

MOTION SENDS EAST COAST INVADER TO AMERICAN OAKS

G raham Motion, who has made a habit of swooping in to win graded grass races in Southern California, will look to add another to the list on the final day of 2016 in the \$300,000 American Oaks (gr. IT).

Team Valor International and Gary Barber's Queen Blossom is one of two East Coast invaders for Motion Dec. 31 at Santa Anita Park—Arles is also entered in the Robert J. Frankel Stakes (gr. IIIT) and the Jeremy filly is scheduled to make her first U.S. start in the 1 1/4-mile American Oaks.

Under the care of trainer P.J. Prendergast, Queen Blossom won the Lodge Park Stud E.B.F. Park Express Stakes (Ire-III) to start her 2016 campaign in March, but finished a well-beaten fifth (by 14 1/2 lengths) and sixth (42 1/2 lengths) in

two subsequent stakes starts in Ireland before moving to Motion's barn at Fair Hill Training Center.

Motion had a standout run on the Del Mar grass during the seaside racetrack's fall meet, with three graded wins.

Miss Temple City scored in the Matriarch (gr. IT) by a nose, Ring Weekend took the Seabiscuit Handicap (gr. IIT), and Journey Home won the Jimmy Durante (gr. IIIT). He just missed a fourth when Arles came up a nose short behind Nuovo Record in the Red Carpet Handicap (gr. IIIT).

Four local graded stakes winners are also in the field of 13, headed by Jungle Racing, KMN Racing, and LNJ Foxwoods' Stays in Vegas, who set the pace in the Matriarch and dug in late to finish a game third, only a head behind Miss Temple City. The daughter of City Zip has two wins in three starts on the Santa Anita grass, including her last victory in the May 7 Senorita Stakes (gr. IIIT). The Jerry Hollendorfer-trained filly's only loss on the Santa Anita turf was another close third, also by a head, to fellow American Oaks entrant Cheekaboo in the June 19 Honeymoon Stakes (gr. IIT).

Since the Honeymoon, however, Cheekaboo has yet to find the winner's circle. A deep closer, the California-bred Unusual Heat filly trained by Peter Eurton hasn't seriously threatened in four stakes starts since.

Big Chief Racing, Head of Plains Partners, and Gene Voss' Decked Out will also look to snap a winless streak following her graded score April 9 in the Providencia Stakes (gr. IIIT). The Street Boss filly trained by Keith Desormeaux hasn't been far off, however, with a head second to Harmonize in the Del Mar Oaks (gr. IT) and a fourth-place finish in the Honeymoon, where she was only a half-length behind Cheekaboo.

J K Racing Stable's Mokat is the final graded winner in the field and is coming into the American Oaks off a two-and-a-half month layoff for trainer Richard Baltas. The Uncle Mo filly lacked a late kick in her last start to finish fifth in the Queen Elizabeth II Challenge Cup Stakes Presented by Lane's End (gr. IT) at Keeneland, but was only threequarters of a length back in the Del Mar Oaks and flashed brilliance in her lone graded win, the July 23 San Clemente Handicap (gr. IIT). BH

MASOCHISTIC DENIED MIDNIGHT LUTE ENTRY

os Pollos Hermanos Racing and Jay Em Ess Stable's Masochistic was not allowed to enter the Dec. 31 Midnight Lute Stakes (gr. III) at Santa Anita Park following his positive post-race test for stanozolol after the Nov. 5 TwinSpires Breeders' Cup Sprint (gr. I).

California Horse Racing Board stewards informed trainer Ron Ellis Dec. 28 that the 6-year-old Sought After gelding was not eligible to enter. The Breeders' Cup positive put him on a stewards' list and to be removed, Masochistic must pass an examination and drug test.

"He'll have to test clean to enter, and that was how the stewards ruled," CHRB equine medical director Rick Arthur said.

Ellis, however, said Arthur told him last week Masochistic could run, as long as he tested clean by race day. Ellis had Masochistic tested Dec. 26, but results will not be available until Dec. 29 or Dec. 30.

