DERBY-WINNING TRAINER LYNN WHITING DIES



at Day remembers meeting Lynn Whiting the spring of 1974 at Rockingham Park. The astute horseman and future Hall of Fame jockey were 18 years away from a Kentucky Derby (G1) upset with Lil E. Tee, but their friendship blossomed long before the roses.

Whiting, a native of Great Falls, Mont., died April 19 in his home near Louisville after a long illness and recent stroke suffered in February, during the Oaklawn Park meet. He was 77. Whiting, who raced primarily in Kentucky and Arkansas, returned to the track just two days earlier to oversee his stable after weeks of hospital and rehabilitation care.

"He wasn't a self-promoter," Day said. "He never rang his own bell. He let his horses do the talking. He was an astute horseman (and) excellent caretaker, with excellent preparation, and he knew his horses. It was a joy to ride for him and work with him, but an even greater joy to be his friend."

Born June 28, 1939, the son of longtime horseman Lyle Whiting earned his first win as a trainer in 1969 at Rhode Island's Lincoln Downs. He sent out 6,113 runners, according to Equibase statistics. The soft-spoken Whiting was highly regarded by his peers as a patient, skilled, and accomplished horseman who possessed a keen eye for potential in young horses. His Kentucky Derby winner was the best-known example of the latter, as he was purchased privately by W. Cal Partee during the colt's 2-year-

old season for \$200,000.

Lil E. Tee was the greatest of Whiting's 1,279 winners. Sent off at 16-1 in the 1992 Kentucky Derby with Day aboard, the At the Threshold runner circled the field and got up in a driving finish for a one-length score.

"I don't know how we got to the 25-year anniversary of that win so quickly," the retired jockey said. "To win the storied Kentucky Derby was the highlight of my racing career, and it was extra special to do it with Lvnn and for Mr. Cal Partee."

Whiting's starters earned \$23,960,058. His best year was 1992, when his single-season earnings topped out at \$1,423,476 courtesy of Lil E. Tee's Derby surprise. In 2009 he became the

10th trainer to saddle 300 winners at Churchill Downs. His final victory came with Jury Wise March 10 at Oaklawn.

"I respected him as a horseman, but more as a person," Day said. "He was a stand-up guy. You'd have to look really hard to find somebody who had a bad word to say about him. He was a man of his word, a stellar individual, a great horseman, a great husband, father, and grandfather, and certainly a dear friend to myself and my family, and to a number of people on the racetrack. He will be sorely missed."

Whiting is survived by his wife, Nell; daughters Kerri and Lori; and three grandchildren. Memorial arrangements are pending. BH

VET'S LIST CHANGES AIM TO PROTECT HORSES

he Association of Racing Commissioners International Drug Testing and Practices Committee April 19 moved forward on changes that would standardize vet's list procedures from state to state.

The end goal of the rule put forward by The Jockey Club Safety Committee is to standardize vet's list rules, specifically targeting situations where a horse on a vet's list in one state or track ships out and is allowed to race in another jurisdiction.

The Jockey Club Safety Committee-supported rule calls for all regulatory authorities to better manage and mutually enforce rest periods for horses on any official vet's list. The Jockey Club subsidiary, InCompass Solutions, would enhance its software to facilitate the efforts, and racing jurisdictions would be notified when a horse on a vet's list in one jurisdiction is attempted to be entered in another.

The Drug Testing and Practices Committee recommended the ARCI Model Rules committee, which will meet April 20, address the rule proposal.

Cathy O'Meara, industry initiatives coordinator for The Jockey Club, presented the rule that also would put restrictions in place for horses who have not raced for one year or longer or horses making their first start at age 4 or older.

Duncan Patterson, chairman of the Drug Testing and Practices Committee and chairman of the Delaware Thoroughbred Racing Commission, said he understands the need for a model rule.

"I see this as a problem. We've put horses on the vet's list in Delaware then you see them racing somewhere else," Patterson said. "That's a situation that puts a horse's health in jeopardy."

In one other move that came to a vote Wednesday, the Drug Testing and Practices Committee approved with three dissenters—asking the ARCI staff to update points previously assigned under the Multiple Medication Violator provision of the National Uniform Medication Program. The ARCI board in December approved changes to the MMV points system and Tuesday's vote will adjust points assigned to trainers before that change to the current standard.

The MMV uses a points system similar to that of many state departments of motor vehicles, in which violations are assigned points. If a trainer with multiple medication violations reaches a points threshold, sanctions in addition to the penalties for the latest offense are assigned.

In December the ARCI board approved changes to the MMV that eliminated points assigned for the lowest penalty category (Class D) and halved points assigned to Class C penalties. Also, the number of points to trigger the initial MMV sanction was raised from three to five. Suspension days were reduced and the time period for points to stay on a horseman's record also were reduced.

Committee members voting Tuesday in favor of having ARCI staff adjust the previously assigned points to the current standard noted fairness issues. BH

VET RECORDS BENEFIT REGULATORS, HORSEMEN

n 2015 Gulfstream Park put a house rule in place that required the sharing of information on joint injections when a horse is claimed, and the track's equine health and safety director Robert O'Neil recalled a vocal complaint from one horseman about the new policy.

