TRAVERS BUZZ HORSE ARROGATE STEPS UP TO PLATE

Thoroughbred racing allows for little time to dwell on missed opportunities. No matter how tough the perceived beat, there is always another race going to post, or another prospect coming into the barn who may make up for a setback.

At the 2014 Keeneland September yearling sale the Juddmonte Farms crew, like many, were keen on a gorgeous gray colt from the Clearsky Farms consignment. While Prince Khalid Abdullah's operation didn't prevail in the bidding for \$2.2 million co-sale topper and future graded stakes winner Mohaymen, the "other" gray colt it ended up taking home succeeded in bringing the farm to one of biggest stages in the 3-year-old male ranks.

The buzz contender in the 14-horse lineup for Saturday's \$1.25 million Travers Stakes (gr. I) is the Bob Baffert-trained, Juddmonte-owned Arrogate, who steps into graded stakes company for the first time while making his fifth career start. It is an ambitious outing for a horse that just debuted in April and broke his maiden June 5, but the move also speaks to the level of confidence from connections who don't normally dive into that deep of a pool unless they are fairly certain they can kick to the surface. Purchased for \$560,000, Arrogate was a larger-bodied specimen than his light-framed neighbor Mohaymen, and was earmarked by Juddmonte as one who would likely flourish with a little patience. Shin issues kept the son of Unbridled's Song from debuting until April 17 of this year, when he ran third going six furlongs at Los Alamitos, but he has impressed in winning three straight since including a 1 3/4-length allowance optional claiming triumph Aug. 4 going 1 1/16 miles at Del Mar.

"He was actually stabled beside Mohaymen and we went into the ring to chase after Mohaymen," said Garrett O'Rourke, general manager of Juddmonte Farms. "But this horse was a lovely individual. He's a bigger horse than Mohaymen and we gave him some time. He had some shin problems as a 2-year-old so we decided to give him the time and allow him to develop, hoping we'll get our returns with him starting with this Saturday.

"One of the things that has been very impressive is even thought he hasn't been running in black-type races, he's had adversity and he's gotten a bit of an education."

Arrogate's third outing, a 5 1/4-length win June 24 going 1 1/16 miles at Santa Anita Park, had Baffert toying with the notion of sending the colt to the July 31, \$1 million Betfair.com Haskell Invitational Stakes (gr. I). After facing pressure on the front end from Chief of Staff down the backstretch, Arrogate put that one away handily on the final turn and found another gear when roused by jockey Rafael Bejarano in the lane.

Were it not for the presence of champion California Chrome, Baffert said he the \$1 Million TVG Pacific Classic Stakes (gr. I) even would have been an option for Arrogate. With Prince Abdullah already "excited" about the prospect of running the colt as a 4-year-old, O'Rourke stressed they didn't feel pressed to "play catch up" with the rest of the sophomore class this summer—unless Arrogate forces their hand with his results.

"I think his ability at 1 1/4 miles is something that excites Bob about the Travers, because he is the kind of horse with a big, long stride, and you'd have to think that would be to our advantage going a distance of ground," O'Rourke said. BH

AMBITIOUS SCHEDULE FOR RUNHAPPY

rainer Laura Wohlers was "really superbly pleased" Aug. 25 with 2015 sprint champion Runhappy's first recorded work of the year.

The 4-year-old son of Super Saver, who was given 60 days off after he was diagnosed with a bone bruise in mid-June, worked three furlongs in :34 4/5 at Keeneland and was also timed for the half-mile (:46) and five furlongs (:59).

What lies ahead is an ambitious schedule for James McIngvale's star runner. The plan, as it has been all along this year, is to stretch Runhappy out to a mile and beyond. On the immediate radar is the one-turn mile Ack Ack Handicap (gr. III) Oct. 1 at Churchill Downs, with a year-end goal of the Nov. 5 Breeders' Cup Dirt Mile (gr. I) at Santa Anita Park.

In Runhappy's final outing last Dec. 26, he won Santa Anita's seven-furlong Malibu Stakes (gr.I) against 3-year-olds.

The "beyond" comes in the form of the nine-furlong Pegasus World Cup (gr. I) in January. Entry into the \$12 million race at Gulfstream Park is gained with a \$1 million buy-in for a spot in the starting gate. McIngvale purchased a slot in May.

As for the work, Runhappy's first recorded work since mid December, he shipped from his base at the Kentucky Training Center north of Lexington to Keeneland in the pre-dawn hours and was one of a handful of horses on the track around 5:30 a.m. EDT. By 8:30 he was back at the Training Center, had spent time in his 350-gallon water Spa, and had been turned out.

