy for federal legislation regarding equine medication and drug testing.

"We'll use it to mark the steady progress that has been made in fan development, integrity, and innovation," Jockey Club president and chief operating officer Jim Gagliano said Aug. 11. "And each year, over the last five or six years, we've tried to introduce a speaker from another jurisdiction. The world has become a much smaller place."

The new international speaker will be Winfried Engelbrecht-Bresges, chief executive officer of the Hong Kong Jockey Club, who will provide an overview of racing in Hong Kong and the organization's strategic plan for growth.

United States Reps. Andy Barr of Kentucky and Paul Tonko of New York will provide an update on the Thoroughbred Horseracing Integrity Act of 2015. A Senate companion bill that addresses concerns brought to light by industry stakeholders is expected to be introduced in the near future.

In a related talk, Jeff Novitsky, vice president of athlete health and performance for the Ultimate Fighting Championship, will explain how the sport's hiring of the United States Anti-Doping Agency has moved it forward.

The Round Table, which begins at 10 a.m. EDT in Saratoga Springs, N.Y., will be streamed live at jock-eyclub.com. **BH**

STRONG MARKET EXPECTED FOR HOKKAIDO SALE

ptimism surrounds the Aug. 22 Hokkaido Summer yearling sale at Shizunai after a strong market boosted both the Japan Racing Horse Association Select and Hokkaido Select sales.

The five-day sale has 1,336 yearlings cataloged, with American bloodlines well represented by horses who currently stand or once stood at stud in Japan, including 27 lots by Henny Hughes, 25 by Roses in May, 20 by Pyro, 17 by Empire Maker, and 10 by I'll Have Another.

Hip 130, the only King Kamehameha yearling cataloged, should be a star. The filly is the first foal out of Rose Adagio by Deep Impact and is from the same family as Balanchine and West Wind, both of whom won European classics.

The sale also features two supplemental entries on the final day.

Hip 1356, a filly by Lord Kanaloa out of Cruzada Americana, winner of the group I Grande Premio Joao Cecilio Ferraz in Brazil; and Hip 1363, a colt by Novellist out of Pisa No Rainbow, who is a grand-daughter of U.S. multiple graded stakes winner Key Dancer. Both were buy-backs from the JRHA Select sale.

Last year the Hokkaido Summer sale ended with a total of 812 yearlings selling for ¥3,507,600,000 (approximately \$34 million) and averaging ¥4,319,704 (\$41,939). BH

BH MARKETWATCH INTERVIEW WITH **BECKY THOMAS**

his week's *BloodHorse MarketWatch* interview is with Becky Thomas, a prominent breeder, pinhooker, and partner in Sequel with Dennis Narlinger, a 223-acre breeding operation in Hudson. N.Y. Sequel is a major consignor to the Fasig-Tipton New York-bred yearling sale Aug. 13-14 in Saratoga Springs, N.Y.

BloodHorse MarketWatch: Considering the declines in the 2-year-olds in training sales this year, are you changing the way you buy yearlings for resale?

Becky Thomas: When we got to the Ocala Breeders' Sales Co. in April and saw there were no Wal-Mart-type buyers, only Neiman-Marcus, I knew we were in serious trouble. My game plan for buying is going to be niche markets rather than randomness. I bought one horse at the Fasig-Tipton July yearling sale that was a California-bred because it is a niche market. I will not be buying as much volume and at a higher end. As pinhookers we play at all levels. We play when the market goes up; we play when the

market goes down. We just have to tweak what we're buying.

BH MW: What other steps are you taking to adapt to the changing marketplace?

BT: I am entering some of my mares in upcoming sales. These trends tend to last three to five years and I can't wait that out. I'm going to go back into the marketplace and hopefully make some good broodmare buys.

BH MW: You are heavily invested in New York, so obviously you are a proponent of the New York-bred breeding and racing programs.

BT: I am much more bullish on New York right now with our current horse climate than I have been for many years. I think there is a group of trainers that try to buy New York-breds because they generate income for them. It is the first time in a long time when you can actually generate a profit by racing. I have always ended up racing something I can't sell, but this is the first time in the last 15 years I am intentionally racing. I have racehorses right now and they are all New York-breds because we are running for so much money. The New York awards program is the strongest in the country and New Yorkbreds run for higher purses year-round.

BH MW: Are there other concerns and needs within the New York sale market?

BT: There are a lot of New York-bred horses for which there is no viable venue in which to sell, because of the limited stabling at the sales grounds. We are working on getting an open New York-bred yearling sale that would follow this sale. The only opportunity to sell a non-select New York-bred yearling is the mixed sale here in October and nobody is going to come here then after they have already seen 5,000 yearlings at Keeneland and another 1,400 at the Fasig-Tipton October sale in Kentucky. We have discussed it with Fasig-Tipton and I think it will happen. BH