O'Neil said the horseman was concerned that if other trainers claimed one of his horses, they would have some insight into his program. But O'Neil said soon after the policy was in place, that same horseman—suddenly seeing the benefits of the policy called to make sure he received the joint injection records of a horse he'd recently claimed.

In a panel on veterinary records April 18 at the Association of Racing Commissioners International annual conference on equine welfare and racing integrity in Charleston, S.C., several veterinarians who oversee such records programs said the benefits for safety, integrity, regulatory research, and horsemen far outweigh concerns of privacy.

In 2015 The Stronach Group went beyond any state regulatory rule and put a house rule in place requiring that within 72 hours of a horse being claimed, the trainer of record of the claimed horse forward to O'Neil information on any joint injections performed in the previous 30 days. The report must include joint(s) involved, medication used (Depo-Medrol, hyaluronic acid, etc.) and the dose used. O'Neil then forwards the information to the party who claimed the horse.

O'Neil said such policies make sense and help new connections to avoid starting from square one or repeating treatments recently performed on the horse.

New York equine medical director Scott Palmer said the state's policy requiring horsemen to report corticosteroid joint injections was put in place in 2012 and has generated 60,000 to 70,000 reports in that database.

"One of the things we do with that information is use it for research purposes. We had no idea, prior to the (Task Force on Racehorse Health and Safety) of 2012 what the scope was of corticosteroid injections at the track," Palmer said. "We knew it was a lot, but if you

don't measure something, you can't manage it. That's why we thought it was important to set it up and get a handle on it."

Palmer believes information from these records helps protect horsemen.

"What we discovered was that Depo-Medrol could be found in a blood test of a horse as long as 100 days after the administration period," Palmer said. "What that means is the 21-day withdrawal time for Depo-Medrol is a risky business."

Palmer said a wide variance exists—based on where the injection occurs—in how long Depo-Medrol can be detected. He said with that information, New York convinced track vets to largely eliminate their use of Depo-Medrol.

"That's a good example of how we can use the research findings from gathering medical and treatment records to protect people and create a regulatory policy that keeps people out of trouble," Palmer said. "That's a pretty good use of the information."

Palmer said additional vet treatment information is used in mortality reviews of horses who die at New York racetracks.

"We require 60 days of medical records. That's part of our review process to examine the circumstances that lead up to that fatality," Palmer said. "Having that medical information is very important.

"I can tell you the primary thing that we found in doing these reviews is that, usually the 60 days leading up to the incident are not adequate to really explain the whole story and frequently it's because the horse has changed hands. So we have no idea about previous surgery, injury, (or) problems in that individual."

In collecting those records, Palmer noticed that they frequently do not meet the standards of the state's veterinary board for keeping medical records. He said every vet is required to keep detailed records of the individual animals they are treating. Palmer said, in

general, more diagnostic work is needed on horses in training.


"One of the things we've found, in four years now, when we ask for medical records in a case of a fatality is that a horse was never examined by a veterinarian at all," Palmer said. "That's a story in itself, isn't it?"

State racing commissions should reach out to their veterinary boards, said Lynn Hovda, equine medical director for the Minnesota Racing Commission and chairwoman of the ARCI regulatory veterinarians committee.

"I think one of the most important things you can do, regardless of what state you're in, is engage your board of veterinary medicine," Hovda said. "We have the director of our board come out and sit down with our veterinarians at the onset of the season. We have a discussion (and) talk about their expectations. We ask our laboratory director to sit down and have a chat with them about her expectations."

Hovda said she also goes through all the rules and ends the presentation by saying, "I'm trusting you to do the right thing." BH

REGULATORS DISCUSS ADDING BACKSTRETCH INVESTIGATORS

n an era where some states have faced budget cuts, racing regulators talked April 19 about creative ways to place more investigators on the backstretch as a way of discovering wrongdoing and deterring future bad behavior.

The talk of such approaches was one of four panel discussions on a busy Wednesday at the Association of Racing Commissioners International annual conference in Charleston, S.C. Other panel topics included the performance of stewards enforcing racing rules, new approaches to the adjudication process, and regulation of the riding crop.

In the panel on investigations titled, "Policing the Backside: A View from the Front Line," Janet VanBebber, chief racing officer of the American Quarter Horse Association, documented the success her group has enjoyed in helping to fund added investigators to observe backstretch activity in the days leading up to some of its biggest races.


Nebraska Racing Commission executive director Tom Sage, who has served on some of the investigative teams, said horsemen most assuredly take notice and many horsemen appreciate their presence. Sage encouraged racing commissions to find ways to increase the number of investigators on the backstretch ahead of big race days or when there is a possible concern.

Sage said by contacting the Organization of Racing Investigators, a plan can be shaped to bring in the extra boots on the ground. He noted that travel expenses and daily pay typically amount to about \$1,000 per person for a weekend.

When those added investigators are there, Sage said if they see anything of concern, they contact commission investigators and the stewards. Sage and others also noted that many states have added safety stewards in recent years, and they also can work with investigators and stewards on integrity concerns.

Delaware Thoroughbred Racing Commission executive director John Wayne—again with limited budgets in mind—offered advice on how racing commissions can tailor out-of-competition testing.

