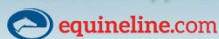

## HENCE SPRINGS UPSET IN SUNLAND DERBY

The volatile nature of the 2017 Triple Crown trail found its way to New Mexico March 26 in the \$800,000 Sunland Derby (G3).

Yet again an upset was sprung at Sunland Park, with 50 Road to the Kentucky Derby points going to Calumet Farm's homebred 10-1 longshot Hence, as he hit the wire 3 3/4 lengths ahead of previously unbeaten Conquest Mo Money.

The son of Street Boss trained by Steve Asmussen found himself 10th—11 1/4 lengths back—under jockey Alfredo Juarez Jr. as Hedge Fund ran the first quarter in :22.26, moved up in the backstretch and wide in the turn, hooked Conquest Mo Money in the stretch, and pulled away late.

Hedge Fund ran a half-mile in :45.72 and six furlongs in 1:10.22, and held third by a head over Irap, but was 4 1/2 lengths behind Conquest Mo Money. The winner took over to run a mile in 1:35.71 and finished off the 1 1/8-mile test in 1:48.10.

Beyond Irap came Total Tap, Dilettante, Balandeen, Oxford Lane, Shareholder Value, and Wine N Divine to complete the order of finish.

Favored Bronze Age stumbled at the start and tracked the early leader in second but was eased late in the backstretch.

Sent off at 10-1, Hence returned \$23.60, \$12.60, and \$7.40 across the board. Conquest Mo Money paid \$4.80 and \$4, while Hedge Fund was worth \$4.60.

Seventh in the Southwest Stakes (G3) in his start prior, Hence broke his maiden in his fourth start Jan. 16 at Oaklawn Park by three-quarters of a length going 1 1/16 miles on a sloppy main track. He now has a 2-1-1 record from six starts with earnings of \$542,601.

The colt was bred in Kentucky, out of the A.P. Indy mare Floating

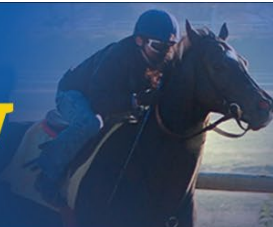
Island. He now sits in fifth on the Road to the Kentucky Derby leaderboard with 50 points, tied in number of points with grade 2 winners Malagacy and Girvin, and grade 3 winner Fast and Accurate.

Hence is the third colt owned by Calumet with points toward a start in the May 6 Kentucky Derby Presented by Yum! Brands (G1). Rebel Stakes (G2) runner-up Sonneteer sits in 18th and multiple graded stakes placed Wild Shot is 21st on the leaderboard.

The victory was Asmussen's second in the Sunland Derby, following Daddy Nose Best in 2012. **BH**

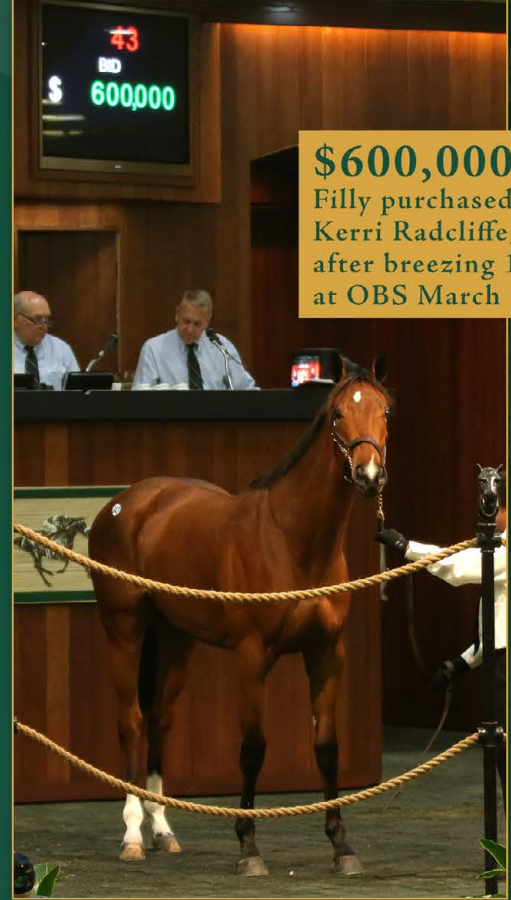

### JUVENILE SALES SCENE MOVES WEST TO BARRETT'S

After several juvenile sales this year in Florida, buyers on the West Coast will get the chance to shop closer to home when Barretts conducts its select 2-year-old sale March 29 at Del Mar, the second year at that location.