"We didn't want it to be a big deal," Wohlers said of the pre-dawn outing. "If he has a group of people out to see him he starts to show off, so we wanted to go out early in the morning.

"Today was a very good day," Wohlers said. "He couldn't have done it any better. He looked like a machine out there. We had been doing a few eighths at the training center that he'd been doing in :11 and it was getting hard to pull him up.

"We'll take him over the Churchill sometime in the next few weeks and see how he likes the surface some horses just don't care for it. If he does well then we could even go in the (Nov. 15) Clark (Handicap, gr. I) if we wanted to. That would give him a two-turn, 1 1/8-mile race."

wner Vince Scuderi announced Aug. 25 his multiple grade I-winning homebred Dads Caps has been retired from racing.

A 6-year-old son of Discreet Cat, Dads Caps is out of the multiple stakes-producing Grindstone mare Seeking the Silver. Dads Caps' multiple grad-

ed stakes winning half sister Paulassilverlining (Ghostzapper) is a scheduled starter in the \$500,000 Ballerina Stakes (gr. I) Aug. 27 on the Travers day undercard.

Dads Caps won or placed in 14 stakes—all on the New York Racing Association circuit—and earned \$1,110,467 with a record of 5-8-5 from 26 starts for trainer Rudy Rodriguez. He won back-to-back editions of the Carter Handicap (gr. I) in 2014-15, and narrowly missed the hat trick with a close thirdplace finish this year.

"We've had a tremendous run with Dads

Caps," Scuderi said. "For four seasons he took on the best sprinters of his generation and his record is a testament to his consistency and heart.

"We could campaign him another season, but we have had a few farms looking into his availability as a stallion and he has certainly earned that opportunity. I have not finalized any plans as of yet, but I am weighing all options for his future." BH

LOVE THE CHASE TO FASIG-TIPTON NOVEMBER

The mare who produced 2014 Horse of the Year California Chrome will be offered at the Fasig-Tipton November sale, owner Perry Martin said.

Love the Chase will be sold through the Taylor Made Sales Agency consignment in foal to Tapit. Actually, the first mare of the year confirmed in foal to North America's leading sire.

"I'm keeping 10% of California Chrome, so that means I'll need some mares, which means I can't keep everything," Martin said. "I plan on selling her and using the proceeds to buy other mares. I'm also breeding horses with the idea of breeding to Chrome.

"For tax purposes, what we are doing is a 1031 exchange, which is basically exchanging assets. This is mostly used for real estate but you can use any asset as long as they are similar in kind, and you have window of opportunity to do that."

A key purchase for Martin's broodmare program down the road was an Ohio-bred Munnings filly now named Not a Kitten. The \$60,000 buy was consigned to the Barretts March sale of 2-year-olds in train-

ing by Crane Thoroughbred Services.

"We named her Not a Kitten as kinda of a jab at Mr. Ramsey. She is in training with Art Sherman and might premier at Los Alamitos," Martin said. "Her female family is top-notch. She may not be ready to be a broodmare that first year, so I might do some foal-sharing. We brought in 22 partners on Chrome, so if they have better mares than I do, then I'll do foal-sharing.

"I think mares by Speightstown will be a terrific cross. The A.P. Indy cross with Mr. Prospector line mares is a mega nick. Storm Cat is another line that should do well."

Martin said California Chrome, who defeated threetime champion Beholder Aug. 20 in the TVG Pacific Classic (gr. I) to run his undefeated record in 2016 to five impressive wins, remains on track for a run at the \$12 million Pegasus World Cup (gr. I) Jan. 28 at Gulfstream Park before retiring for the 2017 breeding season.


"We had three goals this year, and we've already accomplished one and are heading toward the second," he said. "The Pegasus is the third goal. I want the 'Most Accomplished Horse in the World' title. I think winning that race will put us way over the top."

The team at Taylor Made Farm, now partners in California Chrome, has a plan to handle the tight turnaround from racing to breeding when the Lucky Pulpit stallion arrives at their farm near Nicholasville, Ky.

"There is a big concern (about the timing of the Pegasus World Cup), and we tried to get them to move the race, but they have reasons for where it is," Martin said. "We have talked about this in great detail and Taylor Made believes they can get it done. They will have to do some things different than they typically do because they will have three weeks (before the breeding season starts), but they believe they can get it done." **BH**

DEL MAR CRITICS FIRE BACK DURING CHRB MEETING

A group of animal rights advocates, with local television cameras not far behind, made their voices heard at the California Horse Racing Board's monthly meeting Aug. 25 at Del Mar.