"A lot of this is common sense, reading the past performances and being aware when a horse has a form reversal or improves after a change in connections," said Wayne, who added that use of the Equibase Virtual Stable allows such horses to be tracked in terms of workouts and entries.

Wayne, also active in the ORI, said lower-level races within a jurisdiction often can be of more concern than top stakes races.

"Whether it's a betting coup—and of course the (Thoroughbred Racing Protective Bureau) is on the alert for any kind of betting anomalies and they let us know what's going on. But you want to prevent these things from happening," Wayne said. "Out-of-competition testing is very, very important. The strategy we use is to go out seven or 10 days ahead of a race and get a sample, and possibly go out two days later and get a sample from that same horse. Those are things that have been very effective."

Wayne said in 2016 Delaware did 201 out-ofcompetition samples out of a total of 1,786 total samples that were tested (about 11%).

"I think we're doing what we should be doing—being responsible," Wayne said.

Later in the day a panel discussed regulation of riding crop use in advance of an ARCI model rules committee meeting set for April 20 that will consider two proposals.

One of those proposals is from the Jockeys' Guild, which has raised concerns about a California rule put in place in July of 2015 that limits riders to striking a horse three times in succession before giving the horse a chance to respond, a response timeframe that has been estimated to be at least two strides. The Jockeys' Guild would like to see that response timeframe reduced to one stride and more liberal use of the riding crop allowed in the final sixteenth mile of a race.

California Horse Racing Board executive director Rick Baedeker said riders have adjusted to the rule. He said at Santa Anita Park and Golden Gate Fields in the past two months, they've seen just 22 violations from more than 3,400 mounts. He said the rule in California has led to jockeys reducing their use of the riding crop.

"What we have found is there is no question the jockeys have more control of the horses. Both hands are on the reigns more," Baedeker said. "As a result, they're riding straighter."

He added that bumping has been reduced, which is protecting horses.

Jockeys' Guild board member Ramon Dominguez advocated his group's model rule, which he and current riders like John Velazquez and Julien Leparoux helped develop. He noted that as states tweak their rules on use of riding crops, jockeys are forced to adjust their riding style from state to state. He noted that other top athletes are not forced to make such changes to their game based only on where they're competing.

Alan Monat, a former jockey and former Illinois racing regulator, noted that concerns about causing welts or cuts to a horse have been greatly reduced through model rules that have seen riding crops changed to include padded poppers and require the impact area to be more spread out.

A recommendation on riding crop use from The Jockey Club to be considered by the model rules committee would set guidelines on penalties that would call for more severe penalties for repeat offenders and on the severity of the offense.

In other panels Wednesday:

Attorney Peter Sacopulos encouraged regulators to add opportunities for mediation during the adjudication process. Concerns were raised that such an option could see a mediator playing too big a regulatory role by essentially determining penalties through that negotiation process.

Members of the panel on racing officials encouraged transparency from stewards on their racing decisions, noting examples of states where stewards offer reasoning for their decisions in reports available online. BH



AMBERSPATRIOT FIRST WINNER FOR AWESOME PATRIOT

pendthrift Farm's freshman sire Awesome Patriot got his first winner April 19 at Keeneland, where Amberspatriot won a \$60,000 maiden special weight going 4 1/2 furlongs by a length over males.

The juvenile filly out of the winning Limehouse daughter Starkey was bred in Kentucky by Jim and Pam Robinson's Brandywine Farm and was offered through the 2016 Keeneland September yearling sale, where she was bought back for \$1,300. Starkey has now produced two winners from as many starters. Her first foal is Midway Playa, a 3-year-old colt by American Lion.

Amberspatriot found her way to the barn of trainer John Hancock and is owned by Donna Hancock and Charles Brown. She has been working steadily since Feb. 5 at Riverside Downs near Henderson, Ky., and signaled she would be a contender in the field of eight other colts and geldings with two works in :47 and

change at Keeneland April 8 and April 14.

The filly went off as the 2-1 second choice to Vital, the first starter for Ashford Stud's freshman sire Shanghai Bobby, who is owned by Susan Magnier, Michael Tabor, Derrick Smith, and Stonestreet Stables. Vital was the even-money favorite coming out of the barn of Wesley Ward.

Amberspatriot stalked the early leaders Baytown Lex and Vital through much of the race as the frontrunners took the field through fractions of :23.03 and :46.48. Baytown Lex held the lead until a sixteenth from the wire, when Amberspatriot kicked past the gelding to win by a length in a final time of :52.59.

Other juveniles in the field representing freshman sires included Orbatron, by Claiborne Farm's Orb, who races for L and N Racing with trainer Steve Asmussen; and another Awesome Patriot runner named Reaganzie. who is raced by Patience Jazdzeweski and Christa Colli and trained by Willima Helmbrecht.

Awesome Patriot is 9-year-old son of Awesome Again—Tizamazing, by Cee's Tizzy, who was bred in Kentucky by Richard Santulli's Colt Neck Stables. He

> sold as a yearling during the 2009 Keeneland September sale for \$350,000 to the Lanni Family Trust. Trained by Bob Baffert. Awesome Patriot made seven starts and won the Alydar Stakes at Hollywood Park.

