BC CLASSIC WINNER READY FOR NEXT STEP

Breeder's Cup Classic (gr. I) winner Arrogate came out of the race in good condition, trainer Bob Baffert said Nov. 6, the morning after the climactic end to the World Championships.

"Who'd have thought I'd have another horse like American Pharoah?" Baffert said of Arrogate, who passed favored California Chrome in the final strides to win the 1 1/4-mile Classic. "He's doing some of the same things that Pharoah did."

Baffert related a key moment in the race turning into the stretch, when jockey Mike Smith—who targeted cruising leader California Chrome from third place, directly behind Melatonin—won a cat-and-mouse game with Victor Espinoza, who rode the 2014 Horse of the Year.

Anticipating a challenge, Espinoza looked to his left, then right, and back again just as Smith took Arrogate to the outside.

"Mike said that when he went outside, he could hear Victor say 'Damn it,'" Baffert said. "Then, when Mike went to the right hand (whip), Arrogate got on his right lead and took off like a rocket."

While expressing the utmost respect for trainer Art Sherman and the California Chrome crew, Baffert and assistant Jimmy Barnes did point out that three of California Chrome's last five losses came to Baffert-trained horses. Bayern administered back-to-back defeats in the 2014 Pennsylvania Derby (gr. II) and Breeders' Cup Classic, and then Arrogate on Saturday.

"(Arrogate) wasn't even blowing when he came back. It was like 'When are we going to do this again?'" Baffert said.

Racing fans worldwide would like to know the answer to that question. Only time will tell. The colt's connections indicated in post-race interviews an inclination to run in 2017, if all goes well.

Regarding Hoppertunity, who finished fourth in the Classic behind Keen Ice, Baffert said the son of Any Given Saturday is best suited for racetracks outside of California.

"He ran a good race, but he struggles over these California tracks," the Hall of Fame trainer said. "He needs a deeper, softer track. John Velazquez said he was like a different horse from the Jockey Club Gold Cup (gr. I) at Belmont Park."

Baffert said Hoppertunity remains a candidate for the Pegasus World Cup (gr. I) and Dubai World Cup (UAE-I) next year.

Drefong, who provided Baffert with his 13th Breeders' Cup victory in the Sprint (gr. I) six races before Arrogate put the icing on the cake, looked like a winner before setting foot on the track.

"I don't usually bet on my Breeders' Cup horses, but I bet on Drefong after I saw him in the paddock," Baffert said.

A decision on what's next for Drefong, like Arrogate a 3-year-old, also will be determined in coming days.

Trainer David Hofmans said fifth-place Classic finisher Melatonin was sore but otherwise healthy a day after the race.

"He's a little stiff and muscle sore all over from running so hard after being off for so long," Hofmans said. "But nothing more than you'd expect. I thought he ran a good race to about the quarter pole and then he got really tired."

Sixth-place Classic finisher Frosted will be re-evaluated at a later date as to whether he will continue racing or be retired to stud, according to trainer Kiaran McLaughlin. **BH**

'CHROME' TO RETURN IN PEGASUS

After checking in on California Chrome early Nov. 6 at Santa Anita Park, trainer Art Sherman made his way back to his home base at Los Alamitos Race Course.

Losing the Breeders' Cup Classic (gr. I) Nov. 5 for the second time to conquering general Bob Baffert doesn't change the reality of a Sunday morning. There are still horses to work.

"We've got workers and things to do," Sherman said. "That's what this business is all about. You can't sit around and cry about it."

Although there was a tinge of disappointment in the trainer's voice, the ever-present pep Sherman displays whenever he talks about his star chestnut was still underlying.

"He's still a champion in my eyes," Sherman said of California Chrome's half-length loss to Arrogate in Saturday's Classic. "He ran a great race. They were 10 lengths in front of the rest of them. It was a dominant performance by two horses."

The 79-year-old trainer also couldn't help but look forward to getting another shot at Arrogate, possibly in the Pegasus World Cup (gr. I) Jan. 28 at Gulfstream Park.

"I'm gonna go with that we were just using this as a prep for the Pegasus," Sherman said with a hearty laugh. "We're gonna come back and fight."

As for his analysis on the race, specifically the abundant criticisms of Victor Espinoza's ride—during which the jockey sat unmoved on California Chrome, looking back multiple times while Arrogate loomed late in the final turn—Sherman didn't

hesitate to share his opinion.

