

SHARP HORSEMEN BRED DERBY CONTENDER ALWAYS DREAMING

You'd be forgiven for assuming Santa Rosa Partners is a Thoroughbred syndicate formed by San Francisco techies enthralled with horse racing.

"It does sound like California, when instead we're two Irish paddies," laughed Mike Ryan, a prominent bloodstock agent who co-owns Santa Rosa Partners with Dromoland Farm owner Gerry Dilger. The two did not waste much time coming up with a business name, which they got from a beach they visited near Destin in the Florida panhandle.

Santa Rosa is only one of several names that Ryan and Dilger have used during the 20 years they've bred horses together. They first began working together about 30 years ago as pinhookers, but now focus on broodmares. What the two seasoned horsemen call themselves as breeders isn't important to them. Their priorities are picking out quality mares, identifying promising matings, and raising athletic horses for the commercial market with the utmost attention to detail.

Though only a four-mare operation, the venture branded as Santa Rosa Partners found quick success when the partners bought grade 3 winner Above Perfection for \$450,000 out of the ClassicStar dispersal held during Fasig-Tipton's 2006 November sale. The then-8-year-old daughter of In Excess was carrying a filly by Dixie Union, who sold through the Dromoland Farm consignment for \$340,000 to W.K. Warren Jr. at the Fasig-Tipton Saratoga select yearling sale. She grew up to be grade 1 winner Hot Dixie Chick, the first stakes winner and first graded stakes winner bred under the Santa Rosa name.

"Above Perfection is a good-sized mare, 16.1, and very deep mare," said Ryan. "She has a lot of In Excess in her; she was very fast. She was second in the Prioress (Stakes, G1) to Xtra Heat, and that race is worth watching again. I don't think you've ever seen two horses go as hard from gate-to-wire as that particular race. The two of them broke in tandem and ran in tandem all the way around, and finished separated by a nose."

Beside her speed and obviously competitiveness, Ryan said they were attracted to Above Perfection because she has no inbreeding in the first five generations.

"That's hard to find," he remarked.

Since 2007, Above Perfection has been bred to Speightstown, twice to Hard Spun, to Tapit, and to Bernardini. When grade 1 winner and Kentucky Derby Presented by Yum! Brands (G1) runner-up Bodemeister entered stud in 2013, Ryan was one of the early believers in WinStar Farm's son of Empire Maker.

"When I went out to WinStar to look at him, I bought a share in him," Ryan said. "I thought he was one of the most magnificent specimens of a stallion that I had seen in a number of years. He's a pretty special-looking horse, and I've bred to him every year."

Ryan and Dilger's instinct were dead-on and resulted in Santa Rosa's second grade 1 winner, Xpressbet Florida Derby (G1) winner Always Dreaming.

Santa Rosa sold the colt for \$350,000 to agent Steve Young though the 2015 Keeneland September yearling sale. He is now owned by a cadre that includes Brooklyn Boyz Stables, Teresa Viola Racing Stables, St. Elias Stables, MeB Racing Stables, Siena Farm, and West Point Thoroughbreds.

After placing twice at 2, Always Dreaming started his sophomore campaign with a barn-burner Jan. 25 when he broke his maiden by 11 1/2 lengths at Tampa Bay Downs. He carried that momentum into a 1 1/8-mile allowance race at Gulfstream Park, which he won by four lengths.

Trainer Todd Pletcher knew he had a live horse for the Florida Derby, and he was right. The colt tracked speedball Three Rules for the first six furlongs, then kicked clear in the stretch to win by five lengths. The final time of 1:47.47 was less than three-quarters of a second off the track record set Jan. 28 by Arrogate in the Pegasus World Cup Invitational Stakes (G1). In the Florida Derby he also beat Xpressbet Fountain of Youth Stakes (G2) and \$1 million Delta Downs Jackpot Stakes (G2) winner Gunnevera.

Always Dreaming continues on a solid track toward the first Saturday in May. He breezed five furlongs April 21 at Palm Beach Downs in 1:01.40, a move that Pletcher described as a "nice, steady, stamina-building breeze."

"He was very relaxed, very happy, moving well, and galloped out great," the trainer said. "I was very happy. He's been training great, eating well, (and his) energy level has been good. We're really excited about how he's doing."

Always Dreaming will ship to Churchill Downs April 25. Ryan, who makes most of the mating decisions for Santa Rosa, said he could not be happier to see the cross with Bodemeister produce such a nice horse.

