TRAINER IGNACIO CORREAS' CHAMPION STRING

One of the best teams in baseball history was the New York Yankees of the 1920s, whose famed batting order came to be known as "Murderer's Row." Tucked back Keeneland's Barn 70 off Rice Road, trainer Ignacio Correas IV has developed his own "Murderer's Row" of champions from his native Argentina.

The horseman, who worked under California trainer Bill Currin until his death in 2014 and later as a private trainer for Kevin Plank's Sagamore Farm, now calls Lexington home, but has a pipeline of South American talent unrivaled in the Northern Hemisphere. Three of the horses in his 32-horse stable were named champions in

Argentina April 19. Another was Argentina's Horse of Year in 2015.

Correas pulled his stars out of their stalls to show them off to *BloodHorse*:

Dona Bruja, named champion older female, won all three of her starts during the 2016-17 racing season, and finished her run Dec. 8 in San Isidro's Copa de Plata-Roberto Vasquez Mansilla-Internacional (G1) going 10 furlongs on the turf. She is a granddaughter of Bernstein out of a Nureyev mare, giving her a 5x3 Northern Dancer cross. Correas is planning on a summer campaign with Arlington International Racecourse's Modesty Handicap (G3T) in early July as a target.

Le Ken earned the champion 2-year-old male and champion miler title, but will need some time to acclimate according to Correas. In eight starts he has a record of 5-3-0. The bay son of Easing Along (Storm Cat—Cadillacing, by Alydar) out of La Yaca, by Hussonet, won the one-mile Joaquin S. de Anchorena (G1) Dec. 17 after

running second to Eragon in the group 1 Gran Premio Hipodromo De Palermo. Eragon shipped to the U.S. to compete in the Pegasus World Cup Invitational Stakes (G1) for Jim McIngvale, where he finished off the board.

Blue Prize, champion 3-year-old filly, is by Pure Prize out of the Not For Sale mare Blues for Sale and has been working steadily at Keeneland with three recorded works in April alone. Her last outing came last October, a neck victory in the group 1 Seleccion.

Also in the barn is Idolo Porteno (Jump Start—Idealidad, by Roy), who was Argentina's Horse of the Year for 2015 along with champion older male and champion stayer based on his win in his country's biggest race, the Carlos Pelligrini (G1). He's made four starts in the U.S. going back to March 2016 when he was third behind Upstart and Domains Rap in Oaklawn Park's Razorback Handicap (G3). Second in last year's Pimlico Special Handicap (G3) behind Noble Bird, he's

made one start this year, finishing fifth behind Stanford in Tampa Bay Downs' Challenger Stakes. Look for him the final week of Keeneland in an allowance race.

Not among that group of champions is perhaps his most successful horse to date, Diane Perkins' Kasaqui. The horse Correas jokes as his "allowance horse" in Argentina, has performed admirably since he clipped heels and failed to finish in last year's Woodford Reserve Turf Classic Stakes (G1T) at Churchill Downs.

In his next three starts he finished second in Churchill Downs' Wise Dan Stakes (G2T), won the Arlington Handicap (G3T), and was beaten a neck by Mondialiste in the Arlington Million XXXIV Stakes (G1T).

Back-to-back runner-up efforts at Tampa Bay Downs and Fair Grounds Race Course & Slots has set the 7-year-old son of Lasting Approval up for a repeat bid in the Turf Classic. Kasaqui won't be 34-1 this time around however, and he won't have the services of Robby Albarado. Correas and Perkins will make the move to Joe Bravo for the May 6 contest. **BH**

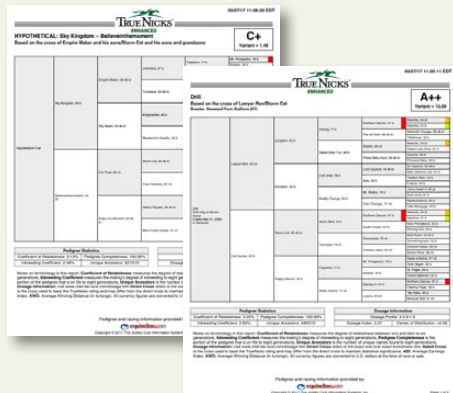

OBS SPRING SALE TO TEST DEPTH OF JUVENILE MARKET

There has been strong demand for 2-year-olds in training through the first four auctions of 2017, but the juvenile marketplace will undergo its stiffest test of depth April 25-28 when Ocala Breeders' Sales conducts its spring sale in Ocala, Fla.