"We've been getting a lot of flack that he should have went on instead of looking around," Sherman said. "He's ridden him with such confidence—maybe sometimes you get too confident. I don't think it mattered, though. I don't think it made a difference."

Sherman said California Chrome will get some rest, but will stay at Los Alamitos and train up to the Pegasus instead of getting turned out.

All that mattered for the moment, though, was the condition of the big horse.

"I feel better now that I went over the horse myself," Sherman said. "You never know how they're going to pull up."

While Sherman, along with his assistant and son Alan Sherman, attended to their duties at Los Alamitos, groom Raul Rodriguez remained at Barn 126 to watch over the 2014 Horse of the Year until his departure south at 10:30 a.m.

"He's good," Rodriguez said, watching the 5-year-old stand calmly with his head poking out of his double-wide stall.

Does he know he got beat?

"Oh yeah," Rodriguez said emphatically. **BH**

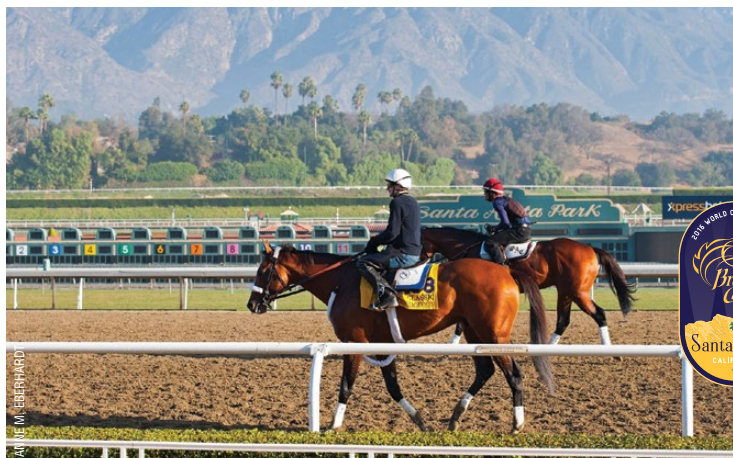

Union Rags at Lane's End

TOP FRESHMAN SIRE UNION RAGS FEE RAISED

With a solid position atop the leading freshman sire list, the stud fee for Union Rags has been raised to \$50,000 for the 2017 breeding season, according to Lane's End. William S. Farish's farm near Versailles, Ky., released the fees for its full roster Nov. 6.

Union Rags (Dixie Union) leads all freshman sires with \$1,100,211 in progeny earnings and is tied with Gemologist with two graded stakes winners each.

Other stallions with adjustments in their fees include Twirling Candy, currently the third-leading second-crop sire by progeny earnings and the second-leading sire of his class with nine black-type stakes winners. The son of Candy Ride had his fee bumped to \$20,000 from \$15,000 for 2016. Candy Ride also stands at Lane's

End, commanding the top fee of \$60,000, which is unchanged.

City Zip (Carson City) had his fee raised to \$50,000 from \$40,000. He is currently ninth on the general leading sire list with more than \$9.5 million in progeny earnings. He has six graded stakes winners so far this year, including two grade I stakes winners. He was represented at the Breeders' Cup World Championships by Breeders' Cup Filly & Mare Sprint (gr. I) winner Finest City, who was the sire's fourth Breeders' Cup winner in the last three years.

The fees on the remainder of the sires on Lane's End's roster are unchanged. The farm will be holding a stallion open house Nov. 7-11 from 11 a.m. to 2 p.m. each day. **BH**

