STELLAR WIND SWEEPS IN FOR APPLE BLOSSOM WIN

Stellar Wind's résumé leading up to her 5-year-old season was already, well, stellar.

She earned a championship, defeated four-time champion Beholder twice, and won six graded stakes overall—but she added a line to her accomplishments April 14 at Oaklawn Park.

Since joining trainer John Sadler after breaking her maiden at Laurel Park during her 2-year-old year, Hronis Racing's daughter of Curlin has won all of her races at home on Southern California soil.

But in the \$600,000 Apple Blossom Handicap (G1) Friday, Stellar Wind shipped out of town and won for the first time. Her two previous stakes starts outside of California—albeit with troubled trips on the racetrack—resulted in a fourth-place finish in the Longines Kentucky Oaks (G1) and a neck second in the Longines Breeders' Cup Distaff (G1), both in 2015.

Under the guidance of regular jockey Victor Espinoza, Stellar Wind got to the rail from post 3 as Terra Promessa shot to the lead from the inside post in the 1 1/16-mile Apple Blossom. In the final turn, the champion 3-year-old filly of 2015 moved alongside the frontrunner and put her away in the stretch to win by 1 1/4 lengths. She finished off the distance in 1:42.75.

"I was happy she had an eye on (Terra Promessa)," Sadler said. "I didn't want that horse to get too easy a lead. So he was stalking her from the inside, then he came to the outside. I knew as long as Victor had an eye on (Terra Promessa), we'd be in good shape. She's got a nice kick and a lot of ability to go the distance."

Terra Promessa, another daughter of Curlin, cruised easily on the lead early and set fractions of :23.88, :48.22, and 1:12.59 through six furlongs. Fourth entering the first turn, Stellar Wind improved her position on the rail to move into a tracking position in third on the backstretch, moved ahead of Durango, and engaged Terra Promessa in the final bend.

"In the first turn, I thought my trip was not so good, because I got stuck in behind the leaders on the inside," Espinoza said. "I thought, 'OK, if the outside horse

doesn't get tired at the end, I might have some trouble.' But it worked out well, because the other one couldn't keep up with the leader. I had a little time to move out and just move forward to attack the one on the lead."

Although Terra Promessa momentarily appeared to be game for a stretch duel, she was no match for Stellar Wind late, as the 2-5 favorite put a head in front with a furlong to run and cruised to the wire as Espinoza only showed the mare the whip.

"She ran a good race," said trainer Steve Asmussen. "I mean, she really did. Hat's off to a champion who beat her, but Terra Promessa definitely ran a good race. A nice Curlin exacta."

Streamline, who won the Azeri (G2) last-time out over Terra Promessa, came in 3 1/4 lengths back in third, followed by Tiger Moth, Divine Elegance, and Durango, to complete the order of finish.

With her eighth win from 13 starts, Stellar Wind, who was bred in Virginia by Keswick Stables and Stonestreet Thoroughbred Holdings, now has more than \$1.8 million in earnings. Sadler said after the race that a start in the June 3 Beholder Mile (G1) back home at Santa Anita Park could be next for the mare.

"She wanted another year under her belt. She wanted to race," said owner Kosta Hronis. "She's in great shape, so we thought we'd keep her on the track at least another year. We're happy with her comeback race. (We're) just really proud of her." **BH**

AMERICAN PATRIOT STEALS MAKER'S 46 MILE

The weight of expectations rested on American Patriot long before a saddle ever touched his back.

As a son of world-class sire War Front out of the Tiznow mare Life Well Lived—a full sister to Dubai World Cup Sponsored by Emirates Airline (G1) winner Well Armed—the homebred colt was well-regarded enough by WinStar Farm to result in an \$850,000 RNA from Taylor Made Sales Agency's consignment to the 2014 Keeneland September yearling sale.

"He's such a beautiful horse, and we were hoping to get a million dollars for him, and we didn't," WinStar president and CEO Elliott Walden said. "Being a War Front, out of the pedigree he has, and being such a

good-looking horse, we decided to go ahead and race him."

American Patriot broke through at the highest level April 14 at Keeneland, nipping hard-trying Heart to Heart in the final strides of the \$300,000 Maker's 46 Mile (G1T) with a powerful rally under jockey Javier Castellano. The 4-year-old picked up his first grade 1 win by a neck in his second start of the year, and gave trainer Todd Pletcher a record 51st stakes score at Keeneland.