Because of his pedigree, B. Wayne Hughes' Spendthrift Farm acquired Awesome Patriot in the summer of 2013. His dam is a full sister to top sire Tiznow and is also the dam of grade 1 winner and fellow freshman sire Oxbow. who stands at Calumet Farm. Awesome Patriot stands for \$2,500 this year. BH

DATA LINK GETS HIS FIRST WINNER IN DI MARIA

Naiborne Farm's Data Link got a guick start to his freshman year when his first starter Di Maria became his first winner in her debut April 19 at Gulfstream Park.

Out of the Pulpit daughter Thine, Di Maria was bred and raised in Kentucky by Elm Tree Farm and sold through the 2016 Keeneland September yearling sale for \$4,500 to Damian Munoz. The filly is now raced by Carlos Munoz and trained by Javier Negrete.

Di Maria was quick out of the gate in the 4 1/2-furlong, \$50,000 maiden special weight, which was Gulfstream's first 2-year-old race of the season. The bay filly hooked early leader and stablemate La Chica Ripool, who was the first starter for freshman sire Soldat. The two ran head-tohead through the turn in fractions of :22.16 and :45.12. Di Maria pulled ahead at the top of the stretch and continued on to win by three lengths. The final time was :51.50.

Besides Di Maria and La Chica Ripool, the maiden race included the first starters for Pleasant Acres Stallions' grade 3 winner Brethren—Baylor and Minaj, who are

both homebreds racing for Arindel and both with trainer Stanley Gold.

Di Maria's dam Thine was bred by Patchen Wilkes and sold through the 2007 Keeneland September sale for \$280,000 to Jane Dunn, as agent, out of the Hopewell Farm consignment. She is a half sister to graded stakes winner Derrianne (Cozzene), who is the dam of black-type stakes winner Tapitation (Tapit) and stakes-placed winner One Eyed Ray (Elusive Quality).

Thine only placed as a racehorse, but as a broodmare she has produced three winners from three starters. She has a yearling colt this year by Paynter.

Data Link is a multiple graded stakes-winning son of Claiborne's top international sire War Front, out of the stakes winner Database (Known Fact). Bred and raced by Stuart Janney III, Data Link also won at 2, but didn't hit his best stride until 4 when he won three graded stakes, including the Maker's 46 Mile Stakes (G1T), Monmouth Stakes (G2T), and the Citation Handicap (G2T). At 5 he won the Canadian Turf Stakes (G3T) and finished second in the 2012 Maker's 46 Mile to eventual Horse of the Year Wise Dan. Data Link won or placed in seven graded stakes overall, and banked \$831,335 upon retirement. He Share this story stands for \$7,500 this year. BH

THE JOCKEY CLUB DENIES STUD **BOOK PRIVILEGES TO FOUR**

ne trainer has been denied all privileges of The American Stud Book for 10 years and three other trainers have been denied the same privileges for one or two years, The Jockey Club announced April 19.

The denials of privileges are pursuant to Rule 19 of the Principal Rules and Requirements of The American Stud Book. All actions became effective January 1.

Roy Sedlacek was denied privileges for 10 years after he was determined to have violated, on two occasions, a racing statute, rule, or regulation relating to prohibited or restricted drugs, medications, or substances in a Thoroughbred. The violations occurred at Belmont Park Oct. 11, 2015 and Oct. 18, 2015, and involved Class 1 prohibited substances.

Ramon R. Preciado was denied privileges for two years due to four violations within a 365-day period, which occurred at Parx Racing Feb. 23, 2015, and at Delaware Park Aug. 26, 2015 and Sept. 12, 2015.



Marcus J. Vitali was denied privileges for two years after seven violations within a 365-day period, which occurred at Gulfstream Park West Nov. 29, 2014; March 28, 2015; March 29, 2015; and April 3, 2015.

Juan Carlos Vazquez was denied privileges for one year because of four violations within a 365-day period. The violations occurred at Delaware Park July 9, 2014, at Penn National Oct. 23, 2014 and March 25, 2015, and at Delaware Park May 18, 2015. BH

MALIBU MOON FILLY FASTEST AT OBS UNDER TACK SESSION

Malibu Moon filly from Eddie Woods' consignment clocked the fastest quarter-mile in :20 4/5 during the April 19 third session of the under tack show in preparation for the Ocala Breeders' Sales spring 2-year-olds in training sale.

The sale at the OBS headquarters in Ocala, Fla., is scheduled for April 25-28 with daily sessions beginning at 10:30 a.m. EDT.

Consigned as Hip 591, the Malibu Moon filly was produced from In the Slips, a daughter of More Than Ready who was a stakes winner and graded stakes-placed at Santa Anita Park. She descends from the female family of group 1 Emirates Melbourne Cup winner Delta Blues.

"We expected her to work good and she did," Woods said of the filly purchased by the Oak Farm partnership for \$47,000 at last year's Fasig-Tipton Kentucky October yearling sale, after previously selling for \$220,000 as a weanling. "She is a really beautiful, tall, elegant filly with lots of leg underneath her, and she is by a great filly sire."

Three 2-year-olds shared the fastest eighth-mile time of :09 4/5 as the under tack show went over the mid-point. On a warm, cloudy day with a slight breeze, the sale entrants worked over the OBS artificial track surface.