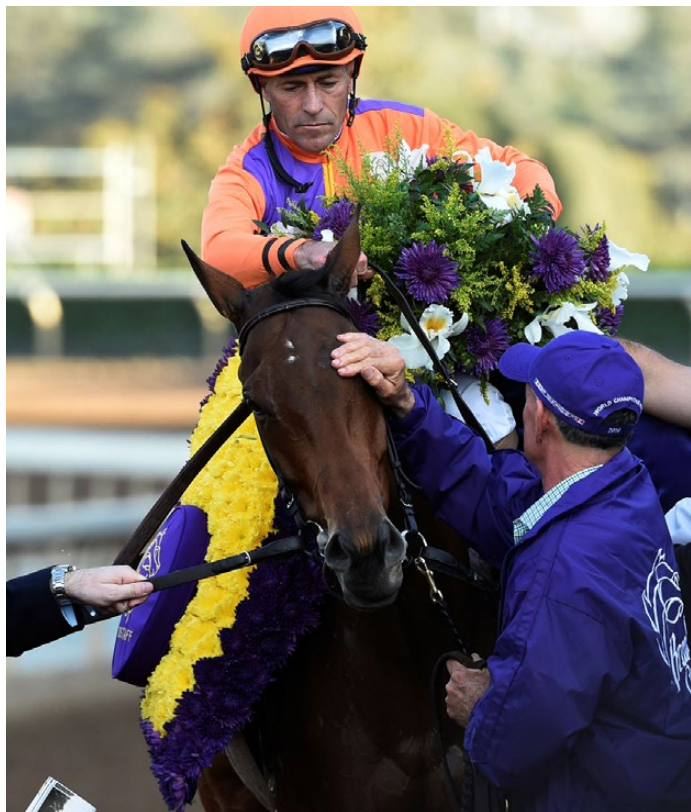

Beholder narrowly defeated Songbird to win her last race in the Distaff

BEHOLDER TO BE COVERED BY UNCLE MO IN 2017

The racing days of Beholder have finally drawn to a close, as Spendthrift Farm officially announced the 6-year-old's retirement Nov. 6, two days after her thrilling victory over Songbird in the Longines Breeders' Cup Distaff (gr. I).

Moving on to B. Wayne Hughes' Lexington farm, she has been booked to runaway leading second-crop sire Uncle Mo early next year.

"We are excited to help usher in the next chapter of Beholder's unprecedented career, and I can't think of a better way to get it started than to breed her to Uncle Mo," Spendthrift general manager Ned Toffey said. "His record-breaking production in his first two years at stud made this an easy decision. We went by the old adage of 'breed the best to the best and hope for the best.' "

Trained by Richard Mandella, Beholder went out on top in a race for the ages over the previously unbeaten Songbird at Santa Anita Park. She retires as the first horse to ever win a grade I race at ages 2, 3, 4, 5, and 6.