The final time for the mile on firm turf was 1:34.70.

"I felt good the whole way," Walden said. "He was traveling well the whole way, and he was in the bridle. You don't know which way a photo goes, but you could tell that he was going to run big. When he came off the turn and lengthened his stride, it was really good to see."

American Patriot came off a Feb. 16 allowance victory going 1 1/16 miles on the Gulfstream Park turf. That score was a confidence boost after things did not go the colt's way Oct. 8 at Belmont Park, where he was ninth in the Hill Prince Stakes (G3T).

"He's a horse we always thought a lot of," Pletcher said. "It just seemed like he really made that great transition from 3 to 4, matured, and physically filled out a bit. I think the freshening did him well, and the good spacing from the prep race to this race today. Everything seemed to fall into place, including a good inside draw and ground-saving trip, and he delivered a big kick at the end."

Castellano kept American Patriot covered up after breaking from post 3 in a field of 11, and the duo made a steady progression from eighth as a quarter went in :23.25 to seventh behind a :47.18 half. With California shipper What a View winging along on the lead and Heart to Heart in close pursuit, American Patriot swung into the six path entering the lane after three-quarters in 1:10.98, and Castellano set him down for the drive.

"It was a good setup: a lot of speed in the race," the jockey said. "I rode with a lot of patience, a lot of confidence. I took my time and turning for home, I let him go a little bit. The way he finished was tremendous. I really like this horse. I rode him here when he broke his maiden on this surface. I had a lot of optimism that he would get it done today."

That maiden win came April 10, 2016. Three starts later American Patriot picked up his first graded trophy, winning the Kent Stakes (G3T) at Delaware Park. Next out he was a troubled third in the Secretariat Stakes (G1T) at Arlington International Racecourse.

"He was a little unlucky not to win the grade 1 last year," Pletcher said. "He had a bit of a rough trip in the Secretariat. He came back and trained exceptionally well all winter. I think his allowance

win was more impressive, maybe, than it looked on paper. I spoke to Elliott Walden right after that race and we decided the Maker's 46 was a great opportunity for him. He had run well at Keeneland before... we knew he liked the turf course. More than anything, it just seemed like he was in great form and trained really, really well here at Palm Beach Downs all winter."

Off at odds of 10-1, American Patriot returned \$23, \$10.80, and \$7.20. Heart to Heart, coming off a Canadian Turf (G3T) score at Gulfstream for trainer Brian Lynch, paid \$5.40 and \$3.80. Conquest Panthera, third in the Canadian Turf last out, missed the place by a nose and returned \$13. Completing the order of finish were Ballagh Rocks, Blacktype, What a View, Western Reserve, Inspector Lynley, 7-2 choice Bolo, Bondurant, and Calculator. Conquest Enforcer was scratched.

"You can't ask for any more than he gave us today," Lynch said of Heart to Heart's effort. "He even tried to stick his nose out at the wire. I think Julien (Leparoux) gave him an unbelievable ride, and (Heart to Heart) laid it down too. It's just one of those things in racing... we'll get put our heads together and come up with a game plan (for his next start). I think coming back quick after the effort he put in today certainly wouldn't be an option."

The connections of the winner also will head to the drawing board where their colt's next target is concerned.

"We'll look at the (May 6) Woodford Reserve (Turf Classic, grade 1, at Churchill Downs), but it might be a little quick back off this big effort," Walden said.

"I think he's a versatile horse," Pletcher added. "He's proven he can run effectively from a mile to a mile and three-sixteenths, and he might even handle a little more than that. I think everything's in play for him. He's got a great disposition and a great mind. We'll see how he comes out of it, I'll talk to the guys at WinStar and we'll come up with a game plan, but we have high hopes he can continue on the roll he's on." **BH**

EVER SO CLEVER RALLIES TO FIRST STAKES WIN IN FANTASY

Behind a sustained late run through the far turn that saw her split horses entering the stretch, Clearview Stable's Ever So Clever surged past rivals to register an upset victory April 14 in the \$400,000 Fantasy Stakes (G3) at Oaklawn Park.

Twice placed in graded stakes entering Friday's 1 1/16-mile test for 3-year-old fillies, Ever So Clever would not be denied, as she rallied in the far turn and punched between rivals before sustaining a strong run to the wire to secure her first stakes, pulling away late for a 1 3/4-length score.