Consigned by de Meric Sales, Hip 422 is a Quality Road filly produced from the unraced Tiznow mare Favoritism, a half sister to the dam of Japanese group 1 winner Moanin. The filly was acquired by Secure Investments for \$25,000 at the Keeneland September yearling sale.

"We weren't surprised," Tristan de Meric said of the filly's work. "We have had her on our farm since

January and she is a really nice filly. We sold her half sister (Lindeza) for \$500,000 as a 2-year-old in 2015."

Also breezing in :09 4/5 was Hip 581, a First Samurai colt from Grassroots Training and Sales. Produced from the unraced Indian Charlie mare Indian Bay, the colt's second dam is grade 3 winner By the Barrel, the dam of multiple graded-placed Mise En Rose. The colt was acquired by Grassroots for \$90,000 at last year's Keeneland September sale.

"He has been an outstanding horse since we got him," said Grassroots' Jody Mihalic. "He's been (fast) from day one."

The other co-fastest worker on the day was Hip 504, a Florida-bred filly from the first crop of Prospective consigned by Daylight Farm Racing and Sales. The filly is out of Grand Episode, an unraced Grand Slam mare who is from the female family of champion and sire Street Sense.

The under tack workouts continue through April 22, beginning at 8 a.m. EDT daily.

Under tack results and videos are posted on the OBS website at obssales.com and can be viewed on kiosks in the breezeway and in the video room adjacent to the horsemen's lounge. BH



RECORDS TUMBLE AT TATTERSALLS **CRAVEN BREEZE UP SALE**

trong trade continued on the second day of the Tattersalls Craven breeze up sale April 19, with records set across the board and a top price of 675,000gns for a colt by Scat Daddy.

The second session saw 49 lots sell for 7,165,000gns at an average of 146,224gns and a median of 100,000gns, taking the two day totals to 98 lots sold for 14,120,000 gns, a new record bettering the previous record set in 2008 by more than 2 million guineas. The average and median both rose 30% and 42% to 144,082gns and 110,000gns, both new records as well. The sale saw a total of 57 lots sell for 100,000 gns or more, eclipsing the previous record of 40 set in 2008.

The top lot on the final day and the top price for the sale was the Scat Daddy colt from Jim McCarten's Gaybrook Lodge Stud, knocked down to David Redvers. Bidding for the colt was frenzied from the start, with Cheveley Park Stud's Chris Richardson, agents Nicolas de Watrigant, Stephen Hillen, Justin Casse, and Kerri Radcliffe all trying to secure the prized lot alongside Ibrahim Araci and underbidder Richard Knight. But none could match the efforts of Redvers, who was stood alongside Sheikh Fahad.

This is the second son of the mare Gender Dance to top a Craven breeze up sale, after her Elusive Quality colt, subsequently a group 3 winner named Great White Eagle, sold for 760,000 guineas in 2013.

"When people buy the sale topper, they always come out with the cliches that they thought it was the best horse in the sale, and that it ticked all the boxes," Redvers said. "This horse had some minor issues as a yearling, but he has proved that he can gallop. He has a great mind and this sale has been tremendously successful for us.

"We are delighted to have bought him, and in fact are quite surprised to have managed to get him. He is exactly the sort of horse we are looking for. He will be trained in Newmarket."

The second top price for the day was 400,000 guineas for the Siyouni colt out of the Shirocco mare Acentela, consigned from Church Farm & Horse Park Stud. The sale was a massive pinhooking triumph after being purchased for 62,000 euros as a yearling. He will go into training with Kevin Ryan.

"We loved him when we saw him, he is a lovely big sort," said John Cullinan of Horse Park Stud. "We are a big fan of the sire and have had some luck with him—they are obviously getting more difficult to get hold of now. Alban Chevalier du Fau of The Channel Consignment highly recommended this horse.

"He did a great breeze this week and is a gorgeous sound horse. He started with me and then went to Roger (Marley) in January—and survived both of us!"

Hillen was delighted with his purchase.

"It is more than we thought we'd have to pay, but the market is savage and if you want horses you have to get involved," he reported. "All the rumors ahead of this sale were correct and it has proved to be strong with lots of new people involved."

"This has been a very good Craven breeze up sale, and as well as sincere thanks to all the buyers who have made the sale such a success, we really must pay tribute to the consignors," said Tattersalls chairman Edmond Mahony. "Yet again they have brought an outstanding collection of 2-year-olds to Europe's premier breeze up sale.

"To see the average and median increase by such wide margins is a clear indication of the extraordinary strength of demand at the top of the market, and the equally extraordinary growth in this sector of the European bloodstock market. At the turn of the century the average price at the Craven breeze up sale was less than 25,000 guineas, and the median was 20,000 guineas... Owners, trainers and agents from all over the world target the Craven breeze up sale because it consistently produces top-class racehorses, and the combination of regular buyers competing with new faces has produced a sale of sustained strength from start to finish." BH

WHITECLIFFSOFDOVER TOPS DAY AT NEWMARKET

Ith Newmarket's Guineas symphony a little more than a fortnight away, the historic racing venue staged a pair of preludes April 19.