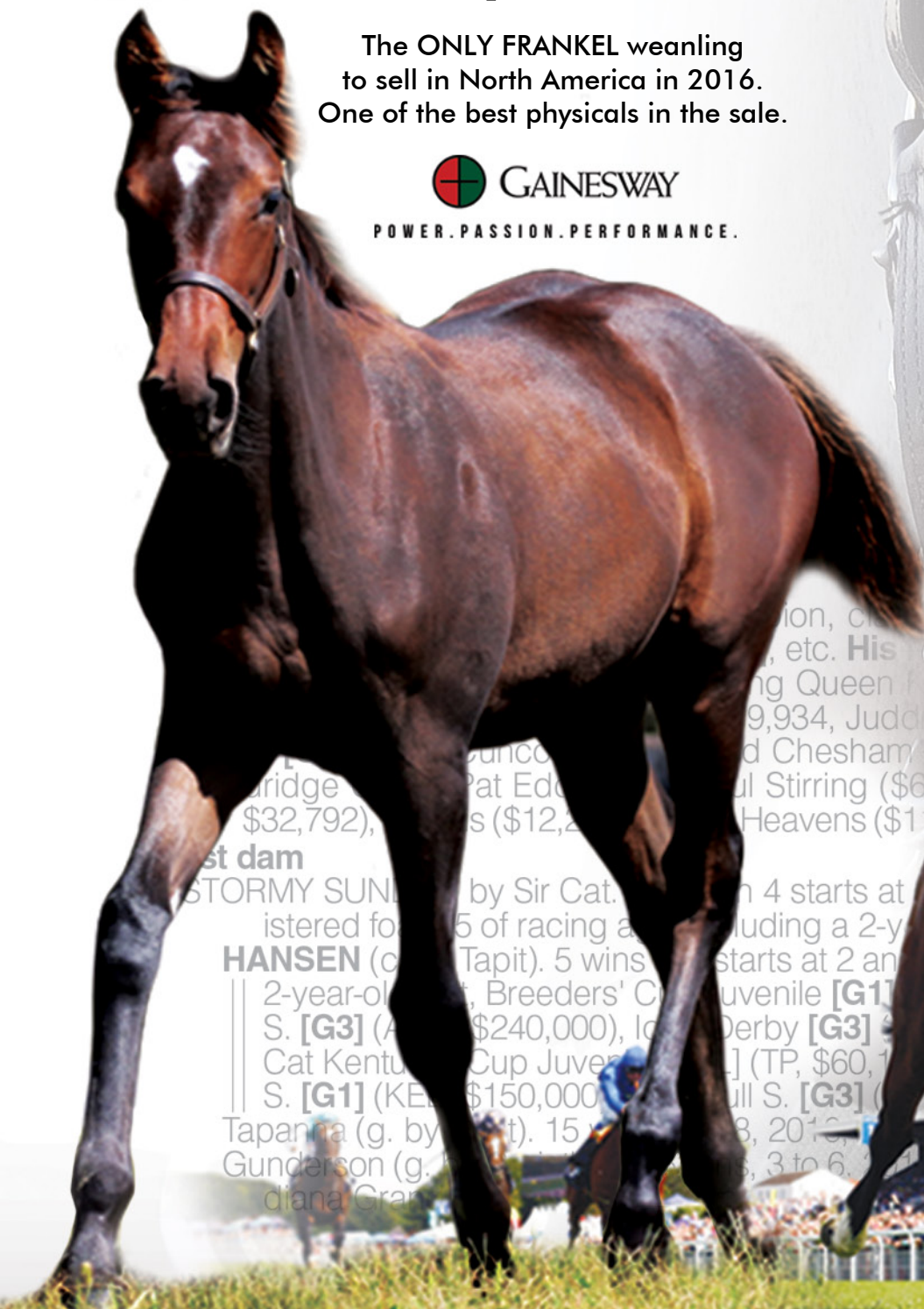

Beholder is also the only horse in history to win both the Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies (gr. I) and Distaff, and remains the first filly since Hall of Fame champion Silverbulletday to earn the Eclipse Award at both 2 and 3.

She is also among a select few females in the history of the sport to be named champion 2-year-old filly, 3-year-old filly, and older female, a title she won in 2015.

A winner of 11 grade I races and \$6,156,600, with 18 wins from 26 starts, Beholder will be bred to last year's leading freshman and general 2-year-old sire.

Standing at Ashford Stud, Uncle Mo has sired 11 graded stakes winners with more than \$15 million in progeny earnings to date. He has three grade I winners from his first crop, including last year's champion 2-year-old male and this year's Kentucky Derby Presented by Yum! Brands (gr. I) winner Nyquist. Nyquist will stand his first season in 2017 at Darley.

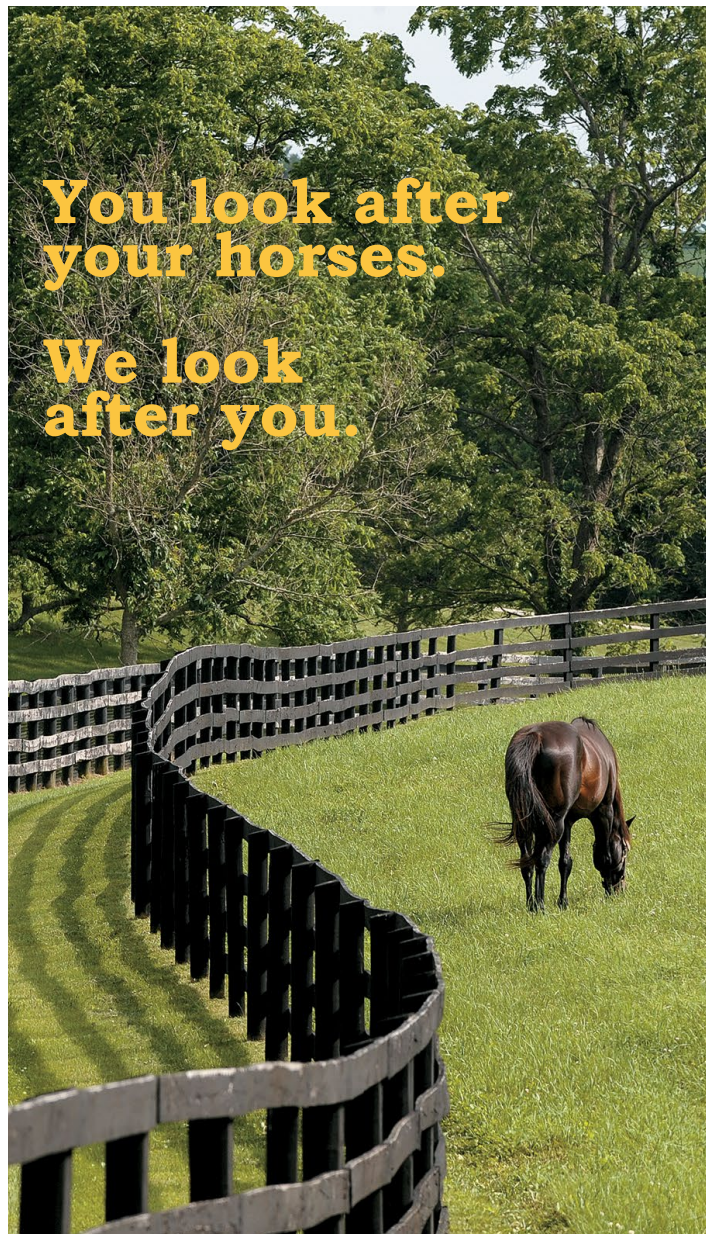
"Beholder and Uncle Mo looks like a match made in heaven," said Coolmore's M.V. Magnier. "She must be one of the greatest race mares we've ever seen, and what Uncle Mo has achieved so far is almost beyond belief. I hope Mr. Hughes will breed another champion. We bought Beholder's half brother (by Scat Daddy) at Keeneland in September, and we can only hope that he'll be half as good as her."

