## CONQUEST STABLES TO DISPERSE

Multiple graded stakes-winning owner Conquest Stables will have a complete dispersal of racing and breeding stock at the Keeneland November breeding stock sale this fall. Lane's End will act as consignor for Conquest Stables.

Co-owner Ernie Semersky cited personal reasons for leaving racing and breeding.

"When we launched Conquest Stables just four years ago. Our goal was to build an operation that could compete in the biggest races in North America," Semersky said. "We were on our way to achieving that goal, with seven Breeders' Cup starters, two Sovereign Award winners, and the winners of races like the grade I Darley Alcibiades.

"We were the 32nd leading owner in North America by earnings in 2014, the 18th leading owner in 2015, and are currently the 13th leading owner this season. Since we began, our horses have won at a 22% clip, and have finished in the money 57% of the time. With mares like My Conquestadory in the (continued on page 3)

breeding shed, and 44 exciting 2-year-olds in our barn, we feel like the best is yet to come. Unfortunately, because of personal reasons, we have decided to step back from racing at this time. But we feel these up-and-coming horses would be at home in any international racing stable."

Lane's End's Bill Farish added, "It's a privilege to be asked to represent Conquest Stables, and we are sure the buying public will be impressed by the number of proven horses and potential stars in the dispersal. It's a dynamic group of athletes."

The dispersal will include 115 horses and feature: seven pregnant broodmares, in foal to Tapit, Candy Ride, Liam's Map, Union Rags, and Tiznow; five weanlings, 41 racing and broodmare prospects, 61 racing and stallion prospects, 42 3-year-olds, and 44 2-year-olds.

Featured in the offer will be grade I winner My Conquestadory, in foal to Tapit, and her 2016 weanling colt by Tapit; Canadian champion ConquestTyphoon; Conquest Vivi, an undefeated 2-year-old who won the Nandi Stakes by 2 1/2 lengths June 25; grade II winner and Sovereign Award finalist Conquest Daddy, a 3-year-old colt by Scat Daddy who won the Toronto Cup Stakes July 24; Conquest Eclipse, a 4-year-old filly by Malibu Moon who is grade I stakes-placed in California; Conquest Enforcer, a 3-year-old colt by Into Mischief who has won three straight stakes and is three-for-four lifetime; Conquest Wildcat, an impressive debut winner at Churchill Downs; and Conquest Sure Shot, a 2-year-old winner on the turf at Saratoga Race Course going a mile and a sixteenth.

Lane's End handled the highest-grossing Thoroughbred dispersal in North American history as agent for the Edward P. Evans Spring Hill Farm dispersal. The dispersal sold 221 horses for \$62.3 million at Keeneland sales in 2011-2012. **BH**

## SEVENTH HEAVEN UNLEASHES IN YORKSHIRE OAKS

A furlong from the wire, the Yorkshire Oaks (Eng-I) appeared to be anyone's race, but Seventh Heaven unleashed a late run none of the other 11 filly and mare rivals could match.

She registered a 2 3/4-length victory over stablemate Found in the 1 1/2-mile test at York.

The top two are both trained by Aidan O'Brien, who watched Seventh Heaven comfortably rate toward the rear early under Colm O'Donoghue, track the leaders a quarter-mile from the finish, and then unleash her decisive stretch move as she completed 1 1/2 miles in 2:28.5 on the good-to-firm going.

Racing near the center of the course, Seventh Heaven surged past Queen's Trust to seize the lead. Queen's Trust finished third when last year's Breeders' Cup Turf (gr. IT) winner Found, the 2-1 favorite, powered clear of her late. The top two finishers are both campaigned by owners associated with John Magnier's Coolmore operation: Derrick Smith, Susan Magnier, and Michael Tabor.

In her first start against older females, classic winner Seventh Heaven matched the 2 3/4-length victory margin of her Darley Irish Oaks (Ire-I) win in her most recent start July 16 at the Curragh.

"She was obviously a classic winner coming here and was getting the weight allowance from some

older fillies, so we made use of it," O'Donoghue said. "She's tough and genuine and has a great temperament and a beautiful action."