A son of The Factor purchased by Narvick International topped the 2016 edition, which saw 43 horses change hands for gross receipts of \$5,356,000, an average price of \$124,558, and a \$100,000 median. The 21 that did not sell represented 33.8% of the 62 through the ring.

Becky Thomas and Willy North are among Florida consignors sending horses to California for the Barretts sale. Both have done so for years, though North is now selling under his own Starting Point Thoroughbreds banner.

Through agent Eddie Woods (who also has a consignment at this year's sale), North sold Danon Legend and Best Macho, now stakes winners in Japan, at previous March sales.

"We've been trying to pick the right horses for the right sales," said North. "You want to target the buyers and what they are looking for in California."

Thomas noted that in California, the Barretts sale attracts a large group of end-user owners. "People who are actually owners just walk in

off the street," she said, citing the late Bob Lewis and Jess Jackson as prominent owners who made some of their earliest purchases at Barretts.

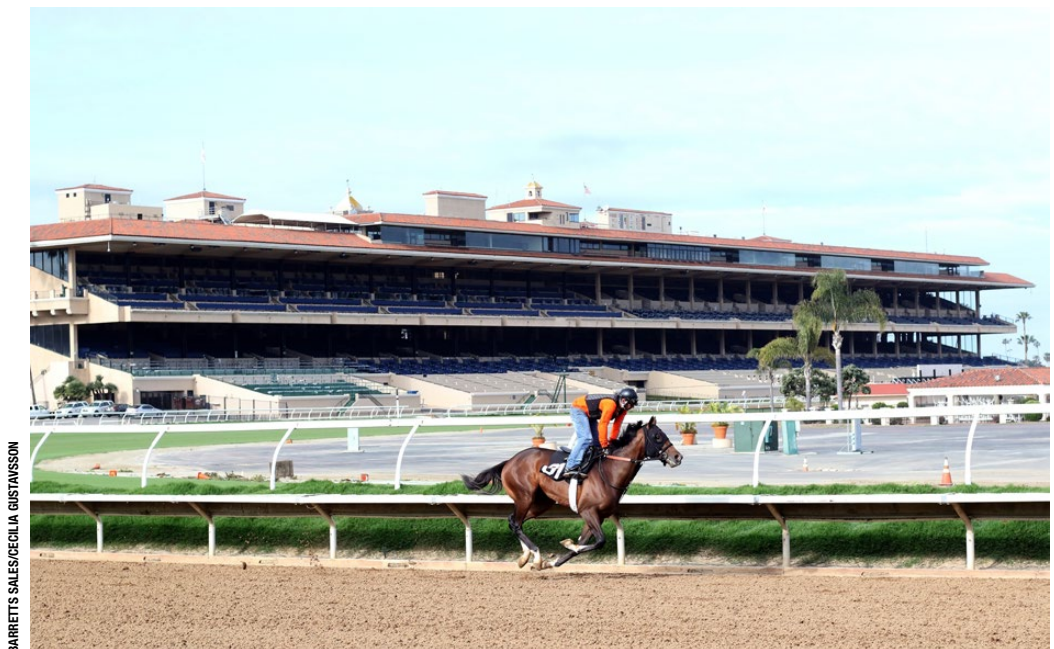
"I'm going to support a West Coast operation," Thomas said. "I think you're going to see some really good sales and some really good horses that come out of it."

Kim Lloyd, general manager of Barretts, is optimistic about the sale because of the quality group of horses assembled.