Bred by Clarkland Farm, Beholder is by two-time Eclipse finalist Henny Hughes, out of Leslie's Lady, by Tricky Creek. Leslie's Lady is the dam of Spendthrift stallion Into Mischief and her yearling topped the Keeneland September sale at \$3 million. **BH**

SALES UPDATE

LADY ELI, STELLAR WIND OUT OF KEENELAND SALE

After the barn areas at Fasig-Tipton and Keeneland were abuzz over the excitement on display at Santa Anita Park during the Breeders' Cup, the effects of the 13 races on the upcoming November sales unfolded Nov. 6.

Among the most prominent Breeders' Cup participants withdrawn from the Keeneland sale were two-time grade I winner Lady Eli, who finished second in the Filly & Mare Turf (gr. IT), and champion Stellar Wind, fourth in the Longines Distaff (gr. I).

Following her sixth-place effort in the 14 Hands Winery Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies (gr. I), grade I winner Union Strike was scratched from the Fasig-Tipton sale, as was Noholdingback Bear, the seventh-place finisher in the Twinspires Sprint (gr. I).

Overall, the 13 championship races left sales company officials and consignors feeling optimistic about Fasig-Tipton sale to be conducted Nov. 7 and the Nov. 8-20 auction at Keeneland.

"We saw two remarkable days of racing that certainly gives inspiration to all participants in the industry," said Fasig-Tipton president and chief executive officer Boyd Browning Jr. "It was marvelous to see the types of athletic performances across the board. It creates passion and enthusiasm for those involved in the game. The people who participated in those races have to be inspired. Those who weren't involved, we think we have the types of horses capable of putting them in that environment."

"It definitely was a world championship weekend," said Geoffrey Russell, director of sales operations at Keeneland, which was represented by eight Breeders' Cup winners, some of which also went through the ring at other sales companies. "The Distaff and Classic were spectacular races and the Juvenile was a great race. People come here to buy stock to perform on the big stage, and we are already seeing some of them here who were participating there."

Andrew Cary, partner and general manager of consignor Select Sales, said the weekend showcased horse racing at its best.

"I think it just gives people that little extra boost that this is something they want to be in over the long run, and inspires them to want to produce horses and to own horses that run like that," Cary said. "That's racing at the highest stage and it gives people the motivation to either stay there if they're at that level, or to get there if they've never been there. It's just amazing the quality of the racing and we're talking about the horses, which is the way it should be."

Kerry Cauthen of Four Star Sales agreed.

"There are a lot of things going right in our business and when you have a Breeders' Cup like that, it makes our sport look like what it is—a lot of fun," Cauthen said. **BH**

CASSE TRAINEES DOING WELL POST BC

Trainer Mark Casse's seven Breeders' Cup entrants are all well Nov. 6, including champion grass mare Tepin, a charging second in her Breeders' Cup Mile (gr. IT) defense attempt.

"She ran a winning race and I'm not overly upset about it," Casse said. "She was maybe just a little unlucky. The winner ran great, too, and we can hold our head high.