With more than 1,200 head cataloged—274 have subsequently been withdrawn and others are likely to come out before the sale begins—the OBS sale offers a larger number and more diverse group of 2-year-olds than the four previous juvenile sales this year.

"April is a little bit different than some of the other sales," OBS sales director Tod Wojciechowski

said. "Because of its size, it attracts all sorts of different players."

With \$90.4 million generated through the first four sales, the juvenile market is up more than 12% in gross receipts this year, driven primarily by demand for the best-bred and best-conformed individuals.

So far, 47 horses sold for \$500,000 or above this year, with only three RNAs in that price range. By comparison, there were 28 such transactions during the first four juvenile sales of 2016, with three buy-backs at that level. The \$36.7 million grossed by the juveniles sold at the top of the market represents 40.5% of gross receipts for the four auctions, compared with \$21.4 million, or 27.3% of the total, at the same juncture a year ago.

"Hopefully, there will be depth in the market we have not seen lately," Wojciechowski said.

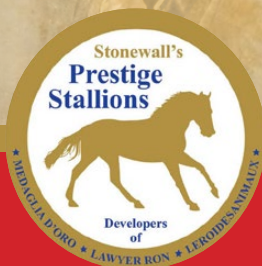

The six-day under tack show workouts went smoothly, with only one incident in which a rider fell and injured an ankle after his mount ducked, according to Wojciechowski.

"We were very pleased with the breeze show," the OBS executive said. "Over the entire six days we had excellent weather. The conditions were good and the track was in great shape. There was a lot of traffic in the barn area each day after the workouts."

The fastest eighth-mile workout time of :09 3/5 was shared by Hip 778, a More Than Ready—Miss Mary Apples filly consigned by Ciaran Dunne's Wavertree Stables, agent, and Hip 793, a Tiznow—Moonbow colt from agent Bobby Dodd. One juvenile, Hip 200, a colt by Wildcat Heir—Business Decision from the Blue River Bloodstock offerings as agent, breezed the fastest quarter-mile in :20 2/5.

Led by a \$1.2 million son of Broken Vow, the 2016 spring sale saw 853 head change hands for gross receipts in excess of \$52 million. The sale-topper, named Glacier, has one victory and three thirds in five starts for owner Breeze Easy and Hall of Fame trainer Bob Baffert.

This year's auction comes on the heels of a 2016 edition that has thus far yielded seven graded stakes winners, including eventual 2-year-old filly champion Champagne Room and grade 1 winner Union Strike.

Consigned by de Meric Sales, Champagne Room was purchased by Larry Zap of behalf of Joseph Ciaglia Jr. for \$310,000. Winner of the

grade 2 Sorrento Stakes, the filly secured her Eclipse Award by taking the 14 Hands Winery Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies (G1) for Ciglia Racing, Exline-Border, Gulliver Racing, Sharon Alesia, R. Christensen, and D. Legan.

Union Strike was a \$375,000 purchase by Ruis Racing from the Old South Farm consignment and went on to win the Del Mar Debutante (G1).

Other graded stakes winners that went through the ring at last year's OBS spring auction are Fast and Accurate, Wellabled, La Coronel, Theory, and Multiplier, winner of the April 22 Illinois Derby (G3).

Previous graduates of the spring sale include classic winners Lil E. Tee, Silver Charm, and I'll Have Another, and the sale has accounted for 25 millionaires and 10 champions. Since the beginning of 2016, 192 April graduates have won or placed in 342 stakes races, including 127 stakes victories. During that time, 27 April graduates have won 33 graded stakes.

The catalog is available via the OBS website. A sortable master index provides searchable pedigree and consignor information as well as access to pedigree updates occurring since the catalog was printed.

The iPad version of the catalog can be accessed via the EquineLine Sales Catalog app. The app allows users to download and view the catalog, receive updates and results, record notes, watch under tack videos, and also provides innovative search, sort, and rating capability features. PRICEY FILLY TOPS OBS PINHOOK PROSPECTS

When a daughter of leading sire Tapit, produced from multiple grade 1 winner Evening Jewel, was offered at the Keeneland September yearling sale ring last year, it was not surprising that she exited the ring on a hefty bid of \$400,000.

Now the chestnut filly bought by White Swan Stables as a yearling from Taylor Made Sales Agency is the top-priced previously purchased individual remaining in the catalog for the Ocala Breeders' Sales spring 2-year-olds in training sale. The auction takes place April 25-28 in Ocala, Fla., with sessions beginning at 10:30 a.m. ET daily.