"I've watched them train all winter," Lloyd said. "Then to see them out here as they are getting ready to preview, it's just amazing how much they've grown up, how well they're doing, and how ready they are."

The Barretts catalog is smaller than the 2-year-old sales in Florida, with 134 cataloged in the original book and two supplemental additions. The sire power is strong, as evidenced by Thomas' group of horses by Midshipman, Archarcharch, and Orb and North's juveniles sired by Scat Daddy and Malibu Moon.

Thomas' Archarcharch filly is out of the D'wildcat mare Wild Forest Cat and is a full sister to Toews On Ice. A \$340,000 buy-back at the 2015 March sale from the Brocklebank Training and Sales consignment, Toews On Ice won three stakes at three different California tracks in 2015, including the Bob Hope Stakes (G3), and last year's William Walker Stakes at Churchill Downs. He also owns the track record for six furlongs at Los Alamitos Race Course (1:07.79).

North's Malibu Moon colt is out of a mare who performed well in California. Indian Breeze, a daughter of Indian Charlie, captured the 2005 Landaluce Stakes at Hollywood Park and finished third in the 2007 Green Flash Handicap at Del Mar.

Ciaran Dunne, another Florida consignor who regularly patronizes Barretts, supplemented

a son of Tapit to the March sale. Now named Fiftyshadesoftapit, the son of the After Market mare Lady of Fifty was a \$625,000 buy-back at last year's Fasig-Tipton Saratoga yearling sale. Lady of Fifty spent her entire racing career in California, winning the 2013 Clement L. Hirsch Stakes (G1) and five other stakes.

In addition to the Floridians, California consignors include Excel Bloodstock, a partnership of Bruno DeBerdt, Angelo Ferro, and Larry Connor; Andy Havens' Havens Bloodstock Agency; and Adrian Gonzalez's Checkmate Thoroughbreds.

Barretts' graduates go back several generations. Havens sold Queenie Belle at the 1999 Barretts March sale, and she is now the second dam of 3-year-old filly sensation Unique Bella. Unique Bella's dam, 2010 Breeders' Cup Ladies' Classic (G1) winner Unrivaled Belle, is not only out of Queenie Belle, her sire Unbridled's Song, was a \$1.4 million graduate of the 1995 Barretts March sale.

Consignors are also coming from Arizona, Utah, and Pennsylvania. Lloyd said he was particularly pleased with more representation from the western

part of the U.S., along with the strong group from Florida.

"We've had a year here at Del Mar," Lloyd said. "People are getting used to the Del Mar scene for the 2-year-olds in training sales. Our stabling is excellent, right across from the facility we're selling in. The track is wonderful. We're looking forward to a nice sale." **BH**

# UNDEFEATED GHALIA TAKES SUNLAND PARK OAKS

Sumaya U.S. Stable's Ghalia remains undefeated in three starts after a late drive in the stretch resulted in a neck in front to win the \$200,000 Sunland Park Oaks March 26.

In her first try around two turns, the Medaglia d'Oro filly, under jockey Jose Ortiz, raced just off the frontrunners who stayed close together while setting a quick pace in the 1 1/16-mile test over a fast track at Sunland Park.

Out of the gate, co-favorite Noted and Quoted and Soft Cheese battled for the early lead. For the first half-mile Soft Cheese maintained a half-length advantage and set fractions of :22.41 and :45.75. Grade 1 winner Noted and Quoted dropped back a half-mile and was eased by jockey Martin Garcia.

Co-favorite at 9-5, Kell Paso and jockey Ry Eikleberry moved up to assume control and Ghalia, who was four lengths back in fourth, began to advance as six furlongs went in 1:10.64. Into the stretch, Ghalia went wide and in her last strides, prevailed over Kell Paso at the wire for a final time of 1:44.24.

What What What was 5 3/4 lengths back in third, another 2 1/4 lengths ahead of Conquest Slayer in fourth. Soft Cheese and McKenzie Honey rounded out the field.