Recent deaths at Del Mar during training and racing prompted several members of the greater San Diego and animal rights communities to criticize the racetrack, the CHRB, and the sport of horse racing during the governing body's allocated time for public comment.

"There are opportunities to do a better job of monitoring the stresses on these animals. Del Mar is an important part of the San Diego community," said Lori Saldana, a former member of the California State Assembly who represented San Diego from 2004-10. "But just as other tourism and hospitality services have seen a change in perception about SeaWorld and Orcas and about zoos and how they display animals; the perception of people and animals is changing."

Some said that 19 horses have died at Del Mar since the meeting began July 15. CHRB spokesman Mike Marten cited equine medical director Dr. Rick Arthur documented 16 deaths during the meet. But minutes from the Del Mar stewards indicate 16 deaths through Aug. 14 and at least one horse, All the Marbles, broke down since, when he was training on the turf Aug. 21 and had to be euthanized.

"You clearly think of the horses as athletes," said local resident Martha Sullivan, who participated in recent protests outside of Del Mar. "I would put to you that in any other sport, if you have 19 athletes die in the same venue... there would be something really dramatic (happening)."

Others called for the immediate shutdown of Del Mar and brought up the recent efforts to change how SeaWorld cares for its animals.

CHRB chairman Chuck Winner and executive director Rick Baedeker both preempted the speakers with statements and assured the crowd investigations are conducted on every racehorse's death in the state.

"I can attest to the fact, that opposed to what people say about racing being just a business for people to make money and just a way for people to gamble,"

Baedeker said," I can state unequivocally—and most of us know this—most businesses are much better investments than horse racing and most serious gamblers prefer casinos.

"The truth is, most of the people involved in racing were drawn to it by the beauty of the horse, and by in large, the people who care for the horses pamper them. Anyone who sees a racehorse run, you realize that they love it—they love to run. That doesn't diminish the sorrow and frustration felt by the same individuals when a horse is lost, but it is an important component of the whole story of the racetrack."

Del Mar issued a statement following the public comment portion of the meeting.

"The total number of fatalities during Del Mar's summer meet is 16," the statement read. "Ten during morning workouts and six during afternoon racing.

"In an effort to provide horses additional time to acclimate themselves to new surfaces and surroundings, beginning in (2017) Del Mar will open its season one week later." **BH**

'CONSUMMATE HORSEMAN' MOTT JOINS WALK OF FAME

N early 20 years after he was inducted into the Hall of Fame across Union Avenue from Saratoga Race Course, trainer Bill Mott will add another accolade to his already impressive rosumo when he joins the Saratoga Walk of Fame Aug. 26.

Established in 2015 on the grounds of the track, the Walk of Fame honors men and women who have made significant contributions to horse racing in general and to Saratoga in particular. Previous honorees include Ogden Mills Phipps, Marylou Whitney, H. Allen Jerkens, Tom Durkin, D. Wayne Lukas, Jerry Bailey, John Velazquez, and Angelo Cordero.

"I thought it was special to be put into the national Hall of Fame, and this is very nice," Mott said. "You say those names (of the other inductees), and all of those people have been very influential in the business. Of course to join Allen Jerkens is an honor."

The winner of nine training titles at Saratoga and three Eclipse Awards for outstanding trainer, Mott

owned in partnership by Adam Wachtel, a long-time Mott client.

"We've had a lot of good horses with him, from El Khali to Ron the Greek to Tourist," Wachtel said. "He's a consummate horseman, and we have similar philosophies on how you're supposed to treat horses. He's a class individual and a really good guy."

Mott has trained more than 4,600 winners for earnings of just under \$250 million. Among his standouts are two-time horse of the year Cigar, trained by Mott to 16 straight wins, and Royal Delta, a threetime champion.

Three years ago Mott appeared in a documentary about the history of Saratoga Race Course, speaking at length about the distinctiveness of the track here and its significance to the national racing landscape. On Friday he will become a part of its history, with an exhibit of memorabilia in the Walk of Fame that will be ready for viewing that day.

"We really love Saratoga," he said, sitting in his office near the Oklahoma training track. "It's been a good place for our family." **BH**

counts wins in a number of Saratoga stakes races, including the Personal Ensign, the Woodward, the Alabama, the Hopeful, the Test, the Ballerina, the Sword Dancer, and the Diana (all gr. l), many of them more than once.