Perennial powerhouse Coolmore unleashed a viable Two Thousand Guineas (G1) candidate in Whitecliffsofdover, a Kentucky-bred son of War Front, who took the listed bet365 European Free Handicap, the opening stakes on the Newmarket card.

Seven 3-year-olds faced the starter for the sevenfurlong trip. Cheveley Park Stud's Private Matter (Mayson) led the field through the first furlong before Whitecliffsofdover assumed control.

Ridden by Ryan Moore for trainer Aidan O'Brien, the bay colt raced smoothly, picking up the pace after three furlongs and quickening when Moore asked, galloping to the wire by 2 3/4 lengths over fellow Kentucky-bred Rodaini (Exchange Rate) in his 2017 debut. Seventh Heaven (Frankel) finished third another three-quarter lengths behind Rodaini.

Whitecliffsofdover accomplished the trip in 1:24.68 over the good to firm going.

Claiborne Farm bred Whitecliffsofdover, who is out of the A.P. Indy mare Orate, a full sister to the successful stallion Pulpit (a connection of some significance to War Front), and offered him at the 2015 Keeneland September yearling sale where M.V. Magnier signed the winning ticket for \$1,150,000.

The youngster races for the Coolmore triumvirate of Susan Magnier, Michael Tabor, and Derrick Smith, and was group 1-placed last year in the Qatar Prix Jean-Luc Lagardere-Grand Criterium Sponsored by Al Hazm.

With the win in the European Free Handicap, Whitecliffsofdover became the 59th stakes winner for Claiborne's son of Danzia. He is also the fourth blacktype winner by War Front out of A.P. Indy mares from 14 foals 3-year-olds and up, a whopping 28.6%, joining grade 2 winner On Leave, grade 3 winner Journey Home, and stakes winner Bolting.

Whitecliffsofdover is out of a full sister to Pulpit, which presents an interesting relationship with War Front. Pulpit is the broodmare sire of six of War Front's 59 stakes winners from 26 foals 3-year-olds and up (23.1%).

Altogether the Seattle Slew broodmare sire line has produced 12 of 59 stakes winners (20.3%). Stepping back a generation, Danzig was quite successful with Seattle Slew mares, producing seven black-type winners from 33 foals (21.2%).

The group 3 Lanwades Stud Nell Gwyn Stakes for 3-year-old fillies was the third stakes on the day's Newmarket card. A seven-furlong prep for the Newmarket's One Thousand Guineas (G1), the Nell Gwyn attracted a field of 11.

Coolmore's Kentucky-bred War Front filly Roly Poly was the 7-2 favorite, but at the wire Abdullah Saeed Al Naboodah's Daban took the prize by three-quarters of a length for trainer John Gosden and jockey Frankie Dettori. A flying Dettori dismount revealed the jubilance the victor's 12-1 win had on the connections.

Unforgetable Filly (Sepoy) finished second and Poet's Vanity (Poet's Voice) was third. Roly Poly's rally sputtered and she finished seventh. The final time was 1:24.42, just under the time for the European Free Handicap group.

Kildaragh Stud bred the Nell Gwyn winner in Ireland and Blandford Bloodstock purchased her for \$398,826. A half sister to group winner Thikriyaat, Daban is by Acclamation (Royal Applause) out of Malaspina, a Whipper half sister to group 3 stakes winner Albisola (Montjeu).

Newmarket's group 3 Earl of Sefton Stakes over nine furlongs was won by Steel of Madrid. The 4-yearold son of Lope de Vega (Shamardal) out of the Royal Applause mare Bibury is trained by Richard Hannon for owner Michael Pescod. Jeddah Bloodstock bred Steel of Madrid in Ireland. BH

STANFORD SEEKS CHARLES TOWN CLASSIC REPEAT

Based on his victory in last year's Charles Town Classic (G2) and an impressive last-out win, Stanford seems a likely favorite for the \$1.25 million race for older horses coming up April 22.

The 5-year-old son of Malibu Moon—Rosy Humor, by Distorted Humor, races for Barbara Banke's Stonestreet Stables, along with the Coolmore triumvirate of Susan Magnier, Michael Tabor, and Derrick Smith.

Trained by Todd Pletcher, Stanford took a slightly different route to West Virginia's eastern panhandle for his title defense than he took in 2016. Last year, the WinStar-bred horse came into the Charles Town Classic off of consecutive runner-up efforts at Gulfstream Park in the Gulfstream Park Handicap (G2) and Fred Hooper Stakes (G3)—both one-turn events. This year Stanford comes into the three-turn Charles Town Classic off three consecutive two-turn races in Florida.

After a six-month break following last summer's Metropolitan Handicap (G1), Stanford led every step of the way to win the Harlan's Holiday Stakes (G3) and came up a head short against Imperative—a horse he'll meet again this time out—in the \$400,000 Poseidon Handicap at Gulfstream. In his most recent start, Stanford blitzed an overmatched group of opponents in a track-record performance in Tampa Bay Downs' March 11 Challenger Stakes.

Stanford was equipped with blinkers for the first time in the Challenger, a change his trainer thinks can move his colt up even further.

"The main objective with putting the blinkers on was keeping him focused throughout the race," Pletcher said. "Sometimes it can be difficult to make an equipment change on a horse you've had so much success with, but it had been in the back of my mind to try it with him."