"Rick Arthur told me, as long as he tested clean by race day, we'd be OK," Ellis said. "It's frustrating. You think you do everything within the rules and something doesn't work out, and everyone thinks you're a bad guy."

Arthur said Wednesday that he didn't tell Ellis Masochistic could run under those circumstances.

Masochistic is expected to be disqualified and his Sprint runner-up purse share redistributed during a Dec. 30 hearing with CHRB stewards. Ellis is unsure when the gelding will run again. BH **T** Share this story



BUCKLAND, CONQUEST ENFORCER QUICK STUDIES

Conquest Enforcer must be a quick study. The 3-year-old Into Mischief colt went through the Keeneland November breeding stock sale as part of the Conquest Stables dispersal, shipped to California for new trainer Phil D'Amato, then won the Dec. 26 Mathis Brothers Mile Stakes (gr. IIT) at Santa Anita Park.

At \$785,000, he was one of four horses from the dispersal purchased by Ron Paolucci through agent Zach Madden of Buckland Sales Agency. Paolucci, who races under Loooch Racing Stables, is perhaps best known for his Ria Antonia, winner of the 2013 Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies (gr. I).

The three other purchases—for Paolucci and friends—were not as pricey. For \$105,000, Madden got Conquest Bandit, a Scat Daddy colt who ran fifth at 6-5 in a Dec. 23 maiden special weight at Tampa Bay Downs. Madden also paid \$65,000 for a Pure Prize filly and \$15,000 for a son of Unbridled's Song.

Madden, 30, met Paolucci when he worked for Three Chimneys Farm and Ria Antonia was part of the farm's consignment at the 2014 Fasig-Tipton Kentucky November sale. The Rockport Harbor filly sold for \$1.8 million.

Madden formed his sale's agency in 2015 with Ro Parra, owner of Millennium Farms. The venture pays probably 10 horses, but 10 becomes six and you get outbid on two, so then you are focused on a few.

"We were locked and loaded for Conquest Enforcer," he said.

Conquest Enforcer, bred by Ivan Dalos' Tall Oaks Farm in Ontario, won Woodbine's Charlie Barley Stakes in July, Belmont Park's Allied Forces Stakes in September, and was grade II-placed while trained by Mark Casse.

"We had to fight off some stiff competition," Madden said. "We had ball-parked him at the \$750,000 range and had bid \$740,000, but someone bid \$750,000. I had Ron on the phone and started to walk out of the back walking ring and he told me to turn back around. The bidding went to \$775,000. I was looking at the bid spotter; I asked Ron if he wanted to go to \$785,000 and he said 'do it.' That was it."

Shipped to trainer Phil D'Amato, Conquest Enforcer had four works under his belt by the time the Mathis Brothers rolled around.

"Phil is such a talented guy," Madden said. "Mark (Casse) is easily one of the best trainers in the world and it is a daunting task to take something out of his barn and try to move it up—as if there is a way to do that. Mark selected and trained the horse. In California he got with Phil's program so quick. Phil was texting Ron, 'This horse has LeBron James-type talent.' We thought about the (seven-furlong) Malibu (Stakes, gr. I) for a bit, but the Mathis Brothers was more in his wheelhouse." BH

homage to the late Thomas Mellon Evans' Buckland Farm, the site of Millennium. The agency had a quick start as well, selling 74 of 102 offerings in 2016 for more than \$1.3 million.

After buying five yearlings for Paolucci at the Fasig-Tipton Kentucky October sale, Madden (who also sold 19 of 25 yearlings in the Buckland consignment) huddled up with his client at the Breeders' Cup in Southern California before the November sale.

"I didn't know what he wanted to buy, but (the Conquest dispersal) was a unique opportunity to buy in that kind of environment and get something ready-made," Madden said. "We vetted

PEGASUS ORGANIZERS LOOK TO THE FUTURE

As the richest race in the world nears its debut, organizers of the inaugural \$12 million Pegasus World Cup (gr. I) are already identifying future innovations.