The daughter of Medaglia d'Oro also punched her ticket to the Longines Kentucky Oaks (G1) at Churchill Downs as the Fantasy is an Oaks points race (100-40-20-10 to the top four finishers).

"She's going to Churchill Monday, and it's fun to have her there," trainer Steve Asmussen said.

Bred in Kentucky by Clearsky Farms, Ever So Clever became the 100th black-type stakes winner for her sire, who stands for \$150,000 at Darley.

Asmussen, who also won the 2016 Fantasy with Terra Promessa—who ran a game second Friday in the Apple Blossom Handicap (G1)—credited jockey Luis

Contreras with a stellar ride from post 12. Contreras and Ever So Clever settled off the pace early, racing 10th, some 9 1/4 lengths behind early leader Chanel's Legacy, who completed a half-mile in :47.03 and enjoyed a clear lead through six furlongs in 1:11.18.

"Luis gave her a perfect trip," Asmussen said. "Nice filly. She broke fine from the 12 hole. He made an immediate decision, got over. She was probably only 6-7 off the lead around the first turn, two-wide and carrying him well. I thought it made the difference in the race.

"I felt very good about how the filly trained and that he had ridden her before. The filly has a great personality, and we've always felt this way about her. And for her now to win a nice graded stakes is what she deserves."

As Chanel's Legacy reached the top of the stretch first, Ever So Clever rallied in the turn and powered through a small gap in a wall of horses. Ever So Clever sustained that run, seized the lead, and pulled away at the wire, while Poindexter Thoroughbreds' Chanel's Legacy held second, just edging third-place Vexatious.

"She felt great today," Contreras said. "The last time I got an opportunity to ride her, she finished fifth. I learned a lot and Steve gave me some advice about the filly, how she likes to run. We got everything perfect today. From the time we broke, she did everything by herself. I just waited... and kicked in at the quarter pole, and she gave me everything. Once I started making

my move, I wasn't worried about anybody in the race. I just went with the momentum and enjoyed the last part."

Ever So Clever, who completed the race in 1:43.40 on a fast track, paid \$33.60, \$13.40, and \$7 across the board while Chanel's Legacy returned \$11.40 and \$6.60 to place and show. Vexatious paid \$4 to show. Benner Island, the 6-5 favorite off her runner-up finish in the Honeybee Stakes (G3), finished fifth after being bumped near the three-sixteenths pole.

Ever So Clever is the first stakes winner out of multiple stakes winner Foxy Danseur, by Mr. Greeley. She is a half sister to stakes-placed winners Miss Centerfold, by Tiznow; and Tathqeef, by Tapit. **BH**

VAN BERG HAS DERBY DREAMS WITH ONE DREAMY DUDE

Hall of Fame trainer Jack Van Berg hasn't had a starter in the Kentucky Derby Presented by Yum! Brands (G1) since 1994, and it's been 30 years since he saddled "America's Horse," Alysheba, to capture the Run for the Roses.

If Van Berg, 80, reaches the Kentucky Derby this year, it will be with the aptly named One Dreamy Dude, who is scheduled to run in the \$1 million Arkansas Derby (G1) April 15 at Oaklawn Park.

"There's a lot of sentimentality, a lot of emotion," said Mike Waters, a Seattle-area commercial flooring company executive who owns One Dreamy Dude and named the bay colt after Van Berg and his chase for a second Kentucky Derby victory. "There's a lot invested in the emotions. Jack believes this is his year, and I hope I can just be part of the fun. It would just be great for racing."

At the same time, Van Berg would shock the racing world.

One Dream Dude is a six-race maiden and the longest price in the program (50-1) for a 1 1/8-mile race that features Eclipse Award-winning 2-year-old male Classic Empire and unbeaten Malagacy.

An owner for approximately four years, 47-year-old Waters said it was strictly Van Berg's call to enter One Dreamy Dude, who is by millionaire grade 1 winner First Dude.

One Dreamy Dude finished sixth in his last start, beaten seven lengths by fellow Arkansas Derby longshot Grandpa's Dream, in a 1 1/16-mile maiden-allowance event March 25 at Oaklawn.

"Jack said the horse was training well," Waters said. "He had a little problem his last race. We had to scope him after the race and he had some mucous. The jock (Declan Cannon) said he thought he had a lot of horse at the quarter pole, and he's been training crazy. Jack said, 'Hey, let's take a chance at it! We know he wants distance, so we're going to give it a shot and hope for the best.'"