Sent off as the 2-1 second choice, Ghalia returned \$6, \$3, and

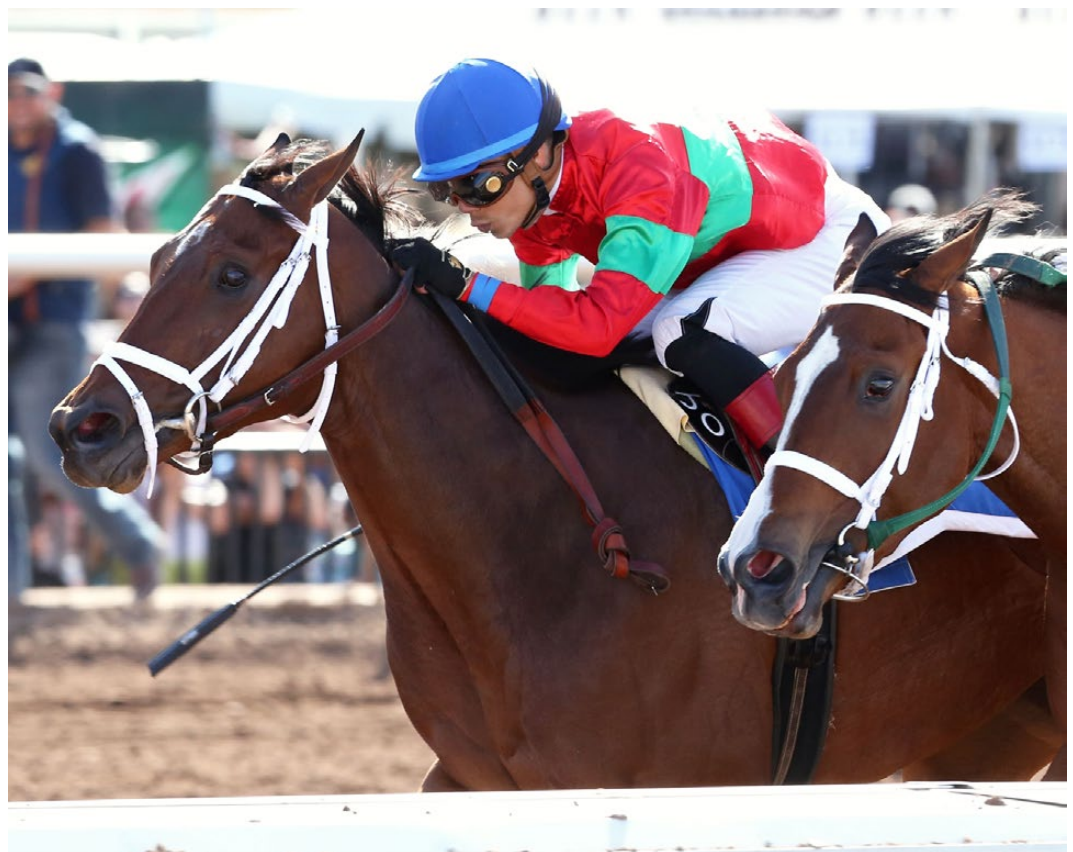
\$2.40 across the board. Kell Paso paid \$3 and \$2.40, while What What What was worth \$3.80.

With her win, Ghalia earned 50 points toward a start in the Longines Kentucky Oaks (G1) May 5. Points were awarded 50-20-10-5.

The Todd Pletcher-trainee entered off two wins earlier this year at Gulfstream Park. Most recently, she took a Feb. 15 6 1/2-furlong optional-claiming allowance race by 1 1/2 lengths. Her first time out in a six-furlong maiden special weight Jan. 22 she scored by 6 3/4.

Bred by Darley, Edward Seltzer, and Beverly Anderson, Ghalia is out of graded stakes winner Verdana Bold. The filly was purchased by Oussama Aboughazale's International Equities Holding for \$600,000 as a weanling out of the Warrendale Sales consignment to the 2014 Keeneland November sale. She now has \$166,800 in earnings. **BH**

# GIRVIN HEADS LOUISIANA DERBY FIELD

In a Triple Crown prep season that has been full of chaos, Brad Grady's Girvin will hope to supply a bit of stability April 1 in the \$1 million Louisiana Derby (G2) at Fair Grounds Race Course & Slots.