Along with potentially holding the race—set for Jan. 28 at Gulfstream Park—at Santa Anita Park in California in 2018, members of The Stronach Group have also considered adding a turf race that would be run under similar conditions as the Pegasus.

"There's definitely talk of having a turf race as well. That's going to add another dimension," said Mike Rogers, president of racing for The Stronach Group. "The details still need to be worked out, but I spoke with (The Stronach Group founder) Frank (Stronach) about it a little bit and I think if we put on a turf race, we can get even more international participation."

Organized with a unique shareholder system, the 12 spots in the starting gate for the Pegasus were sold for \$1 million each to investors, who then could run a horse or sell their spot to owners with potential contenders. Such a transaction recently occurred between Coolmore and Juddmonte Farms, with the latter purchasing Coolmore's place in order to run Breeders' Cup Classic (gr. I) winner Arrogate in the 11/8-mile test for a rematch with California Chrome. The potential turf race would be organized under similar shareholder conditions, Rogers said.

As far as international contenders for the upcoming Pegasus dirt race are concerned, owner James McIngvale purchased Argentinian group I winner Eragon, a son of Offlee Wild, to compete in the Pegasus. Rogers said the connections of Hong Kong's Gun Pit and Chilean group I winner Big Daddy are interested in the race, although they are not currently confirmed.

When Frank Stronach originally introduced the concept of the Pegasus World Cup on Jan. 26, 2016 at the Thoroughbred Owner Conference at Gulfstream, he mentioned the potential of the race transitioning venues between Santa Anita and Gulfstream.

"We're definitely looking forward to having the inaugural event this year at Gulfstream," Rogers said. "Once this race is through, we'll sit down with all the stakeholders and discuss additional options. Gulfstream is a beautiful facility but it's definitely a lot smaller than Santa Anita and it doesn't have the same number of premium dining seating options that hosting an event of this caliber clearly requires. We have a high demand for those kinds of tickets, and that's where we find the challenge at Gulfstream, and we know Santa Anita is more than capable of pulling off major events."

The namesake of the Pegasus is *Pegasus and Dragon*, a mammoth statue of the mythical horse commissioned by The Stronach Group. Installed in 2014, the piece is surpassed in size in the U.S. only by the Statue of Liberty.

"This Pegasus statue is so powerful. The thought of moving the race away from the statue was a major story," Rogers said. "Clearly, the brand will travel. We can't move the statue, but we can definitely move the brand." **BH**

NY VET SIERRA SUSPENDED, FINED

A New York-based veterinarian has been suspended by regulators for falsely submitting health certificates for three horses seeking to enter the grounds at Aqueduct Racetrack.

Stewards with the New York State Gaming Commission handed Dr. Camilo Sierra a 30-day suspension and \$1,500 fine Dec. 26 for an Oct. 31 incident. Sierra agreed to the fine, according to agency records, waived his right to a hearing and, in return, had the one-month suspension reduced to 20 days.

The NYSGC said Sierra was suspended and fined for submitting health certificates to New York Racing Association security staff for three horses that he had not examined: New York Bourbon, Sky Ace, and Too Much Malibu. An NYSGC database lists other fines levied against Sierra over the years, but the site does not include details of those incidents.

New York Bourbon and Too Much Malibu are unraced juveniles and Sky Ace is a 3-year-old maiden

owned by Alex Kazdan and trained by Dominic Giglio Jr. Sierra began serving the suspension Dec. 27 that will last until Jan. 15, during which time the Long Islandbased veterinarian will not be permitted to "directly or

indirectly" be involved in any aspect of care of a horse on a racetrack.

Sierra was first given a license to practice veterinary medicine in New York in 1992, state records show. BH

FIVE SQUARE OFF IN MIDNIGHT LUTE

With top California sprinter Masochistic denied entry in the wake of his post-race positive after the TwinSpires Breeders' Cup Sprint (gr. I), five will head postward in the \$100,000 Midnight Lute Stakes (gr. III) for a chance at an initial graded score.