O'Brien said he sees a bright future for Seventh Heaven, a 3-year-old daughter of Galileo.

"She came forward lovely from the Curragh and we thought the track and ground and trip would suit her well," O'Brien said. "She's a beautiful traveler and is a massive, rangy filly that handles fast ground very well. I'd say she's going to make a real (good) 4-year-old, because she's big and rangy."

With the win, Seventh Heaven ensures herself a spot in the Breeders' Cup Filly & Mare Turf (gr. IT) as the Yorkshire Oaks is a Breeders' Cup Challenge Win & You're In race. O'Brien mentioned the Filly & Mare Turf as an option and said he's considering Found for the Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe (Fr-I).

O'Brien suspects Found tired a bit in her first race in more than two months but ultimately showed her class to finish second. The 4-year-old Galileo filly previously earned a runner-up finish in the Prince of Wales's Stakes (Eng-I) June 15 at Royal Ascot.

Cheveley Park Stud homebred Queen's Trust, a 3-year-old Dansili filly, earned her second straight group I placing.

"It was no disgrace to finish third to those two fillies: a classic winner and a Breeders' Cup winner," said Chris Richardson for owner Cheveley Park Stud. Richardson said some overseas stakes would be considered for Queen's Trust. **BH**

## MOKAT SEEKS FIRST GRADE I IN DEL MAR OAKS

At almost every step on Mokat's road to the Kentucky Oaks (gr. I), trainer Richard Baltas expressed a desire to get the daughter of Uncle Mo back on the grass.

The filly owned by J K Racing Stable broke her maiden last summer on the Del Mar turf, then ran a close second in the Jimmy Durante Stakes (gr. IIIT) in November before embarking on a dirt campaign as a 3-year-old in 2016 (though she did run third in a turf allowance race at Santa Anita Park in February).

That's not to say Mokat wasn't capable on the main track. The dark bay or brown runner finished 13th in the Kentucky Oaks with a less-than-ideal inside trip, but picked up placings in the Santa Anita Oaks (gr. I) and Santa Ysabel Stakes (gr. III), on both occasions encountering undefeated Songbird.

But back on the Del Mar grass for the San Clemente Handicap (gr. IIT), Mokat found her best footing and did so impressively. She displayed an eye-popping turn of foot in the final turn and pulled away from the field in the stretch to win by 3 3/4 lengths.

Now Mokat will look to build on that effort with a run in the Del Mar Oaks Presented by The Jockey Club (gr. IT) Aug. 20.

"She's just better on grass," said Baltas, who has liked Mokat's runs on the surface so much he has

breezed her on the Del Mar turf course in preparation for both races. "We tried the dirt and got a grade I placing, but you can see—she just moves better on the grass. I thought she might have been a little bit short, because I gave her time off and only had two works into her, but she ran off the screen."

Returning from the San Clemente are Lady Valeur (second) and Senorita Stakes (gr. IIIT) winner Stays in Vegas (third), but the field is also dotted with runners exiting the July 17 Sandy Blue Handicap at Del Mar. Barleysugar won the 1 1/8-mile turf test by 2 3/4 lengths at odds of 10-1, while Cheekaboo and Mrs. Norris finished in a dead heat for second.

The Del Mar Oaks also includes fillies shipping in from the East, including two-time grade III winner Tin Type Gal from the barn of Graham Motion; New York-based grade III winner Harmonize from the barn of Bill Mott; and Mines and Magic, who finished third in the Indiana Oaks (gr. II) last time out in her first stakes try.

The Keith Desormeaux-trained Decked Out also returns from the East following a ninth-place run in the Belmont Oaks (gr. IT). The Street Boss filly finished behind multiple Del Mar Oaks rivals in her last two starts in Southern California, but won the Providencia Stakes (gr. IIIT) in April on a yielding turf course at Santa Anita.

Last-out allowance race winner Lynne's Legacy completes the field. **BH**

## RESCHEDULED ADIRONDACK DRAWS SEVEN

Libby's Tail, a 2-year-old daughter of Tiz Wonderful who came from seventh to win first time out at Belmont Park July 2, is the 5-2 morning line favorite for the redrawn Adirondack Stakes (gr. II) Aug. 19.