Hall of Fame jockey John Velazquez will be aboard Stanford for the third consecutive time as he seeks his (continued on page 19)

first win in the Charles Town Classic, while Pletcher aims for his third.

In his quest to join Researcher as the only Charles Town Classic winner in consecutive years, Stanford has been installed as the 8-5 morning-line favorite.

Stanford isn't the only past Charles Town Classic winner. Imperative will become the first horse to start in four Classics and hopes to duplicate his 2014 effort, when he pulled off a shocker at 26-1. This year's run will be for a third trainer, as Bob Hess Jr. will do the honors after Richard Baltas conditioned the son of Bernardini in 2016 and George Papaprodromou did so in 2014-15.

Now owned by a partnership of Loooch Racing and Imaginary Stables, Imperative has enjoyed a level of local success that he's been unable to match elsewhere. In his three starts in the Charles Town Classic, Imperative has banked \$1,342,500

"He loves the track configuration at Charles Town," Hess said. "I think he loves that surface being a little kinder. Javier (Castellano) worked him the other day and he's really happy with how's he's doing."

Castellano will try to pilot Imperative to a second Charles Town Classic triumph after guiding Stanford to his win last year. So far, the pairing of Imperative and Castellano has left Hess encouraged.

"The horse is quirky, and he and Javier seem to have really clicked in the morning, so we'll leave it up to the two experts," Hess said. "But Javier certainly knows the track well there, and that's a plus."

Loooch Racing principle Ron Paolucci will have more than just Imperative in the gate come Saturday, as he also sends out War Story and Cautious Giant.

The Charles Town Classic isn't without a hometown angle, as trainer Jason Servis—a Charles Town native will send out 2016 Withers Stakes (G3) winner and multiple grade 1-placed Sunny Ridge for Dennis Drazin.

For the second consecutive year, Reddam Racing and Doug O'Neill will be represented as well. After finishing third with Donworth in 2016, the two-time Kentucky Derby Presented by Yum! Brands (G1) winning duo ships Gangster east after the son out of multiple graded stakes winner Miss Isella made his stakes debut with an eighth in last month's Santa Anita Handicap

Lady Sheila Stable's Matt King Coal has always been held in high regard by her connections after being purchased for \$250,000 at the Ocala Breeders' Sales 2-year-olds in training sale in April of 2015.

In 2016 the Florida-bred Matt King Coal was considered a Triple Crown contender following a frontrunning allowance score over eventual Toyota Blue Grass Stakes (G1) runner-up My Man Sam, but was sent to the sideline for seven months after tiring and finishing fourth in the Wood Memorial Stakes (G1). Since returning, he's locked down a pair of wins in three starts. BH





STABLEMATES COLLECTED, CUPID SQUARE OFF IN CALIFORNIAN

ollected and Cupid, a pair of Bob Baffert-trained runners who did their fair share of damage during their 3-year-old campaigns, will face each other and a unique field in the \$200,000 Californian Stakes (G2) April 22 at Santa Anita Park.

Speedway Stable's Collected started his 4-yearold season in style April 1, when he bested former stablemate Dortmund to win the Santana Mile by 3 3/4 lengths at Santa Anita. In 2016, the son of City Zip won the Sham Stakes (G3), Sunland Park Festival of Racing Stakes, and Lexington Stakes (G3) before he ran 10th in the Preakness Stakes (G1).

Michael Tabor, Mrs. John Magnier, and Derrick Smith's Cupid will make his first start of the season in the 11/8-mile Californian. The Tapit colt made his impact on 2016 with wins in the Rebel Stakes (G2), Indiana Derby (G2), and West Virginia Derby (G2), which were sprinkled between off-the-board finishes in the Arkansas Derby (G1), Easy Goer Stakes, and Pennsylvania Derby (G2).

The main challenger to the Baffert pair appears to be proven allowance winner Follow Me Crev, who finished third last time out in the Santa Anita Handicap (G1). It was the first graded stakes placing for the 5-yearold Quality Road gelding, who finished fourth or fifth in

his three previous graded tries.

The other three entrants, however, found their footing on a different surface recently. Although they have ample dirt experience, Prime Attraction and Prospect Park are coming off optional-claiming allowance wins on the Santa Anita grass, while Warren Williamson's Texas Ryano is scheduled to make his dirt debut in the Californian.

A 6-year-old son of Curlin, Texas Ryano is trained by Carla Gaines and has made all 20 starts of his career on turf, including his lone graded score in the Hollywood Turf Cup (G2T) at Del Mar Nov. 25.

Gaines said the switch in surfaces came for a variety of reasons, including the potential breeding aspects of winning a graded dirt race to add to his grass accomplishments. Another aspect is that Texas Ryano's come-from-behind running style is often hampered by slow paces he's encountered in longer turf races, so his connections feel a faster pace to run at, even on a different surface, could aid him.

Pam and Martin Wygod's Prospect Park last won on dirt early during his 3-year-old season in 2015, but the son of Tapit has won or placed in nine of his 11 starts on the main track. In his three starts this year, Prospect Park ran a far-back fourth in a sloppy San Pasqual (G2), finished a head behind stakes winner Papacoolpapacool in a grass allowance Feb. 5, then won another turf allowance by 3 1/4 lengths last time out March 9.