Consigned to OBS by Eddie Woods, agent, as Hip 402, the filly was bred in Kentucky by Aaron and Marie Jones. Her dam, Evening Jewel (by Northern Afleet), won the Central Bank Ashland and Del Mar Oaks, both grade 1, as well as two grade 2 stakes, and finished second in the 2010 Kentucky Oaks (G1).

There has also been a significant update in the Tapit filly's first dam since the catalog was printed, as Bernadiva, the 3-year-old filly by Bernardini out of Evening Jewel, has improved her record to 2-0-2 in five starts for trainer Bill Mott and is currently pointing toward the grade 3 Edgewood Stakes at Churchill Downs.

The second-highest priced pinhook prospect at OBS is Hip 778, a More Than Ready filly who was one of two entered in the sale to breeze the fastest eighth-mile in :09 3/5 in the pre-sale under tack show. Consigned by Ciaran Dunne's Wavertree Stables, agent, the filly was bought by JSM Equine

for \$390,000 from breeder KatieRich Farms at last year's Keeneland September sale.

Produced from the grade 2-placed Clever Trick mare Miss Mary Apples, the filly is a half sister to stakes winner Dr. Diamonds Prize, who was also grade 2-placed in Canada, and to multiple stakes winner Miss Red Delicious.

"She was as obvious as the nose on your face as a yearling," Dunne said of the decision to buy her on behalf of a partnership. "We might have overpaid for her, but she was so pretty and we got caught up in the heat of the moment and brought her home."

Hip 584, from Paul Sharp, agent, is a bay colt by Medaglia d'Oro acquired by Bluewater Sales for \$300,000 from Timber Town as a Keeneland September yearling. Bred in Kentucky by Whisper Hill Farm, the colt hails from the A.P. Indy mare Indian Vale, winner of the Falls City and Fleur de Lis handicaps, both grade 2, along with two grade 3 stakes. A daughter of grade 1 winner Marley Vale, Indian Vale also placed in two grade 1 stakes in New York. **BH**

J BOYS ECHO BREEZES FIVE FURLONGS AT CHURCHILL

Albaugh Family Stable's J Boys Echo breezed five furlongs in 1:02 1/5 April 23 at Churchill Downs in preparation for the May 6 Kentucky Derby Presented by Yum! Brands (G1).

With regular exercise rider Tammy Fox aboard, J Boys Echo clocked splits of :12, :24 2/5, :37, and :49 1/5 before galloping out to six furlongs in 1:16 over a fast track.

"It was a really solid work," trainer Dale Romans said. "We'll come back next Saturday and go a little faster. Only one hurdle left until the first Saturday in May."

The Mineshaft colt won the Gotham Stakes (G3) at Aqueduct Racetrack March 4 before finishing fourth in the April 8 Toyota Blue Grass Stakes (G2) at Keeneland.

At Trackside Louisville, Jack Cincinnati Casino Spiral Stakes (G3) winner Fast and Accurate breezed five furlongs in 1:00 1/5. Olympic gold medal skier Bode Miller recently acquired partial ownership, while Kendall

Hansen maintains majority ownership. The Hansen colt won his last three starts, including two stakes races.

Fantasy Stakes (G3) winner Ever So Clever returned to the Churchill work tab, breezing five furlongs in 1:02 for trainer Steve Asmussen in preparation for the May 5 Longines Kentucky Oaks (G1).

Clearview Stables' Medaglia d'Oro filly recorded splits of :25 4/5 and :37 3/5 before galloping out six furlongs in 1:15 2/5 and seven furlongs in 1:29 4/5. **BH**

COLLECTED SHOWED CLASS SINCE EARLY DAYS

The marathon that is the Keeneland September yearling sale can be tough for both humans and horses. For young horses, being shown all day to prospective buyers in an unfamiliar location before stepping into the loud auction ring can be nerve-wracking. That's how a particularly calm chestnut colt in Runnymede Farm's 2014 consignment stood out to SGV Thoroughbreds' Steven Venosa.

"He was a horse that from the first show I looked at him early in the morning (to when) I went back late in the afternoon to look at him again—and you know how it is at Keeneland, those horses show all day long—that never turned a hair. He just dropped his head and walked like a machine," Venosa said of the City Zip—Helena Bay colt who he managed to buy for \$150,000.

That horse is multiple graded stakes winner Collected, who just picked up another graded stakes score April 22 when he easily cleared the field by 3 3/4 lengths in the Californian Stakes (G2) at Santa Anita Park.