The 6 1/2-furlong race was part of last Saturday's program at Saratoga Race Course, which cancelled mid-card due to heavy rains.

The Adirondack picked up an entrant in its new format—Romantic Music drew the rail and was listed at 8-1 on the morning line.

Libby's Tale, a \$375,000 Ocala Breeders' Sales Co. spring sale buy, is trained by Rudy Rodriguez for Michael Dubb, Bethlehem Stables, and partners. Originally drawn in post five, she's slated in the outside seven post.

The 3-1 second choice is Clearview Stable's Ever So Clever, from Steve Asmussen's barn, who broke her maiden first time out going six furlongs at Churchill Downs July 1, earning a field high 93 Equibase Speed Figure in the process.

The daughter of Medaglia d'Oro is out of Foxy Danseur, who finished third in the 2007 Sorrento

Stakes (gr. III) for juvenile fillies. She's produced a pair of stakes horses in Miss Centerfold (Tiznow) and Tathqeef (Tapit) in England.

Silverton Hill's Silvertoni broke her maiden at Keeneland in April and won the Kentucky Juvenile Stakes at Churchill Downs in early May before trainer Wesley Ward tested the waters at Royal Ascot in England, where she was ninth behind Caravaggio. She'll break from post 6. **BH**

## MONMOUTH OAKS CLASS RELIEF FOR MO D'AMOUR

King of Prussia Stable's Mo d'Amour, fourth in her last two starts in grade I company, heads a field of seven entered for the \$100,000 Monmouth Oaks (gr. III) for 3-year-old fillies Aug. 20 at Monmouth Park.

The Uncle Mo filly, trained by Todd Pletcher, will face Emory Hamilton's Tejana, an impressive winner of her first two starts in maiden and allowance company, and Jeremiah Kane's A Place to Shine, a daughter of Tale of Ekati who finished second in the Delaware Oaks (gr. III) in her last start after a claim for \$12,500 three starts back.

Mo d'Amour, a \$75,000 purchase at the Ocala Breeders' Sales Co. March 2-year-olds in training sale, last time out finished 11 lengths behind undefeated Songbird in the Coaching Club American Oaks (gr. I). Before that, the filly finished 7 1/2 lengths behind Off the Tracks, who won the Mother Goose Stakes (gr. I). In May Mo d'Amour was fifth, beaten only 3 1/2 lengths, in the Longines Kentucky Oaks (gr. I) won by Cathryn Sophia.

Her lone stakes win came in the Busher at Aqueduct Racetrack in February at 1 1/16 miles, the same distance as the Monmouth Oaks.

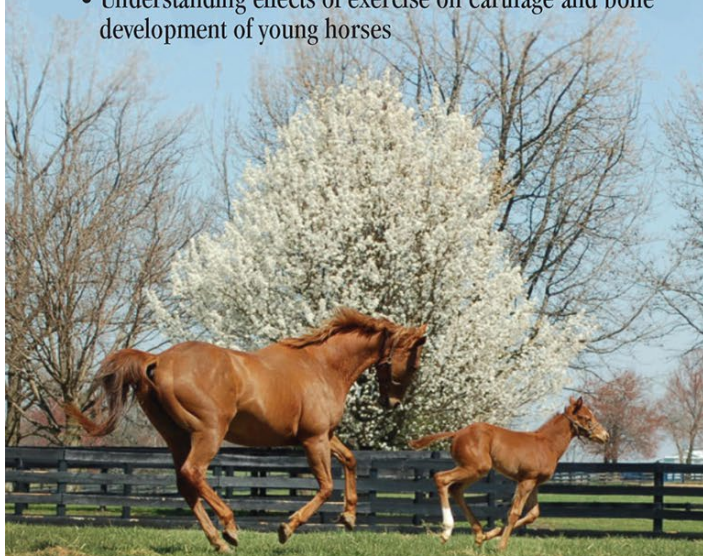
Shug McGaughey-trained Tejana (Curlin) broke her maiden by 4 1/2 lengths in her career debut at six furlongs in May at Pimlico Race Course and returned in July to win a one-turn-mile allowance race by 4 1/4 lengths at Belmont Park. **BH**

## HAT CREEK: BIG BENEFITS FROM MODERATE BUYS

Hat Creek Racing reaped big rewards on moderate investments this month, when both of their runners to race from this year's crop collected stakes scores for trainer Wesley Ward.