Reddam Racing's Jimmy Bouncer looks to make the most of the opportunity, coming off back-to-back victories—a Nov. 18 allowance/optional claiming race sprinting five furlongs on the Del Mar lawn, and the Harris Farms Stakes at Fresno, going six furlongs on dirt.

The versatile 5-year-old Square Eddie gelding has won all three of his previous starts on dirt, in addition to two on turf after breaking his maiden for trainer Doug O'Neill on the old synthetic at Del Mar. He shows good early speed and is assigned high weight of 122 pounds with Cecil and Gary Barber and Stanford Stable's Solid Wager.

That rival comes off a game victory in the Nov. 20 Cary Grant Stakes at Del Mar sprinting seven furlongs against fellow California-breds, his first victory in six starts since winning the 2015 edition.

Along with Solid Wager, trainer Peter Miller will send out Altamira Racing Stable and David A. Bernsen's Dec. 4 allowance winner St. Joe Bay, who romped by 6 1/2 lengths at the Midnight Lute 6 1/2-furlong distance. Allowance winners Navy Hymn and Tough Sunday complete the field. **BH**

OSCAR NOMINATED TO END YEAR IN TROPICAL PARK DERBY

en and Sarah Ramsey's Oscar Nominated is set to finish off a productive 2016 campaign Dec. 31 at Gulfstream Park with a start in the \$75,000 Tropical Park Derby, a 1 1/16-mile turf event for 3-year-olds.

The Michael Maker-trained ridgling amassed nearly \$600,000 during a sophomore campaign that included three stakes triumphs, as well as a start in the Kentucky Derby Presented by Yum! Brands (gr. I).

"He's training well, as always," Maker said. "He shows up every time and I don't expect anything different Saturday."

The homebred son of Kitten's Joy captured the Black Gold Stakes over the Fair Grounds Race Course & Slots turf course in February before earning a berth in the Kentucky Derby with a victory in the Spiral Stakes (gr. III) over Turfway Park's synthetic surface in March.

Never a factor in the Run for the Roses, Oscar Nominated was returned to turf for the rest of his 3-yearold season.

After experiencing a rough trip in a tight second-place finish in the American Derby (gr. IIIT) and forced to check before finishing fifth in the Secretariat Stakes (gr. IT) at Arlington International Racecourse, Oscar Nominated romped to a 6 1/4-length victory in the Dueling Grounds Derby at Kentucky Downs in September.

He ran into trouble again in the Twilight Derby (gr. IIT) at Santa Anita Park, where he was stuck in traffic and finished fourth, less than a length behind the winner and two heads away from being runner-up.

"I think it cost him the race—100%," Maker said.

Oscar Nominated is scheduled to be joined in the starting gate by stablemate Two Step Time. The Get Away Farm runner finished a close fourth behind Oscar Nominated in the Spiral and comes off a photo-finish loss in the Showing Up Stakes at Gulfstream Park West.

Stuart Janney III and Phipps Stable's Inspector Lynley earned his lone graded stakes win in the Saranac (gr. IIIT) at Saratoga Race Course. The Shug McGaughey-trained colt ran back to finish fifth behind Saranac runner-up Camelot Kitten following a wide trip in the Oct. 8 Hill Prince Stakes (gr. IIIT) at Belmont Park.

"I don't think he ran that bad. He didn't get beat that far. Things just didn't go his way. The turf may have had

more give than he wanted," McGaughey said. "He's been freshened up now, so we'll see what happens Saturday. I think his future is in front of him."

Stronach Stables' Berliner is also scheduled for a rebound after finishing seventh in the Hill Prince, a quarter-length behind Inspector Lynley. The son of Bernardini won three in a row at Woodbine prior to that start and after being transferred to trainer Nick Gonzalez.

Robert Baker and William Mack's Giant Run will seek to rebound from a troubled off-the-board finish over a soft Belmont turf course in the English Channel Stakes. The Tom Albertrani-trained son of Giant's Causeway has a 2016 record of 4-2-1 out of nine starts.