"It is very rewarding. You support a horse and own a share in him, and then breed a good one by him," he said. "It is extra special when you still own the mare."

Dilger said Always Dreaming has exuded quality since the day he was born at Dromoland.

"He would always catch your eye," he said. "You'd see him out there among five or six of them and he always stood out. He had plenty of size and scope and strength. He was obvious. I could have never told you he would be a Derby horse, but I always knew he was a nice horse—shoulder, length, hip, and (good) legs."

Besides the rewards of breeding a grade 1 winner and Derby contender, Dilger gets the benefit of having sold him.

Dromoland has now sold two yearlings in consecutive years that became Florida Derby winners. In 2014 the operation sold Nyquist at the Keeneland September sale for \$230,000. The son of Ashford Stud's hot sire Uncle Mo was a pinhook for Dilger, Ted Campion, and Pat Costello, who had purchased him for \$180,000 at the 2013 Keeneland November sale. Ryan bought Nyquist as a pinhook with Niall Brennan, who sold him for \$400,000 to Dennis O'Neill at the 2015 Fasig-Tipton Gulfstream sale.

Racing for J. Paul Reddam, Nyquist became a champion and won seven graded stakes, including last year's Kentucky Derby.

Ryan continues to be high on Nyquist, and is breeding Above Perfection back to the first-year Darley stallion this year.

"He is a horse I really, really believe in, and I'm biased because we bought him as a yearling," he said. "But I'm breeding three or four mares to him; I love him."

So what would it mean to Dromoland's yearling consignments to potentially sell two Kentucky Derby winners back-to-back?

"To have two Florida Derby winners has been really important for us at the sales, because to sell horses well is great, but they have to go on with the new owner, they have to perform," Dilger said. "It also shows you can raise good horses, which I attribute to my staff— Peter Conway (farm manager), Dennis Fenton (yearling foreman), and Theresa Shone (office manager).

"Also, we're not selling huge numbers every year; at the most we sell 30-50 for the whole year," he said. "So if this horse can go on and win that first Saturday, it is a great accomplishment for the farm. This horse, he did everything right. If they were all that way, we'd be blessed." **BH**



Battle of Midway, runner-up in the Santa Anita Derby (G1) and 17th on the Kentucky Derby leaderboard, has been purchased in partnership by WinStar Farm and Don Alberto Stable from Rick Porter's Fox Hill Farm.

The Smart Strike colt will remain in training with Jerry Hollendorfer as he prepares for a start in the May 6 Kentucky Derby Presented by Yum! Brands (G1). Flavien Prat has the Derby mount.

"We are excited to join with WinStar on such an exciting racing prospect," said Fernando Diaz-Valdes of Don Alberto Stable. "Battle of Midway has shown tremendous potential, and we feel he is an excellent prospect for the Kentucky Derby and beyond. We have the utmost respect for Mr. Porter and the job he and his team have done in developing Battle of Midway, and we appreciate the opportunity to campaign him going forward."

"We very much look forward to our partnership with Don Alberto on Battle of Midway, and we believe this colt has a bright future as both a racehorse and stallion prospect," said WinStar president and CEO Elliott Walden. "Physically, it's easy to see why he was picked out at the Saratoga Select sale by Tom McGreevy, who's one of the best

judges of a horse in the game.

"Battle of Midway ran well in the Santa Anita Derby after being hounded through fast fractions, and he has a lot of qualities that make him an exciting Kentucky Derby contender. When you think about him being one of the last top colts by Smart Strike—a proven sire of sires, you can't help but to think about his potential down the road as a stallion."

A \$410,000 Fasig-Tipton New York Saratoga select yearling sale purchase by Fox Hill in 2015 from the Gainesway consignment, Battle of Midway broke his maiden at first asking in January at Santa Anita Park. The bay colt stopped the clock in 1:09 flat for six furlongs.

After placing in the San Vicente Stakes (G2) in his second start, he

stretched out to capture a loaded Santa Anita allowance race before his valiant runner-up effort in the \$1 million Santa Anita Derby earlier this month. In the Santa Anita Derby, he set a fast and contested pace before finishing a half-length short at the wire of the 1 1/8-mile test.

The performance earned Battle of Midway 40 points toward this year's Kentucky Derby, qualifying him for the 1 1/4-mile classic. Plans call for Battle of Midway to train at his home base of Santa Anita before shipping to Churchill Downs the week of the Derby.