"She has a funny way of running," he continued. "She's not the easiest to maneuver and is not easy to steer because she runs with her head cocked, but I think Julien (Leparoux) did a great job given the situation. I could not have asked for a better trip. It's like with Valadorna. Even though she got hung up for a second and it maybe cost her the race, the reason she was able to run as well as she did was because Julien had given her such a good trip."

A little more exhausted was Breeders' Cup Juvenile (gr. I) victor Classic Empire, who stamped himself as the early Kentucky Derby Presented by Yum! Brands (gr. I) favorite with a victory for owner John C. Oxley.

"I think he's a little tired, but he ran his butt off," Casse said. "Given what happened with Valadorna, Julien wanted to make sure we weren't too far away (from the front). We broke running and he looked at the opportunity and saw it."

Casse confirmed that Classic Empire would be pointed to the Kentucky Derby.

Stonestreet Stables' Valadorna finished runner up in the Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies (gr. I) despite a traffic-riddled trip.

"She looked good this morning," Casse said. "Obviously the (Kentucky) Oaks (gr. I) would be our hope. I think she would probably be our leading candidate for that right now."

Catch a Glimpse exited her off-the-board effort in the Breeders' Cup Filly & Mare Turf (gr. IT) in top shape.

"Catch a Glimpse has more energy than anyone this morning," Casse said. "She's going to go home. She's had a long, hard campaign. She could run back with how good she feels, but (instead) she's going to go home (to) grow up a little bit. We're going to figure out a spring campaign for her and get her back on the winning track. I don't see her and Tepin hooking up together."

The Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies Turf (gr. IT) was the most frustrating event for the Casse team. Live Oak Plantation's Victory to Victory was scratched the morning of the race after popping a splint and John C. Oxley's La Coronel broke from post 13, was shuffled back in the first turn, and wide throughout before finishing mid-pack.

"Tough trip for her," Casse said. "You can't give a good filly like the winner (New Money Honey) 44 feet. (La Coronel) was the most frustrating because nobody got to see how great she is. It was just bad luck. She's going to go home and grow up a little bit."

Never a factor in the Juvenile Turf (gr. IT), Gary Barber's Keep Quiet exited his off-the-board finish in the race in good shape and will move forward to a sophomore campaign. **BH**

With Arrogate's scintillating victory over 2014 Horse of the Year California Chrome in the \$6 million Breeders' Cup Classic (gr. I) fresh in the minds of buyers, the dams of both horses are among the top horses to watch during Fasig-Tipton's November sale.

The Nov. 7 sale in Lexington, for which 177 horses are cataloged, begins at 5 pm. ET.

Bubbler, the 10-year-old daughter of Distorted Humor whose first foal is 3-year-old Travers Stakes (gr. I) winner Arrogate, was not shipped to the Fasig-Tipton sales grounds until Nov. 6 because the mare's status in the sale was uncertain, according to Barry Robinette, general manager of consignor Clearsky Farms.

"We were winging it. So it really wasn't definite until last night; we just brought her over this morning," Robinette said, as he showed off the mare glistening in the bright Bluegrass sunshine. "She's probably worth as much as she's ever going to be worth right now, so it's good timing. It's a good selling point.

"She's really a nice (horse)—put together well," Robinette said of the mare being sold in foal to Into Mischief. "She's a little dominant. The first one to get to the gate."

In addition to being the dam of Arrogate, Bubbler won six of her nine starts, including three stakes wins, and has a solid female family that includes champion filly Meadow Star as her second dam.

Consigned by Taylor Made Sales Agency, California Chrome's dam, the Not For Love mare Love the Chase, is in foal to leading sire Tapit. A son of Lucky Pulpit who is also his dam's first foal, California Chrome was 2014 Horse of the Year and champion 3-year-old after winning the the Kentucky Derby Presented by Yum! Brands (gr. I) and Preakness Stakes (gr. I) the same year and has won 15 of 25 races.

In the juvenile colt's first start Sep. 3 he finished 10th and last after faltering in a seven-furlong maiden special weight at Saratoga Race Course.

This time around, running a mile on a fast track, Tapwrit stalked the leaders down the backstretch, moved up to challenge runner-up Commandeering at the quarter-pole, and was able to edge away to finish by a length in hand at the wire.

The Todd Pletcher-trained colt got the trip in 1:38.24 under jockey Eddie Castro.