In five previous starts, all at least a mile, One Dreamy Dude finished behind Silver Dust (another Arkansas Derby entrant) and Blueridge Traveler, runner-up in the \$500,000 JACK Cincinnati Spiral Stakes (G3) March 25 at Turfway Park.

Other horses in One Dreamy Dude's past performance lines include one-time fringe Kentucky Derby candidates Dilettante, Horse Fly, and Senior Investment. Horse Fly beat One Dreamy Dude by a nose to win at 1 1/16 miles Feb. 4 at Oaklawn.

"He's raced against some good horses," Waters said.

"He can go to the front and he can sit behind. Hopefully this race he'll sit behind the pack a little bit. He's got one of the longest reaches Jack said he's ever seen. Hopefully, he'll just come flying by at the end there."

One Dreamy Dude is one of approximately 15 horses Van Berg has for Waters (Muddy Waters Stable), Oaklawn's second-leading owner by wins this year with 10 victories through April 14.

Van Berg, Waters, and the owner's bloodstock agent, Christina Jelm, found the colt at the Ocala Breeders' Sales Co.'s June 2-year-old and horses of racing age sale.

Waters got One Dreamy Dude for only \$25,000 and said he immediately had high hopes for the colt.

"The second Jack saw him, he thought he was a Kentucky Derby horse," Waters said.

Asked if the unthinkable could happen Saturday—One Dreamy Dude breaking his maiden in his stakes debut and in a race that has a seven-figure purse—Van Berg said: "Well, yeah."

"I've always thought he's a good horse," said Van Berg, who has trained for Waters for approximately two years. "He got beat a nose. He's really the same as most of them in there: non-winners of two."

Van Berg's last Kentucky Derby starter, Blumin Affair, ran third. He also ran second in the 1994 Arkansas Derby.

"It would be a great ending," Waters said. "Or maybe just the beginning of Jack's next book." **BH**

ALWAYS DREAMING FINISHES STRONG IN FRIDAY BREEZE

Always Dreaming, impressive winner of the Xpressbet Florida Derby (G1) April 1 at Gulfstream Park, breezed April 14 for the first time since his five-length victory in the \$1 million event.

Under regular rider John Velazquez, Always Dreaming worked a half-mile in :49.55 outside Appleton Stakes (G3T) winner All Included at approximately 6:50 a.m. at Palm Beach Downs.

"I thought he settled well considering the first part was a little on the slow side. He finished up strongly, galloped out impressively," said trainer Todd Pletcher. "Based from what we were seeing in the morning, the track is not super fast.

"The longer you're here the more you kind of get used to this track. It's a little bit quirky in some ways. It can be a little inside biased, sometimes not produce real fast times. But we like it a lot. Knock on wood, it's been a very safe surface for us. It seems like a lot of horses thrive through the winter here."



Always Dreaming wins the Florida Derby April 1 at Gulfstream Park

Always Dreaming, a son of Bodemeister, raced twice as a 2-year-old before breaking his maiden Jan. 25 at Tampa Bay Downs by 11 1/2 lengths. The colt then won by four lengths at Gulfstream March 4 before his victory in the Florida Derby for Brooklyn Boyz Stables, MeB Stables, Teresa Viola Racing Stables, St. Elias Stables, West Point Thoroughbreds, and Siena Farm.

"(Always Dreaming) is one of the exceptions in terms of horses who consistently win breezes, whether

he's on the inside or outside of horses," Pletcher said. "It was, I thought, a very good breeze. I liked the way he finished the last quarter in 23-and-change and seemed to cool out quickly and recover quickly."

Pletcher has not decided whether Always Dreaming will remain in South Florida and work one more time at Palm Beach before shipping to Kentucky for the May 6 Kentucky Derby Presented by Yum! Brands (G1). **BH**

ALL SYSTEMS GO FOR LA CORONEL AFTER APPALACHIAN WIN

The Casse Racing shedrow was one of the happier places on the Keeneland backstretch the morning of April 14.

In addition to Mark Casse being honored with his ninth Sovereign Award for outstanding trainer the previous night, the barn's latest turf standout, La Coronel, was in good order the day after her 3 1/4-length triumph in a particularly salty edition of the \$125,000 Appalachian Stakes Presented by Japan Racing Association (G3T).