An earner of \$290,000 from four starts to date, Battle of Midway is out of the grade 1-winning Concerto mare Rigoletta. **BH**

BLUE GRASS HERO IRAP STEADY IN ONE-MILE MOVE

To the untrained eye, Doug O'Neill was in the midst of a wicked case of deja vu the morning of April 21. He was hiking up the Keeneland horse path behind his leading candidate on the Road to the Kentucky Derby with reporters on each elbow, asking if he thinks he can add to his place in history as the rare trainer with multiple triumphs on the first Saturday in May.

The basics are the same, but the horse bringing the affable conditioner to this point couldn't be more different than the star of morning activities at the track this time last year. Then, O'Neill was trying to get an unbeaten champion to remain just that in the biggest race of his life. This time around, he has the relaxed look of a man playing with house money—one who might actually have as good a chance as any at hitting the May 6 jackpot.

J. Paul Reddam's Irap, the upstart son of Tiznow who broke his maiden with a three-quarter length win

in the April 8 Toyota Blue Grass Stakes (G2), put in his first move since that shocker when he worked a mile in 1:44 at Keeneland Friday morning in preparation for the Kentucky Derby Presented by Yum! Brands (G1).

O'Neill is the enviable spot of seeking his second straight Derby triumph and third win in that classic overall, having conditioned I'll Have Another to victory in 2012 and saddled then-unbeaten juvenile champion Nyquist to the triumph last year. O'Neill trained Nyquist at Keeneland in the month leading up to his Derby victory, and in the vein of not fixing what is not broken, is applying some of the same routine to Irap.

As he often did with Nyquist, O'Neill had Irap start off in a two-minute lick before picking it up under jockey Julien Leparoux. The colt remained steady throughout, clocking splits of :15, :29, :41 1/5, :53, 1:06, and 1:30. Leparoux—who will pilot champion Classic Empire for trainer Mark Casse in the Kentucky Derby—was on Irap for the first time since guiding the horse to his Blue Grass upset.

"He felt good. That's what Doug wanted. He did it pretty easy," said Leparoux, who also worked fellow

Derby contender State of Honor for Casse at Churchill Downs earlier Friday morning. "He changed leads today, so that's great. He came back with good energy, happy, and Doug is happy, so I'm happy too."

O'Neill was typically laid back as he discussed the colt his brother Dennis picked out for \$300,000 at the 2016 Ocala Breeders' Sales' March 2-year-olds in training sale. Irap was without a win in seven starts prior to the Blue Grass, though he did have runner-up efforts in the Los Alamitos Cash Call Futurity (G1) and Robert B. Lewis Stakes (G3).

Neither O'Neill nor Reddam hid their surprise when Irap hit the wire in front in the Blue Grass, besting a field that included previously unbeaten multiple graded stakes winner McCraken. Though he is a half brother to champion sprinter and sire Speightstown, O'Neill said they had confidence in the fact Irap would be one to improve over a route of ground.

"Being a son of Tiznow and a half to Speightstown, you looked at him as a horse that had a lot of potential and he's a horse that never gets tired in the mornings," O'Neill said. "If he gets a running start, he can show a little speed, but away from the gate, he's just not a true one-turn kind of horse. We knew he was going to take time and here we are, it's going the right way.

"We knew he was an outsider going into the Blue Grass, but we had faith in him and to see him run the way we hoped he would have run earlier was pretty phenomenal. We figured it was our last chance to have a chance at the big dance with him."

The wide-open nature of this year's 3-year-old class has the trainer quietly gaining confidence that he may just have one peaking at the right moment.

"He's got tremendous amounts of stamina. I think he's been crying out for nine furlongs or farther, and it just took him a while to get those kinds of races going," O'Neill said. "We're just hoping that he can spring off the Blue Grass win and do something special here in a few weeks."

With wet weather slated to move into the area, several trainers moved their planned works up a day. One of those was Chad Brown, who sent multiple grade 1 winner and Blue Grass runner-up Practical Joke through a four-furlong move Friday in :49 4/5 at Keeneland.

Working in company with Ticonderoga to his outside, Practical Joke was under a good hold as he broke off and clocked splits of :12 3/5 :24 4/5, and :37 2/5, finishing up about a neck in front with a gallop out in 1:01 3/5.

"I got him galloping out three-quarters (of a mile) in 1:15 and change, so it was a good, steady work," Brown said.