Red Lodge, a daughter of Midshipman out of the Aldebaran mare Star Silver (owned in partnership with Head of Plains Partners), notched her first black-type score in her return from an off-the-board finish at Royal Ascot when she won the Aug. 6 Colleen Stakes at Monmouth Park.

Then Con Te Partiro, a Scat Daddy filly out of the grade I-placed Street Cry mare Temple Street, soared 5 3/4 lengths clear in the \$100,000 Bolton Landing Aug. 17 at Saratoga Race Course.

Gatewood Bell of Cromwell Bloodstock selected both for the partnership, which purchases four-yearling fillies per year.

"This partnership doesn't buy expensive horses, and if you're trying to get any sort of value, you have to zig when others are zagging," Bell said. "Con Te Partiro wasn't perfect; I actually vetted her for another client and she failed the vet for him, but I still bought her."

The \$130,000 Keeneland September buy from Taylor Made Sales Agency was the most expensive of the group Bell put together for Hat Creek last season.

He picked Red Lodge for \$82,000 from the Betz Thoroughbreds consignment to the Fasig-Tipton Fall 2015 yearling sale; went to \$70,000 for a City Zip filly now named County Club from Crossroads' consignment to the Fasig-Tipton July sale; and paid \$18,000 for Jermyn Street, a daughter of Quality Road consigned by Taylor Made at Keeneland September. County Club and Jermyn Street both have yet to race but are also in

training with Ward.

"Specifically for this partnership, I raise some money and I keep money to pay all the bills, then I'm trying to buy four fillies that average seventy grand," Bell said. "This group has a lot of local friends; it's a good, fun bunch."

Con Te Partiro's half brother, a Tiznow colt named Tiz Bob, will be offered by Taylor Made as Hip 90 on behalf of breeder K.C. Garrett at the upcoming Keeneland September sale. The dam also produced stakes winner and graded stakes-placed runner Donworth.

Named after the Bocelli opera song "Time to say goodbye," Con Te Partiro was named the day after her sire passed away.

"I have a love affair with Scat Daddy; a lot of people do, but I have for a while and have had a lot of luck with his produce before," Bell said. "This filly was a good mover and had a good outlook. All the Scat Daddy runners are so smart and laid back, I think that's one reason he's such a good sire."

While a target has yet to be decided for Con Te Partiro, whose connections expect to stretch out, Red Lodge will run in the Sept. 3 Exacta Systems Juvenile Fillies at Kentucky Downs. County Club could appear at Keeneland in the fall, while Jermyn Street is a "winter or next spring type of horse," Bell said. **BH**

## AWAITING A PACIFIC CLASSIC, BC CLASSIC SWEEP

The horse that emerges as this year's TVG Pacific Classic (gr. I) winner, in a field that includes 2014 Horse of the Year California Chrome, three-time champion Beholder, and 2015 Santa Anita Derby (gr. I) winner Dortmund, could become the first horse to sweep Del Mar's top race and the Breeders' Cup Classic (gr. I).

In fact, the only Breeders' Cup Classic winner to prep in the Pacific Classic was Tiznow, who finished second to Skimming in the 2000 Pacific Classic before closing out the year with three straight graded stakes wins capped by his victory over Giant's Cuaseway in the Breeders' Cup Classic at Churchill Downs.

Tiznow, of course would win a second straight Breeders' Cup Classic in 2001 but he didn't use the Pacific Classic as a stepping-stone that year.

Considering the Breeders' Cup, launched in 1984, and Pacific Classic, started in 1991, have grown up together and are contested at 1 1/4 miles, it's surprising there aren't more ties between the races. Last year's runaway Pacific Classic winner Beholder figured to be the second betting choice in the Classic until she was scratched.