La Coronel stamped herself the pro-tem leader of a deep bunch of 3-year-old turf fillies when she handily bested an 11-horse field that included 2016 Breeders' Cup

Juvenile Fillies Turf (G1T) winner New Money Honey and runner-up Coasted.

Casse indicated after the Appalachian that the daughter of Colonel John might take on males next in American Turf Presented by Ram Trucks (G2T) at Churchill Downs May 6. Given what assistant trainer David Carroll saw Friday morning, the dark bay filly is ready for whatever comes at her next.

"She jogged sound this morning. Her legs were cold and tight," Carroll said. "She had a great trip in the race, but she was much the best. Some said they had trouble and (jockey) Julien (Leparoux), who was on our other filly Dreaming Dancing (fourth), said he'd beat (La Coronel) next time. But I don't think so. This filly has that tactical speed and she has a kick. And she wasn't even all-out yesterday.

"We'd like to separate the two

of them (La Coronel and Dream Dancing) and I think La Coronel is strong enough and has that kick that she'd be capable against males. And Mark is not afraid to do that."

Appalachian runner-up Morticia was also in good order Friday, trainer Rusty Arnold said, and would likely be pointed to the \$200,000 Penn Oaks at Penn National Race Course June 3. Both Dream Dancing and third-place finisher Proctor's Ledge are possible for the Edgewood Stakes Presented by Forcht Bank (G3T) at Churchill May 5.

Trained Chad Brown called New Money Honey's sixth-place finish as the favorite in the Appalachian "a disappointment," but said the daughter of Medaglia d'Oro came out of her seasonal bow with no physical issue.

"She looks OK today," Brown said Friday morning. "It was a bit of a rough trip and she didn't really seem to care for the turf here, which is fine. It happens. We'll get her back to New York and point to something at Belmont."

Stakes winner Bellavais was "good but tired," according to trainer Jimmy Toner, after running fifth in her first try against graded stakes company. Toner said the tiny chestnut daughter of Tapit would likely shorten up for her next start and be pointed to the seven-furlong Soaring Softly Stakes at Belmont Park May 20.

"I thought she ran well, but it didn't look like the layup horses did that well," Toner said. "The horses that ran better all had races in March." **BH**

REVIEWING SUCCESSFUL MALIBU MOON CROSSES

Malibu Moon is just entering the phase of his stallion career where we'll begin seeing the potential of his sons to also become successful sires.

This year, Spendthrift Farm's marquee sire by A.P. Indy has three graded stakes-winning sons at stud: Claiborne Farm's 2013 Kentucky Derby Presented by Yum! Brands (G1) and Besilu Stables Florida Derby (G1) winner Orb; Ocala Stud's multiple graded stakes winner Prospective; and Country Life Farm's grade 2 winner Freedom Child.

Spendthrift recently announced it purchased the breeding rights to Gormley, winner of the April 8 Santa Anita Derby (G1) for Jerry and Anne Moss. The Malibu Moon son out of stakes winner Race to Urga (by Bernstein) has now won three graded stakes out of six starts, the others being the 2016 FrontRunner Stakes (G1) and the Jan. 7 Sham Stakes (G3).

As breeders sort out what broodmare lines will work best with Malibu Moon's sire sons, *BloodHorse Daily* researched what lines have crossed most successfully with Malibu Moon himself. So far, broodmare sire lines tracing back to Storm Cat (the sire of Bernstein) and his sons/grandsons and Deputy Minister and his sons/grandsons have been out-performing the crosses of Malibu Moon with all other broodmare sire lines.

The Malibu Moon/Storm Cat and sons/grandson cross has been the most successful, having produced six other graded/group winners besides Gormley. Out of 212 foals produced on this cross, 107 (75% of starters) are winners and 16 (11%) are black-type stakes winners, according to a TrueNicks enhanced hypothetical mating report. Of these 16 black-type stakes winners, six are out of Storm Cat daughters.

With the Storm Cat broodmare sire line excluded, Malibu Moon has sired 81 (8%) black-type stakes winners. Further evidence of how well the Malibu Moon/Storm Cat line cross works can be seen by comparing how well the Storm Cat broodmare sire line has done with other sires (excluding Malibu Moon), which has produced 820 (5%) black-type stakes winners out of 26,573 foals.