Tapwrit is the sixth foal out of his grade I-winning dam. Appealing Zophie won the 2006 Spinaway Stakes (gr. I) as a 2-year-old and contested the Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies (gr. I) that year to finish fourth. The next year she took the grade III Silverbulletday Stakes at Fair Grounds Race Course & Slots, but remained unplaced in higher level stakes finishing sixth in the Prioress Stakes (gr. I). **BH**

LEADING 2016 BREEDERS' CUP SIRES

Thirty-two sires were represented by the 39 winners and placers during this year's Breeders' Cup World Championships Nov. 4-5 at Santa Anita Park.

Five of these stallions had a winner and one other runner that placed. Leading the sire standings were Darley's Medaglia d'Oro and Banstead Manor Stud's Dansili, who each got a first and a second. Banstead Manor is Juddmonte's stallion operation in Great Britain.

Medaglia d'Oro's winner was New Money Honey, who won the Juvenile Fillies Turf (gr. IT) for the Edwards family's five Thoroughbreds in their first trip to the Breeders' Cup. The sire's second-place finisher was nearly a dead-heat, with Songbird missing the Longines Breeders' Cup Distaff (gr. I) by a slim nose to Beholder (Henny Hughes). Medaglia d'Oro now has two Breeders' Cup winners to his credit out of 23 progeny starts.

Dansili's winner was European invader Queen's Trust, who beat sentimental favorite Lady Eli (Divine Park) in the Breeders' Cup Filly & Mare Turf (gr. IT). The tables were turned in the Longines Breeders' Cup Turf (gr. IT) when Juddmonte's heavily favored homebred Flintshire was beaten by an aggressive ride by jockey Seamus Heffernan on Highland Reel (Galileo). Queen's Trust and Flintshire were their sire's only Breeders' Cup starters this year. To date, Dansili has tallied two Breeders' Cup winners out of 19 starts.

Three sires had a winner and a third-placed finisher: WinStar Farm's Pioneer of the Nile, Coolmore Stud's Galileo, and the late Unbridled's Song.

Pioneer of the Nile's progeny seem to know the right time to peak. The son of Empire Maker had two Breeders' Cup winners and a third-placed finisher out of three starters. John Oxley's Classic Empire delivered the win in the Sentient Jet Breeders' Cup Juvenile (gr. I) this year, while Midnight Storm came in third in the

Breeders' Cup Mile (gr. IT).

Galileo set a Breeders' Cup single-season sire record with nine starters in this year's World Championships. Highland Reel became Galileo's fourth overall Breeders' Cup winner, following suit with his other three who also all won the Turf. The sire's daughter, Found, who won the Turf last year finished third in this year's running. To date he has been represented by 35 Breeders' Cup progeny starts.

Unbridled's Song, who stood at Taylor Made Farm, is sire of Breeders' Cup Classic (gr. I) winner Arrogate, who beat California Chrome by half a length. An interesting dynamic to this race is that California Chrome will retire to stud at Taylor Made in 2017. Unbridled's Song's daughter Forever Unbridled finished third in the Distaff.

Other sires represented by a 2016 Breeders' Cup winner include: Choisir, Gio Ponti, Broken Vow, Henny Hughes, Speightstown, Kitten's Joy, City Zip, and Tiznow.

A couple feats worth noting. Drefong represented the first Breeders' Cup starter for Castleton Lyon's Gio Ponti, who finished second twice in Breeders' Cup events—behind Zenyatta in the 2009 Classic, and then behind Goldikova in the 2010 Mile. Pin Oak's stalwart Broken Vow also got his first Breeders' Cup winner among 13 progeny starts with Champagne Room. **BH**

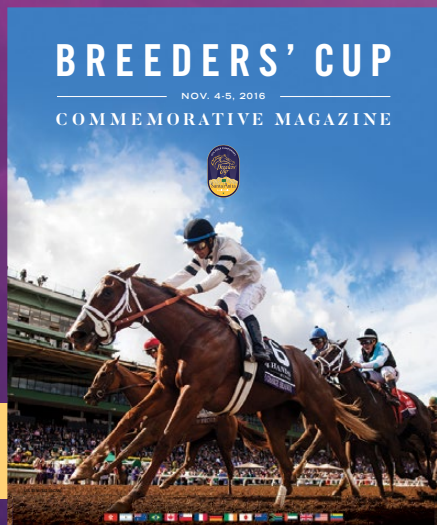