"It's a short meet, but it's become almost the nucleus of horse racing in North America," said the trainer, who makes his home in Saratoga for half the year. "If you're going to make it, you need to make it in New York, and a big part of that is Saratoga."

Mott added to his list of grade I Saratoga winners when he won the Aug. 20 Fourstardave with Tourist, who is

CAMPBELL 'BIG-TIME EXCITED' FOR WALK OF FAME

C itting in his box at Saratoga Race Course, Cot Campbell looked out over the track on which horses owned by his Dogwood Stables won so many races, not far from the winner's circle in which he'd had his picture taken so many times.

Campbell will be back in the winner's circle Aug. 26, and his picture will certainly be taken, but this time, he, not his horses, will be the center of attention, as he will join trainer Bill Mott in being inducted into the Saratoga Walk of Fame, established at the track last year to honor men and women who have made significant contributions to horse racing at Saratoga.


"I'm thrilled," Campbell said. "When I got the call from (New York Racing Association president and CEO) Chris Kay and I called him back, I didn't know what in the world he wanted. Boy, it was good news and it does mean a lot to me."

One of the pioneers of Thoroughbred partnerships, Campbell and his partners campaigned stakes winners Palace Malice, Limehouse, Smok'n Frolic, Trippi, and Summer Squall, who in the summer of 1989 won the Saratoga Special (gr. II) and Hopeful Stakes (gr. I).

Two years ago, Campbell merged Dogwood with Eclipse Thoroughbred Partners, founded by Aron Wellman, who said, "It's truly been one of the greatest honors and privileges of my life and my professional career to have been associated with Cot. He's an incredible guy and it's been an education from a professional and personal perspective to be able to be close with him over these past few years."

Paul Oreffice has been a Dogwood partner for more than a guarter of a century, and he remembered going with Campbell to the Fasig-Tipton February sale of 2-year-olds in 2002.

"There was one horse he wanted me to look at," Oreffice said. "He said, 'He doesn't look good, but I think he's going to be a glorious horse.' Those were his exact words. And we got the horse




Owner Cot Campbell is thrilled to join the Saratoga Walk of Fame

cheap because nobody else saw what he saw." Dogwood paid \$43,000 for the horse that would be named Wallenda, a multiple graded stakes winner of more than \$1.2 million.

Four horses still carry the Dogwood colors, down from a high of 65. Those four are all owned by the Campbell family; Campbell said he'll continue to buy and race horses, though the days of Dogwood partnerships are at an end. And win or lose, this Friday he'll head on down to add his name to a list of all-time greats at the upstate oval.

"I'm big-time excited," he said. "I've been coming up here since 1971 and it's kind of as second home and just to be included with those other people is very flattering." BH



SHARED BELIEF STAKES EMOTIONAL FOR ROME

im Rome thought he would eventually get over losing Shared Belief. The horse owner and syndicated sports talk radio star thought time would help.

On the eve of the first Shared Belief Stakes, Rome still hasn't gotten over the Candy Ride gelding's death following colic surgery in December.

"When it all went down, I thought time would heal all wounds," Rome said. "But it'll never be all right."

Rome will broadcast his "Jim Rome Show" from Del Mar Aug. 26, hours before the Shared Belief Stakes—previously the El Cajon—a \$100,000 stakes for 3-year-olds at a mile on the main track.

"As it gets closer, I'm getting anxious. It's going to be tough and it's going to be emotional," Rome said. "I know there's going to be a tribute and that they want me to say a few words. It's not because we're in the race. It's the horse."

Rome still harkens back to that December morning, when bloodstock agent and fellow owner Alex Solis II reported the standout gelding had died. That message was followed by a call from Shared Belief's regular jockey, Mike Smith, and both broke into tears.

"When I found out he passed, I still did the show," Rome remembered. "Then, after, I'm sitting at my desk, a 51-year-old man crying. My 10-year-old son

had never seen me cry. That's what's hard about this. I'm getting choked up in the middle of the week."

Rome can't help but wonder what could have been. Foot issues nagged Shared Belief throughout his career, knocking him out of Triple Crown consideration, so he never had the opportunity to become the media darling California Chrome became, but the two raced against each other twice.

California Chrome finished third to Shared Belief's fourth in a troubled 2014 Breeders' Cup Classic (gr. I), but the nearly black, Jerry Hollendorfer-trainee turned the tables to win the San Antonio Invitational (gr. II). Just more than two months later, Shared Belief was pulled up by Smith during the Charles Town Classic (gr. II) and was training toward a comeback when colic struck.