Brown added Practical Joke will ship to Churchill April 24 and likely have his final move April 28. The son of Into Mischief captured the Hopeful Stakes (G1) and Champagne Stakes (G1) last fall and has not been worse than third in six career starts.

"He sustained his run in the Blue Grass and ran the best number of his life, and he seems to have come out of it with a good energy level," Brown said. "He's a horse that continues to move forward and has been ultra consistent. He's shown up for us six straight races in a row, and I'm hoping that consistency continues for us in the Derby."

Tapwrit, fifth in the Blue Grass and winner of the Lambholm South Tampa Bay Derby (G2), also worked in company Friday at Keeneland, covering five furlongs in 1:01 2/5 in preparation for his expected Kentucky Derby run.

"He got hung out pretty wide on the turn and ran kind of a flat race, but he seemed to come out well," trainer Todd Pletcher said of the Blue Grass. "Hopefully, he trains accordingly and comes back to his Tampa form."

Also on the Friday tab at Keeneland were Longines Kentucky Oaks (G1) contenders Daddys Lil Darling, who worked a bullet half-mile in :47 2/5 with jockey Robby Albarado aboard for trainer Kenny McPeek, and Dorothy Matz's Gulfstream Park Oaks (G2) runner-up Tequilita.

Second in the April 8 Central Bank Ashland Stakes (G1) last out, Normandy Farm's Daddys Lil Darling will have her final pre-Oaks work at Keeneland next week and then ship to Churchill May 1.

Tequilita, a homebred daughter of Union Rags, worked five furlongs in 1:02 2/5 under exercise rider Jo Saville for trainer Michael Matz.

"She will go to Churchill on Wednesday and have her final work for the Oaks there," Matz said. **BH**

STATE OF HONOR, SALTY BREEZE FOR CASSE AT CHURCHILL

Pressbet Florida Derby (G1) runner-up State of Honor and Gulfstream Park Oaks (G2) winner Salty both put in five-furlong moves for trainer Mark Casse April 21 at Churchill Downs in preparation for the May 6 Kentucky Derby Presented by Yum! Brands (G1) and the May 5 Longines Kentucky Oaks (G1), getting their works out of the way a day earlier than planned because of storms in the forecast.

Ontario-bred State of Honor, by To Honor and Serve, worked alone and completed the breeze in 1:01 3/5, with splits in :13, :26, :37 2/5, and a gallop out to six furlongs in 1:14 and seven in 1:27 4/5.

"We decided that we're not going to breeze him with anybody, he kind of gets a little too wound up early," Casse said, adding that the colt will likely breeze once more before the Derby. "He went off slow but he finished up really well, and galloped out strong.

"He likes it," Casse said of how the colt is taking to the Churchill track. "I watched him breeze on Easter Sunday (four furlongs in :49 4/5) and he gets over it really nicely."

Jockey Julien Leparoux was aboard State of Honor for his move before going to Keeneland to work Toyota Blue Grass Stakes (G2) winner Irap.

"He went very good," Leparoux said. "He relaxed early and finished up very strong. He felt very good, we were happy with him.

"He's been running very good all winter... he tries hard all of the time," Leparoux said of Conrad Farm's homebred colt, who was also runner-up in the Lambolm South Tampa Bay Derby (G2) and third in the Sam F. Davis Stakes (G3).

Gary Barber, Baccari Racing, and Chester Prince's Salty worked in company with Barber's Summer Luck. The duo was credited with five furlongs in 1:00 2/5, with splits of :13, :24 4/5, :36 3/5, and a gallop out to six furlongs in 1:13 2/5 and seven in 1:27 3/5.

"(Salty) worked really well. Norman's comment was:

'Wow,' " Casse said of assistant trainer Norm Casse's reaction. "She'll do the same thing, she'll come back with an easy work next Friday. Everything is good."

Reining juvenile champion Classic Empire, who most recently won the Arkansas Derby (G1) April 15, also stretched his legs on the Churchill track Friday morning and is doing well, the trainer said.

Casse also offered an update on 2015 Canadian Horse of the Year Catch a Glimpse, who most recently ran off the board in the Coolmore Jenny Wiley Stakes (G1T). Casse said there are no immediate plans for the daughter of City Zip but that the Nassau Stakes (G2T) at Woodbine May 27 could be a possible target. The filly won both of her only two starts at Woodbine, including the grade 2 Natalma Stakes as a juvenile.