J R's Holiday, who won the Kitten's Joy Stakes last season at Gulfstream, is set to make a return from a sixmonth layoff in the Tropical Park Derby. Trained by Jose Garoffalo-trained for J R's Racing, the son of Harlan's Holiday finished second in the Transylvania Stakes (gr. IIIT) at Keeneland in the spring.

Scheduled as the last race of the day at Gulfstream, the Tropical Park Oaks will feature Allen Stable and Peter M. Brant's French import Azaelia, who seeks to build on her first U.S. victory when she takes on 13 other 3-yearold fillies going 1 1/16 miles on turf.

Maker-trained Try Your Luck also has a strong stakes resume, which includes a 7 1/2-length triumph in the \$200,000 Dueling Grounds Oaks at Kentucky Downs in her last start. **BH**

PRECIADO: NO PLAN TO APPEAL LICENSE REVOCATION

A n attorney for Ramon Preciado said Dec. 28 that the trainer does not plan to appeal three recent decisions in Pennsylvania to revoke his license.

"As it stands now, with the many different revocations he has, I believe he's going to give up," said Preciado's attorney Alan Pincus. "He would have to attain stays on many different fronts, appeal on many different fronts, and still face the ejection at Parx Racing."

Pincus said Preciado, who also owns horses, will have to take some time off, show he has rehabilitated, and then re-apply at some point down the road if he wishes to return to racing.

The Pennsylvania Horse Racing Commission ruled Dec. 12 that Preciado's license should be revoked effective Dec. 22 following his horse, Denzel, testing positive for clenbuterol after finishing second in the fifth race July 3 at Parx Racing.

In revoking Preciado's license, the PHRC noted

the finding in Denzel as well as his record of multiple medication violations. Preciado has had at least a dozen clenbuterol positives in Pennsylvania from late 2015 through 2016.

On Dec. 21 the PHRC again revoked Preciado's license, effective Dec. 22, after determining Que Facil, who won the sixth race Aug. 25 at Penn National Race Course, also tested positive for clenbuterol.

Also Dec. 21, the PHRC ordered Preciado's license revoked, effective Dec. 22, on the appeal of two cases tied to eight clenbuterol positives: two in late 2015 and six in March and April of 2016. In his appeal, Preciado blamed those positives on former employee Marian Vega. In August, Vega was arrested on race-fixing charges tied to administration of clenbuterol in horses in Preciado's stable.

Pincus said the PHRC ultimately ruled in that appeal that Preciado had failed to secure his horses and still was ultimately responsible for the positives. Since those eight positives, Preciado has had at least four more clenbuterol positives in Pennsylvania.

In April, Parx had ruled off Preciado for three years, but he continued to race there under a temporary restraining order. From five starters as a trainer Dec. 20 at Parx, Preciado had a win and a second. But with the license revocation in place, he has not started a horse since.

For its use to clear up congestion, clenbuterol is considered a controlled therapeutic medication. Because of its potential anabolic side effects, the medication carries a 14-day withdrawal time and a positive post-race test calls for a Class B penalty, second-highest on the Association of Racing Commissioners International uniform classification guidelines for foreign substances and recommended penalties.

This year as a trainer, Preciado has won 79 of 417 starts and his horses have earned purses of \$3.1 million. In both 2014 and 2015 he finished as leading trainer at Parx by wins. Each year since 2006, horses trained by Preciado have exceeded \$1.5 million in purse earnings.

Some of his top horses have included grade III winners Lucy N Ethel, Trouble Kid, Amelia's Wild Ride, and Cherokee Country. **BH**

BLACK CAVIAR'S FIRST FOAL SET TO DEBUT

The first foal of iconic Australian racemare Black Caviar is expected to make a highly anticipated debut at Flemington Jan. 1.

Black Caviar retired in 2013 with a perfect record of 25 wins from 25 starts, stamping herself as the best turf sprinter in the world. Prize money of \$7.9 million and 15 group I victories decorate her resume, including a career-defining triumph at Royal Ascot in the 2012 Diamond Jubilee Stakes (Eng-I).