The Tale of Ekati colt has played his part in the chaos. Last time out the Joe Sharp trainee upset the Risen Star Stakes (G2) at odds of 8-1, but will have to play the favorite in Fair Grounds' final prep for the Kentucky Derby Presented by Yum! Brands (G1).

Girvin tipped his hand a bit in his previous start—albeit on grass—with a second-place run in the Keith Gee Memorial Overnight Stakes at Fair Grounds Feb. 4 after breaking his maiden sprinting on the New Orleans main track by a head in December.

The only other graded winner from the eight remaining 3-year-olds in the field is W. S. Farish and Lorea Jean Kilroy's Guest Suite, who won the Jan. 21 LeComte Stakes (G3) at Fair Grounds but never seriously threatened with a fourth-place Risen Star run. Also returning from the Risen Star is the Five Racing Thoroughbreds' Local Hero, who opened up a six-length lead last time out and held to finish fourth.

Beyond those three is a group that doesn't exude class, but could bring upside.

The most visually impressive last-out winner is Monaco, a \$1.3 million Uncle Mo colt who crushed

a Tampa Bay Downs maiden special weight field by 12 lengths Feb. 12 for trainer Todd Pletcher. Pletcher also has another last-out maiden winner entered in Patch, a Union Rags colt who broke his maiden in his second start by 1 3/4 lengths going a mile at Gulfstream Park.

Senior Investment has made a habit of finding the wire first since his maiden win in December at Fair Grounds. The Discreetly Mine colt trained by Ken McPeck came back to finish first in a Fair Grounds allowance, but was disqualified to seventh, then won an Oaklawn Park allowance in his next start Feb. 18 by three lengths.

Rounding out the field is Fair Grounds maiden winner Hollywood Handsome, West Coast shipper and former claimer Sorry Erik, and Sharp's second entry, Fair Grounds allowance winner Hotfoot. **BH**

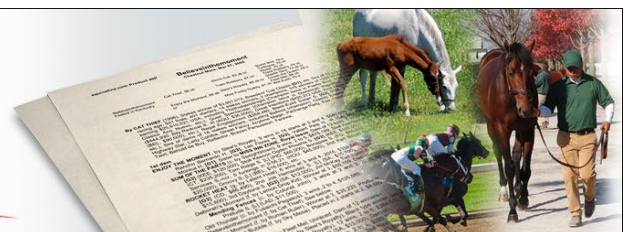

## DORTMUND BACK TO DIRT IN NEXT START

Kaleem Shah's Dortmund sent a clear message to trainer Art Sherman after the son of 2008 Kentucky Derby Presented by Yum! Brands (G1) winner Big Brown finished last by more than 10 lengths in his turf debut in the grade 1 Frank E. Kilroe Mile March 11.

It will be back to square one when the 2015 Santa Anita Derby (G1) winner runs in the \$75,000 Santana Mile for older horses on Santa Anita Park's main track April 1.

"We tried the grass and it didn't work," Sherman said. "The horse has breezed well since then for Saturday's race and he's right on schedule to run."

Dortmund posted a bullet four-furlong work at Los Alamitos Race Course in :46 flat to be the fastest of 21 at the distance March 25.

The Kilroe Mile marked the first race for Dortmund under Sherman's direction. The 5-year-old chestnut was previously trained by Bob Baffert until Shah moved his horses to Sherman and Doug O'Neill at the

beginning of the year.

In 2016 Dortmund did not post a win, but finished second in the Awesome Again Stakes (G1) Oct. 1 and the San Diego Handicap (G2) July 23 behind California Chrome. He also finished third in the \$1 Million TVG Pacific Classic Stakes (G1) Aug. 20, this time behind California Chrome and champion mare Beholder, and fourth in his last start of 2016 in the Las Vegas Breeders' Cup Dirt Mile (G1). **BH**

## FARRELL POISED FOR NEXT TEST IN FAIR GROUNDS OAKS

Coffee Pot Stables' homebred Farrell will look to score her fourth straight stakes win and keep her status atop the Road to the Kentucky Oaks leaderboard in the \$400,000 TwinSpires.com Fair Grounds Oaks (G2) April 1.