"It's hard to say which he likes the best. When he

runs his race, he runs his race," trainer Cliff Sise said of the 2015 La Jolla Handicap (G3T) winner. "The strength of this race—it's not the toughest—and his breeding (went into the decision to run on dirt again). You can put a line through (the San Pasqual). I thought he was bred great for the mud, but he hated it."

D P Racing's Prime Attraction showed versatility in his last two starts for trainer Jim Cassidy. The 4-year-old Unbridled's Song colt came from off the pace to take a 1 1/16mile allowance on the main track Feb. 25. then dueled on the lead and prevailed to win in another allowance on the grass by 11/4 lengths last time out. BH

THE MISSION WINS GROUP 1 **CHAMPAGNE STAKES**

he group 1 Champagne Stakes at Randwick April 15 produced an interesting winner as The Mission (Choisir) led all the way to score a powerful victory over group 1 winner Invader (Snitzel).

Prepared by Paul Perry, the headstrong juvenile achieved what his sire could not as Choisir, also trained by Perry, was third in the 1,600 meter (about one mile) Champagne back in 2002.

Choisir returned at 3 to become the world's best sprinter, posting wins in the King's Stand Stakes (G2) and Golden Jubilee Stakes (G1) at Royal Ascot, making him and his trainer national heroes.

Perry purchased The Mission for just AU\$32,500 at the Magic Millions yearling sale. Out of the Redoute's Choice mare My Amelia, the colt carries a 3 x 3 cross of Danehill.

Doubling up to champion sire Danehill is a practice that polarizes Australian breeders. Throughout the world, horses bred with a double cross of Danehill within

five generations has achieved 46.7% winners to runners with some 1,215 winners, including 57 stakes-winners.

The Mission is one of four group 1 winners bred on the Danehill cross, but only the second in Australia.

The double cross has produced a flurry of juvenile stakes winners this season including Gunnison, Debellatio, and Single Bullet, providing more evidence for a growing perception that the tide may at last be turning. BH

NOOR: THE 1950 NEMESIS OF CITATION

■ n 1948, Calumet Farm's Citation was the scourge of Thoroughbred racing in the United States.

With his Sherman-esque march through the Triple Crown and the major handicap races against older horses, his career ended with 19 wins from 20 starts and honors as champion 3-year-old male, champion older male, and Horse of the Year.

An osselet derailed his entire 4-year-old campaign, but in 1950 the son of Bull Lea—Hydroplane II, by Hyperion, launched his comeback campaign at Santa Anita Park, winning an allowance race in the slop before the unthinkable happened: he lost.

Granted, he was carrying 130 pounds and gave 16 pounds to the winner, Miche, and was beaten only a neck, but this was a foreshadowing of the year to come.

A second loss under 130 pounds, this time to stablemate and fellow Derby winner Ponder (128), followed in the San Antonio Handicap. Finishing third behind the Calumet pair that day was Charles S. Howard's Noor (114), a son of Nasrullah, who became a major foil in Citation's return and left tarnish marks on the champion's otherwise sterling record.

Howard bought and imported Noor from England in late 1949. In five 1950 meetings between the two, the San Antonio was the only time Citation finished ahead of Noor.

Citation's two out-of-character defeats did little to diminish the burden placed on him. Facing the starter two weeks later and a familiar cast of runners in the Santa Anita Handicap, he shouldered 132 pounds. Noor, with a 22-pound advantage at 110 over a 10-furlong trip, delivered Citation his worst defeat, finishing 11/4 lengths ahead of him with Calumet's filly Two Lea (113) a length back in third.

One week separated the Santa Anita Handicap from Santa Anita's other big distance race for older horses, the San Juan Capistrano Handicap. Noor picked up seven pounds (117) and Citation lost two (130) for this 11th running of the 14-furlong event, which, now a grade 3 on the turf, celebrates its 78th renewal April 22.

In addition to the two rivals, six other horses lined up in the starting gate, but to little avail as a virtual match race between Noor and Citation ensued.

Citation, under jockey Steve Brooks, took command of the race after a mile and Noor, with Johnny Longden in the irons, bided his time in sixth. After 12 furlongs, the real running began, with Citation a head to the good of Noor, who had eight lengths on the rest of the field. Showing great heart through the remainder of the stretch, the two matched in a rhythmic dance to the finish. Noor on the outside, Citation on the inside. Breath for breath. Stride for stride.

The photo that separated them at the wire showed Noor had exhaled at the right moment, winning by the flare of a nostril.

Noor defeated Citation twice more that year, in the Forty-Niners Handicap and the Golden Gate Handicap, both at Golden Gate Fields in June. While Citation got a well-deserved rest, Noor took his tack East to finish second in the Manhattan Handicap and Jockey Club Gold Cup before returning to the West and claiming the Hollywood Gold Cup. Noor was named champion older male in 1950.

Today the rivals who were never far apart on the racetrack, are not that separated in death. Noor died in 1974 at age 29 and was buried at Loma Rica Ranch in California until development of the property brought him to Kentucky. He was exhumed in 2011 and now lies at Old Friends near Georgetown. Citation died in 1970 at age 25 and was buried at Calumet Farm in Lexington. BH