Malibu Moon, when crossed with daughters of Deputy Minister and his sons/grandsons, has produced eight (9%) black-type stakes winners, including both Prospective (by Awesome Again) and Freedom Child (Deputy Minister), the only graded stakes winners so far. When the Deputy Minister broodmare sire line is excluded, Malibu Moon again has 8% black-type stakes winners from foals out of all other broodmare sire lines.

Orb represents the Malibu Moon/Unbridled cross, which has produced three (5%) black-type stakes winners to date, including graded stakes winner Farrell and listed stakes winner J Serino. While this cross currently lags behind Malibu Moon's other crosses, one can expect improvement considering both Farrell and J Serino are out of rising broodmare sire Unbridled's Song.

Unbridled's Song is seventh by progeny earnings on BloodHorse.com's 2017 leading broodmare sire list through April 14, but is the second-leading broodmare sire with seven black-type stakes winners behind Sunday Silence with nine.

Overall as a sire Malibu Moon has been represented by 97 (6%) black-type winners so far, of which 39 have won graded/group stakes and 11 have won at the grade 1 level. Orb is his top earner with \$2,612,516 in purses, while Declan's Moon—2004 champion 2-year-old colt—is his sole champion to date. **BH**

PLETCHER READY FOR ANOTHER KENTUCKY DERBY RUN

Considering Todd Pletcher could have the Kentucky Derby Presented by Yum! Brands (G1) favorite in Florida Derby (G1) winner Always Dreaming and several other promising starters in this year's Louisville classic, it's even money the most-repeated Derby-week stat will be the multiple Eclipse Award-winning trainer's 1-for-45 mark in the Louisville classic.

Pletcher currently has five horses ranked in the top 20 on the Kentucky Derby leaderboard used to determine the field: Always Dreaming (6), Tapwrit (11), Malagacy (12), Patch (17), and Battalion Runner (18). Should at least four Pletcher-trained horses start in the Derby, he will pass his former mentor, Hall of Famer D. Wayne Lukas, in the category of most Derby starters.

Pletcher will enter this year's Kentucky Derby with one win—Super Saver in 2010—and five runner-up efforts from 45 previous Derby starters. While the competitive Pletcher most assuredly wants to add to his Derby win column, he does find some level of satisfaction in the 45 Derby starters.

"We've kind of always taken the approach that this race is the reason why a lot of people are in the business. To have that opportunity, to have a potential starter in the Kentucky Derby, it means a lot to the owners," Pletcher said. "Part of the excitement for us is to see the enjoyment

and the excitement that the owners get having a participant in the Derby, participating in the race, participating in the walkover, the post-position draw. It's a very, very exciting time."

The 1-for-45 stat itself plays a bit more dramatically than reality when you consider that—short of a dead-heat—a trainer cannot win a race twice. When Pletcher starts multiple horses in a race, only one can win; and he has started multiple horses in 14 of the 16 years he's started at least one horse in the Derby. In years Pletcher has started five horses, the best he can do is 1-for-5.

He has twice started five horses in the Derby, which is a record also matched by Nick Zito and Lukas. Three other times he has started four.

In the 16 years Pletcher has sent out at least one Derby starter since 2000, he has one winner. The 1-for-16 strike rate is still lower than one would expect for a trainer who has earned seven Eclipse Awards in those years, but not as dramatic as 1-for-45.

Plus, if Pletcher breaks through with a second Derby win, the narrative would likely change. After all, Lukas and Bob Baffert *only* have four Derby wins.

"We want to do well. We want to win," Pletcher said. "I think our Derby record is not as good as we'd like it to be. But at the same token, I think we've had some horses overachieve on their way to getting there and in some cases, underachieve in the race itself. But, you know, we're also very thankful for the win." **BH**

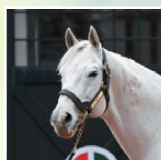
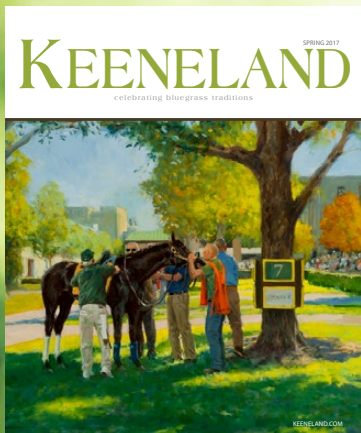

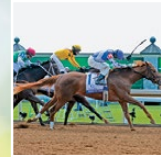