Already assured a spot in the starting gate at Churchill Downs May 5 with 70 qualifying points (tied for the lead with Unique Bella), the Malibu Moon filly could cement her status as a Longines Kentucky Oaks (G1) contender in the 1 1/16-mile test at Fair Grounds Race Course & Slots.

Trainer Wayne Catalano is confident in his multiple graded stakes winner heading into the race where she'll face seven others, but said she's still learning.

"She's doing great. She's training great," Catalano said. "She's not an easy filly (to work with). She's kind of hyper. She's starting to learn and settle down a little bit."

In her last three outings, which she won by a combined 12 1/4 lengths, Farrell set the pace or raced just off of it. In the Feb. 25 Rachel Alexandra Stakes (G2), also at 1 1/16 miles at Fair Grounds, she broke

sharp and never let her competition get closer than a length before hitting the wire 3 1/2 lengths in front. In the one-mile Silverbulletday Stakes in January, she raced just off the pacesetter before making a move after six furlongs to win by 2 3/4 lengths.

If Farrell passes the next test, she could face the West Coast's top 3-year-old filly Unique Bella in Louisville.

"Well, she's at the top (of the Road to the Kentucky Oaks leaderboard)," Catalano said. "Of course Unique Bella is a very, very nice filly. The rest of (the 3-year-old filly crop), I don't really know too much about them until we cross them.

"I'd like to see how this race goes first and then we'll see what shakes up for the (Kentucky) Oaks."

Big Chief Racing, Rocker O Ranch, and trainer Keith Desormeaux's Majestic Quality is winless in eight starts but finished second to Farrell in the Rachel Alexandra. After being bumped at the start and traveling wide around both turns, the daughter of Quality Road got a head in front of Valadorna for second.

The fourth-place finisher in the Rachel Alexandra, Brendan Walsh's Wicked Lick, came in second behind Farrell in the Silverbulletday. She finished a head over Gris Gris in third after a slow start. The Maclean's Music filly's only win came at second asking, a Sept. 22

maiden special weight at Churchill.

Gary Barber's Summer Luck enters the Fair Grounds Oaks off a third and fourth in the Davona Dale and the Forward Gal stakes (both G2) at Gulfstream Park. She broke her maiden in November at Churchill.

Calumet Farm's Vexatious broke her maiden in November at Del Mar, getting a head in front of Majestic Quality at the wire. She ran third in an allowance optional claiming race March 9 at Santa Anita Park when facing colts.

Also entered are maiden winners Daria's Angel, Corporate Queen, and Queen Bernardina. **BH**

## FIRST STARTER IS FIRST WINNER FOR HOLIDAY JUSTICE

Nebraska sire Holiday Justice got his first winner with his first starter when 3-year-old Tuff Luck Tony won a six-furlong maiden special weight for 3-year-olds and up at Fonner Park March 11.

Tuff Luck Tony, bred by Daniel Dettwiller Jr. and owned by Dennis Smith, is one of only three foals from the first crop of Holiday Justice, a 12-year-old son of Harlan's Holiday—Angel Again (Nodouble) owned by and standing at Steffen's Thoroughbreds near Grand Island, Neb.

"We love Harlan's Holiday and he is off to a great start as a sire of sires," said Randy Steffen, whose father, Leland, owns and runs Steffen's Thoroughbreds. "He didn't make much money but he is really well-bred on the bottom side. All the siblings are just hard-knocking horses."

Holiday Justice was bred in Kentucky by Greg Justice and Steve Justice of Justice Farm. He raced from 2 to 5, had a year off, and then made nine starts at 7. He last raced for Gregorio Rivera, who sold the stallion to the Steffens.

The sire got a late start in the breeding shed, the reason he has only three foals in his first crop, according to Randy Steffen. Last year, he bred 19 mares—the largest book in Nebraska.