Although Venosa said he wasn't a "typical 2-year-old in training," he thought highly of the colt when he was breaking him and decided to pinhook the colt to the 2015 Ocala Breeders' Sales March 2-year-olds in training sale, where he brought \$170,000 from his current owners Speedway Stable.

"Looking at him, he wasn't your typical 2-year-old in training... A lot of people passed over him because he didn't have the best breeze. He switched leads a couple of times but he galloped out real strong," Venosa said of the colt's furlong breeze in :10 2/5.

"When we were training him and breaking him, we never found a bottom on that horse," he added. "He went out and really enjoyed training, just really enjoyed it and loved his job.

"Some babies, when you're breaking and training them, they really don't want to do what you want to do

at that point in time, but he was one that really enjoyed being a horse. He was a pleasure to train."

Under the guidance of trainer Bob Baffert, Collected became graded stakes-placed at 2, a two-time grade 3 winner at 3, and is now two-for-two this year after an 11-month layoff. He was a 3 3/4-length winner in his first race back, the April 1 Santana Mile where he bested grade 1 winner Dortmund.

Venosa credits the trainer's handling of the athletic colt to his success in his 4-year-old season.

"(Baffert's) credentials definitely speak for themselves, and he has (Collected) right," Venosa said. "I think it's going to be a nice, fun summer with him. I think the best is yet to come." **BH**

SOUTHERN RING SPEEDS TO WHIMSICAL VICTORY

Sam-Son Farm's homebred Southern Ring, back home at Woodbine, dug in to win the \$125,000 Whimsical Stakes (G3) April 23 and spoiled the season debut of 2016 Canadian Horse of the Year Caren.

Southern Ring set the pace from the start in the six-furlong stakes on the Tapeta main track, but was under pressure from longshot Skylander Girl through quarter-mile fractions of :23.17 and :45.77.

The 5-year-old Speightstown mare kicked away in the stretch, but had to hold off River Maid late to win by a length under jockey Eurico Rosa da Silva in 1:09.70. River Maid closed well to pick up second, a nose in front of Euroboss.

Robert Marzilli's Caren appeared to be in prime striking position early, as she stalked the leaders in third on the backstretch and in the turn. But the eight-time stakes winner never seriously threatened in the stretch and came in fifth, 1 1/2 lengths behind the winner.

It was the second grade 3 score at Woodbine for the Malcolm Pierce-trained Southern Ring, following her victory in the Oct. 16 Ontario Fashion Stakes, also at Woodbine. In four starts on the Woodbine synthetic, she has three wins and two seconds from five starts.

Bred in Ontario, out of the Seeking the Gold mare Seeking the Ring, Southern Ring now has \$327,799 in earnings with a 5-1-2 record from 10 starts. **BH**

PARTY BOAT UPSETS FIFTY FIVE IN MEMORIES OF SILVER

With a late kick in the stretch, Hope Jones' Party Boat overcame frontrunner Team of Teams to score by a length in the \$100,000 Memories of Silver Stakes at Aqueduct Racetrack April 23.

"I got clear turning for home and I was just trying to hold it together," winning jockey Joel Rosario said. "She responded very nicely with a nice finish. (Team of Teams) and (Dynatail) put in an honest pace. It wasn't too fast. It was just right. She put in a good finish today."

In the 1 1/16-mile test over firm turf, Team of Teams took the lead going into the first turn and set fractions of :24.47, :48.87, and 1:11.92 through six furlongs. Dynatail settled in second, while Party Boat tracked in third just outside of Dynatail. In her typical closing style, which won her the grade 3 Florida Oaks last time out, even-money favorite Fifty Five raced near the back of the six-horse field.

Heading into the stretch, Team of Teams held a 1 1/2-length advantage as Fifty Five attempted a run but was steadied coming out of the turn after travelling four wide. Party Boat surged in the final strides to overcome the frontrunner and stopped the clock in 1:42.05 for trainer Graham Motion. Fifty Five managed to finished third, 3 1/2 lengths back from Team of Teams.

Dynatail, Super Marina, and Art Institute completed the order of finish.

Party Boat returned \$9.30, \$4.50, and \$2.50 across the board.

Bred by Fred W. Hertrich III, the Into Mischief filly was last purchased at auction by Webb Carroll Training Center for \$100,000 out of Darby Dan Farm's consignment to the 2015 Keeneland September sale.