"We're thinking that maybe she'll go the Nassau at Woodbine for her next start," he said. "She's good, she's just kind of chilling since her last race." **BH**

GUNNEVERA TAKES FIVE-FURLONG WORK IN STRIDE

G unnevera walked the shedrow without taking as much as a single deep breath following his five-furlong workout April 21 at Gulfstream Park West, continuing to amaze trainer Antonio Sano.

"Never in my life have I had a horse that is like this after a race (or a workout)," Sano marveled. "He never breathes hard; (needs) no water."

Only minutes earlier, Gunnevera breezed five furlongs in 1:01 and galloped out six furlongs in 1:14 1/5 in preparation for a scheduled start in the May 6 Kentucky Derby Presented by Yum! Brands (G1) at Churchill Downs.

"The horse did it very easy. I'm very happy," Sano said. "He galloped out good."

Jockey Edgard Zayas, as usual, was aboard the 3-year-old son of Dialed In for the breeze, the thirdfastest of 15 recorded at the five-furlong distance.

"Last week he was a little bit lazy. Today, he was a

little bit better, but he's kind of a lazy horse. He finished strong today. He went really good in the stretch," Zayas said. "I think he'll be good for the Derby now."

Javier Castellano, who rode Gunnevera to victories in the Saratoga Special Stakes (G2), the \$1 million Delta Downs Jackpot Stakes (G3), and the Xpressbet Fountain of Youth (G2), has the Derby mount.

Gunnevera, who finished a late-closing third behind Always Dreaming and State of Honor in the \$1 million Xpressbet Florida Derby (G1) at Gulfstream April 1, is scheduled to van to Churchill April 22, leaving Gulfstream Park West at 8 a.m. EDT and stopping in Georgia for six hours before continuing on to Kentucky.

Sano is scheduled to fly to Louisville April 24, while Gunnevera is slated to get acquainted with the Churchill surface April 25.

Sano regarded Friday's breeze as Gunnevera's last major workout for the Kentucky Derby and is still unsure if he will schedule an official move over the Churchill surface. Although Gunnevera impressed him in his final local pre-Derby exercise, Sano admits to being a little keyed up looking ahead to his first Derby experience.

"I'm nervous every day. I need to relax," Sano said. "I know the race won't be easy with 20 horses, but my horse is very good."

Sano, however, has no qualms about Gunnevera being up to the task of negotiating the 1 1/4mile distance of the Derby.

"I think the mile and a quarter will be better," he said. "I think there will be a lot of speed in the race. The stretch is very long. I think it's better for me." BH





FLAGSHIP STALLION CAPE CROSS DIES

Cape Cross, a foundation sire of Godolphin and Darley's global breeding operation, has been euthanized due to the complications of old age. He was 23.

Bred by Sheikh Mohammed out of champion group 1 winner Park Appeal, the son of Green Desert was a group 1 winner in Godolphin colors when he won the 1998 Juddmonte Lockinge Stakes (G1) at Newbury. He added victories in the 1999 Queen Anne Stakes (G2) and Celebration Mile (G2) to his accomplishments before retiring to stud.

Cape Cross was a phenomenal success in the breeding shed. A champion first-year sire, he produced in that crop two-time Eclipse Award-winner Ouija Board, champion turf mare of 2004 and 2006 in the United States.

European Horse of the Year and six-time group 1 winner Sea The Stars and Epsom Derby (G1) winner Golden Horn were also among his progeny. He was one of only 17 stallions to have produced more than one Epsom Derby winner.

Joe Osborne, managing director of Godophin, Ireland, where Cape Cross stood at Kildangan Stud in the Northern Hemisphere, said the stallion was hugely influential—particularly in Darley's formative years, when he became the flagship of the operation.

"He has been an integral part of the Godolphin and Darley stories, and an integral part of Kildangan," Osborne

said. "He was our first major success as a stallion. He was champion first-season sire, making an immediate impact, and went on to sire a collection of outstanding racehorses, who left their mark in some of the world's great races.

"As an individual, he was the boss. You did it his way. He very much ruled the roost."

In 2000, Cape Cross started shuttling to the Southern Hemisphere, first to Sir Patrick Hogan's Cambridge Stud in New Zealand, then to Kelvinside stud in Australia. He was retired from stallion duties in 2016.