His career included six grade I wins, including victories on synthetic footing (2013 CashCall Futurity, en route to champion 2-year-old male honors), at 1 1/4 miles (2014 Pacific Classic and 2015 Santa Anita Handicap), and sprinting (2014 Malibu Stakes at seven furlongs).

"It's a reminder that he's not here," Rome said. "I'm not going to lie and say there's not a sense of what could have been. He was 10-for-12 and was taken from everybody. You never know how he would have come back, but everything you asked of him, he did."

In the Shared Belief Stakes Friday, there will be one jockey wearing the black silks with a blue stripe of Rome's Jungle Racing. Flavien Prat will don the colors best employed by Shared Belief in the race aboard 4-1 second choice Taman Guard, while Smith will be aboard fellow Hollendorfer trainee—and 3-1 favorite—Who's Out.

The ownership group for Taman Guard includes another of Shared Belief's co-owners, Kevin Nish's KMN Racing, and when the group discussed whether to run the son of Midnight Lute in a Del Mar allowance or the Shared Belief Stakes, there was no doubt where he'd land. **BH**

SALES UPDATE

WEAK MARKET PLAGUES **OBS AUGUST**

By Eric Mitchell

he rough start at the Ocala Breeders' Sale Co. August yearling sale never smoothed out, with overall statistics during the second day of the twoday open session as sobering as the first.

For the second session Aug.



Hip 672, an Archarcharch filly, was one of two yearlings that brought \$55,000 on the final day

a year ago but the gross was off 14.3% from the 2015 total sales of \$6,774,500. The average price was \$38,682, down 14.3% from last year's \$45,163 select average, and the median price was down 28.6% to \$25,000 compared with \$35,000 a year ago. The buyback percentage was 32.7%; it was 21.9% in 2015.

The session and overall sale-topper was Hip 24, a son of Flatter consigned by Stuart Morris as agent and sold for

25, 156 yearlings brought a total of \$1,269,700, which was down 45% from last year's second-session gross of \$2,315,200 for 194 sold. The average price dropped

31.8% to \$8,139, down from \$11,934 a year ago while the median price of \$4,500 was half of what it was for the same session of 2015. The buyback percentage was 42.2%; it was 20.5% last year.

A filly by Archarcharch and a colt by Dialed In each brought \$55,000 to top the final session.

Jason Hall as agent bought the daughter of Archarcharch—Sweet Screamer, by Belong to Me, (Hip 672) out of Marcial Galan's consignment. The bay filly had been sold previously at the OBS Winter Mixed sale for \$12,000 to agent Anthony Goswell for Derby Daze Farm. Sweet Screamer is out of graded stakes winner Screamer, a half sister to graded stakes winner El Roblar.

Quarter Pole Enterprises purchased Hip 838, a dark bay or brown colt by Dialed In consigned by agent Beth Bayer. The colt is out of Book the Devil (Notebook), a half sister to stakes placed You Dancing Devil.

The two open sessions combined, sold 371 horses \$3,083,000, compared with 404 that generated \$5,456,400 a year ago. The open average price plunged 38.5% to \$8,310 from last year's average of \$13,506, while the median price was more than halved at \$4,500 compared with \$9,500 in 2015. The buyback percentage was 37.7%; it was 19.8% a year ago.

The select session Aug. 23 fared only slightly better. With updates from private sales, 150 selected yearling grossed \$5,802,300. The same number sold

\$210,000 to Stan Hough, who bought the colt on behalf of Sagamore Farm. The bay colt is out of Madoffwiththecash (Dixie Union), who is a full sister to graded stakes winner Nothing But Fun.

With the OBS Fall Mixed sale suspended due to the renovation of the sale pavilion, the next sale on the calendar for the company is the 2017 Winter Mixed sale, including the horses of racing age section, scheduled for Jan. 25 - 27. The 28th annual OBS Championship Stakes races will be run Jan. 24. BH

entucky freshman sire Rule was represented by his Nfirst winner Aug. 24 when Regere won a maiden claiming event for 2-year-olds at Delaware Park.

Rule, a 9-year-old homebred for WinStar Farm, is by Roman Ruler out of Rockcide (Personal Flag). A multiple graded stakes winner for trainer Todd Pletcher, his best win came in the 2012 grade II Monmouth Cup with a 1 1/2-length score over grade I winner Flat Out.