A couple other Breeders' Cup Classic winners did prep at Del Mar: Zenyatta won the 2008 Clement L. Hirsch Stakes (gr. I) and in 1996 Alphabet Soup won the Pat O'Brien Stakes (gr. III) and finished second in the Del

Mar Breeders' Cup Handicap (gr. II).

### Ireland Making Impact

The past four Challenge winners all were bred in Ireland, a stretch starting with Mondialiste's Arlington Million Stakes (gr. I) win, followed by Ribchester, Postponed, and Seventh Heaven in Challenge races conducted in Europe. Ireland boasts seven Challenge wins this year. **BH**

## TIMONIUM BOOSTS TRAINER BONUSES

The Maryland State Fair will offer trainer bonuses worth \$20,000 for the seven-day Timonium meet that begins Aug. 26.

The bonuses, designed to encourage more entries, had totaled \$10,000 for previous meets, but the fair added another \$10,000, according to a release from the Maryland Thoroughbred Horsemen's Association.

"The state fair board asked me what they could do to entice more horses to make the racing go better," said trainer Ferris Allen, who is a member of the boards of the Maryland State Fair and the Maryland THA. "They made the decision and left the particulars up to me. I sat down with (Maryland Jockey Club racing secretary) Georganne Hale, and we came up with a plan that would benefit as many trainers as we could."

The MJC oversees the racing program at the fair meet.

Under the plan, \$15,000 will be paid to trainers via a points system—10 points for a first-place finish, five for a second-place finish, three for a third-place finish, and one point per starter. A trainer whose horses accumulate the most points during the meet will get \$5,000, second is worth \$4,000, and third through fifth are each worth \$2,000.

The remaining \$5,000, contributed by the Maryland THA, will go to the trainer whose horses accu-

mulate the most earnings for the meet. If a trainer with the highest earnings is among the top five in points, he or she will only receive the \$5,000 earnings bonus and will be replaced on the list by the next eligible trainer.

Timonium, which will race Aug. 26-28 and Sept. 2-5, has a five-eighths-mile racing surface. Most races are run at four furlongs and 6 1/2 furlongs.

"We're hoping the additional money here will tempt trainers to stay (in Maryland) and that guys with regional horses will throw Timonium into the mix for their horses," Allen said. "Even if the race fields go up (by) just one horse, it will make a difference."

Timonium, which can field 10 horses, last year averaged 6.87 horses per race for 61 races over seven days, according to The Jockey Club Information Systems. Purses averaged \$163,253 per program.

Maiden special weight races will go for \$32,000 this year, while the purse for an open allowance race is \$45,000. The minimum purse is \$10,000 for \$4,000 claimers or \$5,000 maiden claimers. All races will offer up to 30% in Maryland-bred bonus money.

"This additional bonus money may get more trainers to support the meet," Hale said. "Even if it is just one more horse (per race), it helps the handle and that is a very good thing."

The Laurel Park summer meet concludes Aug. 21. The next Laurel meet, which spans late summer, fall, and early winter, runs from Sept. 9-Dec. 31 on a Friday-through-Sunday schedule for the most part. **BH**

## QUEEN KINDLY TAKES YORK'S LOWTHER STAKES

Of the two fillies from Frankel's first crop entered in the Sky Bet Lowther Stakes (Eng-II) at York Aug. 18, public opinion favored Juddmonte's group III-winning Fair Eva.

However, at the end of the six-furlong event on the Knavesmire, the victory belonged to the other daughter of Frankel, Queen Kindly, who reached the wire three-quarters of a length in front of Coolmore's Kentucky-bred Roly Poly (War Front) with Fair Eva another three-quarters of a length back in third.

Owned by Jaber Abdullah and bred in Britain by Rabbah Bloodstock, Queen Kindly is a third consecutive tail-female Lowther winner.

Her dam, the highweighted Rahy mare Lady of the Desert—also bred by Rabbah and raced by Abdullah—won the York event in 2009. Third dam, Abdullah-raced Queen's Logic (Grand Lodge), captured the 2001 Lowther, as well as two other group Is and

a group III, on her way to being Europe's champion 2-year-old filly.