The eight champions by Cape Cross earned honors in England, France, Germany, Hong Kong, Ireland, Italy, New Zealand, Saudi Arabia, Switzerland, Turkey, United Arab Emirates, and the United States. From 1,591 starters, he sired 1,061 winners. Among them were 54 graded black-type winners and 108 black-type winners. **BH**

Hip 886, a Pioneerof the Nile colt consigned by Eddie Woods, Agent, turned in the session's only three-eighths mile work, clocked in :34 1/5. The colt is a half brother to stakes placed Dragon Mall out of stakes winner Petition the Lady, by Petionville.



"It's a starting point for her. She's not an easy horse to train and it's time to get her in the mix and get her




Jockey Jesse Campbell guides Caren to victory in the Carotene Stakes at Woodbine

JENDA'S AGENDA STRETCHES OUT IN WEBER CITY MISS

er career didn't get under way until the first week of January, but so far Jenda's Agenda has done nothing wrong. The undefeated filly will look to stretch her speed and talent April 22 in the \$125,000 Weber City Miss at Laurel Park.

For the second straight year, the Weber City Miss for 3-year-old fillies at about 1 1/16 miles is a "Win and You're In" event for the \$250,000 Black-Eyed Susan Stakes (G2) May 19 at Pimlico Race Course. The \$125,000 Federico Tesio Stakes, a "Win and You're In" race for the \$1.5 million Preakness Stakes (G1), is also on the Saturday card.

Bred by trainer Larry Jones and his wife, Cindy, out of their grade 2-winning Menifee mare Just Jenda, Jenda's Agenda is three-for-three in her young career. The Proud Citizen filly opened with a pair of wins at Fair Grounds Race Course & Slots over the winter, and followed up with a twolength triumph in her stakes debut, the one-mile Caesar's Wish March 18 at Laurel. Rick Porter's Fox Hill Farms purchased an interest following her unveiling.

Making her Caesar's Wish win even more impressive was the fact that Jenda's Agenda was unable to train much for the race, having been mostly confined to the barn due to cold temperatures that greeted Jones' stable on its return to Delaware Park from New Orleans.

"She ran very, very well," Jones said. "The thing about that race, I was just awful proud of surviving it. We had shipped her out of New Orleans and that filly had only been able to go to the track one day out of 12. She had been hung in the barn just having to (walk the) shed row for that, so I was just awful proud to get out of that race in one piece and with a victory.

"We've had five weeks now to get prepared for this, so we think we got her back up and ready to go. Any time you trade tracks you do all kinds of things and you just can't really get into full mode of training for a little while. We're happy right now. She had a really good breeze the other day and all is good."

Trevor McCarthy replaces regular rider Gabriel Saez aboard Jenda's Agenda, who has led at nearly every call through her first three races, though Jones said it has been more a matter of circumstance than necessity.

"She's just fast," he explained. "Actually in (the last race) we were third for a little while until Gabriel kind of tucked over behind them and came on up in there. He had an opportunity to get up between horses and kind of split, when he saw it was going to get tight when the outside horse started easing

down to crowd her and race-ride her a little bit. He just let her out a notch to get out of any trouble. She'll do whatever you tell her to. This filly is pretty push-button. So far she's answered all the questions that we've asked of her."

Two of the three horses that faced Jenda's Agenda in the Caesar's Wish, Forever Liesl and Star Super, return in the Weber City Miss.

Kallenberg Farms' Forever Liesl is making her fourth straight start at Laurel. She broke her maiden Dec. 31 and ran third in the seven-furlong Wide Country Stakes Feb. 18 prior to her runner-up finish in the Caesar's Wish.

Equine Prep's Star Super is the most experienced filly in the Weber City Miss with eight previous starts, the last six of them in stakes. She won the Jan. 21 Marshua Stakes and finished second in the Gin Talking Stakes and Smart Halo Stakes, all at Laurel, and was third in the Sorority Stakes last fall at Monmouth Park.

Sumaya U.S. Stable's Lights of Medina, an impressive maiden winner at Laurel March 26, is entered to make her stakes debut in the Weber City Miss. Trained by Todd Pletcher, she was heavily favored last time out in a one-mile maiden special weight, her fourth start and first at Laurel.

"She's a filly that we've always felt like had some real potential, and it was just a matter of kind of getting her stretched out a little bit. I think eventually down the road she's a filly that will appreciate plenty of distance," Pletcher said. "It's a little bit of a step up going from a maiden to a stake, but she's got a pretty good foundation of races underneath her for that."

George H. Hall's maiden winner Frank's Folly, fourth in the Jan. 15 Busanda Stakes at Aqueduct Racetrack in her only previous stakes try, completes the field. **BH**