As a 3-year-old, he placed third in the Florida Derby (gr. I) and didn't run again until the following year where he placed second in the Hal's Hope Stakes (gr. III) and then finished third in the Donn Handicap (gr. I) at Gulfstream Park. He went winless until August, when he took the Birdstone Stakes at Saratoga Race Course and then a month later placed third in the grade I Woodward Stakes.

Rule's dam, Rockcide, has produced five winners from five foals to race, including grade III winner Matrooh (Distorted Humor).

Regere, trained by Ramon Aguayo, tracked front-running Two Bit Drifter early, took the lead in the stretch and pulled away to a 1 3/4-length victory.

Owned by Appledore Farm and bred in New York by Joseph Titone and Kimberly Rushia, Regere is the only foal from the Spectacular Bid mare Overtimeangie Baby. BH

NUOVO RECORD TO MAKE BREEDERS' CUP BID

uovo Record will point to the Breeders' Cup Filly N & Mare Turf (gr. IT) Nov. 4 at Santa Anita Park. Reiko Hara's 5-year-old Heart's Cry mare finished a good fourth for trainer Makoto Saito competing against a quality field in the Aug. 21 Sapporo Kinen (Jpn-II), which included 2015 Japanese Horse of the Year Maurice. She comes out of the race well and will make her third trip overseas.

The 2014 Yushun Himba Japanese Oaks (Jpn-I) winner traveled to Hong Kong in December of 2015 to run in the Hong Kong Cup (HK-I), in which she finished second to A Shin Hikari, subsequent winner of France's Prix d'Ispahan (Fr-I). Her connections recognized that Nuovo Record is suitable for overseas campaigns, as she is tough and capable of adapting to new surroundings quickly.

Nuovo Record visited Hong Kong again in April this year and finished sixth in the Queen Elizabeth II Cup (HK-I) on soft turf, which she dislikes.

Though some races in Europe and Australia were also considered as her next target, her connections selected California for her third trip, since the race is for females only and Nuovo Record should have a better chance, rather than running against the boys.

Nuovo Record will ship to California Oct. 26, with Japan's most accomplished rider Yutaka Take booked to ride her at Santa Anita. BH

INTERVIEW

DISSECTING A STRONG **MINNESOTA MARKET**

/innesota may be a relatively small commercial **IVI** market but the recent Minnesota Thoroughbred Association yearling sale Aug. 22 produced some big results. Gross sales set a record of *\$517,350 and the average essentially equaled its* record of \$10,560 set in 2014. The \$6,500 median was the highest since 2002. BloodHorse Market-Watch editor Eric Mitchell talked with MTA president Jay Dailey and MTA Sales Committee co-chair Cameron Mahlum about the issues behind the growth.

BH: Overall, how strong was this sale? Cameron Mahlum: "We had more foals and better quality. We dipped down last year from a strong year in 2014, when we started to see an uptick from the agreement with the Mdewakanton tribe, but with a smaller sale you don't always know about the numbers. Last year we only sold eight horses that were \$15,000 or more, but this year 23 sold for \$15,000 or more out of 49 through the ring. Overall the professionalism was higher; the consignors brought a more consistent, higher quality group of horses."

BH: Why do you think buyers increased what they were willing to spend?

Jay Dailey: "I've been involved with the sale for seven years now and we're always looking for ways to improve it. We've improved our sale location and we've added incentives to buy at our yearling sales.

"Right now there is a special allowance race for sale graduates, which provides an extra opportunity. When the horses sold through this sale break their maiden, we will give out a \$1,000 bonus if it is a Minn-bred. If the horse is foaled and was conceived in Minnesota then you get \$2,000, and \$1,000 goes to the stallion owner. Next year we are looking at making that a 2-year-old race and a 3-year-old race.

"You keep throwing those incentives out there, it makes it makes our horses more attractive."

BH: You mentioned the location. This year the sale was conducted at the new Expo Center next to Canterbury Park. How much do you think that affected the sale?

CM: "The decision to come back to Canterbury Park increased our attendance at the event, and the buyers who were there realized they needed to pay more for the quality."

JD: "Also, it was the Festival of Champions (Aug. 21) and the yearlings were all in so everyone could go see them. We just got everything more coordinated.

"More important, breeders have figured out they have to produce horses that can run in open company. They are producing an allaround good horse that can run in Arizona or Florida or Minnesota and beat the best."

BH: Did you see any new faces among the buyers?

CM: We did see some new buyers, but what really made this sale were the core buyers who have been with us for 10-15 years. This year they all bought. The top buyers was a Who's Who of our industry over the past decade. BH