As a 2-year-old, she won three of her five starts, including an off-the-turf edition of the Wait a While Stakes. Last time out, she ran third behind Dream Dancing in the March 4 Herecomesthebride Stakes (G3T). She now has four wins from eight starts, with earnings of \$183,825. **BH**

DOLPHUS OUTRUNS QUALITY FIELD AT AQUEDUCT

Aqueduct Racetrack's third race April 23, a \$100,000 optional-claiming allowance race, could have been mistaken for a stakes event.

The field of five included Economic Model, runner up in the Ketel One King's Bishop Stakes (G1), graded

stakes-placed Turco Bravo, and Shagaf, who was pulled up in his last race—the 2016 Kentucky Derby Presented by Yum! Brands (G1).

William Lawrence and Klaravich Stables' Economic Model was slated as the even-money, morning-line favorite, but it was Dede McGehee's Dolphus who drew the betting public's attention. The 4-year-old colt by Lookin At Lucky, who previously finished fourth in the Szymie Stakes and ninth in the Hal's Hope Stakes (G3) in his only graded stakes effort, went off at odds of 6-5.

Taking advantage of a fast break, Dolphus went to the lead in the one-mile test and set fractions of :23.57 for the first quarter and :46.46 for a half-mile. He opened up by four lengths in the stretch, but Splashtastic closed to finish second by 1 3/4 lengths. Final time for the distance was 1:35.27 on a fast track.

Economic Model finished third, another three lengths back, with Turco Bravo and Shagaf completing the order of finish. The former Derby contender was never better than fourth throughout the contest.

Bred by Heaven Trees Farm, Dolphus is out of Lotta Kim, dam of the Hall of Fame runner Rachel Alexandra. Dolphus, trained by Jimmy Jerkens, now has a record of four wins and a third from 10 starts and has earnings of \$142,090. **BH**

KENTUCKY DERBY STARTS BY DISTANCE AND QUALITY

Who can carry speed over 1 1/4 miles? It's a key question to answer when unraveling the handicapping puzzle that is the Kentucky Derby Presented by Yum! Brands (G1).

To provide some insight into this answer, this article will look at three influencing metrics: the average winning distance for the sire-dam cross each Derby contender represents, the date each contender made his first start, and the date each got his first win.

These statistics and a slew of others will be available in the April 29 issue of *BloodHorse* magazine within the *BloodHorse MarketWatch's* annual Derby contenders profiles. Besides average winning distance and past performance, the profiles include progeny performance statistics for 3-year-olds and route races for each Derby contender's sire. The profiles also include performance records for the Derby contenders' trainers under the same conditions.

For the purposes of this article, the TrueNicks Cross average winning distance and the first start and win histories are used. The AWD statistic gives insight into the broader question of which horses have the genetic predisposition to handle 1 1/4 miles. The first starts versus first win histories indicate quality by identifying those sturdy enough to not only start at 2 but also win.

The AWD for the cross that produced last year's Kentucky Derby winner Nyquist, from Uncle Mo's first crop, was 7.00 furlongs prior to the Derby. Naturally doubts lingered about whether the colt could get the distance. Nyquist, however, showed his quality early. He won his first start June 5 at Santa Anita Park and became a stakes winner in his second start. Nyquist won three grade 1's at 2 including the Sentient Jet Breeders' Cup Juvenile (G1) and was named Eclipse champion 2-year-old colt.

For this year, the AWD is 7.00 furlongs and higher for 15 Derby contenders topped by Xpressbet Florida Derby (G1) winner Always Dreaming with an 8.62 AWD based on the cross of Empire Maker (sire of Always Dreaming's sire Bodemeister) and his sons with Caro (grandsire of In Excess) and his sons as broodmare sire.

Among these 15 sires, four contenders got their first win by September of their 2-year-old year: Classic Empire, Gunnevera, Practical Joke, and Gormley. Three of these challengers won at first asking: Classic Empire, Practical Joke, and Gormley.

The cross producing Breeders' Cup Juvenile winner and 2-year-old champion Classic Empire (by Pioneerof the Nile) is 7.33. He won his first start May 4 at Churchill by 1 1/2 lengths and won the Bashford Manor Stakes (G3) in his second start.

Practical Joke (Into Mischief), whose cross has a 7.06 AWD, broke his maiden at Saratoga Race Course in his first start Aug. 6 by five lengths going six furlongs. He won the Hopeful Stakes (G1) in his next start.

Gormley (Malibu Moon) won his first start Sept. 4 at Del Mar by 4 1/4 lengths going 6 1/2 furlongs. He became a graded stakes winner in his second start, taking the FrontRunner Stakes (G1) by three lengths. **BH**