The great champion has made a smooth transition to life as a broodmare, producing three foals in quick succession for her original ownership group that bought her as a yearling in 2008 for Aus\$210,000.

The first of them, a 2-year-old filly called Oscietra (Exceed and Excel), is now ready to show her wares on race day, following two recent jump-out wins at Flemington over 800 meters (about four furlongs) that have pleased her co-trainers, David Hayes, Ben Hayes, and Tom Dabernig.

Oscietra is entered for a 1,000-meter (about five-furlong), 2-year-old fillies race on New Year's Day, with Black Caviar's regular jockey Luke Nolen booked to ride.

"I couldn't be happier with her," David Hayes said in a Lindsay Park stable update after her most recent trial Dec. 24. "She made good improvement from her first trial to her second and has put her hand up to run on New Year's Day." **BH**

THE JEROME RETURN OF FUSAICHI PEGASUS

N o sooner does Baby New Year 2017 make his diaper-clad appearance than racing begins looking to the upcoming 3-year-old classics. The first step toward the Triple Crown, the mile-and-70-yard Jerome Stakes (gr. III), takes place Jan. 2 at Aqueduct Racetrack.

For 3-year-olds, the Jerome has historically been run at different times throughout the calendar year, but since the 2013 edition, won by Vyjack, it has been the first calendar stakes for sophomores hoping to wear the roses the first Saturday in May.

One of the oldest stakes races still carded, the Jerome made its first appearance at Jerome Park in the Bronx in 1866, two years after Saratoga Race Course carded the first Travers Stakes. Both track and stakes were named after Leonard Jerome, a wealthy financier and devotee of Thoroughbred racing. His daughter Jennie Jerome married Lord Randolph Churchill and became the mother of England's lauded prime minister, Winston Churchill, also a noted Thoroughbred owner.

Robert A. Alexander's Watson won the inaugural running. The first Kentucky Derby winner to win the Jerome was the first winner of the Kentucky Derby. In 1875 H.P. McGrath's little chestnut Aristides, a son of Leamington, won the Derby as well as the Jerome.

Other Jerome/Derby doubles in the 146 runnings since 1866 have been few and far between. More than a half-century passed before Carry Back accomplished the feat in 1961, followed soon after by Chateaugay in 1963.

The last horse to win the Derby and the Jerome was Fusaichi Pegasus.

Bred by Arthur Hancock III's Stone Farm, in partnership with Stonerside in Kentucky, the handsome son of Mr. Prospector turned many a head at the 1998 Keeneland July sale, where he was purchased for \$4 million by Fusao Sekiguchi of Japan.

Turned over to trainer Neil Drysdale in California, Fusaichi Pegasus raced only once at 2, when he finished 2nd in his November debut at Hollywood Park. At 3 the muscular bay ran off five consecutive wins,

culminating with the Kentucky Derby. A surprising upset in the Preakness Stakes (gr. I) by Red Bullet led to four months between races for the temperamental bay, but the 132nd running of the Jerome Handicap on Sept. 23, 2000, marked the return of Fusaichi Pegasus to the racing fray.

Ridden by regular jockey Kent Desormeaux, the colt faced five other seasoned sophomores in the onemile race at Belmont Park. Racing for the first time in four months, "Fu Peg" returned to his earlier form and posted a three-quarter-length victory over El Corredor, with Albert the Great in third. The final time, in what was to be his penultimate start, was 1:34.04.

Fusaichi Pegasus' final race was the 2000 Breeders' Cup Classic (gr. I), in which he finished sixth behind Tiznow, who just nipped Giant's Causeway in a race for the ages.

Bought by Coolmore for a reported \$60 million, Fusaichi Pegasus retired to Ashford Stud in Kentucky with six wins and two seconds from nine starts and \$1,994,900 in earnings. Shuttled originally between the Northern and Southern hemispheres, he has sired 84 stakes winners and progeny who have earned more than \$103 million. BH