Coincidentally, Queen's Logic is the dam of Rabbah-bred 2-year-old colt King's Advice. His sire is none other than Frankel.

Queen Kindly is inbred 5x3 to Europe's champion miler Blushing Groom through his son Rainbow Quest, broodmare sire of Frankel's dam Kind, and through Rahy.

Fair Eva also has a Blushing Groom double as she is inbred 4x4 to Rainbow Quest, winner of the 1985 Trusthouse Forte Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe (Fr-I) for Juddmonte before becoming a leading sire and broodmare sire in Europe. **BH**

### KUNIHICO TAKE PASSES AT 77

Kunihiko Take, legendary jockey and father of equally talented rider Yutaka Take, died at Saiseikai Shiga Hospital at Ritto City Aug. 12 after a battle with pulmonary carcinoma. He was 77.

Take was born near Hakodate City on Hokkaido Island on Oct. 20, 1938, a son of Yoshihiko Take, successful businessman and racehorse owner. The family owned a Thoroughbred breeding farm in the suburb of Hakodate, and Kunihiko started to ride ponies when he was a child.

Take rode his first winner as a professional jockey in

1957 when he was 19, and won 1,163 races through his 30-year career in the saddle. His illustrated record features 80 graded stakes wins, which include the success of the Tokyo Yushun (Japanese Derby) in 1972 on Long Ace.

While he measured 5'8", tall for a jockey, his riding style was recognized as the most beautiful at his era and he was described as a "Magic Man on Turf."

Take quit riding and started training in 1987. As a trainer, he won 375 races including 18 graded stakes. The most notable victory was the 1990 Sprinters Stakes (Jpn-I), which Bamboo Memory, trained by Take and ridden by his son Yutaka Take, won decisively.

The funeral service was organized at Kusatsu Funeral Hall Aug. 15. **BH**

## AUGUST EXPECTATIONS

**F** Francis Vanlangendonck operates the Central Florida-based Summerfield agency with his wife, Barbara. The leading consignors at the 2015 Ocala Breeders' Sales August yearling sale by gross sales and number sold, Summerfield regularly sells in Florida, Kentucky, and New York. Francis Vanlangendonck talks with BloodHorse MarketWatch editor Eric Mitchell about his expectations for the upcoming OBS select and open yearling sale Aug. 23-25 based on what he's seen so far at previous auctions.

**BH:** You had consignments at the Fasig-Tipton sales in Kentucky in July and most recently at Saratoga. Have you seen anything at these sales that influences your expectations at OBS next week?

**FV:** The sales we've had so far have been smaller sales. Even with the 2-year-olds, we've seen that the smaller more boutique-type sales can be more volatile. That will be different at

OBS where we have more than 1,000 head. It is bringing in more people, particularly local people who don't have to travel. Those buyers can make a sale.

**BH:** Is the selectivity we've been seeing affected any by the larger selection?

**FV:** The lower end is going to take a hit, like every sale; that is the market now. But our medium to good horses should do well. We have had a lot of inquiries, more than I've had in the past, about specific horses and people wanting to know when we're going to start showing. We are getting texts and phone calls from some agents that have not been here in awhile. I'm anticipating a pretty good sale.

**BH:** What is the dynamic between the select session and the open session? If buyers come to the select sale, do they stay?

**FV:** You may have one or two who leave, but we have the select and the first day of the open session on the grounds so people go through all of them. If someone has to leave early, they'll ask what else we have, and we'll have those Thursday horses on the ground Wednesday morning. They get a chance to look at everything and then just bid by phone.

**BH:** How much of a challenge has it been for OBS to sell in August when Keeneland September is only three weeks away?

**FV:** We do fight a regular battle with where we are on the calendar. You have people still in Saratoga and still at Del Mar so it is tough to bring them in for any period of time. But it has been getting better because we've had several horses come out of this sale who are runners. OBS always emphasizes the physical and when you do that you're going to get runners. The effect of Keeneland September we used to see at Saratoga, and then a couple years ago, changed a bit. People came in and wanted to buy horses. Buyers are realizing they'd better buy it when they see it because they may not be able to buy it the next time. **BH**