"Tuff Lucky Tony is like most of his foals, not real big but they are muscular," he said. "Everyone seems to like them." **BH**

## HALF TO HARD ACES STROLLS TO SECOND VICTORY

Dreamchaser Thoroughbreds' homebred Astrollinthepark, half sister to grade 1 winner Hard Aces, won her second of three starts, Laurel Park optional-claiming allowance race for 3-year-old fillies going 5 1/2 furlongs.

The daughter of Divine Park bounced out of the gate and ran the first quarter in :23:07, a half-mile in :46.41, and finished unchallenged in 1:04.22 and 3 1/4 lengths in front of She's Stunning. Thirst for Truth finished another 2 1/2 lengths back in third.

Astrollinthepark finished second to Shes Trickey in her Jan. 29 debut at Fair Grounds Race Course & Slots for trainer Larry Jones after being bumped at the start and then again in the early stages of the six-furlong test. Shes Trickey went on to place third in the Take Charge Brandi Stakes at Delta Downs March 3.

Trying six furlongs again at Fair Grounds, Astrollinthepark was able to overcome bumping again to win her second start by 1 1/2 lengths.

Bred in Kentucky, Astrollinthepark is out of the Quiet American mare All in With Aces.

In Sunday's race, Hailey's Flip clipped heels in the early stages of the race and unseated Jevian Toledo. The jockey was attended to on the track but was standing. Fourth-place finisher Candycoated Dame unseated her rider Forest Boyce after the finish. A steward's inquiry led to the disqualification of Heaven's Door for causing interference in the backstretch. **BH**

## LEADING SIRE TITLE NOT LOCKED UP YET

The late Unbridled's Song appears to have already clinched the 2017 North American leading sire title with Arrogate's rich back-to-back victories in the \$12 million Pegasus World Cup (G1) and \$10 million Dubai World Cup Sponsored by Emirates Airline (G1).

Juddmonte Farms' 4-year-old juggernaut has grabbed \$13 million in purses in two starts this year, raising his career earnings to \$17,084,600. Now the richest North America-based racehorse in history, he is third among the highest earners worldwide behind Orfevre (\$19,005,275) and Gentildonna (\$18,468,392).

But should we dismiss any competition for the leading sire title from Gainesway's Tapit, who topped the rankings for the last three years and set a North American earnings record each time? Not quite yet.

Unquestionably, Tapit has a steep climb ahead if he's to be a serious challenge to Unbridled's Song. The 16-year-old son of Pulpit ranks fifth on the general leading sire list with \$2,533,072 in earnings through March 25. He is the leading sire by both number of black-type stakes winners (8) and graded stakes winners (4).

Tapit's earnings to date are tracking behind what his progeny had accumulated through March 25 in 2014, 2015, and 2016. At this point in 2014, Tapit's runners had earned \$2,898,336. (Note that these earnings include direct conversions from native currency to U.S. dollars and does not have Hong Kong, Japan, and Singapore earnings on par with U.S. average purses as does the *BloodHorse* sire lists.) In 2015, Tapit runners had banked \$3,566,935 in earnings, and in 2016, the earnings totaled \$3,758,122.

If Tapit's year mirrors how his progeny performed in 2014, then he's on track to finish the year with about \$15.8 million in progeny earnings. Close but still significantly north of the \$13,800,913 Unbridled's Song's progeny have earned through March 25. If Tapit's 2017 season unfolds like it did in 2015 and 2016, when he had earned a greater portion of his total earnings by March 25, then his end of the year total could be between \$13.5 million and \$14.1 million, which will not get the job done.

It is worth noting that Tapit did not have either a Dubai World Cup winner or a Breeders' Cup Classic (G1) winner in any of his three record-setting years. His progeny could rally in the second half the year to give Unbridled's Song some competition.

If Arrogate, however, keeps improving off his already peerless performances, then Unbridled's Song not only gets the leading sire title but could be in position to challenge Tapit's most recent earnings record of \$19,245,198. Plenty of intrigue among the leading sires still lies ahead. **BH**
